Wellness Day

Fillmore Central Middle School organized its yearly Wellness Day on April 3rd. This event allowed students to engage in diverse activities related to health, well-being, and essential life skills, including car maintenance. Students took part in six, 30-minute sessions led by individuals from the Fillmore County Hospital, ESU6, and Nebraska Extension - Clay/Fillmore Counties; as well as a local business owner. Steve Fredlund, The Safari Dude, gave a motivational message to our students to wrap up the day.

NSCAS Testing

The NSCAS assessments for English Language Arts, Mathematics, and Science are currently in progress and are scheduled to conclude by the end of next week. This data will be utilized to track the progress of each student in their reading, science, and math skills, as well as to assess the impact of our teaching methods. Additionally, the data will help us determine the most suitable intervention programs for individual students based on their performance.

Step Up Days

We have scheduled our annual Step Up Days event at FCMS on May 2nd, 6th, and 9th for the current 4th-grade students. During these days, students will participate in orientation sessions and receive a tour of the Middle School to help them prepare as they step up to the middle school next year.

AD Report

- JH girls wrestling. There are still plenty of conversations going around the SNC as well as area schools about moving the season. I am working with a couple of SNC schools to try and get some meets scheduled. Fairbury, Centennial and Thayer Central are moving forward and I would recommend that we do the same. We have some quality coaching options. This change would not have any huge financial implications that I can foresee.
- E-Sports. I have a couple of teachers researching what it would take to get a program up and running. There is sufficient interest to look into this and there may be a group of kids that currently do not have any activity involvement, so this might be an option. There would be some associated costs, but I don't have anything solid at this time.
- Winter sports parent survey results. I sent out the same survey to parents of winter sports athletes that I did for fall sports parents. We had about a 50% response rate, and of those responses, 81.3% (*21.9% strongly agree, 59.4% agree*) felt their athlete had a positive experience. In the fall, our response rate was slightly higher and the overall positive rating was at 70.2% (*36.2% agree, 34% strongly agree*).
- School Rebranding. I have been working with Precision Sign and Graphics to potentially update many items with FC: official mascots, colors, logos, etc. Would there be a couple of board members that would like to sit down and take a look? We may not need to do anything, but it would be nice to have some document that outlines specific mascots, paint schemes, etc., especially as we are in the middle of the BVH piece.
