NSCAS Testing

- Mr. Ellis attended a meeting at ESU #11 earlier and came home with some good information regarding NSCAS testing.
 - The fall and winter assessments are optional.
 - The only score that really counts is the spring score.

- So, after discussing this information we decided to cancel the Fall NSCAS testing. I feel that we already overtest our students and this would decrease the amount of time testing and increase class time. We have already cut our MAPS testing from four tests to two. I feel this is beneficial to our students.

- We will still plan on the winter assessment scheduled for December 12 and 13. This will give our students the opportunity to experience the test format and see the types of questions on the state test. This will also allow us to goal-set for the spring assessment which is scheduled for April 22, 23, and 24.
