Fillmore Central Elementary School

We continue to use our positive behavior intervention and supports (PBIS) system. Teachers recognize students with "paws" for meeting expectations. Each week we have announcements that include a drawing to recognize students. We also have a monthly assembly to recognize students/classrooms for meeting expectations.

Nebraska state testing (NSCAS) for 3rd-8th grades in the spring of 22-23 was completed in March and April. District and state level data remain embargoed. Individual student reports have been distributed to families.

Parent Teacher Conferences are scheduled for October 18th from 2-8:30pm. Conferences for elementary students are scheduled in 15-minute increments. Families who are unable to attend will be contacted by the classroom teacher to discuss their student's progress. Last fall we had 95% attendance.

## **Principal/AD Report**

- Fall sports are winding down. Here are a few updates related to each season:
  - The SB team won the SNC Tournament on Sept. 23rd. The team went into the sub-district tournament as a 4-seed and came out on top, defeating Twin River and Boone Central. The team faced Ashland-Greenwood in the best 2 out of 3 district final. They lost game 1, won game 2 and lost game 3. It is noted that AG hadn't lost to a Class C team prior to us and our sub-district was the only one of 8 that went all 3 games.
  - SNC CC took place on October 5th at Branched Oak Lake, and was hosted by David City. The FC-TC timing group was used to run this meet. The boys finished in 3rd place as a team and the girls finished in 4th place. District CC took place on Oct. 11th in Hastings. This was a loaded district. The boys finished in 6th place and the girls in 7th place. Collin McCoy is our lone state qualifier as he placed 10th.
  - The SNC VB tournament will be Oct. 16th and 17th, with the sub district tournament to take place on Oct. 23rd and 24th.
  - The last regular season FB game is scheduled for Oct. 20th. The team has unofficially qualified for the playoffs, and has a good chance to host a first round game.
- One-Act is up and running and things seem to be going very well.
- We had one FFA student qualify for the state Land Judging competition which will be held on Oct. 19th in Scottsbluff. Congratulations to Carson Ashe!
- Parent-teacher conferences will be held on October 18th from 2:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. The high school will host both MS and HS teachers in the gym, as this gives parents the best opportunity to reach as many teachers as possible.
- I have been working with Precision Sign and Graphics on rebranding our district. This essentially entails picking 4 or 5 mascots, defining the colors for paint, graphics, fonts, etc. This is not a huge rush, but something that is needed for our district.
- We probably need to start thinking about what we would like done in the North Endzone, as far as trees, dirt and drainage goes. I am not sure if/how this will fit in the master plan from BVH, but it is something to think about. We also need to really be thinking about the discus area as we are hosting JH SNC track this year, followed by HS SNC next year. We may have some throwers that can throw further than our current set up and we need a plan moving forward.
