**1. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE WITH OPEN MEETINGS ACT AND ROLL CALL**

#### **...4-1407. Act, how cited.**

Sections 84-1407 to 84-1414 shall be known and may be cited as the Open Meetings Act.

#### **84-1408. Declaration of intent; meetings open to public.**

It is hereby declared to be the policy of this state that the formation of public policy is public business and may not be conducted in secret.

Every meeting of a public body shall be open to the public in order that citizens may exercise their democratic privilege of attending and speaking at meetings of public bodies, except as otherwise provided by the Constitution of Nebraska, federal statutes, and the Open Meetings Act.

## **Annotations**

- Nebraska's public meetings laws do not apply to school board deliberations pertaining solely to disputed adjudicative facts. *McQuinn v. Douglas Cty. Sch. Dist. No. 66*, 259 Neb. 720, 612 N.W.2d 198 (2000).
- The primary purpose of the public meetings law is to ensure that public policy is formulated at open meetings. *Marks v. Judicial Nominating Comm.*, 236 Neb. 429, 461 N.W.2d 551 (1990).
- The public meetings law is broadly interpreted and liberally construed to obtain the objective of openness in favor of the public, and provisions permitting closed sessions must be narrowly and strictly construed. *Grein v. Board of Education of Fremont*, 216 Neb. 158, 343 N.W.2d 718 (1984).
- Although a committee was a subcommittee of a natural resources district board, it was not subject to the Open Meetings Act because there was never a quorum of board members in attendance and the committee did not hold hearings, make policy, or take formal action on behalf of the board. *Koch v. Lower Loup NRD*, 27 Neb. App. 301, 931 N.W.2d 160 (2019).
- A county board of equalization is a public body whose meetings shall be open to the public. *Wolf v. Grubbs*, 17 Neb. App. 292, 759 N.W.2d 499 (2009).

#### **84-1409. Terms, defined.**

For purposes of the Open Meetings Act, unless the context otherwise requires:

(1)(a) Public body means (i) governing bodies of all political subdivisions of the State of Nebraska, (ii) governing bodies of all agencies, created by the Constitution of Nebraska, statute, or otherwise pursuant to law, of the executive department of the State of Nebraska, (iii) all independent boards, commissions, bureaus, committees, councils, subunits, or any other bodies created by the Constitution of Nebraska, statute, or otherwise pursuant to law, (iv) all study or advisory committees of the executive department of the State of Nebraska whether having continuing existence or appointed as special committees with limited existence, (v) advisory committees of the bodies referred to in subdivisions (i), (ii), and (iii) of this subdivision, and (vi) instrumentalities exercising essentially public functions; and

(b) Public body does not include (i) subcommittees of such bodies unless a quorum of the public body attends a subcommittee meeting or unless such subcommittees are holding hearings, making policy, or taking formal action on behalf of their parent body, except that all meetings of any subcommittee established under section 81-15,175 are subject to the Open Meetings Act, (ii) entities conducting judicial proceedings unless a court or other judicial body is exercising rulemaking authority, deliberating, or deciding upon the issuance of administrative orders, and (iii) the Judicial Resources Commission or subcommittees or subgroups of the commission;

(2) Meeting means all regular, special, or called meetings, formal or informal, of any public body for the purposes of briefing, discussion of public business, formation of tentative policy, or the taking of any action of the public body; and

(3) Virtual conferencing means conducting or participating in a meeting electronically or telephonically with interaction among the participants subject to subsection (2) of section 84-1412.

## Annotations

- A township is a political subdivision, and as such, a township board is subject to the provisions of the public meetings laws. *Steenblock v. Elkhorn Township Bd.*, 245 Neb. 722, 515 N.W.2d 128 (1994).
- A county agricultural society is a public body to which the provisions of the Nebraska public meetings law are applicable. *Nixon v. Madison Co. Ag. Soc'y*, 217 Neb. 37, 348 N.W.2d 119 (1984).
- Failure by a public governing body, as defined under section 84-1409, R.R.S.1943, to take and record a roll call vote on an action, as required by section 84-1413(2), R.S.Supp.,1980, grants any citizen the right to sue for the purpose of having the action declared void. In this case such failure could not be later corrected by a nunc pro tunc order because there was no showing that a roll call vote on the disputed action was actually taken, and even if it was the record showed it was not recorded until over a year later. Sections 23-1301, R.R.S.1943, and 23-1302, R.R.S.1943, make it the duty of the county clerk to record proceedings of the board of county commissioners. *State ex rel. Schuler v. Dunbar*, 208 Neb. 69, 302 N.W.2d 674 (1981).
- Although a committee was a subcommittee of a natural resources district board, it was not subject to the Open Meetings Act because there was never a quorum of board members in attendance and the committee did not hold hearings, make policy, or take formal action on behalf of the board. *Koch v. Lower Loup NRD*, 27 Neb. App. 301, 931 N.W.2d 160 (2019).
- Although the Open Meetings Act does not define "subcommittee," a subcommittee is generally defined as a group within a committee to which the committee may refer business. *Koch v. Lower Loup NRD*, 27 Neb. App. 301, 931 N.W.2d 160 (2019).
- The Open Meetings Act does not require policymakers to remain ignorant of the issues they must decide until the moment the public is invited to comment on a proposed policy. By excluding nonquorum subgroups from the definition of a public body, the Legislature

has balanced the public's need to be heard on matters of public policy with a practical accommodation for a public body's need for information to conduct business. *Koch v. Lower Loup NRD*, 27 Neb. App. 301, 931 N.W.2d 160 (2019).

- As an administrative agency of the county, a county board of equalization is a public body. *Wolf v. Grubbs*, 17 Neb. App. 292, 759 N.W.2d 499 (2009).
- The electors of a township at their annual meeting are a public body under the Open Meetings Act. *State ex rel. Newman v. Columbus Township Bd.*, 15 Neb. App. 656, 735 N.W.2d 399 (2007).
- The meeting at issue in this case was a "meeting" within the parameters of subsection (2) of this section because it involved the discussion of public business, the formation of tentative policy, or the taking of any action of the public power district. *Hansmeyer v. Nebraska Pub. Power Dist.*, 6 Neb. App. 889, 578 N.W.2d 476 (1998).
- Informational sessions in which the governmental body hears reports are briefings. *Johnson v. Nebraska Environmental Control Council*, 2 Neb. App. 263, 509 N.W.2d 21 (1993).

**84-1410. Closed session; when; purpose; reasons listed; procedure; right to challenge; prohibited acts; chance meetings, conventions, or workshops.**

(1) Any public body may hold a closed session by the affirmative vote of a majority of its voting members if a closed session is clearly necessary for the protection of the public interest or for the prevention of needless injury to the reputation of an individual and if such individual has not requested a public meeting. The subject matter and the reason necessitating the closed session shall be identified in the motion to close. Closed sessions may be held for, but shall not be limited to, such reasons as:

(a) Strategy sessions with respect to collective bargaining, real estate purchases, pending litigation, or litigation which is imminent as evidenced by communication of a claim or threat of litigation to or by the public body;

(b) Discussion regarding deployment of security personnel or devices;

(c) Investigative proceedings regarding allegations of criminal misconduct;

(d) Evaluation of the job performance of a person when necessary to prevent needless injury to the reputation of a person and if such person has not requested a public meeting;

(e) For the Community Trust created under section 81-1801.02, discussion regarding the amounts to be paid to individuals who have suffered from a tragedy of violence or natural disaster; or

(f) For public hospitals, governing board peer review activities, professional review activities, review and discussion of medical staff investigations or disciplinary actions, and any strategy session concerning transactional negotiations with any referral source that is required by federal law to be conducted at arms length.

Nothing in this section shall permit a closed meeting for discussion of the appointment or election of a new member to any public body.

(2) The vote to hold a closed session shall be taken in open session. The entire motion, the vote of each member on the question of holding a closed session, and the time when the closed session commenced and concluded shall be recorded in the minutes. If the motion to close

passes, then the presiding officer immediately prior to the closed session shall restate on the record the limitation of the subject matter of the closed session. The public body holding such a closed session shall restrict its consideration of matters during the closed portions to only those purposes set forth in the motion to close as the reason for the closed session. The meeting shall be reconvened in open session before any formal action may be taken. For purposes of this section, formal action shall mean a collective decision or a collective commitment or promise to make a decision on any question, motion, proposal, resolution, order, or ordinance or formation of a position or policy but shall not include negotiating guidance given by members of the public body to legal counsel or other negotiators in closed sessions authorized under subdivision (1)(a) of this section.

(3) Any member of any public body shall have the right to challenge the continuation of a closed session if the member determines that the session has exceeded the reason stated in the original motion to hold a closed session or if the member contends that the closed session is neither clearly necessary for (a) the protection of the public interest or (b) the prevention of needless injury to the reputation of an individual. Such challenge shall be overruled only by a majority vote of the members of the public body. Such challenge and its disposition shall be recorded in the minutes.

(4) Nothing in this section shall be construed to require that any meeting be closed to the public. No person or public body shall fail to invite a portion of its members to a meeting, and no public body shall designate itself a subcommittee of the whole body for the purpose of circumventing the Open Meetings Act. No closed session, informal meeting, chance meeting, social gathering, email, fax, or other electronic communication shall be used for the purpose of circumventing the requirements of the act.

(5) The act does not apply to chance meetings or to attendance at or travel to conventions or workshops of members of a public body at which there is no meeting of the body then intentionally convened, if there is no vote or other action taken regarding any matter over which the public body has supervision, control, jurisdiction, or advisory power.

## Annotations

- There is no absolute discovery privilege for communications that occur during a closed session. *State ex rel. Upper Republican NRD v. District Judges*, 273 Neb. 148, 728 N.W.2d 275 (2007).
- If a person present at a meeting observes a public meetings law violation in the form of an improper closed session and fails to object, that person waives his or her right to object at a later date. *Wasikowski v. Nebraska Quality Jobs Bd.*, 264 Neb. 403, 648 N.W.2d 756 (2002).
- The public interest mentioned in this section is that shared by citizens in general and by the community at large concerning pecuniary or legal rights and liabilities. *Grein v. Board of Education*, 216 Neb. 158, 343 N.W.2d 718 (1984).
- Hearing in closed executive session was contrary to this section since there was no showing of necessity or reason under subdivision (1)(a), (b), or (c), but did not result in reversal of board decision. *Simonds v. Board of Examiners*, 213 Neb. 259, 329 N.W.2d 92

(1983).

- Negotiations for the purchase of land need not be conducted at an open meeting but the deliberations of a city council as to whether an offer to purchase real estate should be made should take place in an open meeting. *Pokorny v. City of Schuyler*, 202 Neb. 334, 275 N.W.2d 281 (1979).
- Public meeting law was not violated where the Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska voted to hold a closed session to consider the university president's resignation, and also discussed the appointment of an interim president during such session. *Meyer v. Board of Regents*, 1 Neb. App. 893, 510 N.W.2d 450 (1993).

**84-1411. Meetings of public body; notice; method; contents; when available; right to modify; duties concerning notice; virtual conferencing authorized; requirements; emergency meeting without notice; appearance before public body; applicability of section.**

(1)(a) Except as provided in subsection (9) of this section, each public body shall give reasonable advance publicized notice of the time and place of each meeting as provided in this subsection. Such notice shall be transmitted to all members of the public body and to the public.

(b)(i) Except as provided in subdivision (1)(b)(ii) of this section, in the case of a public body described in subdivision (1)(a)(i) of section 84-1409 or such body's advisory committees, such notice shall be given by:

(A)(I) Publication in a newspaper of general circulation within the public body's jurisdiction that is finalized for printing prior to the time and date of the meeting, (II) posting on such newspaper's website, if available, and (III) posting on a statewide website, if available, established and maintained as a repository for such notices by a majority of Nebraska newspapers. Such notice shall be placed in the newspaper and on the websites by the newspaper; or

(B)(I) Posting to the newspaper's website, if available, and (II) posting to a statewide website, if available, established and maintained as a repository for such notices by a majority of Nebraska newspapers if no edition of a newspaper of general circulation within the public body's jurisdiction is to be finalized for printing prior to the time and date of the meeting. Such notice shall be placed in the newspaper and on the websites by the newspaper.

(ii) In the case of the governing body of a city of the second class or village, any advisory committee of such governing body, or the governing body of a rural or suburban fire protection district, such notice shall be given by:

(A)(I) Publication in a newspaper of general circulation within the public body's jurisdiction that is finalized for printing prior to the time and date of the meeting, (II) posting on such newspaper's website, if available, and (III) posting on a statewide website, if available, established and maintained as a repository for such notices by a majority of Nebraska newspapers. Such notice shall be placed in the newspaper and on the websites by the newspaper;

(B)(I) Posting to the newspaper's website, if available, and (II) posting on a statewide website, if available, established and maintained as a repository for such notices by a majority of Nebraska newspapers if no edition of a newspaper of general circulation within the public body's jurisdiction is to be finalized for printing prior to the time and date of the meeting. Such notice shall be placed in the newspaper and on the websites by the newspaper; or

(C) Posting written notice in three conspicuous public places in such city, village, or district.

Such notice shall be posted by the public body in the same three places for each meeting.

(iii) In the case of a public body not described in subdivision (1)(b)(i) or (ii) of this section, such notice shall be given by a method designated by the public body.

(iv) In case of refusal, neglect, or inability of the newspaper to publish the notice, the public body shall (A) post such notice on its website, if available, (B) request the newspaper submit a post on a statewide website, if available, established and maintained as a repository for such notices by a majority of Nebraska newspapers, and (C) post such notice in a conspicuous public place in such public body's jurisdiction. The public body shall keep a written record of such posting pursuant to subdivision (1)(b)(iv)(A) and (C) of this section and a written record of the request to the newspaper pursuant to subdivision (1)(b)(iv)(B) of this section. The record of such posting shall be evidence that such posting was done as required and shall be sufficient to fulfill the requirement of publication.

(c) In addition to a method of notice required by subdivision (1)(b)(i) or (ii) of this section, such notice may also be provided by any other appropriate method designated by such public body or such advisory committee.

(d) Each public body shall record the methods and dates of such notice in its minutes.

(e) Such notice shall contain an agenda of subjects known at the time of the publicized notice or a statement that the agenda, which shall be kept continually current, shall be readily available for public inspection at the principal office of the public body during normal business hours. Agenda items shall be sufficiently descriptive to give the public reasonable notice of the matters to be considered at the meeting. Except for items of an emergency nature, the agenda shall not be altered later than (i) twenty-four hours before the scheduled commencement of the meeting or (ii) forty-eight hours before the scheduled commencement of a meeting of a city council or village board scheduled outside the corporate limits of the municipality. The public body shall have the right to modify the agenda to include items of an emergency nature only at such public meeting.

(2)(a) The following entities may hold a meeting by means of virtual conferencing if the requirements of subdivision (2)(b) of this section are met:

(i) A state agency, state board, state commission, state council, or state committee, or an advisory committee of any such state entity;

(ii) An organization, including the governing body, created under the Interlocal Cooperation Act, the Joint Public Agency Act, or the Municipal Cooperative Financing Act;

(iii) The governing body of a public power district having a chartered territory of more than one county in this state;

(iv) The governing body of a public power and irrigation district having a chartered territory of more than one county in this state;

(v) An educational service unit;

(vi) The Educational Service Unit Coordinating Council;

(vii) An organization, including the governing body, of a risk management pool or its advisory committees organized in accordance with the Intergovernmental Risk Management Act;

- (viii) A community college board of governors;
- (ix) The Nebraska Brand Committee;
- (x) A local public health department;
- (xi) A metropolitan utilities district;
- (xii) A regional metropolitan transit authority; and
- (xiii) A natural resources district.

(b) The requirements for holding a meeting by means of virtual conferencing are as follows:

(i) Reasonable advance publicized notice is given as provided in subsection (1) of this section, including providing access to a dial-in number or link to the virtual conference;

(ii) In addition to the public's right to participate by virtual conferencing, reasonable arrangements are made to accommodate the public's right to attend at a physical site and participate as provided in section 84-1412, including reasonable seating, in at least one designated site in a building open to the public and identified in the notice, with: At least one member of the entity holding such meeting, or his or her designee, present at each site; a recording of the hearing by audio or visual recording devices; and a reasonable opportunity for input, such as public comment or questions, is provided to at least the same extent as would be provided if virtual conferencing was not used;

(iii) At least one copy of all documents being considered at the meeting is available at any physical site open to the public where individuals may attend the virtual conference. The public body shall also provide links to an electronic copy of the agenda, all documents being considered at the meeting, and the current version of the Open Meetings Act; and

(iv) Except as otherwise provided in this subdivision, subsection (1) of section 70-1014, subsection (2) of section 70-1014.02, or subsection (4) of section 79-2204, no more than one-half of the meetings of the state entities, advisory committees, boards, councils, organizations, or governing bodies are held by virtual conferencing in a calendar year. In the case of (A) an organization created under the Interlocal Cooperation Act that sells electricity or natural gas, (B) an organization created under the Municipal Cooperative Financing Act, (C) a governing body of a risk management pool and any advisory committee of such governing body, or (D) any advisory committee of any state entity created in response to the Opioid Prevention and Treatment Act, such organization, governing body, or committee may hold more than one-half of its meetings by virtual conferencing if such organization holds at least one meeting each calendar year that is not by virtual conferencing.

(3) Virtual conferencing, emails, faxes, or other electronic communication shall not be used to circumvent any of the public government purposes established in the Open Meetings Act.

(4) The secretary or other designee of each public body shall maintain a list of the news media requesting notification of meetings and shall make reasonable efforts to provide advance notification to them of the time and place of each meeting and the subjects to be discussed at that meeting.

(5) When it is necessary to hold an emergency meeting without reasonable advance public notice, the nature of the emergency shall be stated in the minutes and any formal action taken in

such meeting shall pertain only to the emergency. Such emergency meetings may be held by virtual conferencing. The provisions of subsection (4) of this section shall be complied with in conducting emergency meetings. Complete minutes of such emergency meetings specifying the nature of the emergency and any formal action taken at the meeting shall be made available to the public by no later than the end of the next regular business day.

(6) A public body may allow a member of the public or any other witness to appear before the public body by means of virtual conferencing.

(7)(a) Notwithstanding subsections (2) and (5) of this section, if an emergency is declared by the Governor pursuant to the Emergency Management Act as defined in section 81-829.39, a public body the territorial jurisdiction of which is included in the emergency declaration, in whole or in part, may hold a meeting by virtual conferencing during such emergency if the public body gives reasonable advance publicized notice as described in subsection (1) of this section. The notice shall include information regarding access for the public and news media. In addition to any formal action taken pertaining to the emergency, the public body may hold such meeting for the purpose of briefing, discussion of public business, formation of tentative policy, or the taking of any action by the public body.

(b) The public body shall provide access by providing a dial-in number or a link to the virtual conference. The public body shall also provide links to an electronic copy of the agenda, all documents being considered at the meeting, and the current version of the Open Meetings Act. Reasonable arrangements shall be made to accommodate the public's right to hear and speak at the meeting and record the meeting. Subsection (4) of this section shall be complied with in conducting such meetings.

(c) The nature of the emergency shall be stated in the minutes. Complete minutes of such meeting specifying the nature of the emergency and any formal action taken at the meeting shall be made available for inspection as provided in subsection (5) of section 84-1413.

(8) In addition to any other statutory authorization for virtual conferencing, any public body not listed in subdivision (2)(a) of this section may hold a meeting by virtual conferencing if:

(a) The purpose of the virtual meeting is to discuss items that are scheduled to be discussed or acted upon at a subsequent non-virtual open meeting of the public body;

(b) No action is taken by the public body at the virtual meeting; and

(c) The public body complies with subdivisions (2)(b)(i) and (ii) of this section.

(9) This section does not apply to a meeting of the Nebraska Power Review Board or a public power district, a public power and irrigation district, an electric membership association, an electric cooperative company, a municipality having a generation and distribution system, or a registered group of municipalities if such meeting is subject to section 70-1034.

## Annotations

- Under subsection (1) of this section, the Legislature has imposed only two conditions on the public body's notification method of a public meeting: (1) It must give reasonable advance publicized notice of the time and place of each meeting and (2) it must be recorded in the public body's minutes. *City of Elkhorn v. City of Omaha*, 272 Neb. 867, 725 N.W.2d 792 (2007).
- An emergency is "(a)ny event or occasional combination of circumstances which calls for immediate action or remedy; pressing necessity; exigency; a sudden or unexpected happening; an unforeseen occurrence or condition." *Steenblock v. Elkhorn Township Bd.*, 245 Neb. 722, 515 N.W.2d 128 (1994).
- An agenda which gives reasonable notice of the matters to be considered at a meeting of a city council complies with the requirements of this section. *Pokorny v. City of Schuyler*, 202 Neb. 334, 275 N.W.2d 281 (1979).
- When notice is required, a notice of a special meeting of a city council posted in three public places at 10:00 p.m. on the day preceding the meeting is not reasonable advance publicized notice of a meeting as is required by this section. *Pokorny v. City of Schuyler*, 202 Neb. 334, 275 N.W.2d 281 (1979).
- Teacher waived right to object to lack of public notice in board of education employment hearing by voluntary participation in the hearing without objection. *Alexander v. School Dist. No. 17*, 197 Neb. 251, 248 N.W.2d 335 (1976).
- A county board of commissioners and a county board of equalization are not required to give separate notices when the notice states only the time and place that the boards meet and directs a citizen to where the agendas for each board can be found. *Wolf v. Grubbs*, 17 Neb. App. 292, 759 N.W.2d 499 (2009).
- A county board of equalization is a public body which is required to give advanced publicized notice of its meetings. *Wolf v. Grubbs*, 17 Neb. App. 292, 759 N.W.2d 499 (2009).
- Notice of recessed and reconvened meetings must be given in the same fashion as the original meeting. *Wolf v. Grubbs*, 17 Neb. App. 292, 759 N.W.2d 499 (2009).
- True notice of a meeting is not given by burying such in the minutes of a prior board proceeding. *Wolf v. Grubbs*, 17 Neb. App. 292, 759 N.W.2d 499 (2009).
- An agenda notice which merely stated "work order reports" was an inadequate notice under this section because it did not give interested persons knowledge that plans for a 345 kv transmission line through the district was going to be discussed and voted upon at the meeting. Inadequate agenda notice under this section meant there was a substantial

violation of the public meeting laws; however, later actions by the board of directors cured the defects in notice, and such actions were in substantial compliance with the statute. *Hansmeyer v. Nebraska Pub. Power Dist.*, 6 Neb. App. 889, 578 N.W.2d 476 (1998).

#### **84-1412. Meetings of public body; rights of public; public body; powers and duties.**

(1) Subject to the Open Meetings Act, the public has the right to attend and the right to speak at meetings of public bodies, and all or any part of a meeting of a public body, except for closed sessions called pursuant to section 84-1410, may be videotaped, televised, photographed, broadcast, or recorded by any person in attendance by means of a tape recorder, a camera, video equipment, or any other means of pictorial or sonic reproduction or in writing. Except for closed sessions called pursuant to section 84-1410, a public body shall allow members of the public an opportunity to speak at each meeting.

(2) It shall not be a violation of subsection (1) of this section for any public body to make and enforce reasonable rules and regulations regarding the conduct of persons attending, speaking at, videotaping, televising, photographing, broadcasting, or recording its meetings, including meetings held by virtual conferencing.

(3) No public body shall require members of the public to identify themselves as a condition for admission to the meeting nor shall such body require that the name of any member of the public be placed on the agenda prior to such meeting in order to speak about items on the agenda. The body shall require any member of the public desiring to address the body to identify himself or herself, including an address and the name of any organization represented by such person unless the address requirement is waived to protect the security of the individual.

(4) No public body shall, for the purpose of circumventing the Open Meetings Act, hold a meeting in a place known by the body to be too small to accommodate the anticipated audience.

(5) No public body shall be deemed in violation of this section if it holds its meeting in its traditional meeting place which is located in this state.

(6) No public body shall be deemed in violation of this section if it holds a meeting outside of this state if, but only if:

(a) A member entity of the public body is located outside of this state and the meeting is in that member's jurisdiction;

(b) All out-of-state locations identified in the notice are located within public buildings used by members of the entity or at a place which will accommodate the anticipated audience;

(c) Reasonable arrangements are made to accommodate the public's right to attend, hear, and speak at the meeting, including making virtual conferencing available at an in-state location to members, the public, or the press, if requested twenty-four hours in advance;

(d) No more than twenty-five percent of the public body's meetings in a calendar year are held out-of-state;

(e) Out-of-state meetings are not used to circumvent any of the public government purposes established in the Open Meetings Act; and

(f) The public body publishes notice of the out-of-state meeting at least twenty-one days before the date of the meeting in a legal newspaper of statewide circulation.

(7) Each public body shall, upon request, make a reasonable effort to accommodate the public's right to hear the discussion and testimony presented at a meeting.

(8) Public bodies shall make available at the meeting or the instate location for virtual conferencing as required by subdivision (6)(c) of this section, for examination and copying by members of the public, at least one copy of all reproducible written material to be discussed at an open meeting, either in paper or electronic form. Public bodies shall make available at least one current copy of the Open Meetings Act posted in the meeting room at a location accessible to members of the public. At the beginning of the meeting, the public shall be informed about the location of the posted information.

## Annotations

- To preserve an objection that a public body failed to make documents available at a public meeting as required by subsection (8) of this section, a person who attends a public meeting must not only object to the violation, but must make that objection to the public body or to a member of the public body. *Stoetzel & Sons v. City of Hastings*, 265 Neb. 637, 658 N.W.2d 636 (2003).

### **84-1413. Meetings; minutes; roll call vote; secret ballot; when; agenda and minutes; required on website; when.**

(1) Each public body shall keep minutes of all meetings showing the time, place, members present and absent, and the substance of all matters discussed.

(2) Any action taken on any question or motion duly moved and seconded shall be by roll call vote of the public body in open session, and the record shall state how each member voted or if the member was absent or not voting. The requirements of a roll call or viva voce vote shall be satisfied by a public body which utilizes an electronic voting device which allows the yeas and nays of each member of such public body to be readily seen by the public.

(3) The vote to elect leadership within a public body may be taken by secret ballot, but the total number of votes for each candidate shall be recorded in the minutes.

(4) The minutes of all meetings and evidence and documentation received or disclosed in open session shall be public records and open to public inspection during normal business hours.

(5) Minutes shall be written or kept as an electronic record and shall be available for inspection within ten working days or prior to the next convened meeting, whichever occurs earlier, except that cities of the second class and villages may have an additional ten working days if the employee responsible for writing or keeping the minutes is absent due to a serious illness or emergency.

(6) Beginning July 31, 2022, the governing body of a natural resources district, the city council of a city of the metropolitan class, the city council of a city of the primary class, the city council of a city of the first class, the county board of a county with a population greater than twenty-five thousand inhabitants, and the school board of a school district shall make available

on such entity's public website the agenda and minutes of any meeting of the governing body. The agenda shall be placed on the website at least twenty-four hours before the meeting of the governing body. Minutes shall be placed on the website at such time as the minutes are available for inspection as provided in subsection (5) of this section. This information shall be available on the public website for at least six months.

- Under prior law, if a person present at a meeting observes and fails to object to an alleged public meetings laws violation in the form of a failure to conduct rollcall votes before taking actions on questions or motions pending, that person waives his or her right to object at a later date. *Hauser v. Nebraska Police Stds. Adv. Council*, 264 Neb. 944, 653 N.W.2d 240 (2002).
- Subsection (2) of this section does not require the record to state that the vote was by roll call, but requires only that the record show if and how each member voted. Neither does the statute set a time limit for recording the results of a vote, after which no corrections of the record can be made. If no intervening rights of third persons have arisen, a board of county commissioners has power to correct the record of the proceedings had at a previous meeting so as to make them speak the truth, particularly where the correction supplies some omitted fact or action and is done not to contradict or change the original record but to have the record show that a certain action was taken or thing done, which the original record fails to show. *State ex rel. Schuler v. Dunbar*, 214 Neb. 85, 333 N.W.2d 652 (1983).
- Failure by a public governing body, as defined under section 84-1409, R.R.S.1943, to take and record a roll call vote on an action, as required by section 84-1413(2), R.S.Supp.,1980, grants any citizen the right to sue for the purpose of having the action declared void. In this case such failure could not be later corrected by a nunc pro tunc order because there was no showing that a roll call vote on the disputed action was actually taken, and even if it was the record showed it was not recorded until over a year later. Sections 23-1301, R.R.S.1943, and 23-1302, R.R.S.1943, make it the duty of the county clerk to record proceedings of the board of county commissioners. *State ex rel. Schuler v. Dunbar*, 208 Neb. 69, 302 N.W.2d 674 (1981).
- There is no requirement that a public body make a record of where notice was published or posted. *Wolf v. Grubbs*, 17 Neb. App. 292, 759 N.W.2d 499 (2009).

### **84-1414. Unlawful action by public body; declared void or voidable by district court; when; duty to enforce open meeting laws; citizen's suit; procedure; violations; penalties.**

(1) Any motion, resolution, rule, regulation, ordinance, or formal action of a public body made or taken in violation of the Open Meetings Act shall be declared void by the district court if the suit is commenced within one hundred twenty days of the meeting of the public body at which the alleged violation occurred. Any motion, resolution, rule, regulation, ordinance, or formal action of a public body made or taken in substantial violation of the Open Meetings Act shall be voidable by the district court if the suit is commenced more than one hundred twenty days after but within one year of the meeting of the public body in which the alleged violation occurred. A suit to void any final action shall be commenced within one year of the action.

(2) The Attorney General and the county attorney of the county in which the public body ordinarily meets shall enforce the Open Meetings Act.

(3) Any citizen of this state may commence a suit in the district court of the county in which the public body ordinarily meets or in which the plaintiff resides for the purpose of requiring compliance with or preventing violations of the Open Meetings Act, for the purpose of declaring an action of a public body void, or for the purpose of determining the applicability of the act to discussions or decisions of the public body. It shall not be a defense that the citizen attended the meeting and failed to object at such time. The court may order payment of reasonable attorney's fees and court costs to a successful plaintiff in a suit brought under this section.

(4) Any member of a public body who knowingly violates or conspires to violate or who attends or remains at a meeting knowing that the public body is in violation of any provision of the Open Meetings Act shall be guilty of a Class IV misdemeanor for a first offense and a Class III misdemeanor for a second or subsequent offense.

- The Legislature has granted standing to a broad scope of its citizens for the very limited purpose of challenging meetings allegedly in violation of the Open Meetings Act, so that they may help police the public policy embodied by the act. *Schauer v. Grooms*, 280 Neb. 426, 786 N.W.2d 909 (2010).

- When a petitioner under this section is successful in the district court, that court may allow attorney fees. *Tracy Corp. II v. Nebraska Pub. Serv. Comm.*, 218 Neb. 900, 360 N.W.2d 485 (1984).
- Informal discussions between the Tax Commissioner and the State Board of Equalization in which instructions were clarified, with such clarification leading to the amendment of hearing notices, did not constitute a public meeting subject to the provisions of this section. *Box Butte County v. State Board of Equalization and Assessment*, 206 Neb. 696, 295 N.W.2d 670 (1980).
- The right to collaterally attack an order made in contravention of the Public Meeting Act must occur within a period of one year as is specifically provided by this section. *Witt v. School District No. 70*, 202 Neb. 63, 273 N.W.2d 669 (1979).
- Statutory change, requiring "publicized notice" for board of education employment hearings, occurring between dates meeting scheduled and conducted, held not to void

proceedings. *Alexander v. School Dist. No. 17*, 197 Neb. 251, 248 N.W.2d 335 (1976).

- Voiding an entire meeting is a proper remedy for violations of the Open Meetings Act. Once a meeting has been declared void pursuant to Nebraska's public meetings law, board members are prohibited from considering any information obtained at the illegal meeting. *Wolf v. Grubbs*, 17 Neb. App. 292, 759 N.W.2d 499 (2009).
- Actions by the board of directors were merely voidable under this section, and not void. Pursuant to subsection (3) of this section, the plaintiffs were awarded partial attorney fees because they were successful in having the court declare that the board of directors was in substantial violation of the statute, even though the plaintiffs did not get the relief requested of having the board's actions declared void. *Hansmeyer v. Nebraska Pub. Power Dist.*, 6 Neb. App. 889, 578 N.W.2d 476 (1998).

**6.A. Proclamation declaring week of May 3, 2026, as Professional Municipal Clerks Week.** Bulkley proclaimed the week of May 3, 2026, as Professional Municipal Clerks Week and thanked the staff in the city clerk's office for all the work they do.

**9. REPORTS OF CITY OFFICES**

**9.A. Columbus in Focus - Public Safety.** Strecker presented on behalf of the Public Safety team, which includes Vasicek, Strecker, Gray, and Pensick. Strecker reviewed 2026 action items and highlighted the individual accomplishments of each department in the past 60 days as well as the group projects the team has been collaborating on.

**9.B. Reveal of new city seal.** Bulkley introduced Jennifer Davila, creator of the new city seal. Davila gave a brief explanation of her design, noting that her inspiration came from how she envisioned the community while growing up in Columbus.

**10. REPORTS OF COUNCIL COMMITTEES**

**10.A. Public Property, Safety, and Works Committee - May 4, 2026.**

**10.A.1. Permanent Sidewalk Easement located in part of Lot 8, Block 4, Evanlawn Addition, to the City of Columbus, Platte County, Nebraska (33rd Avenue and 21st Street).** The committee recommended approval. The report was adopted with a motion by Lopez and a second by Schilling. Alarcòn, Bahr, Hiemer, Jablonski, Lopez, Palensky, Roth, and Schilling voted "Aye" and none voted "Nay".

**10.A.2. Drainage Easement located in South 1/2 of the Northeast 1/4 of Section 11, Township 17 North, Range 1 West of the 6th P.M., Platte County, Nebraska (west of Grayhawk Place cul-de-sac).** The committee recommended approval. The report was adopted with a motion by Schilling and a second by Lopez. Alarcòn, Bahr, Hiemer, Jablonski, Lopez, Palensky, Roth, and Schilling voted "Aye" and none voted "Nay".

**10.A.3. Amend city code section 50.35 to add regulations regarding handling of solid waste.** Vasicek explained that currently there are no regulations

regarding how residents are to dispose of solid waste or how frequently it must be removed from their property. She noted that some residents do not employ a professional garbage service and allow garbage to accumulate on their property for extended periods of time, requiring code enforcement to spend a significant amount of time addressing and abating these nuisances. Vasicek stated that amending city code will allow the police department to more effectively enforce these violations and establish clearer expectations for residents moving forward. Roth expressed concerns regarding the proposed requirement of weekly removal as some residents utilize the option of a bi-monthly garbage pick-up service. The committee recommended approval. 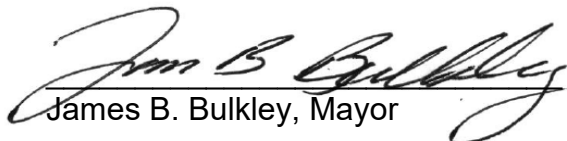

# LEASE TO HANGAR AIRCRAFT

THIS AGREEMENT (herein referred to as either "Agreement" or "Lease") made effective as of this 1 day of May, 2026, by and between THE CITY OF COLUMBUS, a municipal corporation of the State of Nebraska, on behalf of Columbus Municipal Airport (hereinafter referred to as "City"), and BJ Aviation LLC (hereinafter referred to as "Lessee(s)").

IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL PROMISES CONTAINED IN THIS AGREEMENT, THE PARTIES ACKNOWLEDGE AND AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. **LEASE OF HANGAR SPACE:** City hereby leases and grants to Lessee(s) the exclusive privilege of using the space in Hangar No. 1240SE at Columbus Municipal Airport (herein referred to as "Hangar" or "Premises"). This Lease is being granted for the sole purpose of hangaring/storing of Lessee(s) aircraft and/or aeronautical equipment.
  
2. **RENTAL SUM:** Lessee(s) shall pay to City an annual sum of One Thousand One Hundred Forty Dollars (\$1,140). This annual sum shall be paid either in full by December 31 of the preceding year; or, in two semi-annual installments of Five Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$570), due by December 31 of the preceding year and by June 30 of the Lease year. In situations where the initial Lease is entered into after January 1, the first-year annual sum rental amount shall be prorated based on the date of execution of the Lease.
  - (A) **RENTAL SUM DISCOUNT:** Lessee(s) shall be entitled to an annual five percent (5%) discount of the annual sum if Lessee(s) submits to the airport manager at least twelve (12) receipts for aviation fuel purchased at any airport between January 1 and December 31 of the preceding year. Lessee(s) shall be entitled to an annual ten percent (10%) discount of the annual sum if Lessee(s) submits to the airport manager at least twenty-four (24) receipts for aviation fuel purchased at any airport between January 1 and December 31 of the preceding year. This discount will be capped at a maximum of ten percent (10%) annually.
  
  - (B) **RENTAL SUM SUBJECT TO CHANGE:** Lessee(s) hereby specifically acknowledges and agrees that upon any renewal of the Lease as provided for in Paragraph 4 of this Agreement, the annual sum and rental amounts set forth in Paragraph 2 of this Agreement may be reviewed, reevaluated, and unilaterally increased by City to a sum set forth by resolution of the Mayor and City Council. Lessee(s) further agrees that it shall pay the revised/increased annual sum and rental amounts as required in this Agreement.
  
3. **LEASE TERM:** The term of this Lease is for a period of one year, from January 1 through December 31. If the Lease is entered into after January 1, then the Lease term shall be from the effective date until December 31 of that year.

4. **RENEWAL OF LEASE:** This Lease may be automatically and continuously renewed in one-year increments upon both the payment of the annual rental sum for the next year and the acceptance of said payment by the City. To renew the Lease the rental sum is to be paid by Lessee(s) to City on or before the due date as set forth in Paragraph 2. If Lessee(s) fails to pay the rental sum when due, City may serve a fifteen (15) day notice to Lessee(s) to pay or vacate the Hangar. Failure to pay the rental amount within said fifteen (15) day notice period shall, without action by City, terminate the Lease.
5. **STORAGE OF AIRCRAFT AND/OR EQUIPMENT ONLY:** Lessee(s) has rented the hangar space for the purpose of storing aircraft and/or aeronautical equipment and is prohibited from conducting any other use or activity on the Premises. Additionally, Lessee(s) shall not use the Premises for any commercial activity whatsoever, including, but not limited to, the offering of flight services to the general public, maintaining and repairing aircraft for the public, and storage of aircraft other than aircraft owned or leased by the Lessee(s).

(A) **HAZARDOUS MATERIALS:** Lessee(s) shall also refrain from storing any items or materials on the Premises which would violate local or national fire codes and shall not store any gasoline, combustible liquids, or hazardous materials in the above-described hangar. Upon notice to Lessee(s) of the violation of Paragraph 5(A), Lessee(s) shall immediately remove such conditions that violate the local and national fire codes or any gasoline, combustible liquids, or hazardous material on the Premises.

6. **SPECIFIED AIRCRAFT AND REGISTRATION:** This Lease is for hangaring of the following aircraft:

Lessee(s) (whether individual(s), partnership, LLC, or corporation) must have and maintain a majority legal ownership or majority leasehold interest in the above-described aircraft during the entire term of this Lease. Appropriate legal evidence of the Lessee(s) ownership or leasehold interest must be presented upon execution of this Lease and within ten (10) days following any change in Lessee(s) ownership or leasehold interest. Lessee(s) shall keep proof of aircraft ownership and appropriate/legal aircraft registration current with City. Evidence of proof of aircraft ownership and registration shall further be made available to City at any time upon demand of City and upon any renewal of this Lease as may be allowed herein.

7. **HANGAR DOORS, HANGAR LEFT UNATTENDED:** Lessee(s) hereby specifically agrees to keep the hangar door(s) closed at all times, other than during the times the Lessee(s) is moving aircraft in and out of the hangar space, to avoid

wind damage to the hangar. Lessee(s) shall not leave the hangar unattended for any period of time over sixty (60) minutes if the hangar door(s) is open. The hangar door(s) shall be locked at all times when Lessee(s) is not on the Premises. Lessee(s) assumes and agrees to pay for any damage caused to the hangar if and when the hangar door(s) is left open in violation of this provision. Failure to abide by this provision, whether or not damage occurs, will result in cancellation of this Lease at City's discretion.

8. **FIRE EXTINGUISHER REQUIRED:** Lessee(s) shall maintain a fire extinguisher or extinguishers, in good operating condition, containing dry chemical or halon 1211-type extinguishing agents readily available within the hangar space. There shall be one such fire extinguisher for each seventy-five feet (75') of travel within the hangar space.
9. **SPILL PREVENTION AND CLEANUP:** In accordance with requirements of City's Industrial Stormwater Permit issued through the State of Nebraska, Lessee(s) shall keep in the hangar at all times, a spill kit consisting of a securely covered bucket or tub that is clearly labeled as a Spill Kit, absorbent material of either floor dry or absorbent mats, rubber gloves, and trash bags. Lessee(s) shall place drip pans under any leaking aircraft or aviation equipment. Such drip pans must be properly emptied and cleaned on a regular basis with the contents being disposed of in a safe and appropriate manner. In the event of a spill, Lessee(s) shall immediately clean up the spill using contents of the spill kit and dispose of the waste by placing it securely in a trash bag and depositing it in a proper trash receptacle. If a spill is twenty-five (25) gallons or more, Lessee(s) shall contact the airport manager immediately.
10. **NON-INTERFERENCE WITH OTHER AIRPORT USES:** Lessee(s) shall not exercise any privileges granted by this agreement in such a way as to interfere with or adversely affect the use, operation, maintenance, or development of the airport.
11. **CONDITION OF PREMISES:** Lessee(s), at Lessee(s)'s sole cost and expense, agrees to maintain, repair, and keep in good order, condition, and appearance, the Premises, including the hangar structure, and the improvements constructed thereon, in a safe, clean, and sanitary condition. Lessee is expressly prohibited from materially altering the hangar structure, floor, walls, exterior, or adjoining common use areas, or constructing any structure or facility within the hangar, without the expressed written consent of City. Lessee(s) agrees that at the expiration of the term of this Agreement Lessee(s) shall yield possession of Premises to City, without further demand or notice, in as good order and condition as when the Lease was entered into by Lessee(s), excluding reasonable wear and tear. Lessee(s) shall repair any damage to the Premises occasioned by its use or the removal of Lessee(s)'s trade fixtures, furnishings, and equipment. Said repair shall include the patching and filling of holes and repair of structural damage.
12. **CITY NOT LIABLE FOR DAMAGE TO AIRCRAFT:** City shall not be liable for any damage to Lessee(s)'s aircraft, aeronautical equipment, or other property (personal or otherwise) while the same is stored or being moved to or from the hangar space.

13. **INDEMNITY AND INSURANCE REQUIRED:** City shall stand indemnified by Lessee(s) as herein provided. It is expressly understood by and between the parties hereto that Lessee(s) herein is, and shall be deemed to be, responsible to all parties for its respective acts and omissions and City shall in no way be responsible therefore. It is further agreed that in the use of the airport and Premises and the exercise or enjoyment of the privileges herein granted, Lessee(s) agrees to indemnify and hold harmless City, its employees, agents, officers, and volunteers, from any and all losses, damages, costs, expenses, liabilities, claims, demands, suits, attorney's fees, and judgements arising directly or indirectly from any negligence or manner related to Lessee(s) possession, occupancy, or use of the Premises.

Lessee(s) shall obtain an insurance policy in an amount of no less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence to cover general liability which shall name and endorse the "City of Columbus" as additionally insured on the certificate of insurance and endorsement. The minimum amounts of said insurance required may be increased at the sole discretion of City. Proof of insurance shall be submitted to the city clerk's office upon the execution of this Lease and shall remain in full force throughout the term of this Lease. Any certificate of insurance with accompanying endorsement(s) provided must cover the term of the Lease and be updated before the expiration date. The certificate of insurance must list the owners or those having a leasehold interest in the aircraft as insured, as well as all authorized persons/pilots who would have access to the aircraft during the term of the Lease.

14. **CITY ACCESS TO HANGER:** City reserves the right to control access to the Premises in order to regulate the orderly and efficient operation of the airport. City and its designated agents, employees, and volunteers shall at all times have reasonable access to the Premises for the purpose of inspection and to determine compliance with the provisions of this Lease and the Rules and Regulations of Columbus Municipal Airport. Lessee(s) shall lock the door(s) to the hangar space in order to protect Lessee(s)'s property kept in the hangar with locking devices and keys provided and owned by City.
15. **CITY IMPROVEMENTS:** City reserves the right, but it shall not be obligated to Lessee(s), to maintain and keep in repair all publicly owned facilities at Columbus Municipal Airport; and, further, to develop or improve the landing areas and air navigation facilities of Columbus Municipal Airport. Said improvements may be done at City's sole discretion and without interference or hindrance by Lessee(s). City's obligation for repairs or maintenance to the Premises shall extend only to maintain the hangar space in a fit and usable condition suitable for the purpose of hangaring aircraft.
16. **OBEYING RULES OF AIRPORT AND THE LAW:** Lessee(s) affirms that it has read and fully understands the Rules and Regulations of Columbus Municipal Airport. Lessee(s) acknowledges City may decide at its sole discretion to change or amend the Rules and Regulations of Columbus Municipal Airport. Lessee(s) and its employees and agents shall obey the rules and regulations adopted and amended by City or its authorized agents in charge of the airport. Lessee(s) and its employees and agents shall observe and obey regulations as may be promulgated by the United

States, or any department or agency thereof, and by the State of Nebraska, as the same may relate to the privileges provided to Lessee(s) under this Agreement.

17. **NON-DISCRIMINATION:** Lessee(s) as part of the consideration of this agreement, does hereby covenant and agree that:

(A) No person on the grounds of race, creed, color, sex, disability, or national origin shall be subjected to discrimination in the use of the facilities; and

(B) Lessee(s) shall use the hangar space in compliance with all other requirements imposed pursuant to 49 CFR Part 21, Nondiscrimination in Federally Assisted Program of the Department of Transportation, and as said regulations may be amended.

18. **TAXATION:** In the event that the subject hangar space shall at any time become subject to taxation by virtue of this Agreement or the use thereof by Lessee(s), Lessee(s) shall pay such taxes as shall be attributable to such use before they become delinquent.

19. **NOTICES:** The parties expressly agree for the purposes of notice, including legal service of process during the term of this Agreement, the following named individuals shall be the authorized representatives of the parties:

or such other representative at such address as either party may designate by written notice to the other party in accordance with Paragraph 18. All notices, requests, demands, or other communications under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been given the date of service if served personally on the party to whom notice is given; or, on the fourth (4th) day after mailing if mailed to the party to whom notice is to be given, by first class mail, registered mail, or certified mail, with postage prepaid and properly addressed as shown above.

20. **DEFAULT:** City and Lessee(s) agree that every condition, covenant, and provision of this Lease is material and reasonable. Any breach by Lessee(s) of a condition, covenant, or provision of this Lease will constitute a material breach and a default of Lessee(s)'s obligations under this Lease, including, but not limited to:

(A) Failure of Lessee(s) to abide by any provision(s) of this Lease.

- (B) Abandonment of the property by Lessee(s).
- (C) Failure of Lessee(s) to make the rental payment as required under this Lease.
- (D) Failure of Lessee(s) to keep current or provide proof of aircraft ownership and registration.
- (E) Lessee(s), for any reason, fails to maintain insurance coverage which is required pursuant to this Agreement.
- (F) Lessee(s) files a voluntary petition under the Bankruptcy Act of the United States, or is judged bankrupt under such act, or is the subject of a petition filed in federal or state court for the appointment of a trustee or receiver in bankruptcy or insolvency, or makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors.
- (G) Violation of any of the Rules and Regulations of Columbus Municipal Airport by Lessee(s).
- (H) Discovery by City that any material information provided by Lessee(s) related to this Lease is/was materially false.
- (I) Unapproved or unauthorized transfer of any interest acquired under this Agreement by Lessee(s).
- (J) Use of Premises for unlawful purposes by Lessee(s).
- (K) Maintaining, committing, or permitting the maintenance or commission of a nuisance on the Premises by Lessee(s).
- (L) Occurrence of any other event described as constituting an "Event of Default" listed elsewhere in this Lease.

Upon a material breach and default, Lessee(s) shall be provided with written notice and demand to cure said material default(s). Said notice shall give the Lessee(s) fifteen (15) days after receipt of written notice to cure the material default(s).

21. **TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT:** This Agreement may be terminated either for cause by City or by the election of either party as follows:

- (A) **TERMINATION FOR CAUSE:** In the event the Lessee(s) is in material default of this Lease as set forth in Paragraph 19, and such default is not cured within fifteen (15) days after receipt of written notice of default from City, then City at its sole discretion, may terminate this Lease effective immediately by written notice to Lessee(s). If Lessee(s) violates paragraph 5(A) regarding hazardous materials, and Lessee(s) does not immediately remove or cure such violations, then Lessee(s) is in immediate material breach and default of the Lease and the Lease is subject to immediate termination at City's sole discretion.
- (B) **TERMINATION AT ELECTION OF THE PARTIES:** Either party may terminate this Agreement by providing to the other party at least thirty (30) days written notice of intent to terminate. This time frame may be waived by City at its sole discretion.

In the event of the termination as provided herein during a year in which the Lessee(s) has prepaid, the Lessee(s) shall receive a refund of a prorated portion of the advanced payment made under Paragraph 2.

Upon the Date of Termination, Lessee(s) shall vacate the Premises and immediately remove all property (including aircraft, aeronautical equipment, and all other property) from the Premises. If Lessee fails to vacate the Premises or fails to remove any and all property from the Premises, City may seek to reenter and recover possession of the Premises by any lawful means. City may also, at its election, dispose of any remaining property in the appropriate manner provided for by law, and charge all costs associated with such disposal to Lessee(s). City will deem any property remaining on the Premises as having been abandoned by Lessee(s).

22. **ASSIGNMENT OF LEASE:** Lessee(s) shall not have the right to sub-let, assign, transfer, or in any manner re-lease any part of the described Premises. Any attempts to do so without City's expressed written approval shall be null and void.
23. **GOVERNING LAW:** This Lease shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the City of Columbus, the State of Nebraska, and federal law. Lessee(s) shall comply with all said laws. By signing this Lease, City and Lessee(s) hereby submit to personal and subject matter jurisdiction of the State of Nebraska in Platte County of any dispute between City and Lessee(s). To the extent possible, the parties waive their rights to a jury trial.
24. **BINDING EFFECT:** This Agreement shall extend to and be binding upon any heirs, personal representatives, successors, and assigns of the parties hereto.
25. **NON-WAIVER:** No waiver by City of any default or breach of this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of any other default or of the same default on a future occasion.
26. **SURVIVABILITY:** Invalidation of any one or more of the provisions of this Agreement by judgment or court order shall in no way affect any other provision(s) of the Agreement and all which other provisions shall remain in full force and effect.
27. **CAPTION HEADINGS:** Caption Headings in this Agreement are for convenience only and are not to be used to interpret or define the provisions of the Agreement.
28. **AUTHORIZATION:** Lessee(s)'s execution, delivery, and performance of this Agreement has been duly authorized by all necessary action by the Lessee(s) and does not conflict with, result in a violation of, or constitute a default under any provision of any agreement or other instrument binding upon the Lessee(s), with any law, regulation, or court order that is applicable to the Lessee(s) in any way.
29. **FULL INTEGRATION:** This is a fully integrated Agreement and supersedes any and all prior agreements, whether oral or written, between the parties; and, this Agreement embodies a full and complete understanding of the parties.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

I recommend the approval of the final plat, Deed of Dedication and Development Agreement of Sock Pond Addition as it is consistent with the Preliminary Plat in which the Planning Commission provided a recommendation on March 9, 2026, and was approved by City Council on April 6, 2026, in accordance with the Columbus Land Development Ordinance.

**DISCUSSION:**

The addition consists of 32 lots for residential use. It will be voluntarily annexed and rezoned as part of the final plat process. Public improvements include a concrete street with a cul-de-sac, storm sewer, water and sanitary sewer. The storm sewer treatment facility will utilize both the rear of Lots 21-32 in Block A and the City's storm water pre-treatment to Sock Pond.

Due to the existing 40-foot right-of-way width on 14<sup>th</sup> Street abutting the existing houses, which abut Lots 1 and 2 and 13 and 14 of K&S Subdivision, the road will be 24-foot wide with a 4-foot sidewalk on the north side and no parking on either side. The remaining 14<sup>th</sup> Street will be in accordance with the City standard 33-foot road width with 4-foot sidewalks on both sides and include a City standard cul-de-sac.

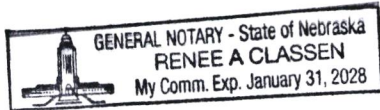

**SOCK POND ADDITION  
DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT**

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2026, by and between Keyes Development, LLC (hereinafter referred to as "Subdivider") and the CITY OF COLUMBUS, a Municipal Corporation in the State of Nebraska (hereinafter referred to as "City")

WHEREAS, Subdivider is the owner of the land included within the proposed plat attached hereto as Exhibit "A", commonly known as Sock Pond Addition to the City of Columbus, Platte County, Nebraska, (hereinafter referred to as the "Area to be Developed") within the City's zoning and platting jurisdiction; and,

**WITNESSETH**

WHEREAS, the CITY requires public improvements in the Area to be Developed; and,

WHEREAS, the Subdivider wishes to connect the system of sanitary sewers, water, and storm sewers to be constructed within, the Area to be Developed, to the sanitary sewer, water, and storm sewer system of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

For the purpose of this Development Agreement, the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings:

The "cost" or "entire cost" of a type of improvement shall be deemed to include all construction costs, engineering fees, attorneys' fees, testing expenses, publication costs; financing costs and miscellaneous costs.

"Property benefited" shall mean property within the Area to be Developed (Exhibit "A"), which will comprise 7.56 acres of property.

"Street intersections" shall be construed to mean the areas shown in the city policy for the same adopted by Resolution R96-78, which by this reference is made a part hereof.

SECTION I

Subdivider and City covenant that the following public improvements shall be installed and provided by Subdivider as set forth herein, at Subdivider's expense, subject to the exceptions and clarifications detailed herein:

A. The Subdivider shall install water, sanitary and storm sewer systems and street improvements, including sidewalks in accordance with City standards. The Subdivider shall be responsible for the design, financing and construction of said public infrastructure improvements as detailed herein.

B. Concrete paving of internal streets, dedicated per plat (Exhibit "A"), all of said paving to be a minimum of thirty-three (33) feet in width and six (6) inches thick, and shall be constructed according to City standards. Concrete paving 14<sup>th</sup> Street to 48<sup>th</sup> Avenue is part of this work. The paving width abutting Lots 1 & 2 and Lots 13 & 14, K&S Subdivision shall be twenty-four (24) feet in width and six (6) inches thick. The entire cost of paving and storm sewer system improvements except for intersections shall be paid by the Subdivider, with exception of intersection pavement and pavement in excess of the minimum width or depth required by a Nebraska Licensed Civil Engineer to properly serve the Area to Be Developed and approved by the City Engineer. In such case, the oversized cost shall be paid for by the City, subject to final approval of plans and specifications by the City.

C. The sanitary sewer system, including, but not limited to: mains, manholes, lift station, and related appurtenances shall be constructed according to City standards within dedicated street right-of-way and easement areas, per plat (Exhibit "A"), the same to be located on a sanitary sewer plan prepared by a Nebraska Licensed Civil Engineer. Any existing sewer service lines from Lots 1 and 2 and 13 and 14, K&S Subdivision that enter 14<sup>th</sup> Street right of way will need to be connected directly into the extended sewer main. The entire cost of sanitary sewer system improvements shall be paid by the Subdivider, with exception of sanitary sewer mains located in a dedicated right-of-way or easement area that are greater than the size required by said Nebraska Licensed Civil Engineer to properly serve the Area to be Developed and approved by the City Engineer. In such case, the oversized cost shall be paid for by the City subject to the final approval of the plans and specifications by the City.

D. The storm water sewer system, including, but not limited to: mains, inlets, manholes, and related appurtenances shall be constructed according to City standards within dedicated street right-of-way and easement areas, per plat (Exhibit "A") to be located on storm water system plan prepared by a Nebraska Licensed Civil Engineer. The Subdivider shall be responsible for the design, financing and construction of said storm sewer system improvements. The entire cost of storm sewer system improvements shall be paid by the Subdivider, with exception of storm sewer mains in a dedicated right-of-way or easement area that are greater than the size required by said Nebraska Licensed Civil Engineer to properly serve the Area to be Developed, including incoming runoff, and approved by the City Engineer. In such case, the oversized cost shall be paid for by the City subject to the final approval of plans and specifications by the City.

E. The water distribution system, including, but not limited to: mains, hydrants and valves shall be constructed according to City standards within a dedicated right-of-way and easement areas per plat (Exhibit "A") on a water plan prepared by a Nebraska Licensed Civil Engineer. Any existing water service lines from Lots 1 & 2 and 13 & 14, K&S Subdivision, that enter 14<sup>th</sup> Street right of way will need

to be connected directly into the extended water main with a new curb stop and box. The Subdivider shall be responsible for the design, financing and construction of said water distribution improvements. The entire cost of the water distribution system and improvements shall be paid by the Subdivider, with exception of water mains located in a dedicated right-of-way or easement area that are greater than the size required by said Nebraska Licensed Civil Engineer to properly serve the Area to be Developed and approved by the City Engineer. In such case, the oversized cost shall be paid for by the City subject to the final approval of plans and specifications by the City.

F. Natural gas distribution mains, if any, shall be located within a dedicated street right-of-way or easement areas dedicated per plat (Exhibit "A"), which Subdivider shall arrange to be installed by the local gas franchisee. Any additional cost participation required by the local gas franchisee for the installation of gas mains, if any, shall be borne by the Subdivider.

G. Subdivider shall arrange for underground electrical service to each buildable lot within the Area to be Developed to be provided by Loup Power District at no cost to the City. If any relocation or adjusting of existing electrical mains are required, the costs shall be borne by the Subdivider.

H. Subdivider shall arrange for street lighting for public streets dedicated per plat (Exhibit "A"), which includes the connection to 48<sup>th</sup> Avenue, to be provided by Loup Power District at Subdivider's cost and at no cost to the City.

I. Subdivider shall install the concrete sidewalk four feet wide and four inches thick, or six inches through driveways or private streets, in accordance with the Americans with Disability Act and per City Code on each lot within the Area to be Developed or shall contract with the builder to construct the same at the time each lot is developed. Sidewalk on one side of 14<sup>th</sup> Street abutting Lots 1 & 2 and 13 & 14, K&S Subdivision shall be constructed as part of the initial improvements. If Subdivider fails to do so, the lot owner along with the Subdivider shall be responsible for installing the sidewalk. If any lot remains a common area lot or is located adjacent to a designated arterial or collector, Subdivider shall install the sidewalk for said lot(s) as part of the initial construction. If a lot remains an undeveloped lot, the Subdivider and the lot owner shall be responsible for installing the sidewalk as of the deadline provided for in Section VI herein,

J. Grading for the Area to be Developed shall be completed by the Subdivider at Subdivider's expense pursuant to the drainage and grading plan elevations to be provided by a Nebraska Licensed Civil Engineer, and submitted with the Final Plat. Post construction storm water management systems shall be installed, maintained, and fully functional in accordance with the City of Columbus Code of Ordinances, Chapter 53, at Subdivider's expense. Subdivider agrees to obtain a Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality, National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System, Construction Storm Water Notice of Intent (NOI), including the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP), prior to disturbing more than one acre. The Subdivider shall provide a copy of the NOI and SWPPP, name and contact information of the certified person/firm providing the inspections to the City as part of the City's Municipal Storm Sewer Separation System requirements. If less than one acre is disturbed, the Subdivider shall complete a small lot NOI SWPPP.

K. Subdivider shall provide copies of all required Federal and State permits to City prior to work on or in those respective areas.

L. Subdivider agrees to pay all costs necessary to extend sanitary sewer system, water system and storm sewer that will service the property.

M. Subdivider hereby acknowledges that post-construction storm water runoff from City right-of-way will enter into the Sock Pond Addition storm water treatment and detention facility system (STF) as a condition of this final plat. Subdivider agrees to grant and create a Home Owner's Association to maintain said STF for such use with the understanding the City does not assume any responsibility for said STF treatment, maintenance, dredging, operation, reporting and permitting. Provide a written long term maintenance plan for the STF as part of this submittal.

N. Developer shall either abide by or revise the existing K&S Subdivision Restrictive Covenants for K&S Subdivision Lots 3 through 12 and file any revisions in the courthouse concurrent with the final plat.

O. All tree, structures, and excess material shall be removed during the initial construction in order to provide the required storm water flow, infrastructure improvements, and meeting the Columbus Land Development Ordinance.

P. Developer and property owners do not have Sock Pond water rights from the subdivision for such things as, but not limited to, boat docks, steps and paths to the pond, fencing, permanent structures, retaining walls, formal landscaping, or similar on City property. Any proposed trees to be planted in the Sock Pond property shall obtain prior City approval as to type, location, watering, maintenance, or City requested removal of said trees and stumps.

Q. Subdivider agrees to complete and submit to the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Section 408 Technical Review and receive USACE approval prior to any disturbance or work within 500 feet of the Loup River Levee. This includes any public and private utilities, residential, non-residential structures, or other work disturbing ground. A copy of the USACE approval shall be provided for each occurrence and received before any Building Permits are issued.

## SECTION II

Subdivider and City covenant and agree that the Subdivider will abide by and incorporate into all of its construction contracts the provisions required by the regulations of the City pertaining to construction of public improvements, and testing procedures therefor, except as otherwise provided in this Development Agreement.

## SECTION III

A. Subject to the conditions and provisions hereinafter specified, the City hereby grants permission to the Subdivider to connect its sewer system to the sewer system of the City in such manner and at such place or places designated on plans submitted by the Subdivider's engineer and approved by the City.

B. Without prior written approval by the City, the Subdivider shall not permit any sewer lines or sewers outside the present boundaries of the Area to be Developed to connect to the sewer or sewer lines of the Area to be Developed, any sewers of the City, any outfall sewer of the City, or any sewage treatment plant of the City. The City shall have exclusive control over connections to its sewers whether inside or outside the boundaries of the Area to be Developed.

C. At all times, all sewage from and through said Area to be Developed into the City sewer system shall be in conformity with the ordinances, regulations, and conditions applicable to sewers and sewage within the City as now existing and as from time to time may be amended.

D. Before any connection from any premises to the sewer system of the Area to be Developed may be made, a permit shall be obtained for said premises, and its connection from the City, it being expressly understood that the City reserves the right to collect all connection charges and fees as required by city ordinances or rules now or hereafter in force; all such connections shall comply with minimum standards prescribed by the City.

E. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Development Agreement, City retains the right to disconnect the sewer of any industry, or other sewer user within the Area to be Developed, which is discharging into the sewer system in violation of any applicable ordinance, statute, rule or regulations.

#### SECTION IV

All buildings built in the Area to be Developed, shall be constructed in compliance with the most recent City of Columbus Building Requirements at the time of application for the building permits, to the extent possible.

#### SECTION V

Installation of entrance signs or related fixtures and any median landscaping and related fixtures, if any, shall be paid by the Subdivider. Plans for such proposed improvements that are to be located in public right-of-way and a proposed maintenance agreement for the improvements must be submitted to the City for review and approval prior to the installation of improvements.

No separate administrative entity or joint venture, among the parties, is deemed created by virtue of the Development Agreement.

The administration of this Development Agreement shall be through the offices of the undersigned officers for their respective entities.

This Development Agreement shall be binding upon parties, their respective successors and assigns.

This Development Agreement replaces and declares void any prior agreements or resolutions regarding the development of the Area to be Developed

This Development Agreement shall be recorded at the Platte County Register of Deeds office, at the Subdivider's expense, within 30 days of final plat approval.

#### SECTION VI

The Subdivider shall install all public improvements within a time period of two (2) years after the signing of this Development Agreement, except that sidewalks directly in front of houses (if residential) or businesses (if commercial) shall be constructed before the Occupancy Certificate is issued or within four (4) years after the signing of this Development Agreement, whichever comes first. An extension of this time period may be requested by the Subdivider and if said request receives a favorable recommendation of Planning Commission and approval by the City Council the deadline will be extended pursuant to the new deadline set by the City Council.

SECTION VII

This Agreement shall run with the land and shall be binding upon and insure to the benefit of all parties hereto, their successors and assigns, including all future lot owners of the Area to be Developed.

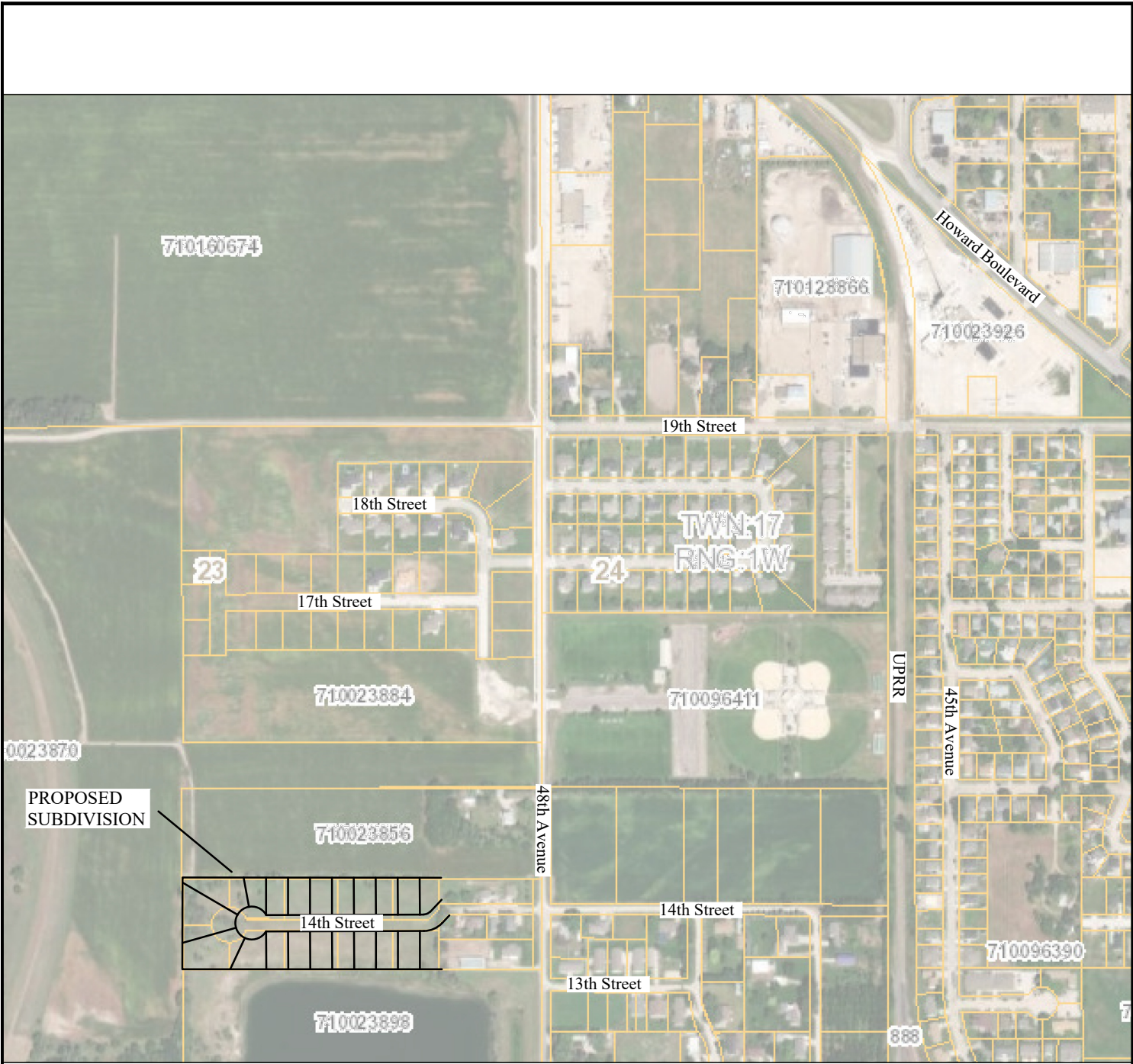

Situation Sketch



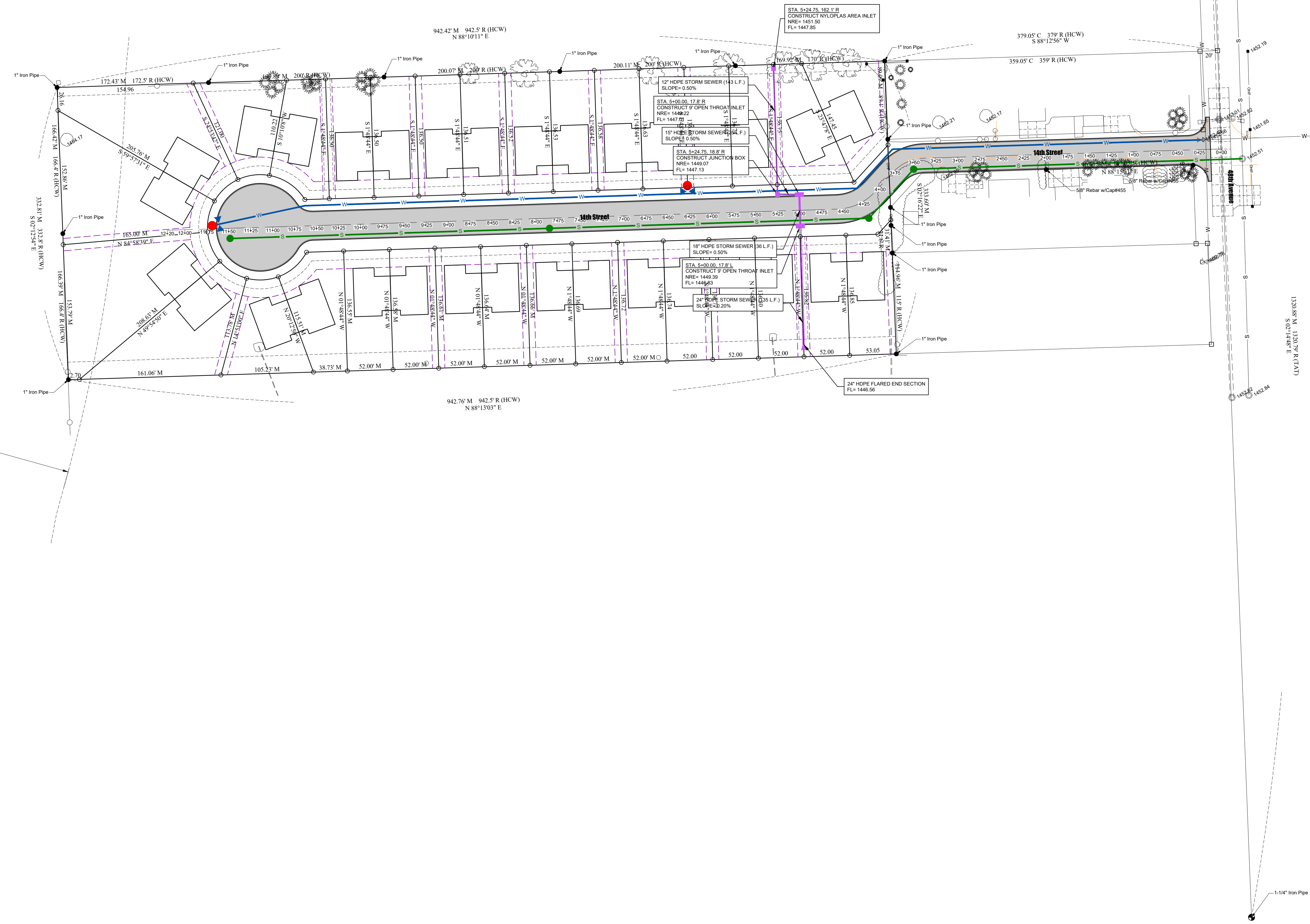

Draft revisions will be required for the preliminary plat submittal with final revisions part of the final draft submittal and filed in the courthouse concurrently.

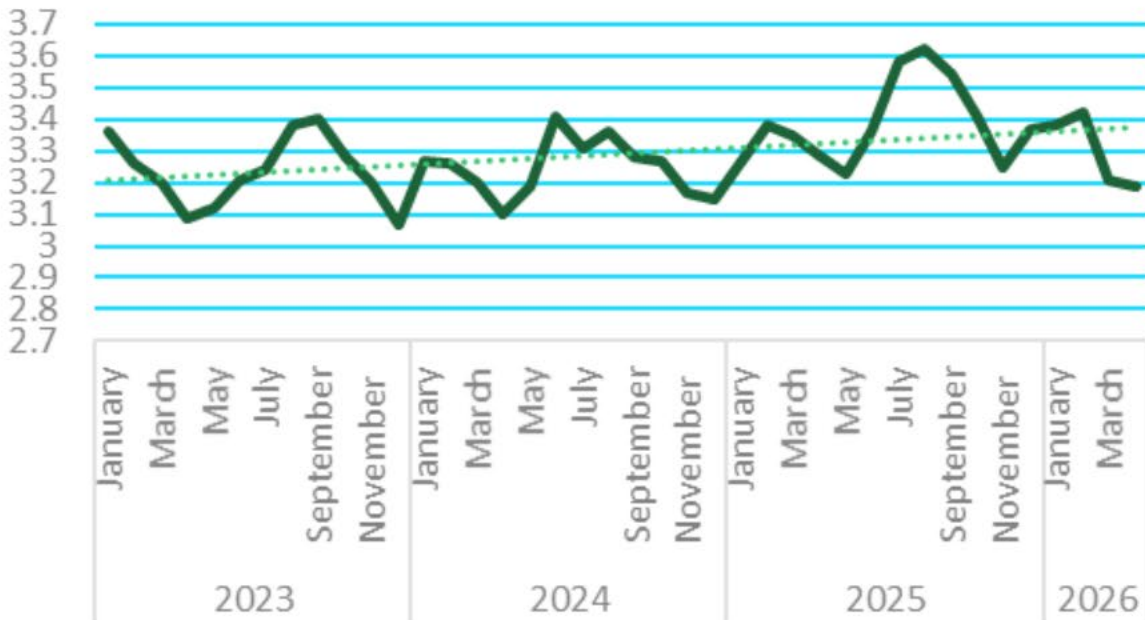

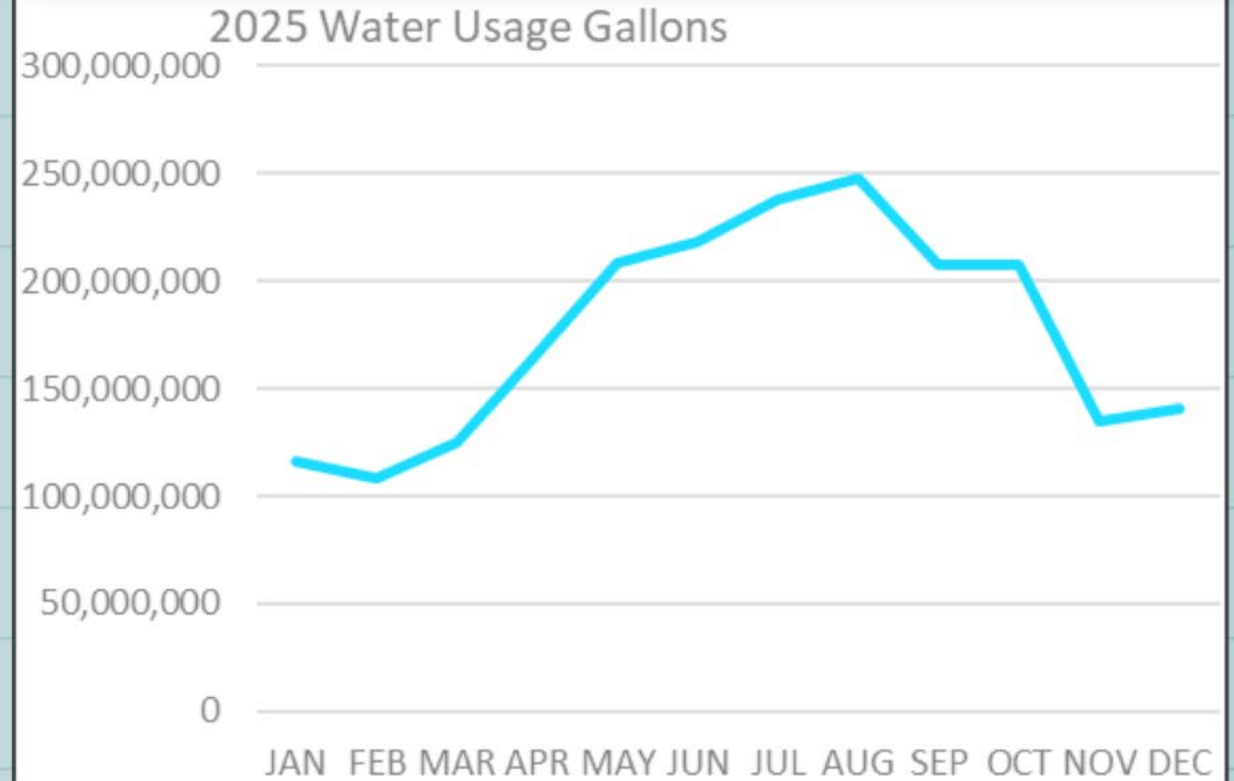

## 2025 Water Usage Gallons



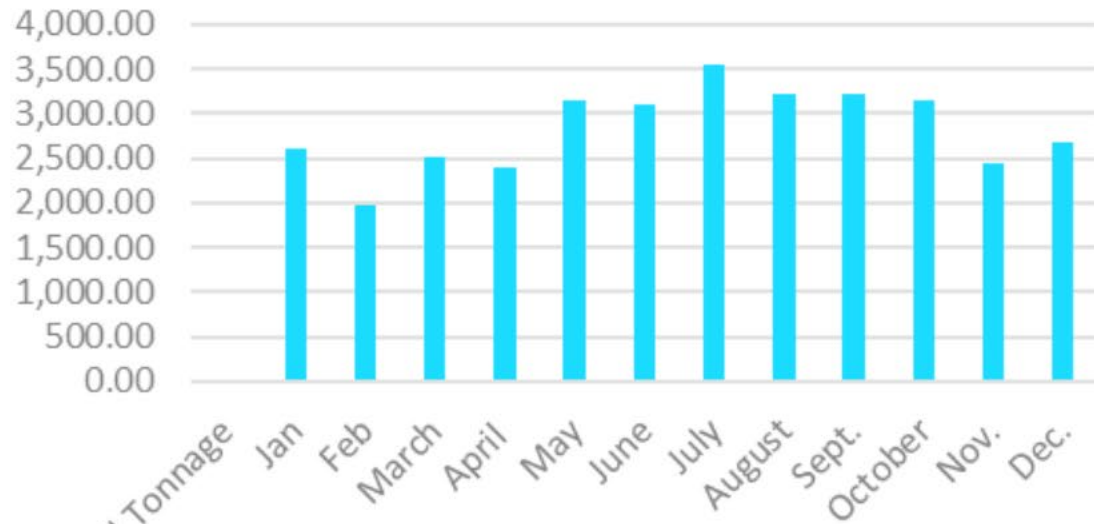

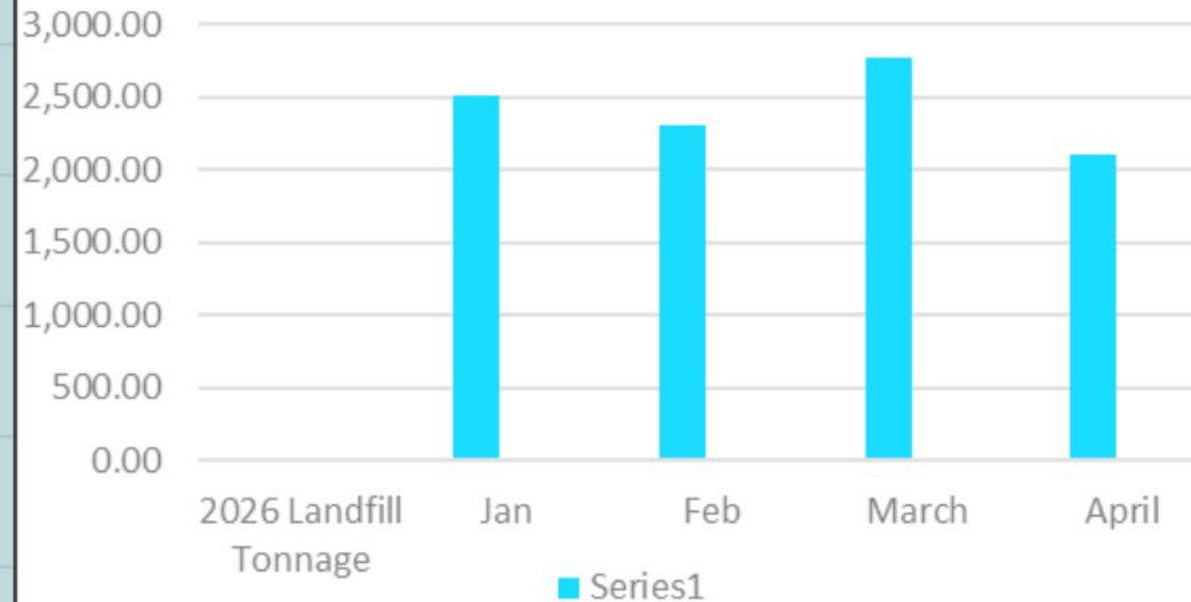

- The submitted plans shall include the minimum information:
  - Footing/anchoring design to be used.
  - Site plan showing location of structure dimensioned from property lines and any other buildings located on the property.



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### COMMERCIAL AND RESIDENTIAL FENCE GUIDE

When submitting a Fence Building Permit through the online portal, please be sure to include a complete site plan showing all setbacks and required information. Most permit applications are processed with little delay; however, the submitted documents must clearly demonstrate that the project complies with building safety codes, zoning ordinances, and all other applicable regulations. Building permit applications submitted without all required documents will be denied. Processing will resume once the correct documentation is received. If further assistance is needed, please contact the City of Columbus Building Department.

#### General Fence Regulations:

- **Build Within Property Lines-** Fences must be located inside your surveyed lot boundaries.

- Any accessory structure 120 Sq Ft or less does not need a permit. Accessory structures need to stay out of any electrical, drainage, or other type easements.
- Accessory structures 120 Sq Ft to 180 Sq Ft, where the bearing wall width is 12'-0" or less, will be constructed on a 4" thick slab. The slab will need a thickened edge to meet the 6" ground separation requirement [10" total]. See diagram for recommended re-bar and clearance requirements.
- Accessory structures 180 Sq Ft to 440 Sq Ft, a monolithic slab/foundation is required consisting of a footing 9" wide and 12" deep below grade with an additional 6" minimum above grade for ground clearance requirement [18" total]. See diagram for recommended re-bar and clearance requirements.
- Accessory structures larger than 440 Sq Ft will need a required frost-free footing of 8" wide and 36" deep below grade with 6" above grade for ground clearance [42" total]. See diagram for recommended re-bar and ground clearance requirements.

DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this    day of   , 2026, by and between Bob A. McDonald, 2016 7<sup>th</sup> Street, Columbus, Nebraska, and Lori J. Warnick, 963 33<sup>rd</sup> Avenue, Columbus, Nebraska, and the CITY OF COLUMBUS, a Municipal Corporation in the State of Nebraska (hereinafter referred to as "City")

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Lori J. Warnick is the owner of the land (hereinafter referred to as "Landowner") included within the proposed plat attached hereto as Exhibit "A", commonly known as McDonald Subdivision, to the City of Columbus, Platte County, Nebraska (hereinafter referred to as the "Area to be Developed") within the City's zoning and platting jurisdiction; and,

WHEREAS, Bob A. McDonald is the subdivider of the Area to be Developed (hereinafter referred to as "Subdivider"); and,

WHEREAS, public improvements are in the Area to be Developed; and,

WHEREAS, the Landowner and Subdivider wish to connect the existing system of sanitary sewers, water, and storm sewers serving the Area to be Developed,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

For the purpose of this Development Agreement, the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings:

The "cost" or "entire cost" of a type of improvement shall be deemed to include all construction costs, engineering fees, attorneys' fees, testing expenses, publication costs; financing costs and miscellaneous costs.

“Property benefited” shall mean property within the Area to be Developed (Exhibit “A”), which will comprise 0.69 acres of property more or less.

### SECTION I

Landowner, Subdivider and City covenant that the following public and private improvements shall be installed and provided by Landowner and Subdivider as set forth herein, at Landowner’s and Subdivider’s expense, subject to the exceptions and clarifications detailed herein:

A. Natural gas distribution mains, if any, shall be located within dedicated adjacent street rights-of-way or easement (Exhibit “A”), which Landowner and Subdivider will arrange to be installed by the local gas franchisee. Any additional cost participation required by the local gas franchisee for the installation of gas mains, if any, shall be borne by the Landowner and Subdivider.

B. Landowner and Subdivider shall arrange for underground electrical service to each buildable lot within the Area to be Developed to be provided by Loup Power District at no cost to the City. If any relocation or adjusting of existing electrical mains are required the costs shall be borne by the Landowner and Subdivider.

C. Grading for the Area to be Developed shall be completed by the Landowner and Subdivider at the Landowner’s and Subdivider’s expense pursuant to the site and drainage plan and submitted with the Minor or Administrative Plat. Post construction storm water management systems shall be installed and maintained and fully functional in accordance with the City of Columbus Code of Ordinances, Chapter 53, at Landowner’s and Subdivider’s expense. Landowner and Subdivider agree to obtain a Nebraska Department of Environment and Energy, National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES), Construction Storm Water Notice of Intent (NOI), including the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP), prior to disturbing more than one acre. The Landowner and Subdivider shall provide a copy of the NOI and SWPPP to the City as part of the City’s Municipal Storm Sewer Separation System requirements.

D. In conjunction with this platting, the Landowner and Subdivider agree to not object to any street or sidewalk improvement districts on the 33<sup>rd</sup> Avenue Frontage Road.

### SECTION II

Landowner, Subdivider and City covenant and agree that the Landowner and Subdivider shall abide by and incorporate into all of its construction contracts the provisions required by the regulations of the City pertaining to construction of public improvements, and testing procedures therefor, except as otherwise provided in this Development Agreement.

### SECTION III

A. Subject to the conditions and provisions hereinafter specified, the City hereby grants permission to the Landowner and Subdivider to connect its sewer system to the sewer

system of the City in such manner and at such place or places designated on plans submitted by the Landowner's and Subdivider's engineer and approved by the City.

B. Without prior written approval by the City, Landowner, and Subdivider shall not permit any sewer lines or sewers outside the present boundaries of the Area to be Developed to connect to the sewer or sewer lines of the Area to be Developed, any sewers of the City, any outfall sewer of the City, or any sewage treatment plant of the City. The City shall have exclusive control over connections to its sewers whether inside or outside the boundaries of the Area to be Developed.

C. At all times, all sewage from and through said Area to be Developed into the City sewer system shall be in conformity with the ordinances, regulations, and conditions applicable to sewers and sewage within the City as now existing and as from time to time may be amended.

D. Before any connection from any premises to the sewer system of the Area to be Developed may be made, a permit shall be obtained for said premises, and its connection from the City, it being expressly understood that the City reserves the right to collect all connection charges and fees as required by city ordinances or rules now or hereafter in force; all such connections shall comply with minimum standards prescribed by the City.

E. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Development Agreement, City retains the right to disconnect the sewer of any industry, or other sewer user within the Area to be Developed, which is discharging into the sewer system in violation of any applicable ordinance, statute, rule or regulations.

#### SECTION IV

All buildings and structures built in the Area to be Developed, shall be constructed in compliance with the most recent City of Columbus Building Requirements at the time of application for the building permits, in the extent possible.

#### SECTION V

Installation of entrance signs or related fixtures and any median landscaping and related fixtures, if any, shall be paid by the Landowner and Subdivider. Plans for such proposed improvements that are to be located in public right-of-way and a proposed maintenance agreement for the improvements must be submitted to the City for review and approval prior to the installation of improvements.

No separate administrative entity or joint venture, among the parties, is deemed created by virtue of the Development Agreement.

The administration of this Development Agreement shall be through the offices of the undersigned officers for their respective entities.

This Development Agreement shall be binding upon parties, their respective successors and assigns.

This Development Agreement replaces and declares void any prior agreements or resolutions regarding the development of the Area to be Developed

This Development Agreement shall be recorded at the Platte County Register of Deeds office, at the Landowner's and Subdivider's expense, simultaneously with the Plat and Deed of Dedication but no later than 30 days of final plat approval.

SECTION VI

The Landowner and Subdivider shall install all public and private improvements within a time period of two (2) years after the signing of this Development Agreement, except that sidewalks directly in front of houses shall be constructed before the Occupancy Certificate is issued or within four (4) years after the signing of this Development Agreement, whichever comes first. An extension of this time period shall be made by favorable recommendation of Planning Commission and approval by the City Council.

SECTION VII

This Agreement shall run with the land and shall be binding upon and insure to the benefit of all parties hereto, their successors and assigns, including all future lot owners of the Area to be Developed.

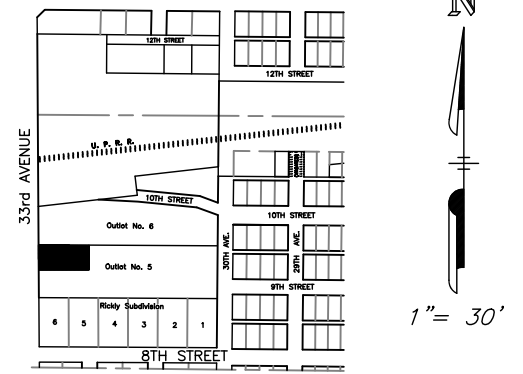

WHEREAS, the City is working with the Nebraska Department of Transportation (NDOT) Infrastructure Hub and NDOT consultant HDR Engineering on submitting the SS4A Implementation grant application; and

WHEREAS, letters of support are being obtained from State of Nebraska congressional delegation; Nebraska Department of Transportation; and project area schools, businesses and residences; for submittal with the grant application; and

WHEREAS, the SS4A Implementation grant provides a City funding commitment to show support of the City in the form of this letter of funding commitment; and

WHEREAS, the estimated project cost is \$19,360,200 with a City SS4A Implementation grant request of \$15,488,160 and a local commitment of \$3,872,040 from City allocations of state and non-federal dollars.

**DISCUSSION:**

The **Howard Boulevard: Safer Streets, Stronger Community** is a safety and connectivity-focused project that will revitalize the Howard Boulevard corridor with improvements that will reduce the potential for fatal and serious injury crashes, provide safe facilities for families and children traveling to and from school, and improve local community connectivity to businesses for our small, rural Nebraska city. A key corridor identified during Columbus' Comprehensive Safety Action Plan work in 2025, Howard Boulevard is an important community corridor that connects residents with Columbus' downtown business district and serves a mix of businesses, parks, churches, and two elementary schools. The proposed improvements will improve traffic flow, reduce the likelihood of serious crashes, and introduce enhanced and safer walking facilities for neighborhood families needing access to schools and businesses, creating reliable access where it does not exist today. The total estimated project cost is \$19,360,200 with the City submitting a grant request of \$15,488,160.

The City of Columbus local commitment is \$3,872,040 to deliver this project. These matching funds will include contributions from the City's allocations of Federal Funds Purchase Program and established city and state transportation budgets. All non-federal funding is fully committed and falls within each partner's existing programming authority.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

The total estimated project cost is \$19,360,200 with a grant request of \$15,488,160. The City funding would only be required if the SS4A Implementation grant is obtained and upon approval of the NDOT-City Program Agreement. The City commitment would be \$3,872,040 (20 percent) to be obtained from City allocations of State and non-federal dollars.

The amended total of the award will be \$30,000 reflecting the increase of \$16,530 on the amended application.

### RECOMMENDATION:

Approval of the amended application for the Downtown Revitalization Grant funds

### DISCUSSION:

The Downtown Business Improvement Board met on Monday, March 9, 2026 for their regular monthly meeting at which time the board reviewed the amended application received from Yonni Izaguirre for his commercial building located at 2319 13 St in downtown Columbus.

His original grant application included replacement windows as part of the project scope. Following review by the State Historical Society, the originally proposed windows were rejected because they did not meet the required commercial-grade standards for the project. As a result, Mr. Izaguirre obtained revised bids for compliant replacement windows, which significantly increased overall project costs.

In addition to the revised window scope, Mr. Izaguirre proposed painting the building exterior following the completion of tuckpointing work. The updated project scope now includes tuckpointing, commercial-grade replacement windows, and exterior painting. Total estimated project costs are approximately \$79,000.

After review and discussion, the Business Improvement District Board approved increasing the Downtown Revitalization Grant award from the originally approved amount of \$13,470 to \$30,000. The revised award reflects the increased project costs associated with meeting State Historical Society requirements and completing additional eligible exterior improvements.

Per Downtown Revitalization Grant guidelines, reimbursement eligibility is limited to work completed on the front and side facades of the building. Any work completed outside of those eligible areas will not qualify for reimbursement under the program.

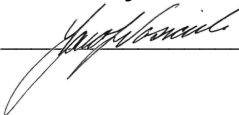

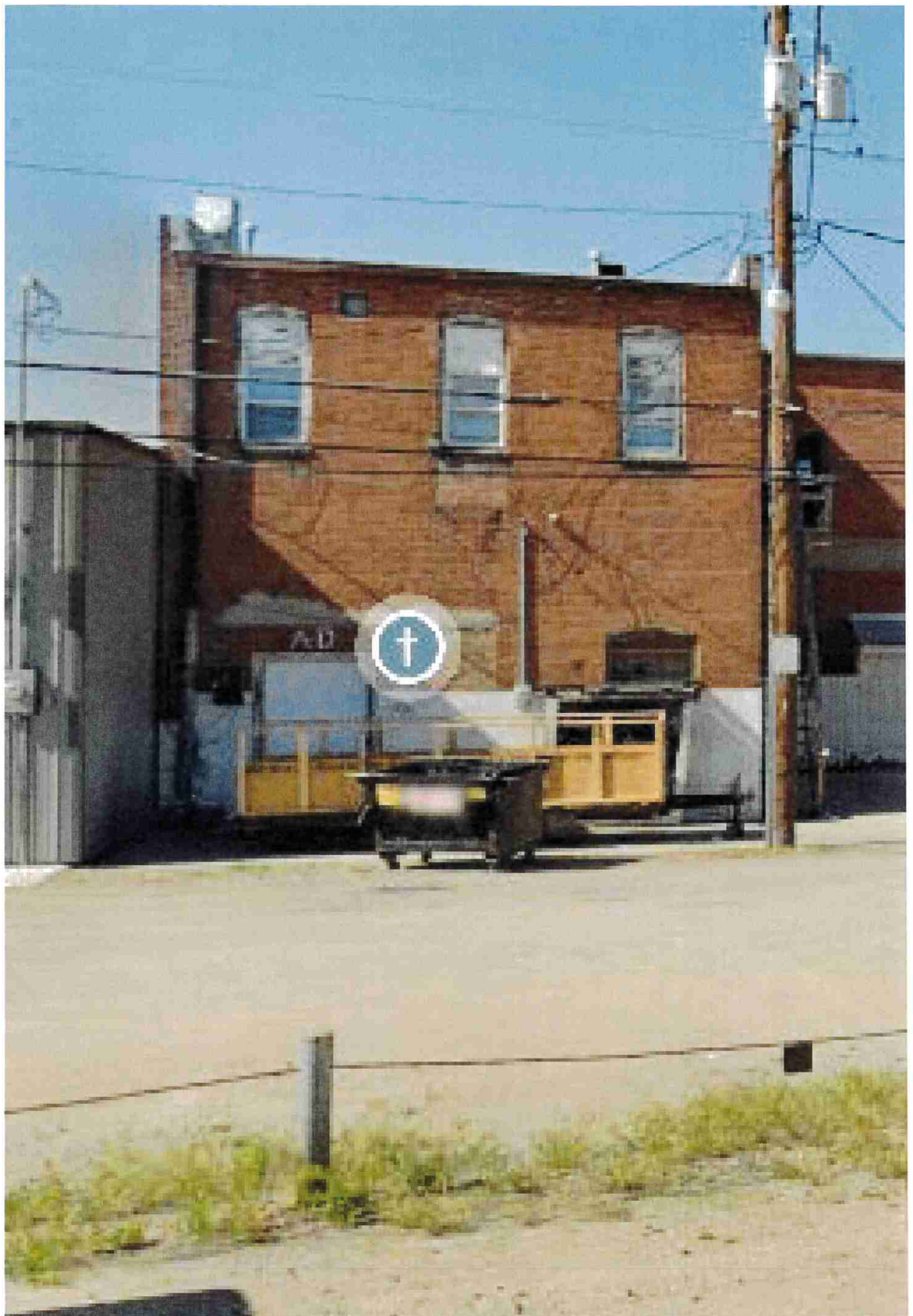

**Downtown Business Improvement District Board**  
**Meeting Minutes**  
**March 9, 2026**

Members Present: Kevin Johnson, Josh Johnson, Barb Duffy, Brett Rains, and Melanie Jensen. Absent: Nicole Lindhorst, Kiara Ziemba, Melissa Spearman, and Cory Reeder.

Others Present: Jean Van Iperen – Planning & Economic Development Coordinator, Kimberly Henggeler- RSVP Designs by Kimberly, Theresa Grape - Columbus Area Convention and Visitors Bureau, Wade Hilker – Central Community College, Angela Kerkman – CSP Printing and Lisa Slusarski – Central Community College.

Meeting was called to order at 1:03 p.m. Statement of compliance with Open Meeting Act was read and Roll Call was taken.

1. A motion was made by Duffy, seconded by Rains, to approve the minutes of the February 9, 2026 meeting. Motion carried 5–0.
2. Finances were reviewed. Motion by Duffy, second by J Johnson to approve the bill of Terracast Products LLC for 15 planters in the amount of \$8,086.05.
3. Committee Report
  - a. Marketing – Jensen will be talking over the radio broadcasts after this month so the board is to get a hold of her if they would like something mentioned. Jensen will be working on contacting businesses regarding getting information to Van Iperen for the Business Spotlights.
  - b. Business/Economic Development – Nothing to report.
  - c. Project Management – Banners still need to be installed. J. Johnson and K. Johnson have contacted Loup Public Power District to inquire about possible assistance and are currently waiting for a response. A special cap has been designed to help prevent wind from blowing the banners off the poles. A motion was made by Duffy and seconded by K. Johnson to approve the purchase of 100 caps at a cost of \$5.00 each. The motion carried. The Board was reminded that, with upcoming budget discussions, funds should be included for ongoing maintenance of banner brackets and replacement of flags as needed. The group should also plan for the cost of providing electrical service to poles where Christmas lights are anticipated to be installed.
  - d. Physical Grounds – New planters have been ordered, and their placement still needs to be determined. A walk-through of the downtown area will be scheduled with City staff to review potential locations and ensure placement does not create traffic sightline or safety issues.
4. Delinquent Notices – The notices have been sent out.
5. Downtown Revitalization Grant Application – An amended application was presented for Yonni Izaguirre for the Downtown Revitalization Grant. His original window bid was rejected by the State Historical Society because the windows were not commercial-grade. Yonni subsequently obtained new bids, which reflected a substantial increase in the cost of the windows. In addition, he expressed interest

in painting the building now that the tuckpointing work has been completed. The total project costs for the new windows, painting and tuckpointing is \$79,000. The Board approved revising the grant award from \$13,470 to \$30,000. The grant does only cover work done to the front and side of the building as per the guidelines so only those costs will be reimbursed. A motion to approved the revised grant amount was made by J Johnson and seconded by Jensen. Motion carried 5-0.

6. City Information – Van Iperen provided the following updates:
  - a. The Wayfinding Study is currently under review by the City. Parking lot signage will be considered a discretionary budget item, so any conversations Board members can have with City Council members regarding the importance of this investment in the downtown would be appreciated.
  - b. An update was provided on the Frankfort Square permanent lighting project.
  - c. The Board expressed interest in participating in Kind Columbus which will be held on Tuesday, April 28. An idea was presented and approved by the Board and coordination will begin to implement the plan. The Board also discussed organizing efforts that day to remove weeds in problem areas within the district and to coordinate a downtown trash pickup.
  - d. The Board discusses an email Van Iperen received regarding concerns about downtown parking. The issue was discussed at length and the Board decided they would continue following the City’s parking regulations and enforcement.
7. Guest Comments – Theresa Grape of the Columbus Area Convention and Visitors Bureau informed the board the theme for this year’s Columbus Days celebration is “Rockin’ in the USA.” The Chamber is requesting business support for the event, which is being spearheaded by Haley Behlen. Grape also reported Jenn Gjerde has been named the new Executive Director of Visit Nebraska. In addition, the Columbus Visitor’s Bureau is working with Adam Boggs of Norfolk to paint a mural on the side of their building. Angela Kerkman introduced herself to the Board. She shared she and her husband, Dusty Kerkman, recently purchased Columbus Screen Printing from Tom and Jenny Schwank. Wade Hilker of Central Community College updated the Board on Earth Day planting plans. Planting will begin on April 22 at 4 p.m. and he will coordinate efforts with Keep Columbus Beautiful. Removal of existing plantings is expected to begin around the first of April. New plantings will start along the 23<sup>rd</sup> Street corridor and then move into the downtown area.
8. Next Meeting – Monday, April 13, 2026 at 1 p.m. in the large conference room.
9. Meeting adjourned at 2:07 p.m.

WHEREAS, the Underlying Agreement was made pursuant to Lender's "840" Local Economic Development Program; and

WHEREAS, due to the passing of K Herman Development, LLC's owner, circumstances have arisen wherein K Herman Development, LLC is no longer able to abide by the terms of said agreement; and

WHEREAS, Valley Drive Properties, LLC is willing and able to assume the Loan Agreement, related documentation, and all of K Herman Development, LLC's accompanying obligations, responsibilities, and duties regarding the same; and

WHEREAS, the City and Valley Drive Properties, LLC are desirous to proceed with a loan assumption under the terms the Loan Assumption Agreement which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS, NEBRASKA, that the Loan Assumption Agreement with Valley Drive Properties, LLC regarding the city's economic development loan with K Herman Development, LLC for work force housing development project is hereby approved, a copy of said Loan Assumption Agreement is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference; and the Mayor is authorized, directed and empowered to execute the same on behalf of the City of Columbus.

This resolution shall repeal all resolutions or portions thereof in conflict herewith.

RE: Loan Assumption Agreement and Deed of Reconveyance – Valley Drive Properties, LLC.

### RECOMMENDATION:

Approval of the Loan Assumption Agreement and the necessary supporting documents for Valley Drive Properties, LLC.

### DISCUSSION:

The City previously entered into an LB840 Loan Agreement with K Herman Development, LLC for two separate housing development projects. One project involved residential construction within the Vitality Village development, while the second project involved a proposed development located near the hospital area. As part of the original agreement, K Herman Development, LLC executed a Deed of Trust in favor of the City to secure the LB840 loan obligations.

Following the disbursement of funds and commencement of construction activity related to the Vitality Village homes, K Herman passed away. Since that time, ownership and responsibility for the Vitality Village project have been transferred to Valley Drive Properties, LLC. Valley Drive Properties, LLC will be assuming responsibility for repayment of the LB840 loan and compliance with all associated terms and requirements related to the project.

In order to properly document this transition, the City is being asked to approve a Loan Assumption Agreement allowing Valley Drive Properties, LLC to assume the obligations previously held by K Herman Development, LLC. Once the assumption agreement is executed, the City will also need to execute a Deed of Reconveyance releasing the existing Deed of Trust executed by K Herman Development, LLC and replace it with a new Deed of Trust from Valley Drive Properties, LLC securing the property and loan obligations moving forward.

The original LB840 Loan Agreement also included a second separate housing project. Funds associated with that portion of the project were never disbursed, and construction had not commenced prior to October 2, 2025, as required under the agreement. As a result, that portion of the agreement is currently considered to be in default.

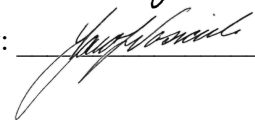
Should Valley Drive Properties, LLC wish to proceed with the hospital-area project and seek disbursement of those remaining LB840 funds, the company will be required to submit a formal application to the City requesting an amendment to the original LB840 Agreement. Any such request would need to include updated project timelines, repayment terms, and any other information deemed necessary by the City. Approval of any amendment request would be at the sole discretion of the City Council.

# **LOAN ASSUMPTION AGREEMENT**

This Agreement is made and entered into as of the dates indicated below, by and between The City of Columbus, a municipal corporation of the State of Nebraska (hereinafter referred to as the "Lender"), and Valley Drive Properties, LLC, a limited liability company of the State of Nebraska (hereinafter referred to as "Assumer").

WHEREAS, K Herman Development LLC and Lender entered in to a "Loan Agreement" on or about April 7, 2025, (hereinafter referred to as the "Underlying Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Underlying Agreement is evidenced via City of Columbus Resolution No. R25-749; and

WHEREAS, the Underlying Agreement was made pursuant to Lender's "840" Local Economic Development Program; and

WHEREAS, due to the passing of K Herman Development LLC's owner, circumstances have arisen wherein K Herman Development LLC is no longer able to abide by the terms of said agreement; and

WHEREAS, Assumer is willing and able to assume the Loan Agreement, related documentation, and all of K Herman Development LLC's accompanying obligations, responsibilities, and duties regarding the same; and

WHEREAS, the Lender and Assumer are desirous to proceed with a loan assumption under the terms as stated herein.

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:**

1. **General Assumption.** Assumer agrees and shall hereinafter be obligated and liable for any and all payments, responsibilities, obligations, and duties of K Herman Development LLC as set out in the Underlying Agreement and its associated Deeds of Trust and Promissory Notes. The Underlying Agreement, and its associated Deeds of Trust, Promissory Notes, are herein incorporated by this reference and made a part of this Loan Assumption Agreement.

2. **Unpaid Balance.** Assumer shall timely make all payments to Lender as required under the Underlying Agreement.

3. **No Impairment of Liens.** The real property described in the Underlying Agreement shall remain (or, to the extent necessary, will be) subject to any and all liens, charges, and encumbrances as set out in the Underlying Agreement and its accompanying Deeds of Trust, Promissory Notes. Nothing contained herein or done hereto shall affect or be construed to affect any of the liens, charges, encumbrances, and Deeds of Trust, nor shall the priority of any of the same (or the ability to file and record the same) be negatively be affected.

4. **Additional Liens, Charges, Encumbrances, and Deeds of Trust.** Assumer shall execute and allow to be filed and/or recorded any and all liens, charges, encumbrances, and Deeds of Trust, Promissory Notes, etc., that Lender in its sole discretion determines is necessary to adequately secure Lender's interests and the underlying loan.

5. **Project 1 and Project 2.** The Underlying Agreement set out two "Projects" (i.e., Project 1 and Project 2) pertaining to residential home development. The parties acknowledge that:

- a. Project 1: Construction of Project 1 has already begun and is underway. Lender previously distributed the funds for this project to K Herman Development LLC. Assumer has the necessary access to said funds or to the material and services that said funds may have already been used for. Lender shall not distribute any further funds for this Project 1. Attached as Exhibit A is an updated loan Amortization schedule for Assumer's repayment of the amount borrowed for Project 1 based on when Project 1 funds were dispersed to K Herman Development LLC.
- b. Project 2: Planning, construction, and other preliminary requirements of Project 2 have been delayed and have not yet begun by K Herman Development LLC or by Assumer. Accordingly, K Herman Development LLC or by Assumer are not eligible for Project 2 funds, and Lender has not distributed any of the funds for Project 2 at the time this Loan Assumption Agreement was entered into. The parties understand that K Herman Development LLC is currently out of compliance with its timelines as to Project 2. Accordingly, Lender shall not distribute any funds for this Project 2. Should Assumer desire to continue on with Project 2 and desire use of the City's Local Economic Development Program, it will need to make formal application to Lender for an amendment to the Underlying Agreement for updated timelines and repayment terms. Assumer agrees and acknowledges that approval of said loan amendment is at the sole discretion of the Lender.

6. **LLC Resolution Needed.** A resolution from the Assumer which explicitly authorizes the approval of this Loan Assumption Agreement and the execution of any and all necessary documents (including, but not necessarily limited, to Deeds of Trust, Promissory Notes,

etc.) shall be supplied by Assumer to Lender at the time Assumer executes this Agreement.

7. **Notices.** The Parties expressly agree for the purposes of notice, including legal service of process during the term of this Agreement and for the period of any applicable statutes of limitations thereafter, for the following named individuals shall be the authorized representatives of the parties.

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Or such other representative at such address as either Party may designate from time to time by written notice to the other Party in accordance with this Paragraph.

All notices, requests, demands or other communications under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been given the date of service if served personally on the party to whom notice is given or on the fifth (5<sup>th</sup>) day after mailing if mailed to the party to whom notice is to be given, by first class mail, registered or certified, postage prepaid and properly addressed as shown above.

8. **Consent and Acknowledgment Agreement Required.** K Herman Development LLC shall be required to consent to and acknowledge this Loan Assumption. Attached as Exhibit B, and incorporated by this reference, is K Herman Development LLC's Consent and Acknowledgment Agreement.

9. **Non-Waiver.** No waiver by Lender of any default shall operate as a waiver of any other default or of the same default on a future occasion.

10. **Applicable Law.** Lender and Assumer agree that Nebraska law shall govern this Agreement. The Parties shall submit to personal jurisdiction and subject matter jurisdiction of the State of Nebraska in Platte County for any dispute between the Parties. Assumer shall further comply will any and all Zoning, Permitting, and City Code requirements of the City of Columbus, Nebraska.

11. **Binding Effect.** This Agreement shall extend to and be binding upon the heirs, personal representatives, successors and assigns, and each other person or legal entity (including guarantors, endorsers, and sureties) of the parties hereto.

12. **Severability.** Invalidation of any one or more of the provisions of this Agreement, by judgment or court order, shall in no way affect any other provision of the Agreement, which other provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

13. **Caption Headings.** Caption Headings in this Agreement are for convenience only and are not to be used to interpret or define the provisions of the Agreement.

14. **Modification of Agreement.** This Agreement may not be modified, altered, changed, or amended except by written instrument executed by all Parties hereto.

15. **Authorization.** Assumer's execution, delivery, and performance of this Agreement have been duly authorized by all necessary action by the Assumer and does not conflict with, result in a violation of, or constitute a default under any provision of any agreement or other instrument binding upon the Assumer, or with any law, regulation, or court order that is applicable to the Assumer in any way. Kallan Herman has been authorized to sign all documents associated with this Agreement on Assumer's behalf.

16. **Counterparts.** Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, including by way of electronically scanned or emailed signatures, each of which shall be an original and which together shall constitute a single document.

17. **Full Integration.** This document is a fully integrated agreement and supersedes any and all prior agreements, whether oral or written, between the parties, and this document embodies a full and complete understanding of the parties.

Trustor now has or may hereafter acquire in the Property, all easements, rights-of-way, tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereof and thereto, all water rights, all mineral rights, all rights, titles and interests of Trustor, now owned or hereafter acquired, in and to any land lying within the right-of-way of any street or highway adjoining the Property, and any and all alleys and strips and gores of land adjacent to or used in connection with the Property, any and all buildings and improvements now or hereafter erected thereon, including, but not limited to, the fixtures, attachments, appliances, equipment, machinery, and other articles attached to such buildings and improvements (hereinafter the "Improvements"), and all the estate interests, rights, titles, other claims or demands which Trustor now has or may hereafter acquire in the Property, and any and all awards made for the taking by eminent domain, or by any proceeding or purchase in lieu thereof, of the whole or any part of the Trust Estate, including without limitation any awards resulting from a change of grade of streets and awards for severance damages. The entire estate, property and interest hereby conveyed to Trustee may hereafter be referred to as the "Trust Estate".

**FOR THE PURPOSE OF SECURING.**

A. The Beneficiary has made loan as herein described in this document to Trustor Valley Drive Properties, LLC under the Beneficiary's Local Economic Development Fund.

B. Payment of an indebtedness in the total principal amount of \$600,000.00, with an annual interest rate of two percent (2%) per annum, evidenced by that certain Promissory Note of even date herewith (hereinafter the "Note") with a maturity date as specified in said Note, executed by Trustor, which has been delivered and is payable to the order of Beneficiary, and which by this reference is hereby made a part hereof, and any and all modifications, extensions and renewals thereof, and;

C. Payment of all sums advanced by Beneficiary to protect the Trust Estate, with interest thereon at the rate as specified in said Note. This Deed of Trust, the Promissory Note, Loan Agreement, Loan Assumption Agreement, and any other instrument(s) given to evidence or further secure the payment and performance of any obligation secured hereby may hereafter be referred to collectively as the "Loan Instruments".

TO PROTECT THE SECURITY OF THIS DEED OF TRUST, TRUSTOR HEREBY COVENANTS AND AGREES AS FOLLOWS:

1. Payment of Obligation. To pay when due the principal, and the interest, on the indebtedness evidenced by the Note, charges, fees, and all other sums as provided in the Loan Instruments.

2. Maintenance and Compliance with Laws. To keep the Trust Estate in good condition and repair; not to remove, demolish or substantially alter (except such alterations as may be required by laws, ordinances or regulations) any of the Improvements; to promptly restore in a good and workmanlike manner any Improvement which may be damaged or destroyed thereon, and to pay when due all claims for labor performed and materials furnished therefore, to comply with all laws, ordinances, regulations, covenants, conditions and restrictions now or hereafter affecting the Trust Estate or any part thereof or requiring any alterations or improvements; not to commit or permit any waste or deterioration of the Trust Estate, not to commit, suffer or permit any act to be done in or upon the Trust Estate in violation of any law, ordinance or regulation, and to pay and promptly discharge at Trustor's cost and expense all liens, encumbrances and charges levied, imposed or assessed against the Trust Estate or any part thereof.

3. Required Insurance. To at all times provide, maintain and keep in force, fire and extended coverage insurance against loss or damage to the Improvements. Such insurance policies shall contain a standard mortgage clause in favor of the Beneficiary and shall not be canceled or terminated without thirty (30) days prior written notice to Beneficiary. Evidence of such insurance shall be provided by Trustor upon request in an amount not less than the original amount of the Note. After the occurrence of any casualty to the Trust Estate or any part thereof, Trustor shall give prompt written notice thereof to Beneficiary. In the event of any damage or destruction of the Improvements, Beneficiary shall have the option in its sole discretion of applying all or part of the insurance proceeds (i) to any indebtedness secured hereby and in such order as Beneficiary may determine, or (ii) to the restoration of the Improvements or (iii) to Trustor.

4. Taxes and Impositions.

(a) Trustor agrees to pay directly at least ten (10) days prior to delinquency, all real property taxes and assessments, general and special, and all other taxes and assessments of any kind or nature whatsoever, which are assessed or imposed upon the Trust Estate, or become due and which create, may create or appear to create a lien upon the Trust Estate, or any part thereof, (all of which taxes, assessments and other governmental and non-governmental charges of like nature are hereinafter referred to as "Impositions"). Trustor will provide Beneficiary paid receipts of such payments being made upon the occurrence of such payment.

(b) If at any time after the date hereof there shall be assessed or imposed (i) a tax or assessment of the Trust Estate in lieu of or in addition to the Impositions payable by Trustor pursuant to subparagraph (a) hereof, or (ii) a license fee, tax or assessment imposed on Beneficiary or this Trust Deed and measured by or based in whole or in part upon the amount of the outstanding obligations secured hereby, then all such taxes, assessments or fees shall be deemed to be included within the term "Impositions" as defined in subparagraph (a) hereof, and Trustor shall pay and discharge the same as herein provided with respect to the payment of Impositions or, at the option of Beneficiary, all obligations secured hereby together with all accrued interest thereon, shall immediately become due and payable. Anything to the contrary herein notwithstanding, Trustor shall have no obligation to pay any franchise, estate inheritance, income, excess profits or similar tax levied on Beneficiary or on the obligations secured hereby.

5. Actions Affecting Trust Estate. To appear in and contest any action or proceeding purporting to affect the security hereof or the rights or powers of Beneficiary or Trustee; and to pay all costs and expenses, including cost of evidence of title and attorney's fees, in any such action or proceeding in which Beneficiary or Trustee may appear. Should Trustor fail to make any payment or to do any act as and, in the manner, provided in any of the Loan Instruments, Beneficiary and/or Trustee, each in its own discretion, without obligation so to do and without notice to or demand upon Trustor and without releasing Trustor from any obligation, may make or do the same in such manner and to such extent as either may deem necessary to protect the security hereof. Trustor shall, immediately upon demand therefor by Beneficiary, pay all costs and expenses incurred by Beneficiary in connection with the exercise by Beneficiary of the foregoing right, including without limitation costs of evidence of title, court costs, appraisals, surveys and attorney's fees.

6. Eminent Domain. Should the Trust Estate, or any part thereof or interest therein, be taken or damaged by reason of any public improvement or condemnation proceeding, or in any other manner ("Condemnation"), or should Trustor receive any notice or other information regarding such proceeding, Trustor shall give prompt written notice thereof to Beneficiary. Beneficiary shall be entitled to all compensation, awards and other payments or relief therefor, and shall be entitled at its option to commence, appear in and prosecute in its own name any action or proceedings. Beneficiary shall also be entitled to make any compromise or settlement in connection with such taking or damage. All such compensation, awards, damages, rights of action and proceeds awarded to Trustor (hereinafter the "Proceeds") are hereby assigned to Beneficiary and Trustor agrees to execute such further assignments of the Proceeds as Beneficiary or Trustee may require. In the event any portion of the Trust Estate is so taken or damaged, Beneficiary shall have the option, in its sole and absolute discretion, to apply all such Proceeds, after deducting therefrom all costs and expenses (regardless of the particular nature thereof and whether incurred with or without suit), including attorney's fees, incurred by it in connection with such Proceeds, upon any indebtedness secured hereby and in such order as Beneficiary may determine, or to apply all such Proceeds, after such deductions, to the restoration of the Trust Estate upon such conditions as Beneficiary may determine. Such application or release shall not cure or waive any default or notice of default hereunder or invalidate any act done pursuant to such notice.

7. Appointment of Successor Trustee. Beneficiary may, from time to time, by a written instrument executed and acknowledged by Beneficiary, mailed to Trustor and Recorded in the County in which the Trust Estate is located and by otherwise complying with the provisions of the applicable law of the State of Nebraska substitute a successor or successors to the Trustee named herein or acting hereunder.

8. Successors and Assigns. This Deed of Trust applies to, inures to the benefit of and binds all parties hereto, their heirs, legatees, devisees, personal representatives, successors and assigns. The term "Beneficiary" shall mean the owner and holder of the Note, whether or not

named as Beneficiary herein.

9. Inspections. Beneficiary, or its agents, representatives or workmen, are authorized to enter at any reasonable time upon or in any part of the Trust Estate for the purpose of inspecting the same and for the purpose of performing any of the acts it is authorized to perform under the terms of any of the Loan Instruments.

10. Beneficiary's Powers. Without affecting the liability of any other person liable for the payment of any obligation herein mentioned, and without affecting the lien or charge of this Deed of Trust upon any portion of the Property not then or theretofore released as security for the full amount of all unpaid obligations, Beneficiary may, from time to time and without notice (i) release any person so liable, (ii) extend the maturity or alter any of the terms of any such obligations, (iii) grant other indulgences, (iv) release or reconvey, or cause to be released or reconveyed at any time at Beneficiary's option any parcel, portion or all of the Trust Estate, (v) take or release any other or additional security for any obligation herein mentioned, or (vi) make compositions or other arrangements with debtors in relation thereto.

11. Events of Default. Any of the following events shall be deemed an event of default hereunder:

(a) Default shall be made in the payment of any installment of principal or interest or any other sum secured hereby when due; or

(b) Trustor shall file a voluntary petition in bankruptcy or shall be adjudicated a bankrupt or insolvent, or shall file any petition or answer seeking or acquiescing in any reorganization, arrangement, composition, readjustment, liquidation, dissolution or similar relief for itself under any present or future federal, state or other statute, law or regulation relating to bankruptcy, insolvency or other relief for debtors; or shall seek or consent to or acquiesce in the appointment of any trustee, receiver or liquidator of Trustor or of all or any part of the Trust Estate, or of any or all of the royalties, revenues, rents, issues or profits thereof, or shall make any general assignment for the benefit of creditors, or shall admit in writing its inability to pay its debts generally as they become due; or

(c) A court of competent jurisdiction shall enter an order, judgment or decree approving a petition filed against Trustor seeking any reorganization, dissolution or similar relief under any present or future federal, state or other statute, law or regulation relating to bankruptcy, insolvency or other relief for debtors, and such order, judgment or decree shall remain unvacated and unstayed for an aggregate of sixty (60) days (whether or not consecutive) from the first date of entry thereof; or any trustee, receiver or liquidator or Trustor or of all or any part of the Trust Estate, or of any or all of the royalties, revenues, rents, issues or profits thereof, shall be appointed without the consent or acquiescence of Trustor and such appointment shall remain unvacated and unstayed for an aggregate of sixty (60) days (whether or not consecutive); or

(d) A writ of execution or attachment or any similar process shall be entered against Trustor which shall become a lien on the Trust Estate or any portion thereof, or interest therein and such execution, attachment or similar process of judgment is not released, bonded, satisfied, vacated, or stayed within sixty (60) days after its entry or levy; or

(e) There has occurred a breach of or default under any term, covenant, agreement,

condition, provision, representation, or warranty contained in the Deed of Trust, Promissory Note, or other related Loan Agreement and Documents; or

(f) There has occurred a default under any loan, extension of credit, security agreement, purchase or sales agreement, in favor of any other creditor or person that may materially affect any of Trustor's property or Trustor's ability to repay that indebtedness or Trustor's ability to perform Trustor's obligation under this Deed of Trust or any related document; or

(g) A material adverse change in Trustor's financial conditions, or Beneficiary believes the prospect of payment or performance of the indebtedness is impaired; or

(h) Trustor's default(s) with any junior creditor / junior lien holder; or

(i) The Beneficiary in good faith believes itself is insecure as to the loan.

12. Acceleration Upon Default; Additional Remedies. In the event of default Beneficiary may declare all indebtedness secured hereby to be due and payable and the same shall thereupon become due and payable without any presentment, demand, protest or notice of any kind. Thereafter Beneficiary may:

(i) Either in person or by agent, with or without bringing any action or proceeding, or by a receiver appointed by a court and without regard to the adequacy of its security, enter upon and take possession of the Trust Estate, or any part thereof, in its own name or in the name of trustee, and do any acts which it deems necessary or desirable to preserve the value, marketability or rentability of the Trust Estate, or part thereof or interest therein, increase the income therefrom or protect the security hereof and, with or without taking possession of the Trust Estate, sue for or otherwise collect the rents, issues and profits thereof, including those past due and unpaid, and apply the same, less costs and expenses of operation and collection including attorney's fees, upon any indebtedness secured hereby, all in such order as Beneficiary may determine. The entering upon and taking possession of the Trust Estate, the collection of such rents, issues and profits and the application thereof as aforesaid, shall not cure or waive any default or notice of default hereunder or invalidate any act done in response to such default or pursuant to such notice of default and, notwithstanding the continuance in possession of the Trust Estate or the collection, receipt and application of rents, issues or profits, Trustee or Beneficiary shall be entitled to exercise every right provided for in any of the Loan Instruments or by law upon occurrence of any event of default, including the right to exercise the power of sale;

(ii) Enact the power of sale and commence an action to foreclose this Deed of Trust as a mortgage, appoint a receiver, or specifically enforce any of the covenants hereof;

(iii) Deliver to Trustee a written declaration of default and demand for sale, and a written notice of default and election to cause Trustor's interest in the Trust Estate to be sold, which notice Trustee shall cause to be duly filed for record in the Official Records of the County in which the Trust Estate is located.

13. Foreclosure By Power of Sale. Should Beneficiary elect to foreclose by exercise of the power of sale herein contained, Beneficiary shall notify Trustee and shall deposit with Trustee this Deed of Trust and the Note and such receipts and evidence of expenditures made and secured hereby as Trustee may require.

(a) Upon receipt of such notice from Beneficiary, Trustee shall cause to be recorded,

published and delivered to Trustor such Notice of Default as then required by law and by this Deed of Trust. Trustee shall, without demand on Trustor, after lapse or such time as may then be required by law and after recording of such Notice of Default and after Notice of Sale having been given as required by law, sell the Trust Estate at the time and place of sale fixed by it in such Notice of Sale, either as a whole, or in separate lots or parcels or items as Trustee shall deem expedient, and in such order as it may determine, at public auction to the highest bidder for cash in lawful money of the United States payable at the time of sale. Trustee shall deliver to such purchaser or purchasers thereof its good and sufficient deed or deeds conveying the property so sold, but without any covenant or warranty, express or implied. The recitals in such deed of any matters or facts shall be conclusive proof of the truthfulness thereof. Any person, including, without limitation, Trustor, Trustee or Beneficiary, may purchase at such sale and Trustor hereby covenants to warrant and defend the title of such purchaser or purchasers.

(b) After deducting all costs, fees and expenses of Trustee and of this Trust, including costs of evidence of title in connection with sale, Trustee shall apply the proceeds of sale to payment of: All sums expended under the terms hereof, not then repaid, with accrued interest as specified in said note; all other sums then secured hereby and the remainder, if any, to the person or persons legally entitled thereto.

(c) Trustee may postpone sale of all or any portion of the Trust Estate by public announcement at such time and place of sale, and from time to time thereafter may postpone such sale by public announcement at the time fixed by the preceding postponement or subsequently noticed sale, and without further notice, except such as may be required by statute, make such sale at the time fixed by the last postponement, or may, in its discretion, give a new notice of sale.

14. Appointment of Receiver. If an event of default described in Section 12 of this Deed of Trust shall have occurred and be continuing, Beneficiary, as a matter of right and without notice to Trustor or anyone claiming under Trustor, and without regard to the then value of the Trust Estate of the interest of Trustor therein, shall have the right to apply to any court having jurisdiction to appoint a receiver or receivers of the Trust Estate, and Trustor hereby irrevocably consents to such appointment and waives notice of any application therefor.

15. Remedies Not Exclusive. Trustee and Beneficiary, and each of them, shall be entitled to enforce payment and performance of any indebtedness or obligations secured hereby and to exercise all rights and powers under this Deed of Trust or under any Loan Instrument or other agreement or any laws now or hereafter in force, notwithstanding some or all of the such indebtedness and obligations secured hereby may now or hereafter be otherwise secured, whether by mortgage, deed of trust, pledge, lien, assignment or otherwise. Neither the acceptance of this Deed of Trust nor its enforcement whether by court action or pursuant to the power of sale or other powers herein contained, shall prejudice or in any manner affect Trustee's or Beneficiary's right to realize upon or enforce any other security now or hereafter held by Trustee or Beneficiary, its being agreed that Trustee and Beneficiary, and each of them, shall be entitled to enforce this Deed of Trust and any other security now or hereafter held by Beneficiary or Trustee in such order and manner as they or either of them may in their absolute discretion

determine. No remedy herein conferred upon or reserved to Trustee or Beneficiary is intended to be exclusive of any other remedy herein or by law provided or permitted, but each shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other remedy given hereunder or now or hereafter existing at law or in equity or by statute. Every power or remedy given by any of the Loan Instruments to Trustee or Beneficiary or to which either of them may be otherwise entitled, may be exercised, concurrently or independently, from time to time and as often as may be deemed expedient by Trustee or Beneficiary and either of them may pursue inconsistent remedies. Nothing herein shall be construed as prohibiting Beneficiary from seeking a deficiency judgment against the Trustor to the extent such action is permitted by law.

16. Request for Notice. Trustor hereby requests a copy of any notice of default and that any notice of sale hereunder be mailed to it at the address set forth in the first paragraph of this Deed of Trust.

17. Governing Law. This Deed of Trust shall be governed by the laws of the State of Nebraska. In the event that any provision or clause of any of the Loan Instruments conflicts with applicable laws, such conflicts shall not affect other provisions of such Loan Instruments which can be given effect without the conflicting provision, and to this end the provisions of the Loan Instruments are declared to be severable. This instrument cannot be waived, changed, discharged or terminated orally, but only by an instrument in writing signed by the party against whom enforcement of any waiver, change, discharge or termination is sought.

18. Reconveyance by Trustee. Upon written request of Beneficiary stating that all sums secured hereby have been paid, and upon surrender of this Deed of Trust and the Note to Trustee for cancellation and retention and upon payment by Trustor of Trustee's fees, Trustee shall reconvey to Trustor, or the person or persons legally entitled thereto, without warranty, any portion of the Trust Estate then held hereunder. The recitals in such reconveyance of any matters or facts shall be conclusive proof of the truthfulness thereof. The grantee in any reconveyance may be described as "the person or persons legally entitled thereto".

19. Notices. Whenever Beneficiary, Trustor or Trustee shall desire to give or serve any notice, demand, request or other communication with respect to this Deed of Trust, each such notice demand, request or other communication shall be in writing and shall be effective only if the same is delivered by personal service or mailed by certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, addressed to the address set forth at the beginning of this Deed of Trust. Any party may at any time change its address for such notices by delivering or mailing to the other parties hereto, as aforesaid, a notice of such change.

20. Acceptance by Trustee. Trustee accepts this Trust when this Deed of Trust, duly executed and acknowledged, is made a public record as provided by law.

21. Invalidity of Certain Provisions. If the lien of this Deed of Trust is invalid or unenforceable as to any part of the debt, or if the lien is invalid or unenforceable as to any part of

the Trust Estate, the unsecured or partially secured portion of the debt shall be completely paid prior to the payment of the remaining and secured or partially secured portion of the debt, and all payments made on the debt, whether voluntary or under foreclosure or other enforcement action or procedure, shall be considered to have been first paid on and applied to the full payment of that portion of the debt which is not secured or fully secured by the lien on this Deed of Trust.

A wide range of achievements may be recognized, including individual performance, team efforts, departmental accomplishments, and citizen contributions that support the effective delivery of municipal services. Nominations may be submitted by employees, supervisors, Department Heads, and citizens, as appropriate. All nominations are evaluated by the Department Heads based on established award criteria and merit. **RE:** Supplemental Information – Proposed Solid Waste Ordinance Amendment

### DISCUSSION:

The following information is provided in response to questions and concerns raised regarding the proposed amendment to the city's solid waste ordinance.

#### 1. What will the fee for a violation be?

Violations of the ordinance would be enforced pursuant to the city's general penalty provisions. Violations may result in citations, fines, court costs, and compliance orders. The current general penalty ordinance:

##### § 10.99 GENERAL PENALTY.

Any person who violates any of the prohibitions or provisions of any chapter or section of this code shall be deemed guilty of an offense, hereinafter termed a misdemeanor. Unless otherwise specified in the particular chapter or section for which the person stands convicted of a violation, the penalty for such violation shall be in an amount not to exceed \$500, in the discretion of the court.

The proposed violation is currently classified as a misdemeanor offense, with the potential for court-ordered restitution to reimburse the city for clean-up and abatement costs. Because of restitution and the need for oversight in chronic nuisance situations, the original intent was for violations to be handled through a mandatory court appearance citation.

If the City would prefer a waiver fine structure for initial violations, the ordinance could be administered as follows:

- First offense: \$250 waiver fine
- Second offense: Mandatory court

#### 2. What will Code Enforcement and/or the Police Department do if an individual continues to not comply?

Enforcement would follow the normal compliance process. Typical steps include:

- Initial contact and education regarding the violation;
  - Written notice providing time for corrective action;
  - Follow-up inspections by code enforcement staff;
  - Issuance of citations when voluntary compliance is not achieved;
-

- Continued enforcement action through court when necessary.
- Abatement if necessary and requests to the court for restitution to the city for the cost.

In cases involving significant public health or safety concerns, the city may also utilize nuisance abatement procedures authorized under state law and city code. This can include city-authorized cleanup of the property when conditions remain uncorrected after notice has been provided.

### **3. What happens if citations are not paid?**

Unpaid citations are processed through the court system in the same manner as other ordinance violations. Failure to appear or failure to satisfy court-imposed penalties may result in additional court action as authorized by Nebraska law and local ordinance.

Additionally, if the city incurs costs associated with nuisance abatement or cleanup, those costs may be assessed against the property or the court could order restitution pursuant to applicable city code provisions and state statutes.

### **4. Costs incurred by the City for cleanup and enforcement**

The city has incurred expenses related to the cleanup of properties containing excessive garbage, refuse, and solid waste accumulation. These costs have totaled \$4,796.24 since 2024. These costs are currently absorbed by the City, with liens being placed on the property. The recovery of the cost by the city would potentially be recouped upon the sale of the property.

The City currently has active liens associated with prior nuisance abatement and clean-up actions on multiple properties. The current outstanding lien amounts include:

- \$406.32
- \$210.88
- \$3,123.07
- \$210.88

There is only one additional property where the City completed abatement that does not currently have an active lien filed against the property. The cost associated with that abatement was \$434.41.

Under this proposed amendment the city could request the court to order the responsible party to provide restitution to the city for any and all cost incurred for clean-up.

### **5. Additional Considerations**

The proposed ordinance amendment was developed to provide clearer authority and expectations regarding the handling and disposal of solid waste within the city limits.

The goal of enforcement is to obtain compliance and improve neighborhood conditions while allowing reasonable opportunities for property owners or occupants to correct violations.

The ordinance is not intended to target isolated or temporary conditions but rather repeated or ongoing accumulations that negatively impact surrounding properties and the community as a whole.

Staff will continue to prioritize education and voluntary compliance whenever possible before pursuing formal enforcement action.

## **§ 50.35 HANDLING OF SOLID WASTE**

**(A)** No person shall accumulate, store, or dispose of solid waste upon any property in a manner that creates a nuisance, health hazard, or violates state or local regulations.

**(B)** All solid waste generated on any property shall be removed and properly disposed of on a routine basis, but no less than once per week. Disposal shall occur by:

1. A licensed private waste hauler; or
2. The owner, occupant, or person responsible for the property transporting such waste to the City of Columbus Transfer Station.

**(C)** Solid waste shall be stored in suitable containers designed to prevent leakage, odor, and access by animals.

**(D)** Open dumping and the burning of solid waste are prohibited within the limits of the city.

**(E)** The owner, occupant, or person in control of the property shall be responsible for compliance with this section.

1. Upon complaint or observation of a violation of subsections (A) and (B), Code Enforcement Officers or Police Officers of the Columbus Police Department may issue a red tag notice identifying the violation and providing notice that the violation must be corrected within five (5) calendar days.
2. If the violation is not corrected by the sixth (6th) calendar day following issuance of the red tag notice, a citation shall be issued for a first offense and notice of abatement may be provided allowing up to an additional five (5) calendar days for compliance.
3. If the violation is not corrected by the eleventh (11th) calendar day following issuance of the red tag notice, a second offense citation shall be issued requiring a mandatory court appearance, and the property may be abated by the city in accordance with applicable procedures.

**(F)** Violations of subsection (B) shall be punishable as follows:

1. First offense: \$250 fine.
2. Second offense: Mandatory court appearance.

**(G)** All loads of waste transported to the City of Columbus Transfer Station in vehicles shall be covered; provided, however, this requirement shall not apply when the entire load consists of material of such bulk or weight that it is unlikely to blow or fall from the vehicle while being operated at lawful highway speeds.

**ORDINANCE NO. 26-08**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS, NEBRASKA, AMENDING COLUMBUS CITY CODE (ORDINANCE NO. 24-01) SECTION 50.35 OF CHAPTER 50 OF TITLE V, TO ADD REGULATIONS REGARDING HANDLING OF SOLID WASTE; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PORTIONS THEREOF IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE IN PAMPHLET FORM.

WHEREAS, the City of Columbus desires to amend city code to add regulations regarding the handling of solid waste.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That Section 50.35 of Chapter 50 of Title V of the Columbus City Code shall be amended and revised to read as follows:

**Section 50.35 – Handling of Solid Waste**

(A) No person shall accumulate, store, or dispose of solid waste upon any property in a manner that creates a nuisance, health hazard, or violates state or local regulations.

(B) All solid waste generated on any property shall be removed and properly disposed of on a routine basis, but no less than once per week. Disposal shall occur by:

- (1) A licensed private waste hauler; or
- (2) The owner, occupant, or person responsible for the property transporting such waste to the City of Columbus Transfer Station.

(C) Solid waste shall be stored in suitable containers designed to prevent leakage, odor, and access by animals.

(D) Open dumping and the burning of solid waste are prohibited within the limits of the city.

(E) The owner, occupant, or person in control of the property shall be responsible for compliance with this section.

- (1) Upon complaint or observation of a violation of subsections (A) and (B), Code Enforcement Officers or Police Officers of the Columbus Police Department may issue a red tag notice identifying the violation and providing notice that the violation must be corrected within five (5) calendar days.

- (2) If the violation is not corrected by the sixth (6th) calendar day following issuance of the red tag notice, a citation shall be issued for a first offense and notice of abatement may be provided allowing up to an additional five (5) calendar days for compliance.
- (3) If the violation is not corrected by the eleventh (11th) calendar day following issuance of the red tag notice, a second offense citation shall be issued requiring a mandatory court appearance, and the property may be abated by the city in accordance with applicable procedures.

(F) Violations of subsection (B) shall be punishable as follows:

- (1) First offense: \$250 fine.
- (2) Second offense: Mandatory court appearance.

(G) All loads of waste transported to the City of Columbus Transfer Station in vehicles shall be covered; provided, however, this requirement shall not apply when the entire load consists of material of such bulk or weight that it is unlikely to blow or fall from the vehicle while being operated at lawful highway speeds.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall repeal all Ordinances or portions thereof and conflict herewith.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication according to law. Publication shall be in pamphlet form as authorized by Nebraska Revised Statutes § 16-405 with distribution to be made by making copies available to the public upon request at the office of the city clerk.

**RE:** Handling of Solid Waste Ordinance

**RECOMMENDATION:**

To adopt the changes in ordinance § 50.35, changing it from Burning of Garbage to Handling of Solid Waste. Also, changing the ordinance requiring that solid waste be properly disposed once a week, either by a licensed hauler or the person responsible for the property.

**DISCUSSION:**

The purpose of this memorandum is to recommend the revision of Ordinance § 50.35 to increase its scope and improve the regulation of solid waste within the City of Columbus.

**Current Ordinance:**

The existing ordinance § 50.35, titled "*Burning of Garbage*," states:

"It shall be unlawful for any person to burn garbage or refuse within the limits of the city."  
(Prior Code, § 50.40) (Ord. 88-11, passed 3-21-1988) Penalty, see § 50.99

While this provision prohibits the burning of garbage, it is limited in scope and does not address broader solid waste handling practices that impact public health, sanitation, and community standards.

**Proposed Revision:**

It is recommended that § 50.35 be repealed and replaced with a new ordinance titled "*Handling of Solid Waste*," which expands regulatory authority to include the proper storage, removal, and disposal of solid waste. The proposed ordinance includes the following key provisions:

- Prohibits accumulation or disposal of solid waste in a manner that creates a nuisance or health hazard
  - Requires weekly removal and proper disposal of solid waste
  - Allows disposal through a licensed hauler or transport by the responsible party to the City Transfer Station
  - Establishes container requirements to prevent leakage, odor, and animal access
  - Prohibits open dumping and maintains the prohibition on burning of solid waste

- Assigns responsibility for compliance to the property owner, occupant, or person in control
- Requires transported waste loads to be properly secured or covered

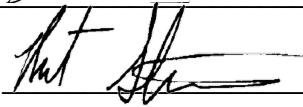
