## School Board Memorandum

**Re:** Recommendation for Chatterbox Speech Therapy, LLC Contract for the 25-26 School Year.

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**Recommendation:** I recommend the board approve the Contract for Chatterbox Speech Therapy, LLC for the 2025-2026 school year.

**Additional Notes:** This Contract is for a Speech Pathologist to provide services to our Upper Elementary, Middle School and High School Students.

Chatterbox Speech Therapy, LLC Contract  
Oologah-Talala Public Schools  
2025-2026 School Year

This Agreement is entered into as of the 28th day of March, 2025, between Oologah-Talala Public Schools (“the Company”) and Chatterbox Speech Therapy, LLC (“the Contractor”).

1. Independent Contractor. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the Company hereby engages the Contractor as an independent contractor to perform the services set forth herein, and the Contractor hereby accepts such engagement.

2. Duties, Terms, and Compensation.

DUTIES: Speech/language evaluation and therapy services will be provided to Oologah-Talala Public Schools for students needing speech/language services in Prek-12 grade (and any eligible 3 year olds per state guidelines) for 5 days per week, 7.5 hours per day (37.5 hours per week) per therapist. The work to be performed by Contractor includes screenings, evaluations, direct therapy, related paperwork and client contact, and collaboration with parents and other health care and/or school professionals. Indirect time can be completed outside the school building. The Contractor will report directly to Oologah-Talala Public Schools and to any other party designated by Oologah-Talala Public Schools in connection with the performance of the duties under this Agreement and shall fulfill any other duties reasonably requested by the Company and agreed to by the Contractor. If therapist medical leave is necessary, the Contractor will make every effort to provide in-person or virtual services during the leave. Medicaid coding and billing (if applicable) will be completed by Oologah-Talala Public Schools. If Oologah-Talala Public Schools chose to have Chatterbox Speech Therapy, LLC file Medicaid claims a separate addendum will need to be attached.

TERM: This engagement shall commence upon execution of this Agreement and shall continue in full effect through the end of the 2025-2026 school year. The Agreement may only be extended thereafter by mutual agreement, unless terminated earlier by operation of and in accordance with this Agreement.

COMPENSATION: As full compensation for the services rendered pursuant to this Agreement, the Company shall pay the Contractor at the hourly rate of \$75 per hour including direct and indirect activities involved with providing speech/language therapy. Billed time will be 37.5 hours per week per therapist for the duration of the posted 2025-2026 school calendar. Such compensation shall be payable within 10 days of receipt of Contractor’s monthly invoices for services rendered supported by reasonable documentation.

3. Contractor is not, and shall not be considered an employee of the Institute. The relationship of the Contractor to Oologah-Talala Public Schools established by this agreement is that of an Independent Contractor. Contractor acknowledges full responsibility for compliance with all Federal, State, and City tax regulations regarding taxes that may accrue on the fee, including expenses, if any, paid to Contractor as a result of services rendered to the Company. Further, the Company will not provide any medical

health insurance or similar plans or worker's compensation or any other benefit whatsoever to Contractor.

4. Interview. The Company will have the opportunity to interview the candidate provided by the Contractor before they begin providing speech/language services for the Company. The Company will have 7 calendar days after the date of interview to notify the Contractor of their refusal to accept that candidate for providing services listed in this contract. After the 7 calendar days, a lack of notice of refusal will serve as acceptance of the candidate to provide the services listed in this contract. Any candidate sent by the Contractor for interview with the Company cannot be employed or directly contracted with for the 2025-2026 school year.
5. Non-Hire Clause. Any therapist sent by the Contractor for providing services with the Company cannot be employed or directly contracted with by the Company for the 2026-2027 school year.
6. Written Reports. The Company may request that treatment notes, progress reports, and evaluation reports be provided by Contractor on a monthly basis.
7. Confidentiality. Contractor acknowledges that during their time with the Company, they may have access to and become aware of confidential information concerning all information disclosed to or received by Contractor in connection with their caseload. According to this agreement and provisions of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPPA) and Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), Contractor agrees to hold in confidence all health information concerning students received from, or created or received on behalf of, Company in connection with the performance of the services provided in this Agreement. The Company further agrees that he or she will not disclose his or her retention as a contractor or the terms of this Agreement to any person without the prior written consent of the Company and shall at all times preserve the confidential natures of his or her relationship to the Company and of the services hereunder.
8. Conflicts of Interest; Non-hire Provision. The Contractor represents that he or she is free to enter into this Agreement, and that this engagement does not violate the terms of any agreement between the Contractor and any third party. During the term of this agreement, the Contractor shall devote as much of his or her productive time, energy, and abilities to the performance of his or her duties hereunder as is necessary to perform the required duties in a timely and productive manner. The Contractor is expressly free to perform services for other parties while performing services for the Company.
9. Merger. This Agreement shall not be terminated by the merger or consolidation of the Company into or with any other entity.
10. Termination. The Company may terminate this Agreement at any time by 30 calendar days' written notice to the Contractor. The Contractor may terminate this Agreement at any time by 30 calendar days' written notice to the Company.
11. Independent Contractor. This Agreement shall not render the Contractor an employee, partner, agent of, or joint venture with the Company for any purpose. The Contractor is and will remain an independent contractor in his or her relationship to the Company. The Company shall not be responsible for withholding taxes with respect to the Contractor's

compensation hereunder. The Contractor shall have no claim against the Company hereunder or otherwise for vacation pay, sick leave, retirement benefits, social security, worker's compensation, health or disability benefits, unemployment benefits, or employee benefits or any kind.

12. Insurance. The individual providing therapy services will carry liability insurance (including malpractice insurance, if warranted) relative to any service that he or she performs for the Company.
13. Successors and Assigns. All of the provisions of this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, if any, successors, and assigns.
14. Choice of Law. The laws of the state of Oklahoma shall govern the validity of this Agreement, the construction of its terms and the interpretation of the rights and duties of the parties hereto.
15. Arbitration. Any controversies arising out of the terms of this Agreement or its interpretation shall be settled in Oklahoma in accordance with the rules of the American Arbitration Association, and the judgment upon award may be entered in any court having jurisdiction thereof.
16. Headings. Section headings are not to be considered a part of this Agreement and are not intended to be a full and accurate description of the contents hereof.
17. Waiver. Waiver by one part hereto of breach of any provision of this Agreement by the other shall not operate or be construed as a continuing waiver.
18. Assignment. The Contractor shall not assign any of his or her rights under this Agreement, or delegate the performance of any of his or her duties hereunder, without the prior written consent of the Company.

Notices. Any and all notices, demands, or other communications required or desired to be given hereunder by any party shall be in writing and shall be validly given or made to another party if personally serviced, or deposited in the United States mail, certified or registered, postage prepaid, return receipt requested. If such notice or demand is served personally, notice shall be deemed constructively made at the time of such personal service. If such notice, demand or other communication is given by mail, such notice shall be conclusively deemed given five days after deposit thereof in the United States mail addressed to the part to whom such notice, demand or other communication is to be given as follows:

20. Modification or Amendment. No amendment, change or modification of this Agreement shall be valid unless in writing signed by the parties hereto. This Agreement is held unless all required signatures are evident below.

21. Entire Understanding. The document and any exhibit attached constitute the entire understanding and agreement of the parties, and any and all prior agreements, understandings, and representations are hereby terminated and canceled in their entirety and are of no further force and effect.

22. Unenforceability of Provisions. If any provision of this Agreement, or any portion thereof, is held to be invalid and unenforceable, then the remainder of this Agreement shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect.

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

*between*

**Oologah Public Schools of Rogers County, Oklahoma  
and CREOKS Mental Health Services, Inc.**

This **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING** is hereby made and entered into by and between **Oologah Public Schools of Rogers County, Oklahoma**, hereinafter referred to as "the District", and **CREOKS Mental Health Services, Inc.**, hereinafter referred to as "**CREOKS**" for the **2025-2026** school year.

## I. Purpose

- a. The purpose of this agreement is to obtain Behavioral Health Services from CREOKS for students who are eligible, and their families, in all schools of the District as mutually agreed upon by the District and CREOKS.
- b. CREOKS offers to provide behavioral health services under the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

## II. Working Agreement

- a. The parties agree as follows:
  1. CREOKS shall provide a minimum of one provider to deliver behavioral health support services to students participating in the Program. Appropriate licensed and/or certified staff will be provided based on the individualized needs of the school system.
  2. The PROVIDER will also possess all other qualifications necessary under state or federal law and regulations to support successful Medicaid billing by PROVIDER for the services they provide in the program.
  3. The PROVIDER will implement behavioral health services consistent with the expectations of the District's Superintendent. The PROVIDER will perform the following duties in accordance with the following mutually agreed design.
    - a. Determine specific therapeutic needs, plan and provide appropriate therapies and activities, and assess, modify and improve the services provided to each student involved in the Program as dictated by the student's individual needs and consistent with this Agreement.
    - b. At the request of the principal or District Superintendent, the PROVIDER shall participate in District meetings, such as child study team meetings, educational team staffing's, IEP meetings, parent conferences or other meetings as mutually agreed upon by both parties to the Agreement.
    - c. Orient, train and consult with professional and nonprofessional staff in treatment techniques that can be used in the classroom.
    - d. Provide monthly tracking reports and other reports to the District on a mutually agreeable schedule.
    - e. Provide in-service training for staff as mutually agreed upon by both parties to the Agreement: and
    - f. Perform other services as may be mutually agreed upon by both parties to the Agreement.
  4. The participating school's designated faculty will make referrals into the program and work with on-site PROVIDER staff to help optimize program attendance.

- a. In the event that there are issues involving PROVIDER personnel and the issues are not resolved, PROVIDER will, upon written request by the District, review the concerns and take appropriate action.
- b. All wages, taxes, benefits and other employment-related expenses and duties associated with the PROVIDER are the sole responsibility of the PROVIDER.
- c. Services under this Agreement will extend for the duration of the school year. The PROVIDER will provide services at the assigned school site on the same schedule as the teachers. Services provided during the summer months or continuous learning schools' intersessions which are billable under this contract will be mutually agreed upon by both parties.
- d. The District agrees to provide adequate space, furniture, and other furnishings as mutually agreed upon by both parties to this Agreement for the implementation of the Program.
- e. PROVIDER will maintain all records, logs, and documentation, including progress notes prepared by the PROVIDER Employees concerning students in the Program in compliance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act.
- f. PROVIDER shall act as the Medicaid Provider for all services provided under this Agreement and will promptly bill Medicaid for all services provided to District Students who are Medicaid eligible pursuant to the fee schedule set forth in Attachment A, which is the current Medicaid fee schedule for the services to be provided. PROVIDER will comply with the requirements of state and federal law and regulations is seeking Medicaid reimbursement for these services. PROVIDER is solely responsible for the proper billing of Medicaid-covered services under this Agreement.
- g. PROVIDER has no duty to disclose treatment information to the District, and all treatment provided is privileged and confidential pursuant to state and federal law and regulations.

### **III. Liability and Indemnification**

- a. PROVIDER agrees to and shall defend, indemnify and hold the District, its officers, administrators, board members, employees, agents, assigns and attorneys from and against any and all liability, loss, or expense, including reasonable attorneys' fees, or claims for injury or damages that are caused by or result from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of PROVIDER, its officers, agents, employees, or contractors. Also, as the Medicaid Provider under this Agreement, PROVIDER shall specifically indemnify and hold harmless the District, its officers, administrators, board members, employees, agents, assigns and attorneys from and against any and all liability, loss or expense, including reasonable attorneys' fees, relating to any legal proceedings (including, but not limited to, administrative proceedings), penalties, claims, or Medicaid disallowances arising out of any omission, fault or negligence by PROVIDER, its agents, employees or anyone under its direction or control, or on its behalf, in connection with the billing of and reimbursement from Medicaid as required in this Agreement.
  1. PROVIDER agrees that prior to entering this Agreement, PROVIDER has obtained a Commercial General Liability (CGL) insurance policy, Professional Liability insurance policy (PL) and School Leaders Legal Liability insurance policy (SLL) (otherwise known as Directors and Officers Liability Insurance), each insuring PROVIDER in an amount not less than \$125,000.00 for personal injury to or death of any individual, and \$2,000,000.00 in the aggregate for personal injury or death. PROVIDER must add the District as an additional insured party on each policy for purposes of PROVIDER's performance of this Agreement and maintain the required insurance policies at all times while this Agreement is in effect. PROVIDER agrees that it will furnish the District with verification of the insurance policies required by this Agreement. If any of the required insurance policies is cancelled during the school year, PROVIDER must immediately notify the District.
  2. Further, PROVIDER affirms that its employees and any subcontractor who will be on District property and acting on behalf of PROVIDER in performance of this Agreement

are covered by Workers Compensation Insurance and shall in no event be entitled to any such coverage from the District.

3. All educational materials and supplies will be provided to PROVIDER but remain the property of the District and shall be annually inventoried by the District.
4. The PROVIDER will operate in accordance with applicable federal and state laws and regulations and District policies, rules, regulations and guidance applicable to the Program. District personnel will directly supervise the day-to-day operation of the Program.

#### **IV. Privacy and Security**

- a. Recognizing the District's interest in providing the most secure environment possible for its students, CREOKS agrees it will act under this Memorandum in compliance with 70 O.S. §6-101.48. Specifically:
  1. CREOKS will not permit any person under its authority, whether employee or volunteer, from coming on to school premises for any activity covered by this Memorandum if that person is currently registered or required to register under the Oklahoma Sex Offenders Registration Act, or the Mary Rippe Violent Crime Offenders Registration Act; and
  2. CREOKS agrees that where work is to be performed by a company employee which would otherwise be performed by a school employee on a full-time or part-time basis, the company shall not permit any person(s) from performing work on school premises if said person(s) has been convicted in this state, the United States, or another state of a felony offense unless ten (10) years has elapsed since the date of the criminal conviction or the employee has received a presidential or gubernatorial pardon for the offense.
- b. CREOKS's agreement to and acceptance of this Memorandum as evidenced by the signature(s) below serves as CREOKS's statement of compliance with the requirements of paragraphs A of this section, as required by 70 O.S. §6-101.48(B).
- c. CREOKS agrees to require all persons under its authority to register through the District's visitor tracking system and clearly display the printed visitor badge while performing activities described in this Memorandum on school premises.
- d. CREOKS agrees to protect the privacy of student information and educational records in accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, as Amended (FERPA).
  1. A student's social security number or student identification number, race/ethnicity, citizenship, nationality, gender, grades, or class schedule is always protected information which should solely be used internally and even then only when essential and among authorized individuals, and which should never be shared with any third party.
  2. Other records that are directly related to a student or students are also considered educational records that are protected under FERPA. They can be items that contain a student's name, or several students' names, or information from which an individual student or students can be personally (individually) identified. Educational records include files, documents and materials in whatever medium (handwriting, print, monitor screen, tapes, disks, film, microfilm, microfiche or notes) that contain information directly related to students and from which students can be personally identified. No educational record should ever be shared with a third party without express written permission from the parent or guardian (if the student is under the age of 18), or the student (if the student is age 18 or older).

3. CREOKS agrees that no one under its authority shall gather, release, or make public in any way any information related to or that could lead to identification of a student. This includes taking photographs, making recordings (video and/or sound), collecting student's written or oral statements, or using records made in connection with the activities that are the subject of this Memorandum. The only exception is where written permission for gathering, releasing, or otherwise using the types of information described in this paragraph is obtained from the parent (if the student is under the age of 18), or the student (if the student is age 18 or older).
- e. CREOKS and the District agree that their employees and volunteers under their authority will conduct themselves in a professional and ethical manner and in accordance with District policies and procedures.

#### **V. Liability and Indemnification**

CREOKS agrees to defend, save, indemnify, and hold the District harmless from any alleged claims, demands, causes of action, liability, loss, damages, and/or injury arising out of or incident to any acts, omissions, negligence, or willful misconduct of CREOKS personnel, employees, agents, contractors, or volunteers in connection with the performance of the activities described in this Memorandum.

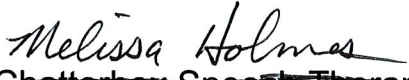

**CONTRACT FOR THE CONVEYANCE OF REAL ESTATE**

This Contract is entered into as of the 1<sup>st</sup> day of March, 2022, by and between the **TOWN OF OOLOGAH** (the "Town"), and **INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 4 OF ROGERS COUNTY, OKLAHOMA** (the "School District").

**RECITALS:**

A. School District is the owner of and possesses good and valid, merchantable, fee simple record title to the following described real property:

Lots 2 through 12, Block 28, and Lots 5 through 7, Block 27, Original Town of Oologah, Rogers County, State of Oklahoma

(the "Property").

B. The Property has been declared surplus to the needs of the School District pursuant to the provisions of *Okla. Stat. tit. 70, § 5-117(A)(11)*.

C. Upon the terms and conditions and for the consideration set forth in this Contract, School District desires to convey the Property to Town, and Town desires to acquire the Property from School District.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein, and intending to be legally bound, the parties agree as follows:

**AGREEMENT TO SELL AND PURCHASE**

School District agrees to convey to Town, and Town agrees to acquire from School District the Property described above. Except as otherwise provided herein, the term "Property" shall be deemed to mean all the real property described above, including all improvements located thereon and all of School District's interest in all easements, rights-of-way, licenses, permits, warranties or privileges located thereon, appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anyway appertaining thereto or used in connection therewith, **LESS AND EXCEPT** all oil, gas and other minerals previously conveyed.

School District shall convey to Town marketable title to the Property, free and clear of all liens and encumbrances, except easements, restrictions and rights-of-way of record and subject to the power of termination set forth herein.

**PURCHASE PRICE AND PAYMENT**

**Purchase Price.** The Property is to be conveyed to the Town without consideration pursuant to the authority granted the School District by OKLA. STAT. tit. 70, § 5-117(11).

### **TITLE**

**Delivery of Abstract.** Within ten (10) days after the date of this Contract, School District shall furnish to Town an abstract of title, certified to a date within six (6) months of the current date, showing marketable title to the Property in the School District subject only to easements, restrictions and rights-of-way of record. The Town shall pay the cost of abstracting directly to the abstract company.

**Defects in Title.** Town shall have ten (10) days from receipt of the abstract of title in which to examine the abstract and object, in writing and with reasonable particularity, to the status of title to the Property. No matter shall constitute a valid objection to title unless it is so construed under the Oklahoma Title Examination Standards promulgated by the Oklahoma Bar Association, where applicable. Failure to so object within the time permitted shall be deemed to constitute Town's acceptance of same. School District shall have ninety (90) days from receipt of Town's objection to the status of title to the Property in which to correct any defects in School District's title. If any defects in School District's title are not corrected within said time, this transaction shall terminate; except that Town may at its sole option elect to waive any defects in School District's title and close this transaction on the basis of such title as School District may have.

### **CLOSING**

**Closing.** The closing hereunder shall take place at the offices of the Superintendent of Oologah-Talala Public Schools at the address provided below (or at such other place as to which School District and Town shall agree). The closing date shall be thirty (30) days after the date of this Contract, or, if valid objections to School District's title are made, closing shall take place ten (10) days after title requirements have been satisfied.

**Delivery of Documents.** At the closing, the following will take place concurrently:

School District will execute and deliver a Quit Claim Deed ("QCD") conveying the Property, less and except all oil, gas and other minerals previously conveyed, to Town free and clear of all liens and encumbrances created by, through or under School District, subject only to easements, restrictions and rights-of-way of record and to the power of termination set forth herein.

School District will execute and deliver a non-lien affidavit in a form acceptable to Town's counsel. The parties shall execute and deliver such additional documents and instruments which, in the opinion of Town's counsel and School District's counsel, are necessary or desirable to the proper consummation of this transaction.

3. **Surrender of Possession.** Possession of the Property shall be surrendered to Town on the day of closing.

**MISCELLANEOUS**

**Notice.** Whenever any notice is required or permitted hereunder, such notice shall be hand delivered in person or sent by U.S. mail, registered or certified, postage prepaid, to the addresses as set forth below:

Any notice which shall be served upon either of the parties in the manner aforesaid shall be deemed sufficiently given for all purposes hereunder (i) at the time such notice is hand delivered in person, or (ii) on the fourth day after the posting, postage prepaid, in the U.S. Mails of such notices in accordance with the preceding portion of this paragraph. Either Town or School District shall have the right from time to time to designate by written notice to the other party such other person or persons and at such other place or places as Town or School District may desire written notices to be delivered or sent in accordance herewith; provided, however, at no time shall either party be required to send more than an original and two (2) copies of any such notice, demand or request required or permitted hereunder.

**Amendments.** No amendment to this Contract shall be binding on any of the parties to this agreement unless such amendment is in writing and executed by both parties with the same formality as this agreement is executed.

**Severability.** If any term, covenant or condition of this Contract or the application thereof shall, to any extent, be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Contract shall not be affected thereby and each term, covenant or condition of this Contract shall be valid and be enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law.

**Survival.** This Contract shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns. Notwithstanding anything contained herein to the contrary, all covenants, agreements, representations and warranties of School District contained herein shall survive the execution and delivery of the warranty deed to Town.

**Applicable Laws.** This Contract shall be construed and interpreted under the laws of the State of Oklahoma.

**Brokers.** School District and Town represent that no broker, agent or finder has been employed by either party in connection with this transaction.

**Attorneys' Fees.** In any judicial proceeding (trial and appellate) between School District and Town seeking to enforce the terms and provisions of this Contract or the power of termination described below, the prevailing party shall be entitled to reasonable attorneys' fees, expenses and court costs, in addition to any other relief provided herein.

**Risk of Loss.** School District shall bear the risk of loss or damage to the Property or any part thereof by fire or any other casualty from the date hereof up to the date possession of the Property is transferred to Town. Thereafter, the Town shall bear the risk of any such loss or damage to the Property.

**Power of Termination.** This Agreement is entered into and the Property will be conveyed to the Town with the understanding that the Town will, within three years from the date of the conveyance, open and operate a multipurpose youth athletic facility on the Property. If the Town fails to open such a facility within three years of the date of the conveyance, or ceases to use the Property for a youth athletic facility, the School District may re-enter and repossess the property, terminating the Town's ownership thereof. The QCD to be delivered to the Town at closing shall contain record evidence of the School District's power of termination as described herein.

**ENVIRONMENTAL INSPECTION, DISCLOSURE AND INDEMNITY**

School District makes no representation as to the presence or absence of hazardous materials on or about the Property and makes no warranty, expressed or implied, as to the physical condition of the Property or the fitness of the Property for any particular use. THE PROPERTY IS BEING CONVEYED TO THE TOWN "AS IS - WHERE IS", WITH ALL FAULTS. Town shall, from and after the closing date, indemnify, defend and hold School District harmless from and against any and all claims or expenses related to or arising from the condition of the Property including, but not limited to, claims for contribution for removal or remediation of hazardous or toxic substances.

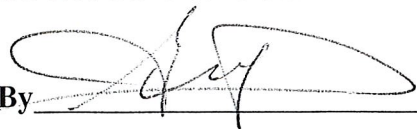
