Student Conference

Select Junior and Senior students were able to attend the 2016 Eastern Nebraska Transition Conference on January 26 in Norfolk, NE. The conference was arranged for students who may transition from high school into one of the following focus areas: auto tech, diesel mechanics, agriculture, welding, or utility line work. Students returned with a better understanding of the potential opportunities and needed skills to pursue a career in these areas.
