Gross has decided to hire a long term sub from August to December and offer the contract to Haley Zabel.

The District has recently been working to acquire the property with the financial help from the Tekamah Area Foundation. The Board engaged in the discussion pointing out the opportunity and flexibility this would give our campus. Marissa Langley presented the Board with a plan to provide an After School Program. She is asking if she could use school facilities to conduct the Program. The Board questioned space needed for the program, hours of operation, and services provided. The Board discussed with Marissa a possibility of sending out a survey to elementary children's parents to see what needs are out there.

3. Discuss the purchase of a new drivers education vehicle.

Mr. Gross informed the Board a new driver's ed vehicle will need to be purchased before the end of the school year. The current Ford Taurus is not reliable enough for the class. The Board asked Gross to gather quotes.

4. Discuss public WiFi

Mr. Gross presented the Board with a quote to provide public wi-fi in the school gymnasium. The Board will vote on the option at the regular meeting in May.

5. Discuss the Tiger Trail Loop

The Board discussed the Tiger Loop Trail path. Board President and Gross attended a meeting at the City office explaining the trail and how the District will not be responsible for any of the costs constructing it. There will be more information on this available once the project gets underway.

Schmader Electric will be replacing the light pole that was damaged.
