Family Learning Community Network

Commitment Agreement

February 2024



In full support of children and families in our community, we (the “Community”) commit to join the National Center for Families Learning 60x30 Family Learning Community Network. We agree to the process of developing a Family Learning Community (FLC) through the phases of exploration, convening, co-designing, celebrating and elevating the work in partnership with NCFL.

The Community commits to:

1. Identifying and convening key stakeholders who will support and guide the design of a Family Learning Community.
2. Codesigning a Family Learning Community action plan with support from NCFL.
3. Sharing relevant data with NCFL for the purpose of producing a brief that summarizes the outcomes of this agreement. The brief will include a description of the design, actions completed, outcomes achieved, lessons learned along the way, and next steps for the co-design phase.
4. Recognizing NCFL’s support in any publications, press releases, or other materials related to the design and action plan.
5. Participating in interviews or surveys conducted by NCFL related to the design and implementation of the action plan, and providing pictures or videos to illustrate the work on NCFL’s website or social media.
6. Acknowledging the ownership to trademarks, copyrighted materials, and intellectual property of all involved.
7. Paying a total of \$10,000 to NCFL to support the planning efforts outlined below in two installment payments, with \$5,000 due upon initial receipt of the signed commitment agreement and \$5,000 due at the end of the 12-month commitment period.

The Community acknowledges that NCFL commits to provide support in:

1. Creating a Family Learning Community design and action plan.
2. Building capacity to reduce barriers, identify gaps, and streamline duplication of services.
3. Identifying strategic partnerships.
4. Elevating stories through shared communications.
5. Supporting fundraising efforts.
6. Networking Family Learning Communities across the country.
7. Providing professional learning and technical support around Family Engagement, Family Literacy, and Family Leadership.
