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CCC & Early College Welding stepping up to the future together


to create young leaders that are excelling in the welding industry.



Students come from several area schools including Giltner, GISH, Northwest, Palmer, Centura, and Heartland Lutheran.

Each student is offered the opportunity to take hands-on college welding courses while earning their high school diploma.

A.A.S. degree can be earned along with two welding certificates, a production and manual certificate.



- Currently, 41 are enrolled this year.
- Students are offered multiple ways to continue their education at CCC, such as the Transition scholarship.
- Fifteen former early college students are enrolled at CCC in the welding program.




Students can participate in an apprenticeship program through our local industry of multiple welding and fabrication shops.

- Currently, four students are working as apprentices at CNH.
- Five former students have transitioned from their apprenticeships into full-time employment with CNH, Chief, AGI, and Standard Iron.



- Students have opportunities to use state-of-the-art welding equipment that mirrors local industry work environments.
- Equipment in the welding lab is not the equipment normally seen at the high school level.


