The regular meeting of the Southern Valley Board of Education was called to order by President Ryan Hunt at 12:00pm. The roll was called and the following members were present: Ryan Hunt, Bob Bergquist, Todd Brown, Dave Witte, Steve Hunt and Stacy Shafer. Members absent: None. Others present: Superintendent Bryce Jorgenson, Secondary Principal Jeff Linden (late), Elementary Principal Mark Grove (late) and Activities Director Brandon Marquez.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance by posting in accordance with the Board of Education approved method for giving notice of meetings. All members and public recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Time was allowed for public comment. Mike Stalder approached the board with the possibility of the school assisting with the fair carnival. Different options and ideas were discussed. Mr. Stalder and Mr. Marquez will continue to work on the details, as the board and the administration are in agreement that this would be beneficial.

The Financial Report and Budget Comparison Reports were reviewed along with current account balances and projected revenue.

Elementary Principal Mark Grove updated the board on the following: Elementary Spelling Bee, Geography Bee, Book Fair, and Elementary Quiz Bowl. Mr. Grove also added that enrollment has increased in the Elementary to 184. A special thanks was given to Roger and Jennifer Luther for the donation of coats and to the Aurora Co-op for the donation of stocking caps for the Kindergarten class.

Secondary Principal Jeff Linden updated the board that Parent- Teacher Conferences went smooth. The Soaring Eagle Wall is up and 5 students have received this award to date. Mr. Linden conducted a Student Engagement Survey, which resulted in showing classroom engagement increasing from 4.28 to 4.54. Mrs. Dannehl invited Lindsay Higel from Central Community College for a day of demonstration with the students on proper cutting techniques and exposed the students to the Culinary Arts program offered at CCC. Mr. Linden is also working on Teacher Evaluations to be completed March 12th.

Activities Director Brandon Marquez wanted to express his thanks to the custodial staff for their hard work to make our school look amazing. Recognition goes out to Mr. Zach Nathan for winning the Jack R. Snider Outstanding Young Band Directors Award from the Nebraska State Bandmasters Association. He will officially receive the award as the NSBA banquet in Lincoln on March 6th. Recognition also goes out to Madison Woodring. Madison has been selected

into the Kearney Health Opportunities Program. RPAC Art Contest winners were Makayla Schoen, Ashlyn Brown and Brooke Jorgenson. Both Boys and Girls Basketball teams places at RPAC with the Boys placing 2nd and the Girls placing 4th. Southern Valley will host District Wrestling as well as Sub-District Girls and Boys D2-9 basketball. Southern Valley Girls Sub-Districts will be played at Kearney High School and Boys Sub-Districts will be played at Cambridge High School.

Superintendent Bryce Jorgenson informed the board that he is currently working on applying for a \$5,000 grant that would be used to provide a "Second Chance Breakfast". This would most likely be offered between 1st and 2nd periods. A survey will be sent out to stakeholders and this information is needed for our School Improvement Plan. Mr. Jorgenson is going to advertise for a Speech Pathologist. Mr. Jorgenson added that hiring our own Speech Pathologist should save the district \$30,000 - \$50,000 a year. The school would also need to purchase a new car for this individual to drive to service students in our district. The school will be looking at replacing the railing in the Mezzanine. This would allow for an unobstructed view of the gymnasium. Mr. Jorgenson informed the board that both Leighton Schmidt, Southern Valley Transportation Director, and himself think that Southern Valley needs to purchase a second activity bus. Mr. Schmidt will be at the March meeting to discuss this further and to give options. Mr. Jorgenson would also like to combine the end of school year awards nights for music, activities, and athletics. The board requested that he check with the students and report back at the next meeting. Finally, Mr. Jorgenson discussed the need to update the Elementary iPads. Policy for Southern Valley Board members purchasing their health insurance from BCBS was also discussed.
