Executive Summary- Bixby Spartan Football

As we prepare for the 2025 football season and continue striving to grow as a program, it's important to reflect on the challenges and triumphs of 2024. We capped off the season with our 7th consecutive 6A state championship—our 3rd straight in 6A-I. However, this championship came with more difficulty than most.

We began 2024 with just one returning starter on defense and four on offense, having graduated many seniors from what some think was the best team in program history. We were young, undersized in several key positions, and that inexperience showed immediately in a Week 0 loss to Owasso, 40-21, in the Battle of the Burbs. This is where our student athlete's perseverance and commitment to the process would begin to pay off.

Throughout the season, we steadily improved, but inconsistency remained. In Week 10, we suffered a 31-20 loss to Norman that nearly cost us the district championship. Ultimately, we claimed the district title through point differential in a three-way tie. In hindsight, that Week 10 setback may have been a blessing—it galvanized us for the playoffs.

In the postseason, we defeated Norman North in the quarterfinals, Edmond Memorial in the semifinals, and then clinched the title with a thrilling 43-42 overtime win over previously undefeated Owasso. Heading into the championship, the entire team knew that our gameplan had to be executed flawlessly, and that we would also need a few breaks. Early setbacks tested us, but our players showed resilience, protected the football, and made clutch plays. A key 4th-and-short stop followed by a two-play touchdown drive tied the game at the end of regulation.

In overtime, we won the coin toss and chose to play defense first. After Owasso scored, we quickly responded. Without hesitation, our staff elected to go for two—and our players executed one of football's most fundamental plays with precision to seal our 11th straight state championship appearance with a victory.

A Year of Growth and Development

Reflection is remembering with analysis so that analysis may be applied to future endeavors. Our mission is to be respected as the very best program in Oklahoma at developing student-athletes. There is no finish line in this pursuit. Our commitment to developing stronger, smarter, and more resilient leaders translates to success both on and off the field.

High school football—and high school in general—is changing rapidly. From online classes and concurrent enrollment to open transfers and NIL (Name, Image, Likeness) deals, these evolving dynamics present new challenges. Bixby Public Schools has met them head-on by providing world-class facilities, staffing, and resources.

Facilities & Infrastructure

After our first game in 2024, we moved into our new state-of-the-art football facility. Our goal was to create the best high school football complex in Oklahoma, and our community delivered. From lockers and meeting rooms to coaching offices, our facility rivals any in the country. It also houses 8th, 9th, and high school teams, enabling collaboration and early relationship-building with players.

In January, we moved into the most advanced high school building in the state. Our students and staff take pride in these environments—making school a place people want to be. Bixby’s commitment to excellence is second to none.

Program Growth & Player Development

Our 2025 roster is projected to be our largest ever, with 142 players currently enrolled, and more expected. We anticipate an additional 75 freshmen and 75 eighth graders. Retaining players is a top priority because we believe football is the greatest classroom. It challenges young people and fosters growth through adversity and how to overcome obstacles.

To maximize development, our program provides more reps than most. We run:

- 3 Eighth Grade Teams
- 3 Ninth Grade Teams
- 2 JV Games Weekly
- 1 Varsity Game Weekly

We also host team camps, 7-on-7 competitions, OL/DL camps, and spring practices—tailored to create maximum reps and meaningful competition. These events allow us to gather film on all players and leverage our expanded meeting spaces for effective film study and teaching.

Staff Development & Continuity

One of our district’s key strategic priorities is developing exemplary staff. We value continuity, which is often underrated in football. Many of our coaches have long tenures:

- OC- Tyler Schneider – 15th year
- DC- Rodney Flowers – 14th year
- Head 8th Grade- Mike Rogers – 30 years
- Head 9th Grade- Doug Behrens – 20 years
- Linebackers- Brian Douglas – 17 years

Our staff consists of lifelong learners who push to innovate and sustain success both on the field and in the classroom. We work hard to attract and retain the very best teachers and coaches for our student-athletes.

Sustaining Success in 6A-I

When we moved up to 6A-I in 2022—after winning 7 of the last 8 championships in 6A-II—many doubted whether we could maintain success. We proved our relevance with a 2022 title and followed it up with an undefeated and dominant season in 2023. The true test came in 2024 with a roster full of new starters. Though the year was bumpy, the team found a way to rise, adapt, and win a championship in overtime.

We recognize that sustaining success is harder than achieving it, and complacency is a real threat. As we approach the 2025 season, it’s vital that we, as a program and a community, continue to support, improve, and innovate.

Each championship team forms a new identity. The 2025 team will be no different. With a strong core returning and rising young talent, we’re excited to see this team fight failure and forge its own legacy.

Continuous Improvement

"Success is never owned, it's rented—and the rent is due every day." – Rory Vaden

This mindset captures the spirit of Bixby Spartan Football. Consistent effort, accountability, and a drive to improve are the foundation of our program. Each season, we take a hard look at where we've been and where we can grow—because staying the same is never an option. Over the past year, we've made a number of improvements that reflect our ongoing commitment to excellence, including:

- **New Football Facility-** On September 1st, 2024, after week zero we occupied the new addition to HOTS which included our new varsity locker room and football coaches' offices. The space is the the best in the State of Oklahoma if not the best high school facility in the United States.
- **New Middle School Locker Rooms-** On November 1st, 2024 we occupied the second floor of our new H.O.T.S. addition. We now have locker space and showers for 120 8th Graders, 120 9th Graders, and coaches offices for our middle school staffs.
- **Additional Film Locations & Meeting Rooms-** The Bixby Quarterback Club partnered with the district along with the athletic department to build out the former upstairs locker room area with 3 separate meeting rooms. These walls can be retracted to make one large film room. Along with this space, we now have 13 functioning locations in HOTS to meet and watch film with our players.
- **New Assistant Strength & Conditioning Position-** We added one full-time strength and conditioning coach and one assistant coach to help address the increased enrollment in our in-school strength and conditioning courses.
- **Improvements to Track Facility-** Approximately 70 percent of our athletes run track during the spring semester. We continue to make improvements to this facility. This offseason we added protective nets at the end of each field to protect track athletes from errant soccer balls.
- **Legacy/All-State Wall at our new facility-** Our new facility includes a Legacy wall that includes all OCA football All-State athletes and Bixby Quarterback Club Legacy Members.
- **Broyles Award Winner-** Coach Rodney Flowers was awarded the 2024 Broyles Award for the best high school assistant coach in the state of Oklahoma. He attended the national Broyles Award conference in February.
- **Broyles Award Winner-** Coach Tyler Schneider was nominated as the 2025 State Broyles award winner and will attend the Broyles award presentation in 2026.

Continuous Improvement

- **Quarterback Club Revenue-** During the 2024 fiscal year, the Bixby Quarterback Club generated over \$280,000 in total revenue. These funds helped support uniforms, new facility equipment, weight room upgrades, and—among other things—an impressive \$50,000 spent on meals for our student-athletes!
- **Improved Spring Game-** This year we again improved our spring game atmosphere. We were able to divide into four teams for competition. We recognized state championship teams, academic champions, all-state athletes, and alumni. All these improvements created a great environment for our athletes to enjoy. We hosted an amazing crowd.
- **Largest S.P.A. Enrollment Ever-** This year we have over 700 1st-12th graders training with us during the summer months.
- **Summer Feeding Program-** The summer feeding program has returned this year, providing free meals to all students under the age of 18. This initiative is especially valuable for our student-athletes, who benefit greatly from receiving a nutritious meal immediately after their daily workouts.
- **Reserved Seating Upgrade at Spartan Stadium-** During the offseason, chair-back seating was installed in the reserved section of Spartan Stadium. This enhancement was made possible through the efforts of Athletic Director Kate Creekmore, who secured the necessary funding by bringing in multiple premium sponsors.
- **High Five Friday-** With the help of quarterback club member Tiffany Villareal, we were able to send groups of players and cheerleaders to our elementary schools each home game Friday to greet the students as they entered the building. This was very well received by students and parents.
- **Coach Tyler Schneider Published-** Coach Schneider was once again published. Throw Deep Publishing has published a series of videos on the Bixby Spartan Offense.
- **Friends of Bixby Coaches Roundtable-** This year we hosted several coaching clinics in our new facility. Among those clinics was our friends of Bixby Spartan Football roundtable that included the University of Missouri, Greenwood, AR, Dothan, AL, Hamilton, WI, Carey Grove, IL, and North Crowley, TX.

Continuous Improvement

- **The Rack-** Continuing with our theme of record, rank, and publish, we improved our point system during our SPA program to earn a spot at the best racks in our weight room. Our players are measured each day on a weight room, field, and leadership activity. We present the point totals to the team on the weight room projector so each player can see where they rank among their teammates.
- **Upgraded OSPA and GOSPA Programs-** Our strength staff has worked closely with Olympic sport coaches to boost attendance and engagement in Speed, Power, and Agility (SPA) training—particularly among female athletes and those in Olympic sports. This year, over 170 students are enrolled, with the majority of Bixby athletic programs now participating in SPA Camp.
- **Clinic Presenters-** During the off-season, Coach Flowers, Schneider, Montgomery, Myers, Stephens, and Suffal were speakers at multiple coaches’ clinics. We believe that presenting at clinics allows our coaches to grow as well as recruit great coaches to our program.
- **59 2024 Steak Eaters-** We had 59 student-athletes with perfect attendance last year, no questions asked. Our student-athletes take great pride in being a “Steak Eater.” 59 student athletes with perfect attendance is an all-time record.
- **Spartan BBQ-** We hosted our fifth annual Spartan BBQ as a tailgate for one of our softball/baseball games this last spring. We served over 300 hamburgers to players and parents from football, softball, and baseball programs.
- **BYFA Coaches Clinics-** We host two annual clinics for our youth football coaches—one focused on offense and one on defense. In addition, we’ve developed a series of drill tapes accessible via YouTube to further align our youth and high school programs, ensuring consistency and development across all levels.
- **Largest Twitter Following in Oklahoma-** At the start of the 2023 season, Coach Roe set a goal for Bixby Football to become the most-followed high school program in Oklahoma on Twitter. By the end of the year, we achieved that milestone—growing our following to over 9,200 and claiming the top spot in the state.
- **7th Grade Strength & Conditioning Expansion-** We continue to add students and staffing to our 7th grade Strength and Conditioning program. We now offer 7th Grade Strength and conditioning 1st, 2nd, & 6th hour.

Continuous Improvement

- **All-School Under Armour Contract-** To further improve all of our sports programs in Bixby, we have renewed an all-school UA deal to brand all of our student-athletes in UA uniforms on game nights. Now, every sports program in Bixby is an Under Armour program.
- **5-Minute Football Library-** Each offseason, we continue to expand and refine our 5-Minute Football Library—a simplified football curriculum designed to build our players’ foundational football IQ. Coach Evans leads this effort with great attention to detail. This year, we’ve also integrated a structured 5-Minute Football curriculum into our summer program for athletes in grades 8–12.
- **#Team21-** We continue to use the #Team21 campaign to help teach character and leadership development in our program. We strive to improve this each year.
- **Team Camp at Bixby-** We proudly hosted our fifth annual Team Camp right here at Bixby. Hosting the camp not only provides our athletes with valuable reps on home turf but also saves the program money by eliminating travel and entry fees. Widely regarded as the premier team camp in the state, this year’s event welcomed top programs including East St. Louis, Broken Arrow, Lawton, Westmoore, and Edmond Memorial. In addition, our cafeteria staff did an outstanding job feeding all participating athletes each day of camp.
- **Coaches Program Study-** In place of our traditional offseason book study, for a second year, Coach Rodney Flowers conducted a new professional development initiative for our staff. Each coach selected a successful high school football program, conducted an in-depth study, and presented their findings to the rest of the staff. This collaborative effort provided valuable insights and fresh ideas to help strengthen our own program.
- **Improved Teacher of the Week-** We continued our Teacher of the Week program led by Coach Embrey. We improved this program by soliciting a sponsor who donated enough to provide a \$200 gift card to each Teacher of the Week!
- **Youth Offensive Line Camp-** For the last three years, Coach Corbin Burchett, our offensive line coach, started the Eastern Oklahoma Youth Offensive Line Camp. The camp was successful and something we will continue for our youth offensive linemen.
- **Creative Team Improvements-** Coach Ethan Roe continues to grow the Bixby Creative team. This team works to take photos and create content for our program.

Continuous Improvement

- **New White Uniforms-** The Quarterback Club and Athletic Department have stepped up to purchase a full set of 150 new white uniforms. This year we also added fill-ins to increase our numbers of uniforms to 150 total uniforms of each color. .
- **Chocolate Milk Post-Workout Nutrition-** This year, the Quarterback Club partnered with parents to provide 16 oz. of whole chocolate milk to our athletes after each workout. Proper post-workout nutrition is essential for recovery and helps ensure that our athletes maximize the gains from their training sessions.
- **Eastern OK OL/DL Camp-** We hosted the largest Eastern Oklahoma OL/DL camp ever with 650 campers in attendance this year. This camp is the largest lineman camp in Oklahoma and probably the largest in the United States.
- **Coach Flowers moves to the Athletic Department-** Ms. Creekmore has added Coach Rodney Flowers to our athletic department staff. Coach Flowers will serve as the athletic department's technology liaison.
- **Coach Schneider Joins Athletic Department-** Coach Tyler Schneider has transitioned into a new role as Assistant Athletic Director of Facilities, succeeding the recently retired Onis Pankey. His experience and leadership will be a valuable asset to the athletic department in this new capacity.
- **Skordle 7-on-7 Tournament-** This year, we expanded our annual Skordle 7-on-7 tournament from 20 to 24 teams. The event continues to grow in reputation, thanks in large part to Coach Trevor Suffal's outstanding organization and leadership—something visiting teams consistently recognize and appreciate.
- **Increased Football Coach Stipends-** Following the 2024 season, the athletic department and BPS administration conducted a review of football coaching stipends in neighboring school districts. As a result, our coaching stipends were increased by 7%, placing Bixby in the upper tier among comparable programs.

Continuous Improvement

- **Expanded Athletic Department Staff-** The additions of Stephanie Butler, Rodney Flowers, Jamie Finley, and Tyler Schneider to our athletic department have significantly increased our efficiency and enhanced the level of service we provide to our student-athletes, coaches, and community.
- **Expanded Passing League Participation-** We now take both our freshman and varsity skill players to multiple passing leagues and 7-on-7 tournaments. This increased participation provides valuable opportunities for all players to develop, gain experience, and get meaningful reps in competitive environments.
- **Wednesday Night Coaches Clinic-** Since our first year in Bixby, we've hosted a Wednesday night clinic during the offseason to support ongoing coach development. This year's featured presenters included Coach Drew Dallas from Hutchinson Community College and Josh Reardon, Defensive Coordinator at the University of Tulsa. The clinic continues to be a valuable opportunity for our staff to build relationships, exchange ideas, and strengthen our culture of continuous improvement.
- **Football Budget Increase-** The athletic department increased our program's school budget from \$45,000 to \$52,000. While this amount only begins to meet the full scope of our program's needs, the additional funding has allowed us to purchase much-needed equipment to support our growing number of student-athletes.
- **SportsYou Communication Platform-** At the start of the 2023 season, our entire athletic department transitioned to SportsYou for all parent communication. The move has significantly improved communication efficiency, and we continue to receive positive feedback from families regarding its effectiveness.
- **Football Country –** The first episode of *Football Country*, a docuseries produced by Neek Films, has been released. Neek Films has spent the past two years going behind the scenes of our program and has produced an outstanding feature that highlights the heart and soul of Bixby Football.

Program Strengths

- **Community Expectations-** Our Bixby community values athletics and holds high expectations for all of our programs. As a result, we challenge our students, coaches, and teams to consistently strive for excellence—on and off the field.
- **Commitment to Facilities-** Bixby Public Schools has made a long-term investment in providing top-tier athletic facilities. With the completion of our newly renovated football complex, we are proud to offer the best locker room and coaching offices in the state of Oklahoma.
- **Progressive Culture-** Our players, staff, and community are united in a commitment to continuous improvement. Everyone involved in our program works tirelessly to make it better every day.
- **Academic Excellence-** As evidenced by strong test scores and Advanced Placement performance, Bixby Public Schools is a forward-thinking district with a well-earned reputation among the nation’s top academic institutions.
- **Administrative Support-** Through facility upgrades, a strong emphasis on student activities, and the hiring and retention of a highly qualified coaching staff, our administration has demonstrated that Bixby Public Schools recognizes the vital role athletics play as an integral part of a well-rounded educational experience.
- **Athletic Administration-** Kate Creekmore has assembled a forward-thinking team committed to setting the standard for athletic departments nationwide. Under her leadership, the team works diligently to remove barriers and provide coaches with the resources necessary for success.
- **Weight Rooms-** The Spartan Power House and Multipurpose Weight Room are widely regarded as the premier training facilities in the state. Outfitted with the most advanced and functional equipment available, these spaces allow us to safely and effectively train over 288 athletes simultaneously.
- **Full-Time Strength Staff-** The addition of a full-time strength coach has transformed the athletic culture at Bixby Public Schools. We now benefit from a dedicated team that includes two full-time and two part-time strength coaches, ensuring our athletes receive consistent, high-level training across all sports.

Program Strengths

- **Staff Continuity**- Staff continuity is often overlooked in football. We have so many coaches who have been at Bixby for a long time: Coach Rogers (30), Coach Behrens (20), Coach Douglas (17), Coach Montgomery (16), Coach Schneider (15), Coach Flowers (14), and Coach Burchett (14), all have long tenures at Bixby and are familiar with the community.
- **Athletic Media Content Coordinator**- The addition of a dedicated Athletic Media Content Coordinator has elevated our social media presence, giving Bixby Athletics one of the strongest and most engaging platforms in Oklahoma.
- **Tradition**- Bixby Public Schools has a tradition of excellence, and our district attracts great teachers, coaches, and businesses because of that.
- **Quarterback Club**- Our Quarterback Club is led by a dedicated group of selfless individuals who are fully committed to providing the best possible playing experience for our Bixby Spartan athletes.
- **Core Values**- Through our deliberate focus on our core values (Discipline, Integrity, Selfless, and Consistent) our stakeholders know what to expect from our program each year.
- **National Recognition**- Our program has gained national attention through USA Today rankings, ESPN-televised games, All-American selections, and high-profile recruits, solidifying Bixby Football's presence on the national stage.
- **Recruiting**- The continued success of our student-athletes at the Junior College, NAIA, and NCAA levels has made Bixby a consistent destination for college recruiters. Being part of the Bixby Football program provides our athletes with unmatched exposure and recruiting opportunities across the state.
- **8th–12th Grades in One Facility**- Housing all 8th–12th grade players in a single facility allows us to build relationships with athletes at a younger age and enhances collaboration between our middle school and high school coaching staffs.
- **7th Grade Strength & Conditioning**- Now in its fifth year, our in-school Strength & Conditioning program for 7th grade athletes provides foundational training to support long-term athletic development. Students are bussed to the high school campus during 1st, 2nd, and 6th hour to train under the direction of our high school S&C staff. This early exposure has already led to noticeable improvements in athleticism and reduced injury rates as players transition to the high school level.

Program Needs

- **Stadium Facelift** – Bixby Spartan Stadium is in need of significant upgrades to meet the demands of 6A scheduling and enhance the overall game-day experience. Key improvements include expanded seating capacity, upgraded entrances and plazas, modernized concession stands, a larger press box, and dedicated visitor locker rooms.
- **Indoor Facility**- With field space at a premium for athletics and band, the addition of an indoor facility would provide much-needed practice space and flexibility. It would also offer a reliable training environment during inclement weather, benefiting student-athletes and band members alike.
- **Powerhouse Flooring**- The existing Powerhouse floor requires complete removal and replacement with durable concrete and new flooring to ensure a safe and functional training environment.
- **Visitor Locker Room/Locker Room Space**- Our current visitor locker room facilities are inadequate for hosting opposing teams. A comprehensive renovation is urgently needed to provide a comfortable and functional space for our guests.
- **Repurpose the Former 9th Grade Cafeteria**- To adequately support the Powerhouse weight facility, it is essential to provide proper bathrooms, locker rooms, and showers. I propose repurposing the former 9th-grade cafeteria to create sufficient locker room and shower amenities for our athletes.
- **Turf Both Practice Fields**- I propose installing turf on the two practice fields east of the track complex. Currently, football, band, men's and women's soccer, ROTC, and track must share the single existing turf field, limiting practice time. Adding two additional turf fields would provide adequate practice space for all sports, support larger 7-on-7 and soccer tournaments, and create opportunities to rent field access to various sports clubs
- **Recondition Grass Practice Fields & Maintain**- If both practice fields are not converted to turf, they are in urgent need of reconditioning and regular maintenance. Currently, only two grass fields remain, which are heavily used by football, band, and soccer programs. I propose implementing a consistent maintenance schedule to preserve their quality. Additionally, converting these two grass fields to turf would further benefit our athletics programs by providing durable, year-round practice surfaces.

Coach Montgomery will be entering his 16th season as Head Coach of the Bixby Spartans. He has led the Spartans to 11 straight championship appearances earning 10 state championship titles: 7 in Oklahoma's 6A-II classification and 3 in Oklahoma's 6A-1 classification. He has an overall record of 143-40 and a playoff record of 32-3 as the Spartans Head Coach.

In 2019, Coach Montgomery earned OSSAA, Daily Oklahoman, and Tulsa World Coach of the Year honors, and OCA Region 7 and NFHS Regional Coach of the Year. In 2022, he was once again awarded the Tulsa World Coach of the Year. In 2022 and 2023, he had the opportunity to coach in the UA All-American Game in Orlando, FL. In 2023, he served as the head coach. He also led the Spartans to a 58-game winning streak.

Before arriving in Bixby in 2010, Coach Montgomery spent 10 seasons as an Assistant Football Coach for the Jenks Trojans. During his time at Jenks, he served as Interim Head Coach, Offensive Coordinator, Offensive Line Coach, and Strength Coach. Coach Montgomery coordinated an offense that set the all-time record for points scored at Jenks averaging nearly 50 points per game. Montgomery has coached over 40 NCAA Division IA athletes, several of whom had careers in the NFL.

Prior to entering the coaching profession, Coach Montgomery was a 4-year starter on the offensive line at Northeastern State University in Tahlequah, OK. Montgomery was a starter on NSU's 1999 Division II Semifinals team. Coach Montgomery also earned Academic All-Conference accolades while he was a member of the Redmen football team under legendary coach Tom Eckert. Coach Montgomery is a 2025 inductee into the NSU Athletic Hall of Fame.

Coach Montgomery holds a Master's Degree in Teaching and Learning Leadership from Oklahoma State University and a Bachelor of Science in Special Education from Northeastern State University.

Coach Montgomery attended high school at Charles Page High School in Sand Springs where he was a 6A All-State offensive lineman under Hall of Fame Coach L.D. Bains. Coach Montgomery started on both the offensive and defensive lines.

Coach Montgomery has been married to his wife Jessica for 22 years. Loren and Jessie have two children Guy (15) and Sloane (13).

STRENGTH CULTURE

January 2025 S&C Update

We are now wrapping up our first month of training for the second semester. Fortunately, we've experienced fewer interruptions to our training this year due to weather. This consistency has been beneficial in numerous ways.

First, it helps us maintain our goal of **progressive overload**. Each week, we gradually increase either the volume or intensity of our exercises. For clarity: **intensity** refers to the weight on the bar, while **volume** refers to the total number of repetitions performed. Consistent training weeks allow us to stay on track with our schedule and progressively improve.

Second, consistent training minimizes spikes in training volumes or intensities. Gradual increases in these factors reduce the risk of disruptions to the body, allowing athletes to adapt more easily. This is particularly critical at the start of a new semester. After a two-week break, it's important to ramp up training slowly to prevent issues such as soft tissue or orthopedic injuries, which can occur when volumes or intensities increase too rapidly. At the high school level, we're fortunate to work with our athletes year-round. This allows us to make these transitions more patiently, utilizing our 48 weeks of training opportunities each year to build strength and resilience effectively.

Current Program Overview: Football Team

Now, let's discuss our current program for the football team. After winning the state championship this fall, our season ended in December. Following that, we had two weeks of training before a two-week break for Christmas. The goal during the two weeks post-season was to restore lost movement patterns and help the body recover and feel better.

Since the last four weeks of the season weren't very intensive, we began the new semester with low training intensities and moderate volume. Some volume is necessary at this stage, as one of our key goals is to rebuild muscle mass lost during the season.

I typically organize training into four-week waves:

Week 1: Teach – Introduce and refine movements.

Week 2: Base – Establish a foundation of strength and endurance.

Week 3: Load – Gradually increase intensity or volume.

Week 4: Perform – Focus on performance and execution.

At the start of the semester, however, I program a six-week wave. The first two weeks are dedicated to building a base before transitioning into the traditional four-week cycle.

This semester, we started with low percentages of intensity and gradually built up each week. For exercises where we aimed to increase volume, we used a flat-loading approach for the first two weeks. This means volume remained consistent to allow athletes to adapt to the training demands. Now, over the next four weeks, we will progressively increase volume each week.

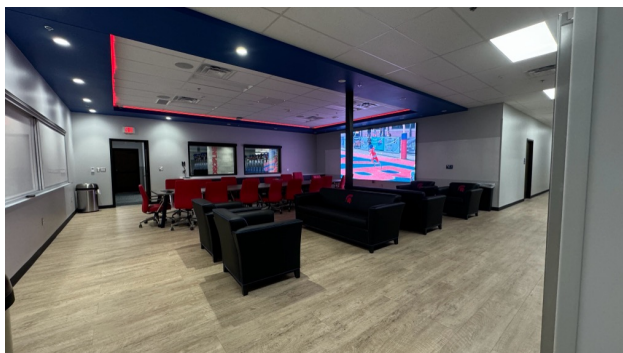

RECITALS:

- A. School District desires to employ Kori Neely, MA, LMFT to provide counseling and consultation services in School District's schools during the 25-26 school year in the position of Counseling Provider.
- B. Kori Neely, MA, LMFT desires to accept employment by Bixby Independent School District as Kori Neely, MA, LMFT under the terms of this contract.

BUSINESS INFORMATION SERVICES, LLC AGREEMENT

This **BUSINESS INFORMATION SERVICES, LLC AGREEMENT** (“Agreement”) is entered into by and between **BUSINESS INFORMATION SERVICES, LLC**, a Missouri Limited Liability Company (“BIS”), whose office for business is located at 375 NW Weschester, Blue Springs, MO 64014, and **Bixby Public Schools**, its directors, officers, employees, and agents (“District”), whose office for business is located at Bixby, Oklahoma.

WHEREAS, District desires to work with BIS to provide a demographic study of the Bixby Public Schools (said study being referred to herein as “Study”).

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein, and the compensation paid to BIS by District, BIS and District agree as follows.

I. EFFECTIVE DATE

The Effective Date of this Agreement shall be November 1, 2025.

II. TERM OF AGREEMENT

The term of this Agreement shall be for 365 days from the Effective Date stated herein subject to the Termination provision stated in this Agreement.

III. SERVICES.

The services provided shall include: provide student enrollment projections for 10 years by building, by grade level and district-wide, identify enrollment trends, student migration and other factors in the models used to project enrollment, analyze the number of students that live in the district but attend a private/parochial school, provide various charts, tables and maps by District school but not limited to population, socio-economic profile, housing characteristics, and population and student demographics.

Provide a capacity analysis based on gross square footage method, as well as a per-classroom count and classroom square footage. Emphasis on the project will include detailed analysis of future developments in the Bixby school district, which includes the City of Bixby and areas outside of the city. This new development work will include new maps of proposed developments, by-elementary attendance zone counts, and estimated student numbers per area.

A comprehensive report will be produced to include all of the above items. BIS will provide the district with a dozen (12) bound copies of the study and electronic copies, and all raw data files.

To complete the Study, BIS agrees to gather data from a wide variety of sources and use professional standards in the preparation of the Study.

It is expected that a draft demographic report will be delivered to the district by mid-February, 2026.

IV. DISTRICT OBLIGATION

District agrees to provide the following information in a usable format to BIS: a roster listing all students, with current addresses, for the last three years, correct names of all schools and grades assigned to each school, and a total number of students attending each school, by grade, for the last three years.

District agrees to send PDF schematics of all the schools that will show square footages per classroom, total gross square footages under the room, and classroom counts and designated use of classrooms.

District understands and agrees that the services offered by BIS are dependent on the data being provided by District in a timely and accurate manner. District understands and agrees that the accuracy of the proposed enrollment projections in the Study is dependent on the data provided by District.

V. COMPENSATION.

District agrees to compensate BIS at total of Twenty-Eight Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$28,000) for the Study, capacity analysis and all other items, which includes all publication expenses. No additional expenses will be billed under this contract. A billing of \$7,000 shall occur in November 2025, December 2025, January 2026 and February 2026.

VI. CONFIDENTIALITY AGREEMENT

BIS understands that, as a result of providing services pursuant to this Agreement, it may obtain proprietary or confidential information of the District and/or its students. District understands that by virtue of this Agreement, BIS may be considered a District official with a legitimate educational interest in personally identifiable student information under FERPA. BIS understands the requirements of FERPA and agrees to receive all student information subject to the requirements of FERPA. BIS warrants and agrees that it will not, directly or indirectly through another person, persons, firm, entity or any other means, use, disseminate, or disclose to any person, firm or business proprietary or confidential information of the District and/or its Students.

VII. INDEMNITY

BIS shall indemnify and hold District and District's officers and employees harmless from and against damages, losses and judgments arising from claims by third parties, including reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses recoverable under applicable law on account of negligence, but only to the extent they are caused by the negligent acts or omissions of BIS, its employees and its BISs in the performance of professional services under this Agreement.

District shall indemnify and hold BIS and BIS's officers and employees harmless from and against damages, losses and judgments arising from claims by third parties, including reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses recoverable under applicable law on account of negligence, but only

to the extent they are caused by the negligent acts or omissions of District, its employees in the performance of professional services under this Agreement.

VIII. TERMINATION

District may terminate this Agreement only for cause. For cause shall include, but not be limited to, any breach or threatened breach by BIS of any provision of this Agreement. District shall provide BIS with written notice of the alleged breach and BIS shall have thirty (30) days from receipt of the notice to cure any alleged breach. If BIS fails to cure the breach within thirty (30) days, the Agreement shall be terminated at the end of the thirty (30) day period and District shall be released from any further obligations under the Agreement. If full compensation has been made to BIS, District shall be entitled to a pro rata return of the compensation if the Agreement is terminated for cause. In the event that District wants to change the scope of the project, then this Agreement will become null and void and a new Agreement shall be submitted.

IX. NOTICE

Any notice given pursuant to this Agreement shall be in writing and sent by first class mail or facsimile or private courier to the other party at such party's address shown below or such other address(es) of which the sending party has received notice.

X. ASSIGNMENT

BIS agrees that the services and compensation subject to this Agreement shall not be assigned or transferred to any other person or entity by BIS without the written permission of District.

XI. AMENDMENTS

Any amendment to this Agreement shall be in writing and signed by a duly authorized signature for each party.

XII. COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAWS

In performing this Agreement, all parties agree to comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules, and regulations.

XIII. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Agreement is declared invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect and this Agreement shall be construed and performed as if it did not contain the invalid or unenforceable provision. If, however, the invalid or unenforceable provision materially deprives one party of the benefit of its bargain, the parties agree to renegotiate such invalid or unenforceable provision to restore the original intent of the parties.

XIV. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement, together with any addenda, exhibits, and/or attachments, constitutes the entire understanding of the parties hereto. Any prior agreements, documents, understandings, or representations relating to the subject matter of this Agreement and not expressly set forth herein or referred to or incorporated herein by reference are superseded hereby and are of no force or effect.

XV. GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the state of Oklahoma.

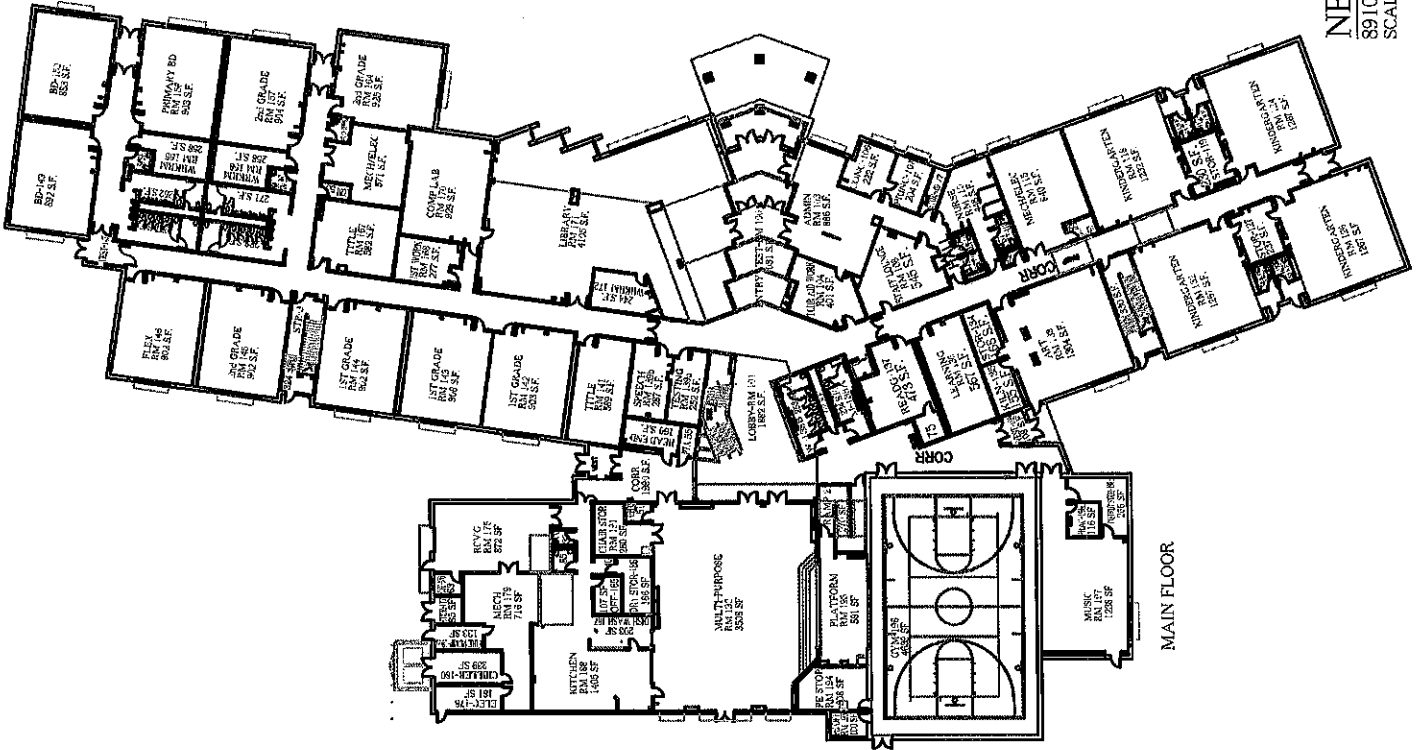
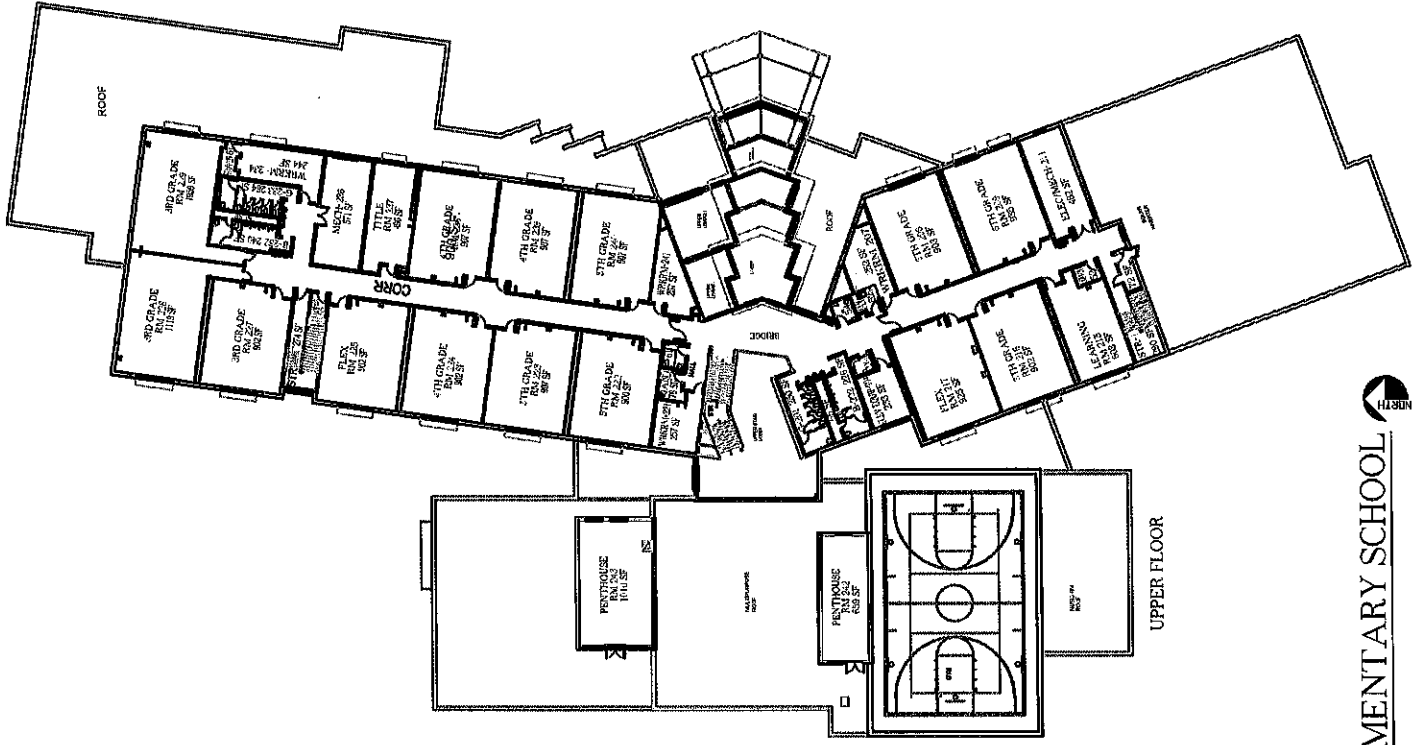

MONITORING/ALARM VERIFICATION/GUARD RESPONSE

2. **COMMUNICATION SYSTEM REMAINS PERSONAL PROPERTY OF LIS:** LIS shall install and program communication software and radio, cellular and/or internet connection devices (the "**Communication System**") connected to the Security/Alarm System. The Communication System shall remain the sole personal property of LIS and no proprietary interest, in law or equity, shall be conveyed to Subscriber. Moreover, it shall not be considered a fixture, or an addition to, alteration, conversion, improvement, modernization, remodeling, repair or replacement of any part of the Property, and Subscriber shall not permit the attachment thereto of any apparatus not furnished by LIS. Communication software is part of the instrument panel programmed to transmit a signal. The passcode to CPU software remains property of LIS. Provided Subscriber performs this Agreement for the full term thereof, upon termination LIS shall, in its sole discretion, provide to Subscriber the passcode to the CPU software or change the passcode to the manufacturer's default code.

3. **DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE AND EQUIPMENT:** Value of installed Communication System is: \$ N/A

4. **INSTALLATION AND SERVICE CHARGES:** In addition to the purchase price set forth in Section 1, Subscriber agrees to pay LIS:

(a) **Communication System Installation:** the sum of \$ N/A, plus tax for the installation and programming of the Communication System (if not previously installed).

(b) **Monitoring Service:** the sum of \$ 1,085.00, plus tax, per month, in advance for the monitoring and servicing of the Communication System for the Term (as defined in Section 5) commencing on the first day of the month next succeeding the date hereof, and continuing monthly thereafter, all payments being due on the first day of each month during the Term. The balance of all payments due under this Section 4(b) are due and payable upon execution of this Agreement. However, for the convenience of Subscriber and so long as the Subscriber is not in default under any term of this Agreement, Subscriber may make payments as provided in this Section 4(b).

(c) **Guard Response Service:** the sum of \$ N/A per month, plus tax, for the Term (or \$ N/A per guard response). If guard response is specified as a service to be provided, upon receipt of an alarm signal, LIS or its subcontractor shall as soon as reasonably practical send one or more of its guards to the Property. Unless any such guard determines that the alarm is a false alarm and that no situation requiring police or fire department services exist, the guard shall notify the LIS's central office or law enforcement or fire department directly that an emergency situation exists and wait up to fifteen (15) minutes for law enforcement or fire department personnel or Subscriber to arrive at the Property and if permitted by law enforcement shall assist in making a search of the Property to determine the cause of the alarm. If provided with keys to the Property, the guard shall endeavor to secure the Property and repair the security equipment. However, Subscriber acknowledges that the guard is not required to enter the Property or to render any service to the security equipment and shall not be required to remain stationed at Subscriber's Property for more than fifteen (15) minutes after initial arrival. Subscriber authorizes any guard to take such action as such individual deems necessary to secure the Property and reset the alarm, though Subscriber acknowledges that the guard may not be able to or may not have sufficient time to secure the Property or reset the alarm and put same in working order. If Subscriber requests LIS to station its guard at the Property for more than fifteen (15) minutes, and LIS, in its sole discretion) has sufficient personnel to provide such service then Subscriber agrees to pay LIS Sixty-Five Dollars (\$65.00) per half hour plus tax for such service. Subscriber agrees to confirm the request to LIS to provide extended guard service by email, text or recorded conversation to LIS at the time the request is made and LIS is authorized to ignore any request not confirmed within fifteen (15) minutes.

(d) **Alarm Signal Verification Service:** the sum of \$ N/A per month for the Term. If Subscriber selects Alarm Signal Verification as a service to be provided, or if Alarm Signal Verification is required by law, LIS or its designated central office shall verify the alarm signal by electronic telephone communication, video verification or such other verification system deemed appropriate by LIS or as required by law and only verified alarm conditions shall be communicated to police or fire department.

5. TERM OF AGREEMENT; RENEWALS/ INCREASES OF MONTHLY CHARGE: The term of this agreement shall be for a period of _____ month to month and shall automatically renew month to month thereafter under the same terms and conditions, unless either party gives written notice to the other by certified mail, return receipt requested, of their intention not to renew the Agreement at least 30 days prior to the expiration of any term. After the expiration of one year after the initial five year terms, LIS reserves the right from time to time to increase its charge under the Agreement by an amount not to exceed nine percent (9%) each year and Subscriber agrees to pay such increase as invoiced.

6. MONITORING LIMITATIONS: Upon receipt of a signal from Subscriber's Security/Alarm System, LIS shall make every reasonable effort to notify Subscriber and the appropriate law enforcement agency and/or fire department. Subscriber acknowledges that signals transmitted from the Property directly to law enforcement agencies or fire departments are not monitored by personnel of LIS or LIS's central office and LIS does not assume any responsibility for the manner in which such signals are monitored or the response, if any, to such signals by third parties. Subscriber acknowledges that signals which are transmitted over telephone lines, wire, air waves, internet, VOIP, radio or cellular, or other modes of communication pass through communication networks wholly beyond the control of LIS and are not maintained by LIS and LIS shall not be responsible for any failure which prevents transmission signals from reaching LIS's central office monitoring center or damages arising therefrom, or for data corruption, theft or viruses to Subscriber's computers if connected to alarm communication equipment. Subscriber agrees to furnish LIS with a written list of names and telephone numbers of those persons Subscriber wishes to receive notification of alarm signals. All changes and revisions shall be supplied to LIS in writing. Subscriber authorizes LIS to access the control panel of the Security/Alarm System to input or delete data and programming. If the Security/Alarm System contains video or listening devices permitting LIS's central office to monitor video or sound, then upon receipt of an alarm signal LIS's central office shall monitor video or sound for so long as LIS personnel, in their sole discretion, deem appropriate to confirm an alarm. If Subscriber requests LIS to remotely activate or deactivate the Security/Alarm System, change combinations, openings or closings, or re-program system functions, Subscriber shall pay LIS Ninety Dollars (\$90.00) for each such service. LIS may, without prior notice, suspend or terminate all services to be provided hereunder, LIS's sole discretion, in event of Subscriber's default in performance of this Agreement or in event the Security/Alarm System or Communication System is nonoperational or if the Security/Alarm System is sending excessive false alarms. LIS is authorized to record and maintain audio and video transmissions, data and communications, and shall be the exclusive owner of such property.

SERVICE/INSPECTION

7. SERVICE OF ALARM SYSTEM: Any amounts charged for service to the Security/Alarm System under this Agreement shall include both parts and labor. At Subscriber's request, LIS shall service the Security/Alarm System between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, within a reasonable period of time after receiving notice from Subscriber that service is required, exclusive of Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays. All repairs, replacement or alteration to the Security/Alarm System made by reason of alteration to the Property, or caused by unauthorized intrusion, lightning or electrical surge, or caused by any means other than normal usage, wear and tear, shall be made at Subscriber's sole cost and expense. Batteries, electrical surges, lightning damage, obsolete components and components which have exceeded the manufacturer's stated estimated useful life are not included in service and will be repaired or replaced at Subscriber's expense. Subscriber shall not attach or connect any apparatus or device to the Security/Alarm System as originally installed without LIS's written consent.

8. SERVICE AND INSPECTION OPTIONS FOR SECURITY/ALARM SYSTEM: (Strike out a or b; c is optional – both parties should initial any strikeouts)

(a) **Per-Call Service:** Subscriber agrees to pay LIS for servicing the Security/Alarm System on a per-call, "as incurred" basis. If this Agreement provides for service on a per call basis, Subscriber agrees to pay LIS for all parts and labor at time of service.

(b) **Monthly Service Fee:** Subscriber agrees to pay LIS the sum of \$ N/A , plus tax, per month, in advance for the servicing of the Security/Alarm System for the Term commencing on the first day of the month next succeeding the date hereof, and continuing monthly thereafter, all payments being due on the first day of each month during the Term. The balance all payments due under this Section 8(b) are due and payable upon execution of this Agreement. However, for the convenience of Subscriber and so long as the Subscriber is not in default under any term of this Agreement, Subscriber may make the payments as provided in this Section 8(b).

(c) **Yearly Inspection Service:** Subscriber agrees to pay LIS the sum of \$ N/A , plus tax, per month, in advance for inspection service for the Security/Alarm System. If this option is selected LIS will make an annual inspection of the Security/Alarm System. Inspection service includes testing of all components to insure proper working order. LIS will notify Subscriber thirty (30) days in advance of inspection date, and it is Subscriber's responsibility to reschedule or permit access. Only one (1) scheduled inspection is included. Testing at inspection insures only that components are in proper working order at time of inspection unless otherwise reported by Subscriber to LIS at time of inspection.

9. LIQUIDATED DAMAGES: Provided Subscriber has selected the monthly service fee for servicing of the Security/Alarm System set forth in Section 8(b) and/or the yearly inspection service set forth in Section 8(c), the parties agree that due to the nature of the services to be provided by LIS, the payments to be made by Subscriber for the Term are an integral part of LIS's anticipated profits and in the event of Subscriber's breach of this Agreement it would be difficult, if not impossible, to reasonably estimate LIS's actual damages. Therefore, in the event of Subscriber's default under this Agreement LIS, LIS may accelerate and declare immediately payable all payments still due and owing under Sections 4(b), 8(b) and 8(c) and Subscriber shall pay to LIS eighty percent (80%) of the balance of such amounts as Liquidated Damages. The parties intend that Subscriber's payment of the Liquidated Damage Amount would serve to compensate LIS for any breach of Subscriber's obligations under this Agreement, and they do not intend for it to serve as punishment for any such breach by Subscriber.

REMOTE SERVICE ACCESS

10. REMOTE SERVICES ACCESS: If remote view camera(s) and/or any remote keypad control module is included in the Security/Alarm System and remote services are to be provided, the equipment will transmit data via Subscriber's high speed Internet service to Subscriber's device which is compatible with LIS's remote services server. LIS will grant access to server permitting Subscriber to monitor the Security/Alarm System, access the Security/Alarm System to arm and disarm the Security/Alarm System, and view the remote video camera(s). The remote services server is provided either by LIS or a third party. LIS shall install the camera(s) in a permissible legal location at the Property to permit Subscriber viewing. LIS shall not be responsible for failure of data transmission, corruption or unauthorized access and shall not monitor or view the camera data.

11. WIRELESS AND INTERNET ACCESS CAPABILITIES: Subscriber is responsible for supplying high speed internet access at the Property. LIS does not provide internet service or maintain any internet connection or wireless service, computer, smart phone, electric current connection or supply, or maintain a remote video server. LIS will provide Subscriber with a unique passcode with which to access LIS's website, thereby providing access to the Security/Alarm System. LIS is not responsible or liable for the sufficiency or adequacy of Subscriber's access to the internet or any interruption of service or down time of remote access. Subscriber agrees and acknowledges that the Security/Alarm System can be compromised if the internet codes or devices used for access are lost or accessed by others and Subscriber acknowledges that LIS shall have no liability for such third party unauthorized access. LIS is not responsible for the security or privacy of any wireless network system or router. Wireless systems can be accessed by others, and it is Subscriber's responsibility to secure access to any wireless systems or networks with pass codes and lock outs.

LIMITED WARRANTY ON SALE



12. In the event that any part of the Security/Alarm System is or becomes defective, or in the event that any repairs are required, LIS agrees to make any and all repairs and replacement of parts at no cost to Subscriber for a period of ninety (90) days from the date of installation. LIS reserves the option to either replace or repair the defective parts or components of the Security/Alarm System and reserves the right to substitute materials of equal quality at time of replacement, or to use reconditioned parts in fulfillment of this warranty. This warranty does not include batteries, reprogramming, damage by lightning, electrical surge, wire or foil breaks. LIS is not the manufacturer of the equipment and components constituting the Security/Alarm System and other than LIS's limited warranty set forth in this Section 12, Subscriber agrees that LIS is providing no warranty of any equipment or components.

THE FOREGOING LIMITED WARRANTY IS IN LIEU OF ALL OTHER WARRANTIES AND NO OTHER REPRESENTATIONS, GUARANTEES OR WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED (LUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, A WARRANTY OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR PARTICULAR PURPOSE OR WARRANTY OF HABITABILITY), ARE MADE BY LIS IN CONNECTION WITH THE EQUIPMENT AND COMPONENTS CONSTITUTING THE SECURITY/ALARM SYSTEM AND THE INSTALLATION OR PURCHASE OR SALE THEREOF. NO EMPLOYEE OR REPRESENTATIVE IS AUTHORIZED TO CHANGE THESE WARRANTIES IN ANY WAY OR GRANT ANY OTHER WARRANTY ON BEHALF OF LIS. LIS does not represent nor warrant that the Security/Alarm System may not be compromised or circumvented, or that the Security/Alarm System will prevent any loss by burglary, hold-up, fire or otherwise; or that the Security/Alarm System will in all cases provide the protection for which it is installed. The limited warranty provided in this Section 12 does not cover any damage to material or equipment caused by accident, misuse, attempted or unauthorized repair service, modification, or improper installation by any third party other than LIS. The parties agree that in no event shall either party be liable for consequential damages arising under this Agreement. Subscriber acknowledges that any affirmation of fact or promise made by LIS shall not be deemed to create an express warranty unless included herein; that Subscriber is not relying on LIS's skill or judgment in selecting or furnishing a system suitable for any particular purpose and that there are no warranties which extend beyond those set forth in this Agreement, and that LIS has offered additional and more sophisticated equipment for an additional charge which Subscriber has declined. Subscriber's exclusive remedy for LIS's breach of this Agreement or negligence to any degree under this Agreement is to require LIS to repair or replace, at LIS's option, any equipment or components of the Security/Alarm System which are non-operational. If required by law, LIS will procure all permits required by local law and will provide certificate of workman's compensation prior to starting work. Any action for breach of the limited warranty provided in the Section shall be commenced within three (3) years after the expiration of the warranty; otherwise, such action automatically shall be deemed to have been waived; provided, however, that no action for breach of warranty may be brought unless written notice of the defect is provided to LIS within ten (10) days after expiration of the ninety (90) day warranty period described above.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

13. **FIRE ALARMS:** LIS has no responsibility or liability for and makes no representation that any fire alarm equipment at the Property which is not sold by LIS to Subscriber pursuant to this Agreement (and included on Schedule "A") meets local code requirements or constitutes a fire alarm system as that term is defined by any applicable law. If a fire alarm system to code is listed on Schedule "A", then LIS will install fire alarm equipment pursuant to applicable law. Subscriber agrees that the cost of any fire alarm equipment required by law but not specified on Schedule "A" will be Subscriber's sole responsibility.

14. **DELAY IN INSTALLATION:** LIS shall not be liable for any damage or loss sustained by Subscriber as a result of delay in installation of equipment, equipment failure, or for interruption of any service to be provided by LIS hereunder due to electric failure, strikes, walk-outs, war, acts of God, or other causes, including LIS's negligence in the performance of this Agreement. The estimated date work is to be substantially completed is not a definitive completion date and time is not of the essence with regard to any provision of this Agreement.

15. **TESTING AND SERVICE OF COMMUNICATION SYSTEM:** The Communication System, once installed, is in the exclusive possession and control of the Subscriber, and it is Subscriber's sole responsibility to test the operation of the Communication System and to notify LIS if it is in need of repair or not functioning properly. LIS shall not be required to service the Communication System unless it has received notice from Subscriber, and upon such notice, LIS shall service the Communication System to the best of its ability within thirty-six (36) hours, exclusive of Saturday, Sunday and legal holidays, during the business hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Service of the Communication System is LIS's responsibility.

16. **CARE OF COMMUNICATION SYSTEM:** Subscriber agrees not to tamper with, remove or otherwise interfere with the Communication System which shall remain in the same location as installed and Subscriber agrees to bear the cost of repairs or replacement made necessary as a result of any damage to the Communication System, including but not limited to damage caused by unauthorized intrusion to the Property, lightning or electrical surge. The parties agree that there are no third party beneficiaries of this Agreement. Subscriber on its own behalf and on behalf of any of its insurers hereby waives any right of subrogation which any of Subscriber's insurers may otherwise have against any LIS Indemnitee arising out of this Agreement or the relation of the parties hereunder. Subscriber shall not be permitted to assign this Agreement without written consent of LIS which consent may be withheld by LIS in its reasonable discretion. LIS shall have the right to assign this Agreement and shall be relieved of any obligations herein upon such assignment.

21. **EXCULPATORY CLAUSE:** LIS and Subscriber agree that LIS is not an insurer and no insurance coverage is offered herein. The Security/Alarm System is designed to reduce certain risks of loss, though LIS does not guarantee that no loss will occur. LIS is not assuming liability, and, therefore shall not be liable to Subscriber for any loss, personal injury, data corruption or inability to retrieve data, or property damage sustained by Subscriber as a result of burglary, theft, hold-up, fire, equipment failure, smoke, or any other cause, whatsoever, regardless of whether or not such loss or damage was caused by or contributed to by LIS's negligent performance, failure to perform any obligation or strict products liability. Subscriber hereby releases LIS from any claims for contribution, indemnity or subrogation.

22. **INSURANCE:** The Subscriber shall maintain adequate insurance, covering general liability, property damage, burglary and theft insurance under which LIS and the Subscriber are named as insured, and under which the insurer agrees to indemnify and hold LIS harmless from and against all claims, costs, damages, losses, expenses, (including any reasonable attorneys' fees, costs and expenses) and liability arising out of or based upon any and all claims, lawsuits, injuries and damages arising under this Agreement, including, but not limited to, those



claims, injuries and damages contributed to by LIS's negligence or its failure to perform any obligation arising under this Agreement or otherwise. The minimum limits of liability of such insurance coverage shall be One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00). LIS shall not be responsible for any portion of any loss or damage which is recovered or recoverable against Subscriber by any insurer covering such loss or damage or for such loss or damage against which the Subscriber is indemnified or insured.

23. Mingo Road, Tulsa, OK 74117), as the case may be, or to such other address as shall have been furnished in writing by either Party to the other. All such notices, requests, demands and communications shall be deemed to have been received on the date of delivery or on the third day after the mailing thereof, whichever is sooner. Subscriber submits to the jurisdiction and laws of Oklahoma and agrees that any litigation or arbitration between the parties must be commenced and maintained in Tulsa County, Oklahoma. In the event of termination of law enforcement or fire response this Agreement shall nevertheless remain in full force and Subscriber shall remain liable for all payments provided for herein. Should LIS be required by existing or hereinafter enacted law to perform any service or furnish any material not specifically covered by the terms of this Agreement Subscriber agrees to pay LIS for such service or material.

31. FULL AGREEMENT/SEVERABILITY: This Agreement along with the Schedule "A" attached hereto and hereby incorporated by reference constitutes the full understanding of the parties and may not be amended, modified or canceled, except in writing signed by both parties. Subscriber acknowledges and represents that Subscriber, in entering into this Agreement, has not relied on any representation, assertion, guarantee, warranty, collateral contract or other assurance by LIS or any third party, except those set forth in this Agreement. Subscriber hereby waives all rights and remedies, at law or in equity, arising, or which may arise, as the result of Subscriber's reliance on such representation, assertion, guarantee, warranty, collateral contract or other assurance. Should any provision of this Agreement be deemed void, the remaining parts shall not be affected. This Agreement shall run concurrently with and shall not terminate or supersede any existing agreement between the parties unless specified herein. The captions and headings used in this Agreement are for convenience of reference only and shall not be considered part of this Agreement or used in its interpretation or construction.

32. AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE: The Parties warrant and represent that the individuals signing this Agreement have the full power and authority to execute this Agreement, bind the respective Parties, and to perform obligations set forth in this Agreement.

33. GOVERNING LAW AND VENUE: Subject to the provisions herein, this Agreement shall be governed, construed and interpreted by, through and under the Laws of the State of Oklahoma. The Parties further agree that the venue for any and all disputes related to this Agreement shall be Tulsa County, Oklahoma.

Introduction

LifeWise Academy utilizes the structure and focus of The Gospel Project curriculum. This curriculum originally produced for Sunday school and group applications, has been licensed by LifeWise and reformed to suit the needs of a released time program. Foundational Curriculum

Where other programs study Bible stories, The Gospel Project curriculum focuses on God's plan to rescue His people from sin through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We draw from and build upon lessons and activities provided by The Gospel Project. These lessons are a special character quality that are changed by the gospel, becoming evident in their lives.

Course Objectives:

The LifeWise Threefold Focus

 Chapter 1 - School Code of 1971

 Article Article XXIV - Miscellaneous Provisions

 Section 24-156 - Chase Morris Sudden Cardiac Arrest Prevention Act

Cite as: 70 O.S. § 24-156 (OSCN 2024)

-
- A. This act shall be known and may be cited as the “Chase Morris Sudden Cardiac Arrest Prevention Act”.
- B. As used in the Chase Morris Sudden Cardiac Arrest Prevention Act, “athletic activity” means any sport sanctioned and offered in grades seven through twelve by a school district.
- C. The State Department of Health and the State Department of Education shall jointly develop and post on their publicly accessible websites guidelines and other relevant materials to inform and educate students participating in or desiring to participate in an athletic activity, their parents, and their coaches about the nature and warning signs of sudden cardiac arrest including the risks associated with continuing to play or practice after experiencing one or more symptoms of sudden cardiac arrest including unexplained fainting, difficulty breathing, chest pains, dizziness, and abnormal racing heart rate. In developing the guidelines and materials, the State Department of Health and the State Department of Education may utilize existing materials developed by other entities or organizations.
- D. A student participating in or desiring to participate in an athletic activity and the student’s parent, or guardian shall, each school year and prior to participation by the student in an athletic activity, sign and return to the student’s school an acknowledgement of receipt and review of a sudden cardiac arrest symptoms and warning signs information sheet jointly developed by the State Department of Health and the State Department of Education.
- E. A school may hold an informational meeting prior to the start of each athletic season for all ages of competitors regarding the symptoms and warning signs of sudden cardiac arrest. In addition to students, parents, coaches, and other school officials, informational meetings may include physicians, pediatric cardiologists, and athletic trainers.
- F. A student who collapses or faints without a concurrent head injury while participating in an athletic activity shall be removed by the coach from participation at that time.
- G. A student removed or prevented from participating in an athletic activity pursuant to subsection F of this section shall not return to participation until the student is evaluated and cleared for return to participation in writing by a health care provider as defined in Section 3090.2 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- H. Once each year, a coach of an athletic activity, school nurses, and athletic trainers shall complete:
1. The sudden cardiac arrest training course offered by a provider approved by the State Department of Health; and
 2. Training in first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and use of an automated external defibrillator. The training shall follow guidelines set by a nationally recognized, guidelines-based organization focused on emergency cardiovascular care.
- A coach of an athletic activity shall not coach the athletic activity until the coach completes the training course required under this subsection.
- I. Each public school in this state shall develop a sudden cardiac emergency response plan. The plan shall be formulated by a school site administrator and presented to the school district board of education. The plan shall:
1. Establish and provide for membership of a sudden cardiac emergency response team for each school site. Each team shall include a school site administrator;
 2. Activate the team in response to a sudden cardiac arrest;

I. Each public school in this state shall develop a sudden cardiac emergency response plan. The plan shall be formulated by a school site administrator and presented to the school district board of education. The plan shall:

1. Establish and provide for membership of a sudden cardiac emergency response team for each school site.

Each team shall include a school site administrator.

2. Activate the team in response to a sudden cardiac arrest.

3. Implement automated external defibrillator (AED) placement and routine maintenance within the school as needed and dictated by the plan and in accordance with guidelines set by a nationally recognized, guidelines-based organization focused on emergency cardiovascular care. The plan shall provide for implementation of clearly marked and easily accessible AED placement;

4. Provide for communication and dissemination of the plan throughout the school campus;

5. Require the response team to practice the plan by conducting periodic drills;

6. Provide for coordination with emergency medical service providers that serve the area in which the school is located;

7. Address athletic events and athletic facilities at each middle school and high school site provided:

a. an AED shall be placed at each athletic venue or be accessible within one to three minutes of each venue where athletic practices or competitions are held, or

b. a mobile AED device shall be on the premises in accordance with guidelines set by a nationally recognized, guidelines-based organization focused on emergency cardiovascular care;

8. Provide for appropriate school staff to be trained in first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and the use of an AED in accordance with guidelines set by a nationally recognized, guidelines-based organization focused on emergency cardiovascular care. The plan shall stipulate the appropriate staff to receive training which shall include, but not be limited to, athletic coaches, school nurses, and athletic trainers; and

9. Be reviewed by the school district board of education and sudden cardiac emergency response team members and updated annually.

J. The sponsors of youth athletic activities not associated with a school are encouraged to follow the guidance stated in the Chase Morris Sudden Cardiac Arrest Prevention Act.

K. Nothing in the Chase Morris Sudden Cardiac Arrest Prevention Act shall be construed to create, establish, expand, reduce, contract, or eliminate any civil liability on the part of any school or school employee.

L. The State Board of Health and the State Board of Education shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of the Chase Morris Sudden Cardiac Arrest Prevention Act.

They will then stay available to communicate with other important team members and access student information for family contact. The member awaiting EMS will position themselves to make contact with the EMS crew and guide them to the incident. They will also call the admin building and inform them of the incident. The member responsible for hallway crowd control will direct other students away from the incident and be available to take charge of students.

Per your request, we are pleased to present this scope of work and fee proposal for architectural services for the above-referenced project.

SCOPE OF WORK:

The project consists of the interior buildout for an existing 2400 sq. ft. one story building shell for use as a vocational educational building for high school students. The project is to include two classrooms, an office, a woodshop and toilet rooms (see Exhibit One). CJC will conduct a code analysis of the adjacent Agg building to determine if the quantity of plumbing fixtures is high enough to serve both buildings load requirements. CJC will assist Owner in development of program to include functional and area requirements, relationships, and cost budgeting.

The building construction consists of wood framed walls and roof. The exterior material for both the walls and roof are exposed fastener metal R panels. The existing building is not fire sprinklered.

CJC has conducted a preliminary review of the building code and since this is a stand-alone building, we believe the wood shop does not require the fire separation typically associated with incidental uses in an education occupancy type. For building code review we would look at the functions of the building as a vocational education space. We suggest conducting a predevelopment meeting with the City of Bixby prior to starting work to confirm the "Authority Having Jurisdiction" agrees with our assessment.

CJC Architects, Inc. will provide architectural and MEP design services separately for the interior buildout of the project as described in the SCOPE OF SERVICES listed below. If the district chooses to move forward with Architectural services only the MEP will be a deferred design under the responsibility of the MEP trade contractors.

SCOPE OF SERVICES:

Based on the Scope of Work, CJC Architects Inc. proposes the following phased design services:

SCHEMATIC DESIGN PHASE

Attend a project kick-off meeting to review project parameters. Initiate building survey of existing conditions. Develop site plan and floor plan drawings of the existing conditions.

Prepare a Schematic Design Submittal to include site plan and floor plan drawings for review and approval. The site plan and floor plan will illustrate the size and use of the spaces and compliance with

the building code. A narrative of the building systems utilized will be provided. An opinion for the cost of the work will be provided that reflects the approach to the project budget.

DESIGN DEVELOPMENT PHASE

Prepare a Design Development submittal based on comments received from the Schematic Design Submittal. The documents shall illustrate and describe the refinement of the design of the project, establishing the scope, relationships, forms, size and appearance of the project by means of plans, sections and elevations, and typical construction details. The documents shall include outline specifications that identify major materials and systems and establish in general their quality levels. The opinion for the cost of the work will be updated based on the work of this phase.

CONSTRUCTION DOCUMENTS PHASE

Prepare Construction Documents submittals based on review comments of the Design Development submittal. The Construction Documents shall set forth in detail the requirements for the construction of the project. They shall include drawings and specifications that establish in detail the quality levels of materials and systems required for the project, including the fire alarm, plumbing, mechanical, and electrical systems of the building.

PERMITTING AND PROCUREMENT SERVICES PHASE

Submit documents to the City of Bixby for building permit. Assist in obtaining competitive bids or negotiated proposals for the Work. Respond to questions and comments and issue addenda during the bidding period.

CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION SERVICES PHASE

Services include evaluations of the Work, submittal and shop drawing review, changes in the Work, and project completion services. Fees assume monthly trips to the project construction site by CJC and their consultants over a six-month construction period.

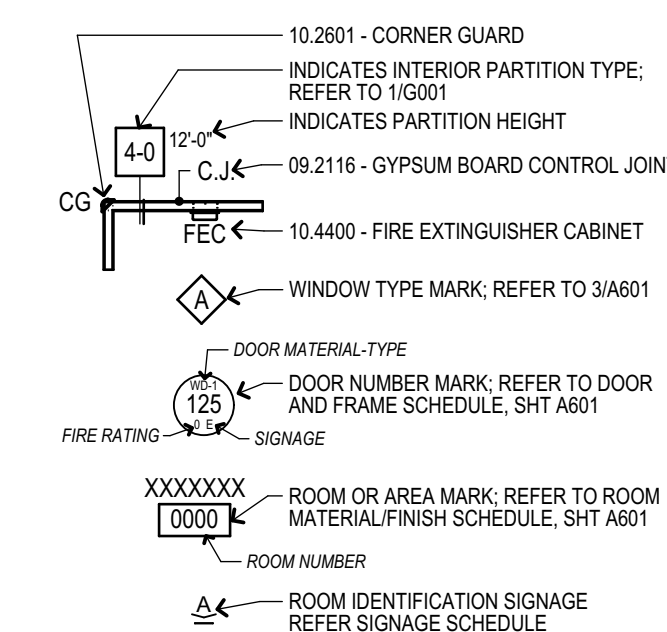

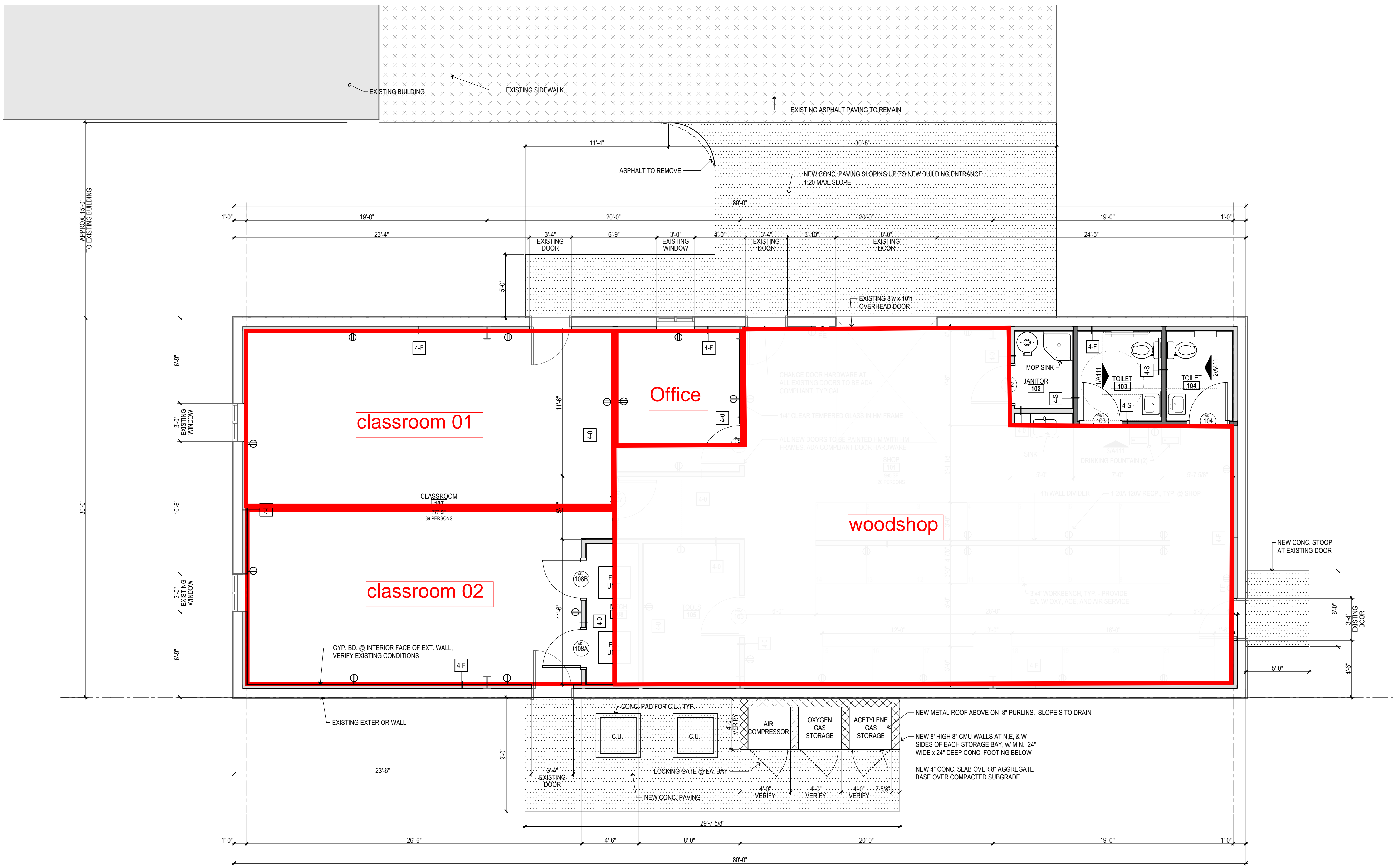

LICENSE AGREEMENT

THIS LICENSE AGREEMENT (the “Agreement”), dated as of _____, is made and entered into by and between **EMPLOYEE EVALUATION SYSTEMS, INC. (“EES”)**, whose notice address is 2801 N. Lincoln Blvd., suite 226, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73105, and **SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. _____ OF _____ COUNTY, OKLAHOMA, a/k/a _____ PUBLIC SCHOOLS (“District”).**

RECITALS:

A. EES has also developed a web application for use with the McREL principal/leader evaluation system.

B. EES and the District desire to license the use of EES’s McREL web-based System to the District for use in principal/leader evaluations for the 2025-2026 school year and thereafter.

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, EES and District agree as follows:

1. **Grant of License.** Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, EES hereby grants to District a non-exclusive, non-transferable license to use the McREL web-based System (the “License”).

2. **Term.** The term of this Agreement shall be for one year, beginning July 1, 2025 and ending June 30, 2026.

3. **Support, Training and Services.** District’s license of the McREL web-based System includes online access to the web-based principal/leader evaluation system, online users guides, unlimited technical support, reports of observation and evaluation data, and training related to the operation of the web-based system. State mandated training for evaluators on the McREL principal/leader system is not included with this license, and may be obtained from the State or State licensed vendors according to the requirements of the Oklahoma State Department of Education.

4. **License Fee.**

5. **Release by District.** District, in consideration for the grant of the License and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, hereby releases EES, its officers, agents and employees, from any and all liability or expense, including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys’ fees, expenses, costs, judgments, settlements, or other costs to the extent arising out of or relating to (1) District’s use, misuse or modification of the McREL web-based System; or (2) District’s failure to use corrections or enhancements to the McREL web-based System provided to District by EES.

6. **District’s Remedies.** District’s exclusive remedy hereunder is termination of this Agreement.

7. **Limitation of Liability.** To the maximum extent permitted by law, under no circumstances shall either party be liable to the other for indirect, incidental, consequential, special or exemplary damages arising from this agreement or the breach hereof.

8. **Miscellaneous.**

(a) **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties relative to the licensing of use of the McREL web-based System and supersedes all oral or written proposals or understandings concerning such subject matter. This Agreement may be modified only pursuant to a writing executed by both parties.

(b) **Severability.** If any of the provisions of this Agreement are held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable under any applicable statute or rule of law, such provision shall, to that extent, be deemed omitted and the remaining portions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

(c) **Survivability.** The obligations set forth herein shall survive any termination of this Agreement.

(d) **Waiver.** No term or provision of this Agreement shall be deemed to be waived and no consent to any breach or default shall be deemed to have been made unless such waiver or consent shall be in writing signed by the party against whom the waiver or consent is asserted. The waiver of one breach or default or any delay in exercising any rights under this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of any subsequent breach or default.

(e) **Construction.** Descriptive headings or captions in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not affect the construction or application of this Agreement. No rule of construction requiring interpretation against the drafting party shall be applied or given effect.

(f) **Intellectual Property.** District shall cooperate fully with EES in the maintenance and protection by EES of any rights or interests of EES in the McREL web-based System or other intellectual property or interests therein that are the subject matter of this License.
