## **Buildings & Grounds**

- KPE Engineering visited the school on April 25<sup>th</sup> to do an onsite inspection and preliminary engineering work. They're hoping to have the spec sheets for the new high school HVAC system ready to go out to bids by the end of May at the latest.
- Paper towel dispensers for the high school boy's and girl's restrooms have been installed.
- We put up a new gazebo down at the outdoor classroom area. The old Gazebo was in poor structural shape with lots of and has needed some TLC for quite a while. We purchased a kit online from Yard Craft and a work crew from the county jail came and put together the gazebo and shingled it. We're going to purchase a copula to go on the peak to finish it off. The gazebo was paid for by insurance since the old one was damaged in a storm some time back. Seneca did a great job on this project, selecting some gazebos for us to choose from, getting the information to Cassie, and lining up the work crew to build the gazebo from the McCook Work Program. George Probasco was also over at the gazebo helping with the overseeing of the project.
- We've talked to TL Sund about coming in and pouring concrete pads for the new HVAC system, the high school courtyard area, and a possible pad for the cardboard recycling trailer.
- We're going to have Cacy Electric give us a bid to add a couple flood lights to the south end of the high school entrance and also move a 240v outlet in the kitchen to move a warming oven closer to the serving area.
- The football field will have fertilizer and pre-emergent weed

**NDE Title Program Review** – was on April 19<sup>th</sup> and it went well. Ann Carmoney from NDE came out and did the review with Mrs. Helms, Mr. Perez, and myself. Nice to report that the district is in compliance with all state and federal requirements concerning the running of our Title program.
