See the attached documents and the following explanation for agendas, motions, and steps to be taken by the City.

1. May 4, 2026 meeting # 1070

- a. Add the Ordinance to vacate the south half of alley to your agenda. This should be voted in the typical manner for an ordinance.

 - i. At the time for discussion, it should be noted that the alley was vacated, and the City reserved the ownership. The proposal now is to convey the entire vacated north half to the Mr. Smith in exchange for \$(whatever the City deems appropriate). Ultimately, a motion, 2nd and vote should occur.
 - ii. If the vote is successful, the Mayor should execute the prepared deed, which would then be filed. Under these circumstances, we likely would need to prepare a Form 521, and handle the filing, given there isn't a title company involved.

AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE THE NORTH HALF OF THE ALLEY IN BLOCK 108, ORIGINAL TOWN OF ST. PAUL, HOWARD COUNTY, NEBRASKA; AND TO DECLARE AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, a request has been made that the north half of the alley located in Block 108, Original Town of St. Paul, be vacated, and

WHEREAS, because of the location of said property, the Mayor and City Council of St. Paul, Nebraska have determined that the City no longer has a need for the property described in Section 1 hereof other than for reservation of easements, and hereby approve the vacation of said alley.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. PAUL, NEBRASKA:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor and City Council of St. Paul, Nebraska do hereby vacate the north half (N1/2) of the alley in Block One Hundred Eight (108), Original Town of St. Paul, Howard County, Nebraska, more fully described as:

Commencing at the southeast corner of Lot Seven (7), Block One Hundred Eight (108), in the Original Town of St. Paul, Howard County, Nebraska, said point being the True Point of Beginning; thence northerly along the East line of said Lot Seven (7) to the northeast corner of Lot Eight (8) in said Block; thence easterly along an extension of the North line of said Lot Eight (8) to the northwest corner of Lot One (1) in said Block; thence southerly along the West line of said Lot One (1) to the southwest corner of Lot Two (2) in said Block; thence westerly along an extension of the South line of said Lot Two (2) to the True Point of Beginning,

and that is hereby vacated and title to the same is hereby reserved in the City of St. Paul, Nebraska; subject to all easements of record.

SECTION 2. That the City of St. Paul, Nebraska reserves the right to maintain, operate, repair, and renew public utilities existing; and there is reserved to the City, any public utilities, and any cable television systems the right to maintain, repair, renew, and operate water mains, gas mains, pole lines, conduits, electrical transmission lines, sound and signal transmission lines, and other similar services and equipment and appurtenances, including lateral connections or branch lines, above, on, or below the surface of the ground that are existing as valid easements at the time title to the property is vacated for the purposes of serving the general public or the abutting properties and to enter upon the premises to accomplish such purposes at any and all reasonable times.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

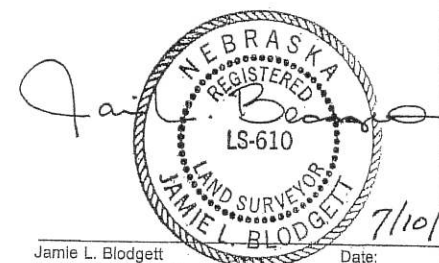

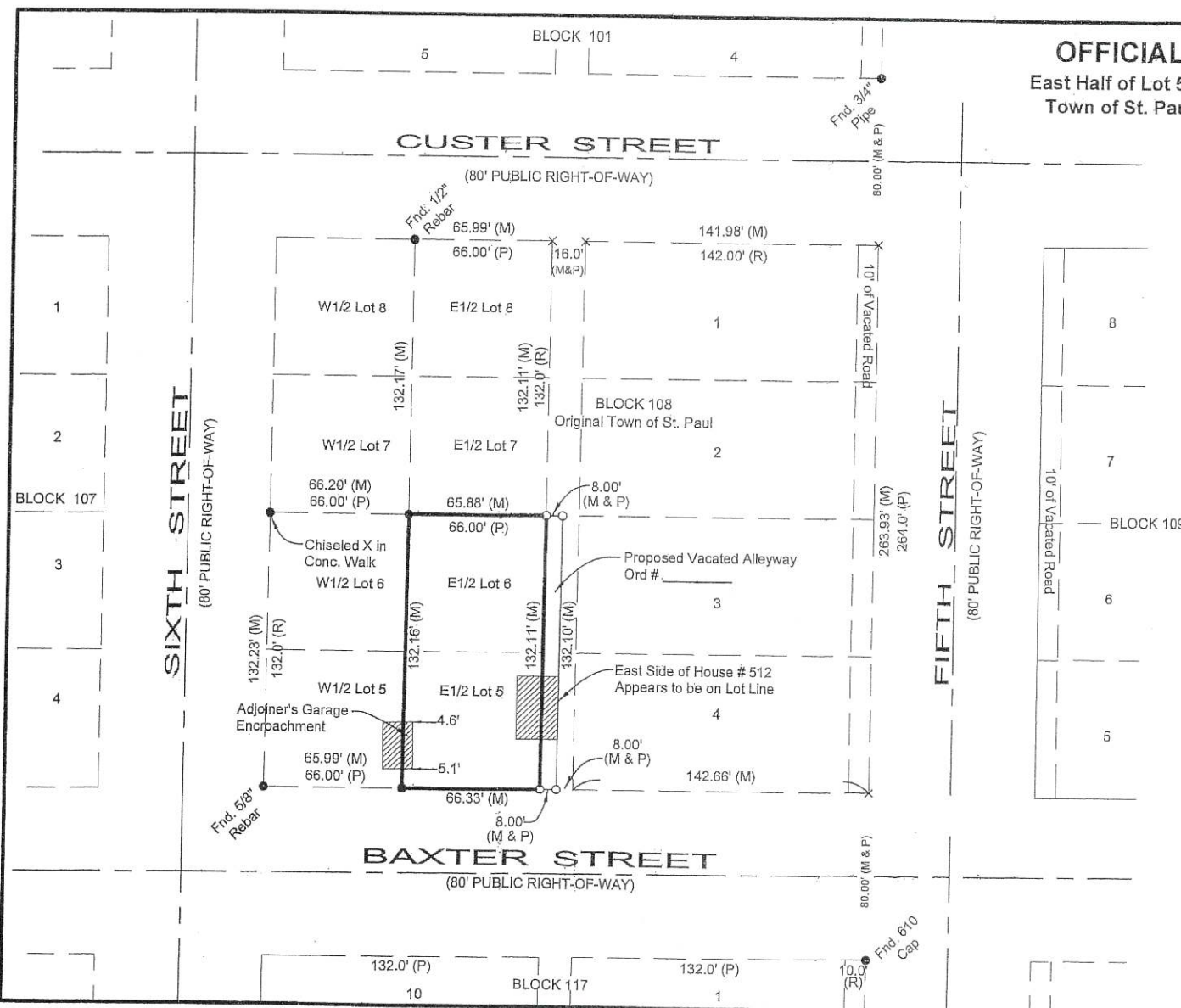

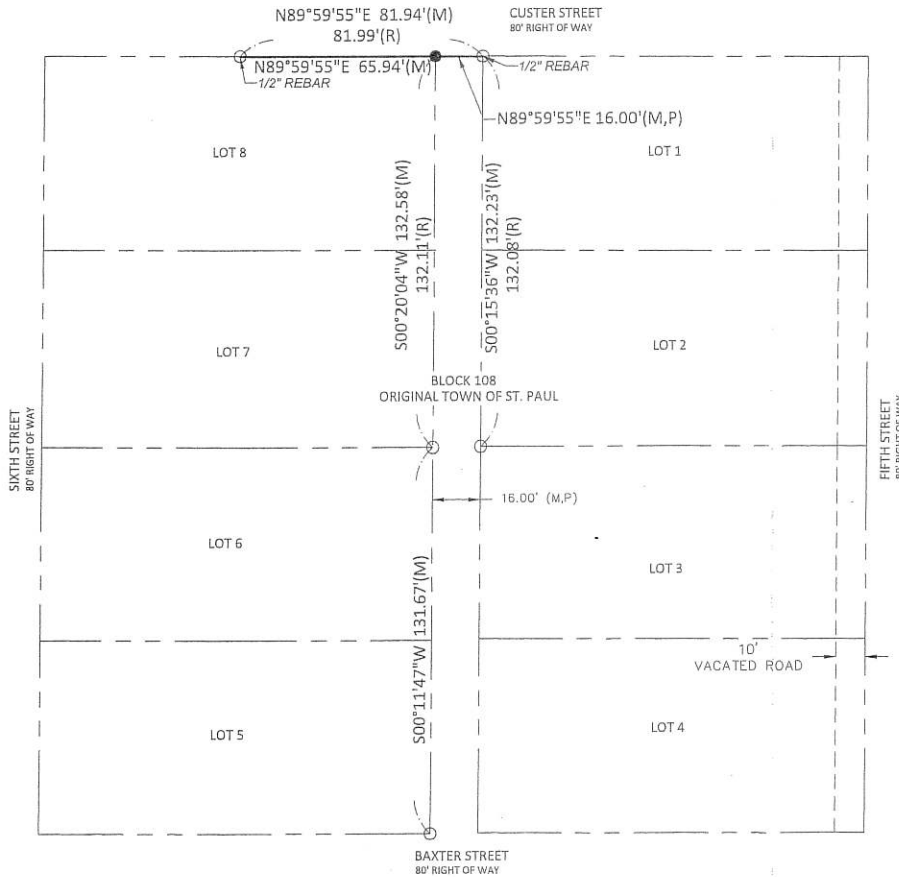

ORDINANCE NO. 1067

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ST. PAUL MUNICIPAL CODE; TO ESTABLISH NEW SECTIONS 5-403 TO 5-406 OF CHAPTER 5 RELATED TO THE OPERATION OF LIGHTWEIGHT E-SCOOTERS, E-BIKES AND HOVERBOARDS; TO REPEAL ANY ORDINANCE, OR PARTS OF ANY ORDINANCE IN CONFLICT WITH THIS ORDINANCE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF SUCH ORDINANCE; AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE PUBLICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAINT PAUL, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That new Sections 5-403 through 5-406 of the Official City Code of the City of Saint Paul, Nebraska, be and the same is hereby enacted to read as follows:

**§ 5-403 LIGHTWEIGHT E-SCOOTER, E-BIKE, AND HOVERBOARD;
DEFINITIONS.**

The following words, terms, and phrases, when used in this Chapter, shall have the meanings prescribed to them as follows, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning.

- (1) **"Business district"** shall mean that portion of the Municipality embraced within, and the area of public streets enumerated as follows:
 - (a) "Howard Street from Fifth Street to Ninth Street";
 - (b) "Sixth Street from Grand Street to Indian Street"; and
 - (c) "Seventh Street from Grand Street to Indian Street".
- (2) "Lightweight E-Scooter" shall mean a scooter propelled by an electronic or gas motor, stand on deck, with handlebars, two (2) to three (3) wheels, 12" or smaller wheels.
- (3) "Hoverboard" shall mean a self-balancing single or double-wheeled electronic board scooter or electric skateboard.
- (4) "E-Bike" shall mean a bicycle propelled by electronic or gas motor, fully operative pedals for human propulsion, capable of exceeding 15 miles per hour, two (2) to three (3) wheels.
- (5) "Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Device" shall mean any motorized wheelchair or other self-balancing, two non-tandem-wheeled device designed to transport only one (1) person, powered solely by such a propulsion system, not capable of exceeding 20 miles per hour on a level surface.

§ 5-404 GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR THE USE OF LIGHTWEIGHT E-SCOOTERS, E-BIKES, AND HOVERBOARDS.

- (1) No person shall ride a lightweight e-scooter, e-bike, or hoverboard upon a roadway on which the posted speed limit is greater than 25 miles per hour. A person riding a lightweight e-scooter, e-bike, or one-wheeled scooter may cross such roadways at a marked intersection.
- (2) No person shall ride a lightweight e-scooter, e-bike, or hoverboard upon Second Street (US Highway 281) from Adams Street to 13th Avenue. Any person riding a lightweight e-scooter, e-bike, or hoverboard may cross Second Street (US Highway 281) at a marked intersection.
- (3) Any person riding a lightweight e-scooter, e-bike, or hoverboard shall not ride on or operate such within the business district. Any such person is permitted to carry or walk alongside such lightweight e-scooter, e-bike, or hoverboard on the sidewalks located in the business district.
- (4) Every person riding a lightweight e-scooter, e-bike, or a hoverboard upon a roadway shall be granted all of the rights and shall be subject to all the duties applicable to the driver of a vehicle by the laws of the State of Nebraska declaring rules of the road applicable to vehicles or by this Code or other traffic ordinances of the City applicable to the driver of a vehicle, except as to special regulations in this section and as to those provisions of laws and ordinances which by their nature can have no application.
- (5) Any person operating a lightweight e-scooter, e-bike, or hoverboard shall obey the instruction of official traffic control signals, signs, and other control devices applicable to vehicles, unless otherwise directed by a Police Officer.
- (6) Any person operating a lightweight e-scooter, e-bike, or hoverboard shall not allow any passenger(s) on such device.
- (7) Any person operating an e-scooter, e-bike, or hoverboard upon a street shall clearly signal their intention to turn left or right by utilizing hand signals.
- (8) Any lightweight e-scooter, e-bike, or hoverboard being ridden at nighttime shall be equipped with a light on the front which shall emit a white light visible from a distance of at least five hundred (500) feet to the front on a clear night and with a red reflector on the rear which shall be visible on a clear night from all distances between one hundred (100) feet and six hundred (600) feet to the rear when directly in front of a lawful lower beams of headlights on a motor vehicle. A light emitting a red light visible from a distance of five hundred (500) feet to the rear may be used in addition to such red reflector.

- (9) When riding a lightweight e-scooter, e-bike, or hoverboard on a sidewalk, or other pedestrian walkway, the user shall yield the right of way to all pedestrians and give an audible signal before overtaking and passing such pedestrian.
- (10) The operator of a lightweight e-scooter, e-bike, or hoverboard emerging from an alley, driveway, or building, shall upon approaching a sidewalk or the sidewalk area extending across an alleyway, yield the right of way to all pedestrians approaching on the sidewalk or sidewalk area, and upon entering the roadway shall yield the right of way to all vehicles approaching on the roadway.
- (11) Any person operating an Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Device is exempt from the provisions of this section. This exemption applies to devices designed primarily for individuals with mobility impairments and operated in accordance with applicable state and federal accessibility laws and regulations.

§ 5-405 PENALTIES.

Any person who shall violate or refuse to comply with the enforcement of any of the provisions of Sections 5-403 through 5-406, set forth at full length herein or incorporated by reference shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined as follows. A new violation shall be deemed to have been committed every twenty-four (24) hours of such failure to comply.

- (1) First offense: fine not less than \$0.00 nor more than \$50.00
- (2) Second offense: fine not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$100.00
- (3) Third and successive offenses: fine of \$150.00
- (4) For each fine issued, a fee for court costs will also be added. The court fee can be waived if the fee is paid at City Hall before the issued court date.

§ 5-406 IMPOUNDMENT.

A Police Officer detaining a person for violating any of the provisions of Sections 5-403 through 5-406 may impound the lightweight e-scooter or hoverboard, and a court may order it to be sold by the City of Saint Paul or destroyed. The fee for impoundment of a lightweight e-scooter, e-bike, or hoverboard shall be \$10 per week. If a lightweight e-scooter, e-bike, or hoverboard that has been impounded isn't claimed from impoundment after 180 days, the property will be considered unclaimed property. If a lightweight e-scooter, e-bike, or hoverboard is unclaimed, the Chief of Police must follow Saint Paul City Code Section 6-433 through 6-435.

Section 2. That any Ordinance or parts of any Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall become effective and be in full force and effect after its passage, adoption, and publication as provided by law.

Lightweight E-Scooter, E-Bike, and Hoverboard Definition.

- (1) "Lightweight E-Scooter" shall mean a scooter propelled by electronic or gas motor, stand on deck, with handlebars. Two (2) to three (3) wheels, 12" or smaller wheels.
- (2) "Hoverboard" shall mean a self-balancing single or double-wheeled electronic board scooter or electric skateboard.
- (3) "E-Bike" shall mean a bicycle propelled by electronic or gas motor, fully operative pedals for human propulsion, capable of exceeding 15 miles per hour, two (2) to three (3) wheels.
- (4) "Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Device" shall mean any motorized wheelchair or other self-balancing to non-tandem-wheeled device designed to transport only one (1) person, powered solely by such a propulsion system, not capable of exceeding 20 miles per hour on a level surface

Article 4. Bicycles / E-Bikes, lightweight E-Scooter and Hoverboards.

- (a) No person shall ride or propel any of the listed Devices on a street or other public highway of this Municipality with another person on such device unless device is factory manufactured for an additional rider.
- (b) No Device shall be ridden faster than is reasonable and proper, but every device shall be operated with reasonable regard to the safety of the operator and any other persons upon the streets and public highways.
- (c) No Device shall be permitted on any street or public highway from one half (1/2) hour after sunset and one half (1/2) hour before sunrise without a headlight, visible under normal atmospheric conditions, from the front thereof for not less than five hundred (500') Feet indicating the approach or presence of the ridden device, firmly attached to such Device, and properly lighted, or without a yellow, or Red light reflector attached to, and visible five hundred (500') feet from The rear thereof. The said headlight shall give a clear, white light.
- (d) No person shall ride or propel a bicycle or E-Bike upon any street or other public highway abreast of more than one other person riding or propelling a bicycle or E-Bike.
- (e) No person shall ride or propel any **Lightweight E-Scooter or Hoverboard** on any Highway within the Municipality limits.
- (f) No person shall ride a **Lightweight E-Scooter or hoverboard** on any roadway where the speed limit is 25 mph or greater. Any person riding a **Lightweight E-Scooter or Hoverboard** may cross these roadways at a marked intersection.
- (g) No person shall ride any of these devices upon the sidewalks in the downtown area. Downtown area shall be considered:

Howard Ave from East side of 5th Street to the West side of 8th street,

6th street from Grand to Indian,

7th street from Gand to Indian, these devices may be carried or walked on the sidewalk in these areas.

- (h) Every person riding one of these devices (Bicycle, E-Bike, Lightweight E-Scooter, or Hoverboard) upon a roadway shall be granted all of the rights and shall be subject to all the duties applicable to the driver of a vehicle by the laws of this State declaring rules of the road applicable to vehicles or by this Code or other traffic ordinances of this City applicable to the driver of a vehicle, except as to special regulations in the section and as to those provisions of laws and ordinances which by their nature can

have no application, and shall obey the instruction of official traffic control signals, signs, and other control devices applicable to vehicles, unless otherwise directed by a law enforcement officer or person acting on their behalf.

- (i) Any person riding one of these devices shall clearly signal their intention for turning left and right by utilizing hand signals.
- (j) When riding a device on a sidewalk, the user shall yield the right of way to all pedestrians and give an audible signal before overtaking and passing such pedestrian. When three or more devices ride in a group, such group must proceed in single file so as to not impede other.

MUNICIPAL CODE 3-314: NUISANCES; AFFECT OF FAILURE TO ABATE

If the below nuisances are not abated within the period given in the first (1st) notice, the City Council may determine to proceed with a second (2nd) notice in the same manner. The second (2nd) notice shall establish a date, time, and place at which all interested parties may appear before the City Council. Any interested party may appeal such decision to the City Council. Chief of Police Howard provided a summary of two (2) nuisances, which include: (1) 204 5th Street (Kyle Kult) and 1014 Grand Street (Michael Peace). Council member Wilson moved to approve sending the second (2nd) notice to 1014 Grand Street, more legally described as Lot Nine (9) &

East 8' of Lot Eight (8), Block Two (2), Military Addition, St. Paul, NE. And nuisance property 204 5th Street, Chief of Police Howard offered his assistance in cleaning the property, due to the owner having medical issues. Council member Peters seconded the motion. Council members Kowalski, Peters, Wilson & Woodgate voted aye, nays none. Motion carried 4/0.

On March 17, 2026, Chief of Police Howard sent a certified letter of "Notice of Unsafe Building" to owner, David Moomey regarding 1212 Howard Avenue. The owner had until March 27, 2026, (ten (10) days) to appeal the determination by a written request with a hearing to the governing body; no request was received by the City. The property owner had until May 16, 2026 (60 days), to remedy the condition or demolish the building; no action has been taken as of this time.

Council member Peters moved to approve by Monday, June 1, 2026, the property owner (David Moomey) is to have the "unsafe property" at 1212 Howard Avenue either up for sale or needs to be demolished. The property is more legally described as the East Half (E1/2) of Lot Eight (8) & All of Lot Nine (9), Block Four (4), Barlett's Addition, St. Paul, NE. Council member Wilson seconded the motion. Council members Kowalski, Peters, Wilson & Woodgate voted aye, nays none. Motion carried 4/0.

The amendment to the St. Paul Municipal Code to establish new Sections 5-403 to 5-406 of Chapter 5 related to the operation of Light-Weight E-Scooters, E-Bikes, and Hoverboards was tabled. This is due to Mayor Feeken contacting Julie Harris, the Executive Director of the Bike Walk Nebraska, a non-profit organization for additional information.
