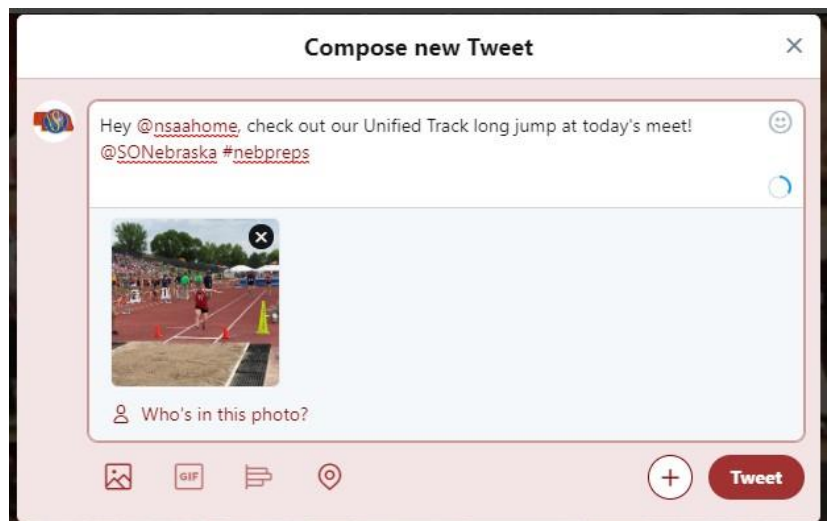
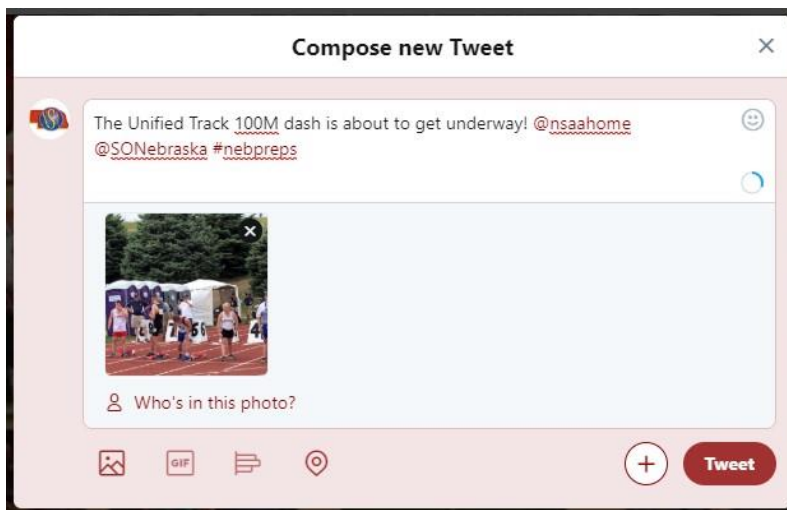


Unified Sports, Track & Field Exhibition Events

Statement of Principle on Conduct Synopsis

Adopted by the NDE, NSAA, NCSA, NASB, NSEA, NRCSA, NCA and NSIAAA

Recently, students in our schools have been experiencing negative, harassing, and bullying conduct during the school day, and at school activities by the spectators attending those events or, and at times by opponents in an activity, that is directed at the school's participants and spectators, often with a racial component. Such conduct is unacceptable and does not reflect the foregoing basic tenants of our society.

It is the responsibility of our organizations to promote and respect the liberty interests of all persons who may participate in or attend any educational endeavor sponsored by our organizations which includes ensuring that common courtesy is shown for all persons, insuring tranquility for all, and being responsible that no one person abuses their liberties to the detriment of other persons.

As the educational leaders of Nebraska's school system, we firmly support Nebraska schools and communities in proactively involving teachers, administrators, students, parents, and community members in developing and maintaining a positive school and community culture that supports learning opportunities for all persons, and ensures that respect and courtesy are shown to all persons.

Conduct by any person that does not show respect for and courtesy of other persons in Nebraska schools and any school activity is prohibited and shall not be tolerated – period.



A Reminder to Compete With Respect

Concerns have been expressed in regard to the lack of respect being afforded to students, coaches, officials, spectators and host staff.

Schools should understand the seriousness of their responsibility to everyone and the privilege of representing their school and community. As educators, we must recommit ourselves to the preservation of respect. Unfair acts prohibited by the spirit and intent of the rules include the use of disconcerting acts or words.

Deliberately disrespecting the rules and fellow participants in the hope or expectation of gaining an advantage is deplorable and indefensible. It is imperative that administrators, coaches, officials and students make an extra effort to model the type of behavior that illustrates the educational values of activity participation. Conduct that berates, intimidates or threatens anyone, based on gender, ethnicity, or sexual preference is unacceptable.



Requirements for Ejected Coaches & Players

Enforcement of the “sit-out rule” for ejections from high school contests for unsportsmanlike conduct is a responsibility of the member school. Failure to properly enforce this rule could result in other sanctions by the NSAA.

Administrators will be expected to promptly file a report with the NSAA whenever a participant or coach from their school has been ejected from any high school contest. Such filing must be done online under the AD login section of the NSAA website.

Enforcement of the “sit-out rule” is expected to begin immediately, regardless whether it is regular-season or tournament play.

Any athlete ejected from a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct shall be ineligible for the next athletic contest at that level of competition and any other athletic contest at any level during the interim. Any athlete ejected for a second time during a season from a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct shall be ineligible for the next two contests at that level of competition and all other athletic contests at any level during the interim. Any athlete ejected for a third time during a season from a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct shall be ineligible for the next three contests at that level of competition and all other athletic contests at any level during the interim, in addition to other penalties the NSAA or school may assess. During the time of their “sit-out” suspension, athletes who are ejected for unsportsmanlike conduct may not suit up or participate, but it is the school’s discretion whether such athlete is able to travel with the team or sit on the team bench. (The athlete is permitted to practice per school’s discretion.)

Coaches who are ejected for the first time will be required to sit-out the next contest at that level, plus all other contests at any level during the interim. Coaches may not be present at the contest site during the time of their “sit-out” suspension. The coach will also be required to successfully complete the NFHS online course “TEACHING AND MODELING BEHAVIOR” within 10 days of the ejection.

Coaches who are ejected a second time in a season will be required to sit-out the next two contests at that level, plus all other contests at any level during the interim. Coaches may not be present at the contest site during the time of their “sit-out” suspension. The coach will also be required to successfully complete the NFHS online course “FUNDAMENTALS OF COACHING” within 10 days of the ejection.

Medical Personnel at Regular Season Contests

Severe injuries, sudden illnesses and other critical incidents do not often occur during school activities, but it is important for every school to have an emergency action plan (EAP) for administrators, faculty, coaches and staff members to follow should emergencies occur. Due to lack of universal availability of medical coverage and other logistical reasons, NSAA does not require that schools have a physician, trainer or ambulance on-site at regular season activities; however, each school should have a plan in place should there be an emergency involving students, coaches, officials or spectators requiring medical attention.

Are your head and assistant coaches C.E.R.T.I.F.I.E.D?

NSAA Bylaw 2.12 stipulates, “*In order to serve as a head or assistant coach or sponsor of any activity sponsored by the NSAA, the individual must possess a valid Nebraska Teaching Certificate or Nebraska Administrative and Supervisory Certificate and have a written contract of employment as a coach or sponsor with the schools in which he/she is to perform these duties.*” Yes, this does include coaches/directors/sponsors/advisers in the non-athletic activities as well: Play Production, Music, Speech and Journalism.

Individuals that do not possess either of the certificates listed above, may serve as a head or assistant as long as they successfully complete the requirements for a Special Services Coaching Permit (*NSAA Bylaw 2.12.2*). This information can be found on the NSAA webpage under the Coaches tab. It is important to remember that certification is not complete until the individual has applied and received their certificate from the Nebraska Department of Education Certification Office. Schools should request a copy of the certificate and have it on file at the school.

Non-certified personnel may be contracted by the school, but such personnel shall be Coaches Aides. (*NSAA Bylaw 2.12.3*). There are restrictions and limitations for Coaches Aides. Refer to the respective Bylaw for a complete listing in regard to Coaches Aides.

3.12.2 Officials for Varsity Contests.

Only those officials who are registered with the Association may be used by member high schools to officiate varsity competition in football, baseball, basketball, wrestling, soccer, softball and volleyball competition, and start track & field meets.

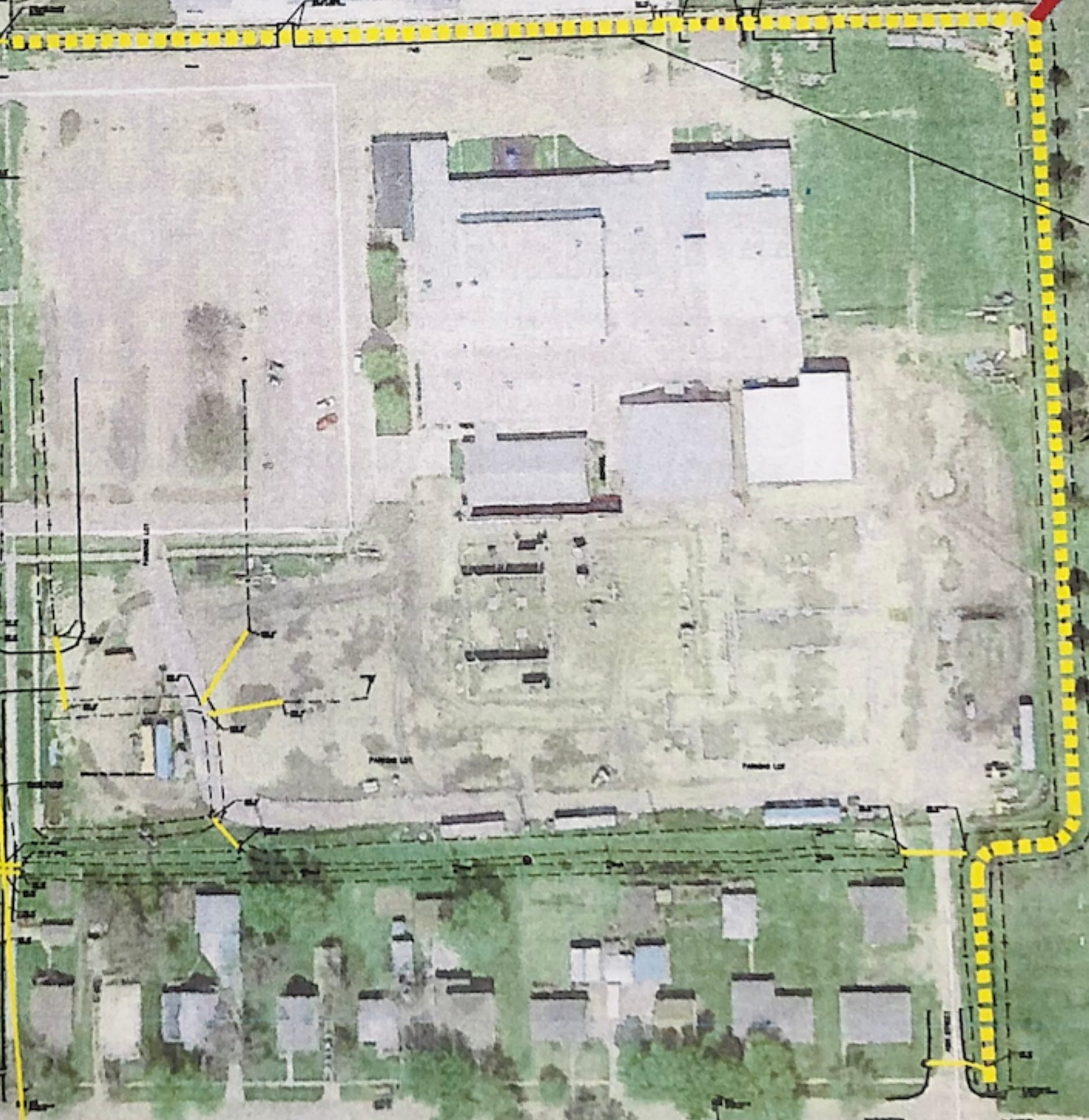

Electronics Recycling

Free electronics recycling for member schools. Schools are encouraged to drop off a variety of unused computer-based electronics where they are palletized and recycled.

LAN Manager Program

Provide support and training to school LAN Managers.

Datacenter Services

Provides a direct connection to each school via a layer 2 VPN. This connection allows schools to place servers in our data center for redundant and primary services along with offsite backups.

E-Rate Filing & Consultation

This service focuses on assisting schools with completing the processes required by the Universal Service Corporation for discounts on telecommunications services. These requirements include filing numerous reports, letting bids or requests for proposals, and completing on-line requests to receive calculated discounts for eligible services.

Identity Management

Provides support for a regional single sign on system.

Internet Access

Provide coordination and support for our school's direct connection to an internet service provider of their choice. These services range from the initial planning and design, to implementation of equipment and assuring continuity of the connection.

LanMan Partnership

ESU offers to supply technical services on a consistent scheduled basis per our LANMAN Partnership service agreement. A District Technology Coordinator is hired by the ESU and assigned to those schools who choose to participate in the service.

STUDENT SERVICES

Behavior Analyst

A Behavior Analyst conducts Functional Behavior Assessments to determine why a behavior is occurring and then develop a Behavior Intervention Plan to address the challenging behaviors. The analyst works closely with school administrators, teachers, paraprofessionals, and school psychologists. Services can be minimal, such as conducting an observation and helping with classroom strategies, or much more extensive. Some students may require intensive behavior interventions, social skills training and/or emotional behavioral health support. I also provide trainings to districts that discuss the basics of behavior, classroom strategies to help manage challenging behaviors, de-escalation strategies, and various other topics that the school district specifies.

Early Childhood

EC staff work with children b-2 with identified disabilities and their caregivers in home, daycares and preschools.

Program Supervision

Compliance, financials, training

Speech Language

Provide diagnostic, therapeutic, and consultative services for the educational needs of individuals with oral and/or written speech-language disorders in the areas of receptive language, expressive language, articulation, voice, fluency, literacy, and social communication.

Vision

The ESU7 Vision Team provides resources, services, and support in preparing children/youth who have a visual impairment for success in life through collaboration with schools, families, and community agencies. Vision services are available for students experiencing vision problems. Certified vision personnel provide evaluation, consultation, and intervention for these children. This assistance may include the use of adaptive equipment, assistive technology, instruction in Braille, orientation and mobility, and other skills for accessing the general curriculum, and acquire Adapted Core Curriculum skills specific to individuals with vision impairments.

Cen7ter

Cen7ter is designed to meet the needs of students ages 12 to 21 with developmental disabilities. Cen7ter's mission is to empower students to use their strengths to assist in preparing each individual to gain employment and independent living skills. Cen7ter program emphasis is placed on life skills academics, social skills, independent living, recreation/leisure, and prevocational opportunities. Cen7ter services are IEP driven and available 1 - 5 days a week.

Deaf Education

A teacher of the Hearing Impaired provides deaf education services and/or consultation for students verified as deaf or hard of hearing. Our Deaf Educator works with audiologists to ensure appropriate aural rehabilitation services to students, families, and schools.

Mental Health

To find the best solution for each student and situation and use different counseling strategies to address student's needs socially and emotionally. To collaborate with educators, parents and other professionals to create safe, healthy, and supportive learning environments for all students that strengthen connections between home and school. Counsel with emphasis on prevention. Work with individuals and their families to promote optimum mental health of the student.

Resource Coach

The ESU7 Resource Coach focus is working with teachers, other district staff, and families to assist and provide guidance, training, resources, and strategies for working with students by utilizing programming and materials to improve learning through meeting each individual student's needs. ILCD stands for Improving Learning for Children with Disabilities, a Nebraska Department of Education Initiative designed to enhance program improvement that will result in better outcomes for children with disabilities. The ESU7 ILCD Facilitator assists school districts with their improvement activities for students with disabilities. The Facilitator partners with districts to gather and analyze data in collaboration with the Continuous School Improvement Process and to assist in the development of Targeted Improvement Plans. Each Nebraska school district will develop a Targeted Improvement Plan that will lead to better child and student performance and report annually to NDE on the Plan's progress.

Title II-A Consortium

The ESU 7 Title II-A Consortium supports the goal of Title II-A: Increase the academic achievement of all students through strategies such as improving teacher and Principal quality and increasing the number of highly qualified teachers in the classroom and highly qualified Principals and leaders in schools.

Coop Purchasing

Nebraska ESUCC Cooperative Purchasing provides compliant, competitive, aggregated bidding and purchasing to control and reduce costs to its members by maximizing efficiency of resources and processes in Nebraska and Nationally. Cooperative Purchasing is authorized to coordinate purchases for public school districts, nonpublic school systems, other ESUs, and other public agencies, including any county, city, village, school district, or agency of the state government,

Thanks for contacting Omaha Stage Equipment regarding the stage at Shelby Rising City High School in Shelby, NE. I have come up with a very practical design that I feel will perfectly suit your needs for decades to come.

Below I will outline the Set Schedule and proposed changes.

The Set Schedule will be as follows:

Valance: 3'h x 50'w, made with 22 ounce brushed polyester inherently flame resistant fabric in the color of your choice. This curtain will be sewn with 50% fullness.

-No proposed changes

Main Curtain: (2) 13'h x 27'w, made with 22 ounce brushed polyester inherently flame resistant fabric in the color of your choice. This curtain will be sewn with 50% fullness.

-Main Curtain will be updated with all new hardware. Carriers, End Pulleys, Floorblock, Rope.

Leg Set 1: (1) (Stage Right) 13' 5"h x 15' 4"w, (1) (Stage Left) 13' 5"h x 15'w, made with 14 ounce brushed polyester inherently flame resistant fabric in the color black. This curtain will be sewn with 50% fullness.

-Leg Set 1 will be changed from 7'w to approx. 15'w and be taken off pivots to be run manually on and offstage. It will also be moved from 4' 9" off the proscenium to 2' 9". These Leg Curtains will provide entrances for actors while also masking the side walls from audience view. Existing track will be used, new carriers will be added.

Border 1: 6' 6"h x 50'w, made with 14 ounce brushed polyester inherently flame resistant fabric in the color black. This curtain will be sewn with 50% fullness.

-No proposed changes

Leg Set 2: (2) 13' 5" h x 12' w, made with 14 ounce brushed polyester inherently flame resistant fabric in the color black. This curtain will be sewn with 20% fullness.

-Leg Set 2 will be changed from 7' w to 12' w and be taken off pivots to be run manually on and offstage. It will also be moved from 10' 2" off the proscenium to 8' and provide masking for the side walls. Existing track will be used, new carriers will be added.

Midstage Curtain: (2) 14' 2" h x 25' 6" w, made with 14 ounce brushed polyester inherently flame resistant fabric in the color black. This curtain will be sewn with 50% fullness.

-Currently, Leg Set 3 exists at 17' 8" off the proscenium. I propose scrapping that Leg Set and adding a Midstage Curtain approx. 13' off the proscenium. This curtain not only can be used as a Leg Set to provide masking for the side walls, it can also be fully closed and essentially cut the stage in half for smaller performances and speakers. This curtain will be fully operable and can be open and closed from the Stage Left side.

Border 2: 3' 9" h x 50' w, made with 14 ounce brushed polyester inherently flame resistant fabric in the color black. This curtain will be sewn with 50% fullness.

-No proposed changes

Rear Curtain: (1) (Stage Right) 14' 2" h x 25' 6" w, (1) (Stage Left) 14' 2" h x 28' 6" w, made with 14 ounce brushed polyester inherently flame resistant fabric in the color black. This curtain will be sewn with 50% fullness.

-Rear Curtain stays in the same location but 3' of width will be added to the Stage Left side to provide better masking for the side wall. Omaha Stage Equipment also proposes making this curtain fully operable to allow for operation from the Stage Left side of the stage. Rear Curtain will be updated with all new hardware. (Carriers, End Pulleys, Floorblock, Rope)
