PART-TIME ENROLLMENT

The parent, guardian, or custodian of a student receiving instruction at a private, denominational or parochial school, or a school choosing not to meet accreditation or approval requirements may also enroll the student in the school district. The district's application form for part-time enrollment must be received by the Superintendent by August 1st preceeding the school year for the student to be considered for part-time enrollment.

The parent, guardian, or custodian requesting part-time enrollment for the student shall indicate the academic courses and extracurricular activities in which the student will participate. Considerations of educational appropriateness and district capacity limits that generally apply to option enrollment students will also apply to part-time students. Part-time students will not receive priority over full-time students.

A dual enrollment student is eligible to participate in the school district's academic and extracurricular activities in the same manner as other students enrolled in the school district to the extent allowed within NSAA regulations. The student must be enrolled in five credit hours at the district in a semester during the year. The policies and administrative rules of the school district shall apply to the part-time enrollment students in the same manner as the other students enrolled the school district. These policies and administrative rules shall include, but not be limited to, athletic eligibility requirements, rules governing student conduct, academic eligibility requirements, and payment of the fees required for participation. Full-time and part-time students shall have the same opportunities and expectations to participate in extracurricular activities regardless of full- or part-time status.

It shall be the responsibility of the superintendent to develop administrative regulations as needed regarding deadlines, specific courses or activities approved, restrictions of classroom space, maximum or minimum course number limitations and other procedures for this policy.

Guidance for Reporting Part-Time Students Enrolled Outside of Resident District for Extracurricular Activities

Effective for the 2025-2026 school year

Overview

Recent updates to Nebraska Revised Statute [79-215\(11\), as enacted by LB306](#), require school districts to admit certain students on a part-time basis for the purpose of participating in extracurricular activities. These students may be enrolled in a private, denominational, or parochial school or a school that has elected not to meet accreditation or approval requirements (exempt school).

Per LB306, a district must admit such a K-12 student without charge for part-time enrollment if:

1. The student is enrolled in a nonpublic or exempt school, and
2. One of the following applies:
 - a. The student's resident district does not offer the extracurricular activity, and the requested district is the closest that does; or
 - b. The resident district does offer the activity, but the requested district includes the closest school offering that activity.

Additionally, the new legislation affirms that these part-time students are required to enroll in courses and participate in extracurricular activities, provided they meet local district requirements and policies.

SIS Reporting Requirements

To ensure proper inclusion of these students in state data collections, please follow the guidance below when submitting them through your Student Information System (SIS):

1. Residency Status

Use the new Residency Status code "10":

- Part-Time Students Enrolled Outside of Resident District for Extracurricular Activities

2. FTE (Full-Time Equivalency)

These students should be reported with an FTE based on their part-time enrollment status and course participation. This FTE must be less than 100.

3. Other Required Data Elements

Districts must report the same data elements for these students as required for any other part-time student, including:

- Courses the student is enrolled in
- Attendance records while participating in district courses or activities
- Discipline incidents occurring while the student is participating in school activities or on school grounds

Data Validation

Errors and/or warnings will be created in ADVISER Validation if a student using this Residency Status code is also seen with any of the following:

- Has concurrent enrollment in another public district in Nebraska
- Is not enrolled outside of their district of residence
- Has an FTE of 100
