- 1) Diesel mechanics to keep our tractors and combines running,

- 4) Welders and advanced manufacturing technicians to create customized products as well as mass production of items like medical needles, syringes or aeronautical parts,

- 7) Construction workers to build and repair homes,

- 10) Correction, law, and probation officers to respond to emergencies and protect our families.
- 11) Child development providers so parents can work and have peace of mind knowing their children are in safe and educational environments,

Just be prepared that it may take a while as it is our passion, and something we celebrate each day is our ability to serve and support the everchanging workforce needs and people of Nebraska.
