
Overview


- In the past three years CCC has experienced an increase in total awards each year.

Awards by Year and Type





Percentage of Awards by Type Over the Past Three Years

The University of Nebraska-Lincoln (UNL) conferred the highest number of degrees and awards in the state throughout the 10-year period from 2008-09 to 2018-19. Among the six institutions in the table listed below, Metropolitan Community College experienced the largest 10-year increase (76.4%) while Bellevue University experienced the a 10-year decrease of 7.4%.

As per CCPE's Postsecondary Education Operating and State Aid Budget Recommendations 2021-2023 Biennium report (page 64), CCC receives significantly less funding than the other community colleges per award conferred.

"In the cart above, the lowest cost per degree for state funds is at Central Community College and is due to a significant increase in awards conferred, including 12 credit hour programs and a concerted effort to identify students nearing degree completion, and relatively little state funding."


Of the 37 programs tracked in the three-year completions report:

- 9 programs experienced small declines in overall awards
- 28 programs experienced large increases in overall awards
- Two programs started (Pharmacy Technician and Energy Technology)
- One end-dated (Visual Communications)

General facts:

As per the 2019-2020 Graduate Outcomes Report:

- 89% of Graduates were employed full time or continuing education (2017-18 Graduates)
- 94% of Graduates remained in the CCC service area and the remaining 6% in the state of Nebraska
- 49.2 percent were female and 50.8% male
- 17.8% of graduates were Hispanic/Latino
- The oldest graduate was 69 and the youngest 17





As per CollegeSimply. Com UNL graduates earn on average \$37,800 after six years of enrolling.

- Top six-year average earnings of CCC graduates by program include:
- 1. Paramedicine (\$33.22 per hour)
- 2. Quality Technology (\$30.73 per hour)
- 3. Mechatronics (\$30.44 per hour)
- 4. Associate Degree in Nursing (\$25.81 per hour)
- 5. Advanced Manufacturing Design Technology (\$22.29 per hour)
- 6. Dental Hygiene (\$20.58 per hour)

Facts about CCC graduates who continue their education post award:

- 32% of graduates (award recipients) continue attending CCC.
- 20% attend the University of Nebraska Kearney
- 15% attend the University of Nebraska Lincoln
- 6% attend the Hastings College
- 5% (each) attend Bellevue University or UNO
- 4% attend UNMC
- 9% attend an out of state college or university
