## Update on Campus Goals

The campus goals for the middle school/high school were narrowed down to a reading goal and a college and career readiness goal based on the Annual District Goals. The areas of focus address Student Performance Objective 1: "APS will consistently score above the state average and score in the top $20 \%$ of identified array schools at each grade level in reading, math, and science utilizing a 5year average" and Objective 4: "Develop, articulate, and deliver a comprehensive post-secondary curriculum to assist students in transitioning from secondary education career and/or college."

Post-Secondary Goal -
*Students will plan, monitor, and manage their post-secondary goal with $100 \%$ of graduating seniors having a post-secondary plan in place by the end of the first semester of their senior year.

Action -
*We will begin developing a district college/career readiness curriculum.
*Teachers will engage in college/career readiness activities as outlined (which is developingcollege and career readiness standards focus, etc...).

## Reading Goal -

* $90 \%$ of our students will meet the passing standard on the reading portion of the state assessment.


## Action -

*We have dedicated DEAR time two times per week during TA.
*We have utilized MAP data more readily to understand relative strengths and weaknesses, both for the campus and for individual students.
*We have implemented reading questions in assessments across the curriculum.
*Mrs. Lorsch has attended training sessions focused on text-dependent analysis questioning which is a focus on the updated state test.

## MAPS Testing

Students completed the winter administration of the MAPS testing and we are breaking down the data by grade, class, and student. An example of the data for our students in comparison with a "norm" is shown in the chart below.
