Literacy Conference

The Nebraska Literacy Project Plan was approved by the State Board of Education on February 7, 2025. The goal of the project is to improve third grade reading proficiency on NSCAS and increase the number of K-3 students meeting the Nebraska Reading Improvement Act approved assessment thresholds. As part of this effort, the Unicameral has appropriated funds to Nebraska ESUs to help support school districts increase early childhood literacy. Mrs. Hambidge will be attending a 3 day Coaching and Literacy Leadership Retreat in Galveston, TX on June 22-25, 2025. She will then have the opportunity to share some of the best practices in literacy instruction with the staff.

Summer School

Elementary summer school will be conducted Monday-Friday from June 9-27 (8:30-11:30am). Mrs. Thomas will be organizing and leading summer school one last time. The primary goal is to close gaps in reading and math and provide students with additional learning opportunities in the summer. We recently held our latest Elementary MTSS meeting on April 8th and identified 27 students that would benefit from additional reinforcement in reading and math. Mrs. Thomas is in the process of reaching out to parents and confirming whether their child will be able to attend or not. Breakfast and a grab-and-go lunch will be served Monday through Thursday.
