Project H.E.L.P. By The Numbers:

√ 3,288 participants enrolled

2,683 participants enrolled at CCC (82%)

√ 2,251 healthcare trainings completed

1,850 participants completed at CCC (82%)

Project H.E.L.P. By The Numbers:

√ 1,656 participants employed in healthcare

1,370 participants employed in healthcare from CCC (83%)

- √ \$4.48 average wage increase from intake
- ✓ 315 healthcare employers have hired Project H.E.L.P. participants

(unique by employer, not each facility or location)

...and there's more work to do (grant-wide)

- √ 55 projected completions
 for healthcare diploma / degree programs
- √ 47 projected completions
 for pre-requisites to healthcare diploma /
 degree programs
