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# Equity Transfer Initiative (ETI)

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Central Community College along with our partner the University of Nebraska at Kearney.

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Selected by American Association of Community Colleges (AACCC) in partnership with the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) and the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities (APLU).

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Goal of the initiative is to advance transfer pathways and align them to increase transfer and completion for underrepresented student populations between our institutions.

# Proposed updated and new pathways through ETI include:

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Criminal Justice AAS to Criminal Justice BS

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Business Administration/Accounting/Logistics AAS to one or more

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Business BS

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Information Technology AAS to Cyber Systems BS

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Early Childhood AAS to Elementary Teaching BA

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Human Services AAS to Social Work Comprehensive BS

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Medical Laboratory Tech AAS to Allied Health Science BS

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Construction Tech AAS to Construction Management BS/Comprehensive.

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# Criminal Justice Comprehensive 2+2 CCC-UNK Pathway Curriculum Complete!

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- Students will take first 60 credits through CCC and second 61 - 64 credits through UNK without retaking any credits!
- Students graduate with an AAS from CCC and a BS from UNK.
- Completed the agreement in July 2021 and in one month **6 CCC graduates matriculated** to UNK and are working on their bachelor's degrees using the new pathway. 4 of the students identify themselves as Hispanic and/or first-generation students.

# Up Next

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CCC's Business Administration's AAS 2+2 is almost complete.

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Bring together CCC and UNK faculty groups to identify and act on other opportunities (following the Criminal Justice successful model).
