

PROCEEDINGS OF CITY COUNCIL  
May 4, 2026

A regular meeting of the mayor and council of the City of Columbus, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session on May 4, 2026, at 6 p.m. in the Columbus Community Building, Community Room, 2500 14 Street, Columbus, Nebraska. Notice of this meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Columbus Telegram on April 29, 2026, with a copy of the proof of publication being on file in the office of the city clerk. Notice of this meeting was given simultaneously to the mayor and members of the city council, with a copy of the acknowledgment of receipt of notice being on file in the office of the city clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the mayor and city council of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public.

1. **STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE WITH OPEN MEETINGS ACT:** Mayor Bulkley announced that a copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted in the meeting room. **6. SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS**

**6.A. Proclamation declaring week of May 3, 2026, as Professional Municipal Clerks Week.** Bulkley proclaimed the week of May 3, 2026, as Professional Municipal Clerks Week and thanked the staff in the city clerk's office for all the work they do.

**9. REPORTS OF CITY OFFICES**

**9.A. Columbus in Focus - Public Safety.** Strecker presented on behalf of the Public Safety team, which includes Vasicek, Strecker, Gray, and Pensick. Strecker reviewed 2026 action items and highlighted the individual accomplishments of each department in the past 60 days as well as the group projects the team has been collaborating on.

**9.B. Reveal of new city seal.** Bulkley introduced Jennifer Davila, creator of the new city seal. Davila gave a brief explanation of her design, noting that her inspiration came from how she envisioned the community while growing up in Columbus.

**10. REPORTS OF COUNCIL COMMITTEES**

**10.A. Public Property, Safety, and Works Committee - May 4, 2026.**

**10.A.1. Permanent Sidewalk Easement located in part of Lot 8, Block 4, Evanlawn Addition, to the City of Columbus, Platte County, Nebraska (33rd Avenue and 21st Street).** The committee recommended approval. The report was adopted with a motion by Lopez and a second by Schilling. Alarcòn, Bahr, Hiemer, Jablonski, Lopez, Palensky, Roth, and Schilling voted "Aye" and none voted "Nay".

**10.A.2. Drainage Easement located in South 1/2 of the Northeast 1/4 of Section 11, Township 17 North, Range 1 West of the 6th P.M., Platte County, Nebraska (west of Grayhawk Place cul-de-sac).** The committee recommended approval. The report was adopted with a motion by Schilling and a second by Lopez. Alarcòn, Bahr, Hiemer, Jablonski, Lopez, Palensky, Roth, and Schilling voted "Aye" and none voted "Nay".

**10.A.3. Amend city code section 50.35 to add regulations regarding handling of solid waste.** Vasicek explained that currently there are no regulations

regarding how residents are to dispose of solid waste or how frequently it must be removed from their property. She noted that some residents do not employ a professional garbage service and allow garbage to accumulate on their property for extended periods of time, requiring code enforcement to spend a significant amount of time addressing and abating these nuisances. Vasicek stated that amending city code will allow the police department to more effectively enforce these violations and establish clearer expectations for residents moving forward. Roth expressed concerns regarding the proposed requirement of weekly removal as some residents utilize the option of a bi-monthly garbage pick-up service. The committee recommended approval. The report was adopted with a motion by Lopez and a second by Bahr. Alarcòn, Bahr, Hiemer, Jablonski, Lopez, Palensky, and Schilling voted "Aye" and Roth voted "Nay".

**10.A.4. Proposed changes to parking restrictions for streets and avenues located in the downtown area. (Downtown Business Improvement District recommends approval.)** Vasicek explained that recent discussions regarding downtown parking have highlighted concerns related to the existing two-hour parking limits and inconsistent compliance. As a result, the City and the Downtown Business Improvement District are recommending removal of the two-hour parking limit on 25th, 26th, and 27th Avenues between 12th and 14th Streets. She noted that additional updates to the overnight parking restrictions were also proposed for street cleaning and snow removal. The committee recommended approval. The report was adopted with a motion by Schilling and a second by Bahr. Alarcòn, Bahr, Hiemer, Jablonski, Lopez, Palensky, Roth, and Schilling voted "Aye" and none voted "Nay".

**13. NEW BUSINESS:**

**13.A. Appointment of Margaret (Peg) Slusarski to the Civil Service Commission filling unexpired term until April 2029.** Hiemer read a brief resume and the mayor's appointment of Peg Slusarski to the Civil Service Commission was ratified with a motion by Jablonski and a second by Roth. Alarcòn, Bahr, Hiemer, Jablonski, Lopez, Palensky, Roth, and Schilling voted "Aye" and none voted "Nay".

**13.B. Application from 23rd West LLC dba Bo's West Sports Bar to add secondary catering license to existing Retail Class "C" liquor license at 3720 23 Street.** A recommendation was made to the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission to approve the addition of a catering license to the existing Class C liquor license for 23rd West LLC with a motion by Lopez and a second by Schilling. Alarcòn, Bahr, Hiemer, Jablonski, Lopez, Palensky, Roth, and Schilling voted "Aye" and none voted "Nay".

**13.C. Quote from Wemhoff Refrigeration, Inc. in the amount of \$17,383.72 for air conditioning unit for Quail Run pro shop. Reallocated CIP #26-07** The

reallocation of funds was approved and the quote from Wemhoff Refrigeration, Inc. for air conditioning unit was accepted with a motion by Palensky and a second by Jablonski. Alarcòn, Bahr, Hiemer, Jablonski, Lopez, Palensky, Roth, and Schilling voted "Aye" and none voted "Nay".

**13.D. Quote from CDW Government in the total amount of \$49,097.62 for Microsoft 365 mailbox licenses.** The quote from CDW Government for Microsoft 365 mailbox licenses was accepted with a motion by Hiemer and a second by Lopez. Alarcòn, Bahr, Hiemer, Jablonski, Lopez, Palensky, Roth, and Schilling voted "Aye" and none voted "Nay".
