"Brox and Cos are two of the same as far as just intensity and toughness and that fierce competitor and they're both just gritty," Slough said. "They make timely shots and they get timely rebounds and they just make game winning plays."

New to Grand Island and the Islanders this season is junior Victor Fisher, who's a 6-5 forward who played at Iowa High School in Louisiana last season. He's already made an impact after a great showing in GISH's jamboree game against Crete.

"He's very dynamic. He can play inside out. I think he had 25 in our jamboree game against Crete. He's definitely capable," Slough

Through the first couple weeks of practice, Slough has also found some guys

they're going to do them exceptionally well," Slough said. "They're going to guard the other team's best player. They're going to get a deflection that leads to an assist. They're going to make the deflection that leads to a steal.

"They just do all of the small things that you ask them to do."

There is a change coming for the Islanders this season and it comes on the defensive end. After primarily being a zone defense team, Slough and the Islanders are making the switch to playing more man-to-man.

"It allows some opportunities for us to turn people over and to get going in transition and hopefully allow our offense to fuel our defense again and when we've been at our best, that's been our identity," Slough said. "There's a time and place for zone and you'll see us in zone, but at the same time we want to be the aggressor and we want


Central High School.
