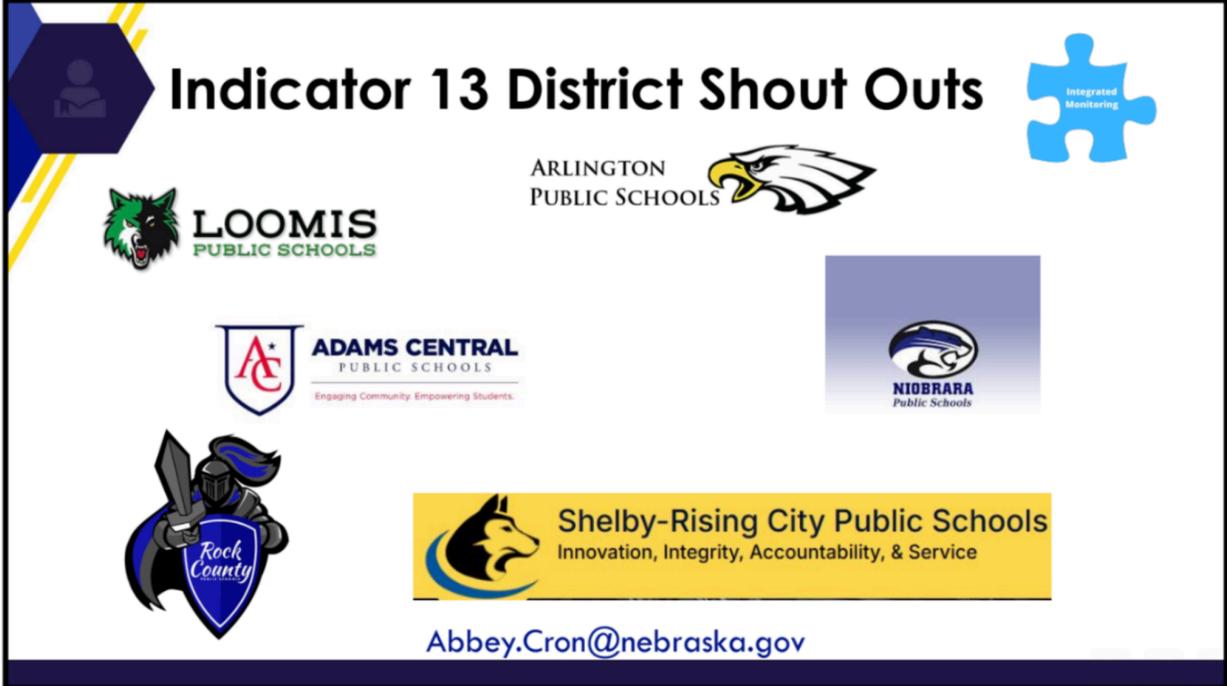

Update from NDE (10/15/25)

Nebraska Students Outscore Peer States on Act

78. Nebraska students earned the highest composite score nationally compared with states that test all their students on the ACT exam that measures college readiness in English, reading, mathematics, and science.

All Nebraska public school juniors are required to take the ACT as part of the Nebraska Student-Centered Assessment System (NSCAS). Overall Nebraska had 100 percent of public and private school graduates participate in the ACT.

Nebraska's average 2025 ACT composite score is 19.2, up one tenth of a point from 19.1 in 2024. The average composite score of the states that also test 100% of students is 18.2. The highest possible ACT score is 36. (SRC students over the past 3 years - Class of 2024 = 17.6, Class of 2025 = 17.7, Class of 2026 = 18.3, if taking into consideration "BEST" score class of 2026 increases to 18.4)

Nebraska also continues to stand out compared to states with more than 90 percent of graduates taking the ACT. The average score of those 15 states is 18.4. This is a significant comparison as states that test a high percentage of graduates tend to have lower averages as the scores include more students who are not on a college course-taking track.

The average of all students who take the ACT nationwide remained the same from last year at 19.4. Only 36 percent of students take the ACT nationally compared to the 100% of Nebraska graduates.

Nebraska students scored an average of 18.2 in English, up from 18.1 in 2024. In reading, Nebraska students scored an average of 19.6, up from 19.5 in 2024. In math, Nebraska students scored an average of 18.9, up from 18.8 in 2024. And in science Nebraska students scored an average of 19.4, the same as last year.

Next year there will be a change in the way the ACT is administered. Nationally, the science portion will be optional while Nebraska will still require science as part of our state assessment. The writing portion will remain the same, currently it is optional nationally and required for the Nebraska state assessment.

- 91. Starting in the 2nd quarter seniors will begin their WBL opportunities. I will be meeting with seniors once more to go over their placements and to find a time to check in with their WBL provider. To date I have about half of the class that has given me their proposal. I will be working with them to get paperwork etc completed and getting them started on their first 9 weeks of WBL. This is still a pilot setting in which I am finding out how best to get seniors to experience career opportunities in a controlled setting.
- 92. Mr Recker and other surrounding districts have worked hard to put together a career fair for sophomores and juniors. This career fair will be held in David City on Oct 15. More feedback will be provided upon the conclusion of the event.

Update from NDE (10/15/25)

Nebraska Students Outscore Peer States on Act

98. Nebraska students earned the highest composite score nationally compared with states that test all their students on the ACT exam that measures college readiness in English, reading, mathematics, and science.

All Nebraska public school juniors are required to take the ACT as part of the Nebraska Student-Centered Assessment System (NSCAS). Overall Nebraska had 100 percent of public and private school graduates participate in the ACT.

Nebraska's average 2025 ACT composite score is 19.2, up one tenth of a point from 19.1 in 2024. The average composite score of the states that also test 100% of students is 18.2. The highest possible ACT score is 36. (SRC students over the past 3 years - Class of 2024 = 17.6, Class of 2025 = 17.7, Class of 2026 = 18.3, if taking into consideration "BEST" score class of 2026 increases to 18.4)

Nebraska also continues to stand out compared to states with more than 90 percent of graduates taking the ACT. The average score of those 15 states is 18.4. This is a significant comparison as states that test a high percentage of graduates tend to have lower averages as the scores include more students who are not on a college course-taking track.

The average of all students who take the ACT nationwide remained the same from last year at 19.4. Only 36 percent of students take the ACT nationally compared to the 100% of Nebraska graduates.

Nebraska students scored an average of 18.2 in English, up from 18.1 in 2024. In reading, Nebraska students scored an average of 19.6, up from 19.5 in 2024. In math, Nebraska students scored an average of 18.9, up from 18.8 in 2024. And in science Nebraska students scored an average of 19.4, the same as last year.

Next year there will be a change in the way the ACT is administered. Nationally, the science portion will be optional while Nebraska will still require science as part of our state assessment. The writing portion will remain the same, currently it is optional nationally and required for the Nebraska state assessment.

New for 25-26

127. As previously mentioned we will be implementing the HUSKY acronym on the MS/HS side for the 25-26 school year. Along with this we will be utilizing the PBiS Rewards program. Students were given the opportunity during the first three days of school to reply to a prompt about what they would prefer to receive as part of the PBiS rewards program. I will be gathering that information and we will then have a store and student accounts established that will allow them to “cash in” their points to receive such awards.
128. We will be utilizing Advisory time to allow teachers to meet as MTSS cohorts appx 6 times throughout the school year (ie - once every six weeks). During this time students will be assigned to a standard advisory thereby building/expanding their advisory family.

Legislation Update:

-
- In Nebraska's 2026 legislative session, education has been a focal point, particularly regarding student discipline, literacy requirements, and teacher compensation. As this is a "short" 60-day session, the pace is quick, and several high-priority bills have already seen significant action.

-
- **Student Discipline & Behavior**

The most immediate change comes from a push to give teachers more control over classroom environments.

- **LB653 (Passed/Signed):** This bill was recently signed into law. It partially repeals a previous prohibition on suspending students in **Pre-K through 2nd grade**. While not a full repeal, it allows administrators to suspend young students who exhibit "violent behavior," aiming to improve classroom safety.
- **LB1053 (Pending):** A broader version of the above, supported by Governor Pillen, which seeks to further restore the ability of administrators to use suspensions for young students to manage disruptive behavior.

Academic Standards & Graduation

- **LB1050 (High Priority):** This bill would amend the **Nebraska Reading Improvement Act**. It proposes that 3rd-grade students who do not meet reading proficiency standards must repeat the grade. It also requires districts to create "intensive acceleration classes" to support these students.
- **LB1112:** Proposes the **Statewide Standardized Grading System Act**, which would move Nebraska toward a more uniform grading scale across all public schools.
- **LB1024:** Would require school districts to include specific instruction on the **history of communism** in their curriculum.

Funding & The "TEEOSA" Formula

School funding is always a battleground in the Unicameral, usually centered on the Tax Equity and Educational Opportunities Support Act (TEEOSA).

- **LB1038:** A major proposal to overhaul the funding formula. It aims to lower the maximum property tax levy for schools (from \$1.05 to \$0.50) while increasing "equalization aid" from the state to make up the difference.
- **LB1182:** Seeks to establish a **base salary for certified teachers** statewide and proposes a new "block grant" funding model to change how state aid is distributed.

Higher Education & Student Rights

- **LB1061 / LB870:** These competing bills address **in-state tuition**. Some versions seek to repeal the long-standing

policy allowing certain undocumented students (who grew up in Nebraska) to pay in-state rates, while others seek to protect it.

- **LB960:** This would require school boards to include **nonvoting student members** to ensure student voices are represented in local governance.
- **LB1262:** Known as the "Foreign Adversaries Out of Postsecondary Education Act," it aims to restrict influence or funding from certain foreign entities in Nebraska colleges.

Current Status: The session is scheduled to conclude on **April 17, 2026**. Many of these bills are currently in the "Select File" or "Final Reading" stages, meaning they are close to a final vote.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SALE

Interpretation, Definitions and Modifications. The following terms and conditions (“Terms and Conditions”) govern the sale of products (each, a “Product” and together the “Products”) and installation, maintenance, and other ancillary services (each, a “Service” and together the “Services”) by Digital Scoreboards, LLC, to the customer set forth in the Proposal (“Buyer”). As used herein, “Agreement” shall mean the following (including, without limitation, all documents or instruments referenced herein):

- The Proposal to which these Terms and Conditions are attached;
- Any applicable cooperative purchasing agreement through which the Buyer is purchasing the Products and Services;
- These Terms and Conditions; and
- All Change Directives and Change Orders properly executed as set forth herein.

Capitalized terms used but not otherwise defined in this Section shall have the same meaning as provided elsewhere in the Agreement.

1. Proposal. The proposal to which these Terms and Conditions is attached (the “Proposal”) shall be valid for no more than 15 days, unless otherwise stated therein. The Proposal is subject to change by Digital Scoreboards, LLC at any time upon notice to Buyer before the execution of the Agreement. The Agreement shall be valid, binding, and enforceable contract upon written acceptance or acknowledgment by an authorized representative of the Buyer (which may be via email if permitted by applicable law).

2. Change Orders. The Agreement, including but not limited to the Products and Services, may only be altered, modified, superseded, or amended by a written document (“Change Order”) that specifically references the Agreement, sets forth the change, and is signed by an authorized Digital Scoreboards, LLC representative and authorized Buyer representative. Such document shall be referred to as a “Change Order.” In the event a Change Order is signed before Digital Scoreboards, LLC ships the Product to Buyer, Digital Scoreboards, LLC will include the additional cost of the Change Order in the sales invoice. In the event a Change Order is signed after Digital Scoreboards, LLC ships the Product to Buyer, Digital Scoreboards, LLC will invoice Buyer for the additional cost of the Change Order separately.

3. Price; Payment Terms. Buyer shall purchase the Products and Services from Digital Scoreboards, LLC at the price detailed in the Agreement (the “Price”) and on the payment terms set forth in the Agreement. Any deposit under the Agreement is non-refundable. The Price does not include fees for government-required inspections, special assessments, permits (including but not limited to installation permits), prevailing wages, bonds, tariffs, taxes (including sales, use and excise taxes, and any other similar taxes, duties and charges of any kind imposed by any governmental authority on any amounts payable by Buyer), and Buyer shall be responsible for all such charges, costs and taxes; if applicable, upon Digital Scoreboards, LLC’s request, Buyer shall provide a tax exemption certificate in a form acceptable to Digital Scoreboards, LLC in advance of the delivery of the Product. In addition to all other remedies available under the Agreement (which Digital Scoreboards, LLC does not waive by the exercise of any rights hereunder), Digital Scoreboards, LLC shall be entitled to suspend the delivery of any Product or Service if Buyer fails to pay any amounts when due hereunder and such failure continues for three (3) days following written notice thereof. Buyer shall not withhold payment of any amounts due and payable by reason of any set-off of any claim or dispute with Digital Scoreboards, LLC, whether relating to Digital Scoreboards, LLC’s breach, bankruptcy, or otherwise, or arising under any other sales or service order or transaction between Digital Scoreboards, LLC and Buyer.

4. Termination. Either party may terminate this Agreement for cause should the other party materially breach its obligations hereunder and fail to remedy such breach within thirty (30) days of receipt of notice of breach. Buyer may terminate the Agreement for convenience upon thirty (30) days prior written notice. Buyer shall pay Digital Scoreboards, LLC, for all (a) materials and equipment fabricated and/or customized, (b) all design and/or professional services performed, and (c) all freight and handling charges incurred prior to receipt of notice of the termination (whether for cause or convenience).

5. Delivery, Title, and Risk of Loss. (a) For all orders in the Continental USA, the Product is sold FOB Digital Scoreboards, LLC's facility (the "Shipping Point"). Title to the Product passes to Buyer upon Digital Scoreboards, LLC's placement of the Product into the carrier's possession. Digital Scoreboards, LLC will insure the Product from risk of loss until it reaches the destination designated by Buyer (the "Destination"). Digital Scoreboards, LLC will, at its expense, put the Product in possession of a carrier at the Shipping Point and contract with the carrier for the shipment of the Product to the Destination. Buyer bears all other expenses and risks of transportation including, without limitation, loading and unloading, storage and freight. Buyer may not direct the Product to any destination other than that specified in the Agreement without the written permission of Digital Scoreboards, LLC. Delivery or shipping dates are approximate only and merely represent Digital Scoreboards, LLC's best estimate of time required to make delivery or shipment. Shipment dates are contingent on prompt receipt by Digital Scoreboards, LLC of all necessary manufacturing, shipping, and delivery information. Digital Scoreboards, LLC is not responsible for failure to meet estimated shipping dates and will not be liable for any loss, cost, damage, or expense whatsoever incurred by Buyer or its customers that may result therefrom. 6. Services. 7. Site Access. Buyer is responsible for providing Digital Scoreboards, LLC with safe access to the location where the Product will be installed or has been installed (the "Site"), either through (1) providing an "Accessible Site", which means the Product is accessible through the use of: (a) a 20 foot or shorter ladder; (b) a secure catwalk or base; and (c) a guard rail or a safety lifeline which is securely attached to the support structure if the Product display is over 6 feet off the ground, or (2) furnishing the use or bearing the cost of a bucket or broom truck and any other machinery or equipment capable of providing safe access to the Site reasonably requested by Digital Scoreboards, LLC. In the event Digital Scoreboards, LLC arrives to the Site and Buyer has failed to provide an Accessible Site or otherwise provide safe access to the Site as reasonably requested by Digital Scoreboards, LLC, then Buyer will bear the cost of Digital Scoreboards, LLC's demobilization, delay, and remobilization; Digital Scoreboards, LLC will issue Buyer a Change Order including the invoice for such additional cost(s).

8. Installation and Subsurface Access. All drawings, know-how, designs, specifications, inventions, devices, developments, processes, copyrights and other information or intellectual property disclosed or otherwise provided to Buyer by Digital Scoreboards, LLC and all rights therein (collectively, “Intellectual Property”) will remain the property of Digital Scoreboards, LLC and its licensors or suppliers and will be kept confidential by Buyer in accordance with these Terms and Conditions. Other than the limited licenses granted herein with respect to the Software (if installed), Buyer has no claim to, nor ownership interest in, any Intellectual Property, and all such Intellectual Property, in whatever form and any copies thereof, shall be promptly returned to Digital Scoreboards, LLC upon its request or, if it is subject to a limited license hereunder, upon termination of such license in accordance with these Terms and Conditions.

12. Graphics. Buyer must approve all elements of custom graphics to be affixed to the Product no later than three (3) weeks prior to the Product’s scheduled shipping date. If Buyer fails to meet this deadline, Digital Scoreboards, LLC will issue a Change Order including an invoice for the cost of the delay.

13. Security Interest. As collateral security for Buyer’s full payment to Digital Scoreboards, LLC of all amount(s) that may become due under this Agreement, Buyer hereby grants Digital Scoreboards, LLC a lien on and security interest in and to all of the right, title and interest of Buyer in, to and under the Product, wherever located, and whether now existing or hereafter arising or acquired from time to time, and in all accessions thereto and replacements or modifications thereof, as well as all proceeds (including insurance proceeds) of the foregoing until all non-recurring fees and costs have been paid. Buyer hereby irrevocably authorizes Digital Scoreboards, LLC at any time and from time to time while such security interest is in effect to file in any Uniform Commercial Code jurisdiction any initial financing statements and amendments necessary to perfect the foregoing security interest.

14. Limitation of Liability.

Under no circumstances will Digital Scoreboards, LLC be liable or responsible to Buyer for any failure or delay in fulfilling or performing any term of this Agreement when and to such extent such failure is caused or results from acts or circumstances beyond the reasonable control of Digital Scoreboards, LLC including, without limitation, fire; flood; earthquake; act of God; explosion; governmental action, war, invasion or hostilities (whether war is declared or not), or other civil unrest; national emergency; revolution; insurrection; epidemic; pandemic; lockouts; strikes or other labor disputes (whether or not relating to either party's workforce); restraints or delays affecting carriers; inability or delay in obtaining supplies of adequate or suitable materials; or telecommunication breakdown or power outage (each of the above, a "Force Majeure Event"). 20. Applicable Law, Limitations.

(a) This Agreement is being delivered in, performable in, and shall be governed, construed, enforced, and interpreted by, through and under by the laws of the state of Florida, without regard to conflict of laws principles that would cause the application of laws of another jurisdiction. For the purpose of any action or proceeding arising out of or relating to this Agreement, Buyer hereby irrevocably submits to the exclusive personal jurisdiction and venue of the Twelfth Judicial Circuit Court in and for Sarasota County, Florida, with respect to such dispute and agrees to waive any defenses to venue and jurisdiction including forum non conveniens, along with irrevocably agreeing that all claims in respect to such action or proceeding may be heard and determined exclusively in any such court. Buyer agrees that a final judgment in any action or proceeding shall be conclusive and may be enforced in other jurisdiction by suit on the judgment or in any other manner provided by applicable law. Buyer irrevocably consents to the service of the summons and complaint and any other process in any action or proceeding relating to the transactions contemplated by this Agreement, on behalf of itself or its property, by personal delivery of copies of such process to such party. Nothing in this section shall affect the right of any party to serve legal process in any other manner permitted by applicable law. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Digital Scoreboards, LLC will have the right, and in addition to all other remedies available to it at law, in equity or under this Agreement, to affirmative or negative injunctive relief from a court of competent jurisdiction in the event Buyer violates or threatens to violate the terms of Sections 10 or 11. Buyer acknowledges that a violation of Sections 10 or 11 would cause irreparable harm and that all other remedies are inadequate. Any legal action pertaining to this Agreement, other than Buyer's failure to pay any amount(s) owed to Digital Scoreboards, LLC, or any indemnification required by Buyer hereunder, must be commenced within one (1) year of the event giving rise to the legal action.

(b) When the Buyer is a Governmental Entity. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the Buyer is a governmental entity, the law of the state where Buyer is located shall apply to this Agreement, without regard to conflict of laws principles, and both parties shall comply with all applicable state law when performing the Agreement, regardless of whether such law is specifically enumerated in these Terms and Conditions. Further, if applicable law or the terms and conditions of an applicable cooperative purchasing agreement require it, venue shall be in the state or federal courts (as appropriate) of the state where the Buyer is located. Neither the one-year limitation on the initiation of legal actions stated above nor the doctrine of nullum tempus occurrit regi shall apply. All other provisions in Section 20(a) shall apply.

21. Cooperative Purchasing Agreements. The terms and conditions of the cooperative purchasing agreement being utilized by Buyer to enter into this Agreement (if any) are incorporated herein by reference as if set forth at length.

22. Order of Precedence. In the event of any inconsistency or conflict between the terms of the cooperative purchasing agreement through which Buyer is entering into the Agreement, these Terms and Conditions, and the Proposal, the terms of the cooperative purchasing agreement shall take precedence; followed by the Proposal, and then these Terms and Conditions. The terms and conditions of any purchase order shall have no effect and shall not be binding on Digital Scoreboards, LLC, unless such terms and conditions are expressly incorporated by reference into the Proposal.

23. Assignment. Buyer may not assign any of its obligations under the Agreement without the prior written consent of Digital Scoreboards, LLC. Any attempted assignment not in conformity with this Section 23 is void. Digital Scoreboards, LLC may assign its rights and obligations under this Agreement upon written notice to the Buyer (a) to any affiliate, parent, or subsidiary organization or (b) in connection with a merger, acquisition, reorganization, sale or transfer of substantially all of its assets, or other operation of law.

24. Fees. Buyer shall be liable for any and all costs and expenses (including attorney's fees) incurred by Digital Scoreboards, LLC in enforcing any provision of this Agreement, including, without limitation, any costs of collection of amounts due to Digital Scoreboards, LLC hereunder.

25. No Waiver. All remedies of either party hereunder are cumulative and may, to the extent permitted by law, be exercised concurrently or separately, and the exercise of any one remedy shall not be deemed to be an election of such remedy or to preclude the exercise of any other remedy. Any failure by a party to enforce or exercise any provision of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of that right or provision.

26. Independent Contractors. PRINCIPAL'S CONTRACT OF EMPLOYMENT SHELBY-RISING CITY PUBLIC SCHOOLS

THIS CONTRACT is made by and between the **Board of Education of Shelby-Rising City Public Schools**, legally known as **Polk County School District No. 72-0032**, and referred to as "the Board" and "the School District" respectively, and **Heather Thompson**, referred to herein as "the Principal". In accordance with its action taken and recorded in the minutes of a duly advertised board meeting, the Board agrees to employ the Principal, and the Principal agrees to accept such employment, subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein.

Section 1. Term of Contract. The Principal shall be employed for 1 year beginning on/around August 1, 2026, and expiring on/around JUNE 30, 2027. During this and any subsequent year under this contract, the Principal shall render at least **210** working days of service in the performance of her duties as Principal. References to "working days" shall mean the period from August 1st through June 30th and shall consist of all days except those on which: are scheduled school holidays and teachers and/or staff are not required to be at school; school is canceled; the Principal's illness makes attendance impossible or impracticable; the Principal's presence is not necessary to fulfill her contractual duties; or the Board otherwise excuses the Principal. The Principal agrees to work sufficient hours and days to satisfactorily complete the duties of this contract. The Principal shall keep complete and accurate records of her working days and shall provide the Superintendent with a report of her accumulated working days.

Section 2. Renewal of Contract. Unless the Superintendent recommends the nonrenewal, termination, amendment, and/or cancellation of this contract by April 15th, the contract will automatically renew for a period of **one contract year**, as defined in Section 1, from and after the expiration date provided in Section 1 of this contract.

Section 3. Salary. The Principal's salary for the contract year shall be **\$118,496** (includes \$7,752) for *SPED Director Duties- 7% of 2026-27 Principal Base Salary of \$110,744*) which shall be paid in 12 equal monthly installments beginning in the month of August. The Board shall not reduce the Principal's salary during the term of the contract, but may increase it and/or the benefits during the term of this contract, as an amendment to the contract, without the amendment constituting a new contract, requiring a hearing, or extending the term of this contract.

Section 4. Deductions. This contract shall conform to the statutes and regulations governing deductions from compensation. The Principal

authorizes the District to deduct or withhold from each and every period of pay any amounts necessary to offset any damages caused by the Principal or the value of property or money entrusted to the Principal or owed by the Principal to the District during the course of or as a result of the Principal's employment, if such property or money have not properly been returned to the District. The school district shall withhold other deductions as the Principal and Board may agree.

Section 5. Professional Status. The Principal affirms that she is not under contract with any other board of education covering any part or all of the term provided in this contract. Throughout the contract term, she will hold a valid and appropriate certificate to act as a principal in the State of Nebraska which she will register and maintain on file in the school district's central administrative office. This contract shall not be valid and the Board will not compensate the Principal for any service performed prior to the date that she registers her certificate.

Section 6. Principal's Duties. The Principal's duties shall be as prescribed by statute and by Board policies, rules, regulations and directives. The Principal agrees to devote her time, skill, labor and attention to her duties throughout the contract term. She shall be subject to the direction and control of the Superintendent at all times and shall perform such administrative duties as the Superintendent or Board assigns to her. By agreement with the Superintendent, she may undertake consultative work, speaking engagements, writing, lecturing, or other professional duties and obligations as long as they do not interfere with carrying out her duties and obligations to the school district. The Board of Education recognizes the building principal as the chief educational leader in her building. The Principal will be responsible for the organization and administration of the building, all phases of the instructional program, and the direction of personnel and school management. These are to be in harmony with the standards and goals for the schools and the District as directed by and in cooperation with the Superintendent of Schools.

Section 7. Nonrenewal, Termination, Cancellation or Mid-Term Amendment. Nonrenewal, termination, cancellation, or amendment of this contract shall be in accordance with state statutes. During any applicable probationary period, the Board may non-renew or amend this contract for any reason so long as it is not unconstitutional. At all other times, the Board may terminate, cancel or amend this contract for any of the following reasons: (a) the cancellation, termination, revocation, or suspension of the Principal's certificate (Nebraska Administrative and Supervisory Certificate, or the Nebraska Professional Administrative and Supervisory Certificate) by the State Board of Education; (b) any of the reasons set forth in this contract; (c) the

breach of any of the material provisions of this contract; (d) incompetence; (e) neglect of duty; (f) unprofessional conduct; (g) insubordination; (h) conduct involving moral turpitude; (i) physical or mental incapacity; (j) immorality; (k) conviction of a felony; (l) any conduct that substantially interferes with the Principal's continued performance of her duties; (m) any arrest, criminal charge, or criminal conviction of Principal or the failure to report the same; (n) any filing against the Principal under Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 43-247 or any other provision of the Nebraska Juvenile Code for child abuse and/or neglect or the failure to report the same; (o) knowingly falsifying school district records or documents; (p) misrepresentation of fact to the district and its personnel in the conduct of the district's official business; (q) the use or possession of illegal drugs or controlled substances except as prescribed by a physician; or (r) being under the influence of illegal drugs, controlled substances, or alcohol while on school grounds, at school events, or in a vehicle owned, leased or contracted by the district except as prescribed by a physician.

Section 8. Disability. If the Principal is in her first year of employment with the District and does not have her domicile and principal place of residence within the District at the time of her employment, the Principal shall move her domicile and principal place of residence into the corporate limits of the District before the expiration of the first six months from the Principal's first duty day under this contract. It is the purpose of this paragraph to require the Principal to, at all times during such employment, live and maintain her domicile and principal place of residence in the District to encourage the Principal: (1) to be highly motivated and deeply committed to the District's educational system; (2) to speak to and vote on ballot issues affecting the district as a legal voter of the school district; (3) to be involved in school and community activities bringing her in contact with parents and community leaders and be committed to the future of the district and its schools; (4) to be accessible to parents and students, and allow parents and students to become personally acquainted with the Principal; and, (5) to gain sympathy and understanding for the cultural basis of the community, and the social, economic, and environmental problems of the children of the school community and are thus less likely to be considered isolated from the community in which she is the educational leader.

contract unless it is accepted by the Board, and the Board shall fix the date at which the resignation shall take effect.

Upon lawful termination of this contract for any reason, the compensation to be paid hereunder shall be an amount which bears the same ratio to the annual salary specified as the number of months or fraction thereof to the date of such termination bears to the 12 months in the annual salary period in which termination occurs. The Principal shall refund any portion of the salary she was paid but had not earned prior to the date of termination of this contract.

The Principal agrees that time spent working in conjunction with the Superintendent on school-related matters may be counted toward observation for a full instructional period.

Section 15. Legal Actions. The Board will support the Principal if there is a legal dispute caused by her carrying out her duties properly. If a legal action, including a professional practice complaint, is threatened or filed against the Principal as a result of her performance of her duties or her position as Principal of the district, the Board will provide her with a legal defense to the maximum extent permitted by law so long as she acted in good faith and in a manner which she reasonably believes to be in or not opposed to the best interests of the district and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe that her conduct was unlawful.

Section 16. Physical or Mental Examination. The Principal agrees that, at the request of the Board or Superintendent, she will have a comprehensive physical and/or mental examination performed by one or more licensed physicians or psychologists of the Board's choosing during the term of this Contract. AGREEMENT

CONTRACTED LEVEL I, II, AND III SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this **27th** day of **February** by and between Educational Service Unit 7 of the State of Nebraska, hereinafter called “Servicing Agency” and **Shelby Rising City** hereinafter called “District.”

WITNESSETH:WITSSETH:

1. That the Servicing Agency does hereby agree that it will furnish to the District the following described Special Education services which meet the requirements of the State Department of Education. All rates are subject to the approval of the State Department of Education, and will be provided to the district prior to the district’s budget preparation.
2. That the Servicing Agency does hereby agree it will furnish to the District the following described special education services as follows:
3. Services shall be provided only to children who qualify for such services as specified in State Department of Education, Special Education Rules and Regulations (Rule 51).
4. The Servicing Agency shall supply recorded information on each child for whom services are contracted. The Servicing Agency agrees that it will confer with the School District personnel for purposes of evaluating each child’s progress.
5. The placing of a child in said program shall be made by joint decision of the Servicing Agency, the District, parents and/or guardians, and other members of the IEP team.
6. The Servicing Agency agrees to perform the services and the District agrees to pay in accordance with the Servicing Agency rate schedule as approved by the Nebraska State Board of Education. This schedule shall be in full force and effect during the school year of 2026-2027 commencing no earlier than August 1, 2026 and ending no later than July 31, 2027 .
7. The Servicing Agency retains the right to designate personnel to provide services. All personnel provided by the Servicing Agency shall be endorsed to provide their respective services.
8. Policies regarding sick leave, personal leave, and professional leave shall be determined by the negotiated agreement with the Servicing Agency for personnel providing services to the District.
9. In the event that school district’s programming requirements and needs change at any time subsequent to and during the term of this agreement, the costs to the school established by this agreement, shall in mutual agreement between ESU 7 and the school district be adjusted and prorated and the parties may agree. Nothing in this paragraph, however, shall be construed to entitle the school district to abrogate this contract or declare it void. The district shall be obligated to pay all sums specified by this contract as due and owing the ESU 7 regardless of changes in circumstances within the district during the course of this contract. The ESU 7 shall, however, be obligated to meet with the school district and discuss in good faith alternatives to mitigating expense, reallocating staff, and other resources within the bounds of the law and as the ESU 7 may

in its sole discretion determine to be in the best interest of ESU 7 and the school district. Any and all changes or expenses incurred by ESU 7 in the course of performing its obligations pursuant to this agreement, or in preparing to do so, shall become due and payable by school district to ESU 7 upon billing in a manner consistent with the billing provision of this agreement.

10. If, for any reason the District does not pay as agreed, the Servicing Agency may cancel this contract and forthwith, without notice, refuse further services, without notice, to said district, but the District shall not be relieved from paying for services rendered by the Servicing Agency to the said District to date of termination of service. The District hereby expressly agrees, acknowledges and affirms that its refusal to pay for services rendered will result in the Servicing Agency refusal to render services in the future and that, by refusing to pay, the District does not and will not expect the Servicing Agency to provide services of any kind to the District until payment has been made in full.

11. The School District agrees that its payments will be made upon receipt of billing from the Servicing Agency. If the District refuses to make payment within sixty(60) days upon its receipt of billing, the outstanding amounts owed shall accrue in interest of the 1.25% per month or the maximum permitted by law, whichever is less, plus the expenses of collection.

12. It is understood and agreed, that in the event of any reason this contract does not comply with the State's requirement, it will be changed in accordance therewith, upon written notice by the Servicing Agency to the District and advising the District of the required changes to meet State requirements.

13. It is agreed this contract between the Servicing Agency and district must be signed by the District Board or Representative and returned to the Servicing Agency by **March 31, 2026**. The Servicing Agency's Board will then sign and return a copy of the contract to the District.

This agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their successors. The persons executing this Agreement on behalf of the respective parties specifically acknowledge and represent that they have value authority to bind the party to whose benefit this Agreement had been executed.

AGREEMENT

CONTRACTED LEVEL I, II, AND III SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this *5th* day of *March* by and between Educational Service Unit 7 of the State of Nebraska, hereinafter called "Servicing Agency" and **Shelby Rising City** hereinafter called "District."

WITNESSETH:WITSSETH:

1. That the Serving Agency does hereby agree that it will furnish to the District the following described Special Education services which meet the requirements of the State Department of Education. All rates are subject to the approval of the State Department of Education, and will be provided to the district prior to the district's budget preparation.
2. That the Serving Agency does hereby agree it will furnish to the District the following described special education services as follows:
3. Services shall be provided only to children who qualify for such services as specified in State Department of Education, Special Education Rules and Regulations (Rule 51).
4. The Servicing Agency shall supply recorded information on each child for whom services are contracted. The Servicing Agency agrees that it will confer with the School District personnel for purposes of evaluating each child's progress.
5. The placing of a child in said program shall be made by joint decision of the Servicing Agency, the District, parents and/or guardians, and other members of the IEP team.
6. The Servicing Agency agrees to perform the services and the District agrees to pay in accordance with the Servicing Agency rate schedule as approved by the Nebraska State Board of Education. This schedule shall be in full force and effect during the school year of 25-26 commencing no earlier than August 1, 2025 and ending no later than July 31, 2026 .
7. The Servicing Agency retains the right to designate personnel to provide services. All personnel provided by the Servicing Agency shall be endorsed to provide their respective services.
8. Policies regarding sick leave, personal leave, and professional leave shall be determined by the negotiated agreement with the Servicing Agency for personnel providing services to the District.
9. In the event that school district's programming requirements and needs change at any time subsequent to and during the term of this agreement, the costs to the school established by this agreement, shall in mutual agreement between ESU 7 and the school district be adjusted and prorated and the parties may agree. Nothing in this paragraph, however, shall be construed to entitle the school district to abrogate this contract or declare it void. The district shall be obligated to pay all sums specified by this contract as due and owing the ESU 7 regardless of changes in circumstances within the district during the course of this contract. The ESU 7 shall, however, be obligated to meet with the school district and discuss in good faith alternatives to mitigating expense, reallocating staff, and other resources within the bounds of the law and as the ESU 7 may

in its sole discretion determine to be in the best interest of ESU 7 and the school district. Any and all changes or expenses incurred by ESU 7 in the course of performing its obligations pursuant to this agreement, or in preparing to do so, shall become due and payable by school district to ESU 7 upon billing in a manner consistent with the billing provision of this agreement.

10. If, for any reason the District does not pay as agreed, the Servicing Agency may cancel this contract and forthwith, without notice, refuse further services, without notice, to said district, but the District shall not be relieved from paying for services rendered by the Servicing Agency to the said District to date of termination of service. The District hereby expressly agrees, acknowledges and affirms that its refusal to pay for services rendered will result in the Servicing Agency refusal to render services in the future and that, by refusing to pay, the District does not and will not expect the Servicing Agency to provide services of any kind to the District until payment has been made in full.

11. The School District agrees that its payments will be made upon receipt of billing from the Servicing Agency. If the District refuses to make payment within sixty(60) days upon its receipt of billing, the outstanding amounts owed shall accrue in interest of the 1.25% per month or the maximum permitted by law, whichever is less, plus the expenses of collection.

12. It is understood and agreed, that in the event of any reason this contract does not comply with the State's requirement, it will be changed in accordance therewith, upon written notice by the Servicing Agency to the District and advising the District of the required changes to meet State requirements.

13. It is agreed this contract between the Servicing Agency and district must be signed by the District Board or Representative and returned to the Servicing Agency by **March 31, 2025**. The Servicing Agency's Board will then sign and return a copy of the contract to the District.

This agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their successors. The persons executing this Agreement on behalf of the respective parties specifically acknowledge and represent that they have value authority to bind the party to whose benefit this Agreement had been executed.
