In track Sabrina qualified for state her freshman year where she medaled by throwing 117-6 in the discus and placing 7<sup>th</sup>. Last year Sabrina qualified for state discus for the third straight year, placing 6<sup>th</sup> with a throw of 123-4. Sabrina currently holds the school discus record with a throw of 159-0.

In softball Sabrina Luttig is a four-year varsity letter winner in softball. Sabrina was a member of the 2012 State Champion team. Sabrina was selected to 1<sup>st</sup> Team Class C All-State team in the Omaha World Herald and the Lincoln Journal Star in 2014 and 2015.
