

### 1. Roll Call

President Boeve called the meeting to order.

Board member Brent Gollner joined the meeting at 6:17 p.m.

### 2. Announcement - Jim Boeve

President Boeve reminded those in attendance of the Open Meetings Act.

### 3. Welcome to HEA reps and guests - Jim Boeve

President Boeve welcomed HEA representatives and guests. He asked those in attendance to introduce themselves.

### 4. Review Board Norms/Goal - Jim Boeve

There were no Board member comments.

### 5. Budget Update - Jeff Schneider & Erin Cafferty

Erin Cafferty reviewed expenditures for the current fiscal year and compared with prior years. Superintendent Schneider reviewed the budget presentation, noting he intends to recommend a reduction to the bond fund tax levy when approving the budget in September.

Board members held a discussion about the budget.

6. Approve Property Tax Authority Resolution - Jeff Schneider

Superintendent Schneider reviewed the proposed Property Tax Authority Resolution. Mr. Schneider stressed that passing this resolution provides the Board with options to consider in the future, but does not raise taxes on the community. The budget and tax levy is set by the Board each year in September.

Board members held a discussion about the Property Tax Authority Resolution.

7. Hold Parental Involvement Hearing and Reaffirm Policy 1005.03: Parental Involvement in the Schools - Lawrence Tunks

Lawrence Tunks reminded Board members of the annual hearing to be held on the Parental Involvement policy. The policy is to inform and encourage parental involvement in schools. There were no changes to the Parental Involvement Policy. Mr. Tunks will recommend reaffirmation of the Parental Involvement Policy after the hearing.

8. Approve New Policy 502.095: Full Time & Part Time Enrollment - 2nd Reading - Lawrence Tunks

Lawrence Tunks reviewed new Policy 502.095: Full Time & Part Time Enrollment. New policy is due to new legislation - LB 705, which revised part-time enrollment and extracurricular activity eligibility laws. No changes have been made since the first reading. Mr. Tunks will recommend approval of the second reading of new Policy 502.095: Full Time & Part Time Enrollment, as presented.

9. Revise Policy 506.01: Student Activity Eligibility - 2nd Reading - Lawrence Tunks

Lawrence Tunks reviewed new Policy 506.01: Student Activity Eligibility. Policy update is due to new legislation - LB 705, which revised part-time enrollment and extracurricular activity eligibility laws. The revision requires two readings because it refers to new policy 502.095. No changes have been made since the first reading. Mr. Tunks will recommend approval of the second reading of new Policy 506.01: Student Activity Eligibility, as presented.

10. Approve New Policy 604.012: Collection of Information regarding Dyslexia - 2nd Reading - Dr. Kandace Garwood

Dr. Kandace Garwood reviewed new Policy 604.012: Collection of Information regarding Dyslexia. Policy is to comply with new legislation - LB 298, which requires public school districts to submit information about student dyslexia to the Nebraska Department of Education. No changes have been made since the first reading. Dr. Garwood will recommend approval of the second reading of new Policy 604.012: Collection of Information regarding Dyslexia, as presented.

Board members held a discussion about the proposed policy.

11. Approve New Policy 608.011: Behavioral Points of Contact - 2nd Reading - Dr. Kandace Garwood

Dr. Kandace Garwood reviewed new Policy 608.011: Behavioral Points of Contact. Policy is to comply with legislation - LB 852 & LB 705, which requires schools to designate and publish behavioral points of contact. No changes have been made since the first reading. Dr. Garwood will recommend approval of the second reading of new Policy 608.011: Behavioral Points of Contact, as presented.

12. Approve New Policy 508.11: Seizure Safe Schools - 2nd Reading - Dr. Tom Szlanda  
Dr. Tom Szlanda reviewed new Policy 508.11: Seizure Safe Schools. New policy is to clarify compliance with legislation - LB 639, which required schools to develop plans for students with seizure disorders. No changes were made since the first reading. Dr. Szlanda will recommend approval of the second reading of new Policy 508.11: Seizure Safe Schools, as presented.

13. Approve New Policy 504.20: Initiations, Hazing, Secret Clubs & Outside Organizations - 2nd Reading - Dr. Tom Szlanda

Dr. Tom Szlanda reviewed new Policy 504.20: Initiations, Hazing, Secret Clubs & Outside Organizations. New policy is to comply with legislation - LB 705 (via LB 805), which repealed Neb. Rev. Stat. 79-2,103. No changes were made since the first reading. Dr. Szlanda will recommend approval of the second reading of new Policy 504.20: Initiations, Hazing, Secret Clubs & Outside Organizations, as presented.

14. Revise Policy 503.03: Enrollment Option - 2nd Reading - Jeff Schneider

Superintendent Schneider reviewed changes to Policy 503.03: Enrollment Option. Policy changes are due to new legislation - LB 705, which revamps Nebraska's option enrollment laws for special education students. Mr. Schneider noted this will become a regular September meeting agenda item. No changes were made since the first reading. Superintendent Schneider will recommend approval of the second reading of revised Policy 503.03: Enrollment Option, as presented.

15. Revise Policy 505.04: Alternative Education - 2nd Reading - Jeff Schneider

Superintendent Schneider reviewed changes to Policy 505.04: Alternative Education. Policy changes are due to new legislation - LB 705, which revised alternative education requirements for expelled students. No changes were made since the first reading. Mr. Schneider will recommend approval of the second reading of revised Policy 505.04: Alternative Education, as presented.

Board members held a discussion about the proposed policy.

16. Approve the addition of extra standard duty stipends to Appendix B - Dr. Tom Szlanda

Dr. Tom Szlanda reviewed the request to add two Category IV, extra-standard duty music stipends to compensate for directing musical productions. Dr. Szlanda will recommend approval of two new musical production director stipends for the 2023-2024 school year.

Board members held a discussion about the proposed extra duty stipends.



## Hastings Public Schools Safe Return to Learn Plan

The Hastings Public Schools will ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address student's academic needs and students' and staff social emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services.

HPS was able to accomplish this in the 2020-21 school year by using a variety of strategies, many of which are listed below. Counselors, Teachers, School Administrators, and School Psychologist were instrumental in the mental health accommodations for both students and staff members. Some of the other strategies/procedures were:

1. Face Coverings:
  - A. Required for students and staff in 20-21 until May 16<sup>th</sup>
  - B. Recommended in all HPS buildings since 5-16-21
  - C. Required for pre-k to 6<sup>th</sup> grade students beginning August 23<sup>rd</sup>
  - D. Required for 7-12 starting September 2, 2021
  - E. Based on attendance levels as approved at 2021 September Board Meeting.
2. Social Distancing:
  - A. Used alternate lunch procedures and spaces to allow as much as possible.
  - B. Attempted to use outdoor classrooms as much as possible
3. Hand washing and respiratory etiquette.
  - A. Scheduled extra time for hand washing and sanitizing.
  - B. Made hand sanitizer available in almost every room in the district
4. Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities.
  - A. Altered cleaning routines to schedule more time to clean surfaces more often such as door handles, desks, etc
  - B. Using enhanced HVAC products to improve the air quality.
5. Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine.

HPS will continue to work with local health officials in determining the need for isolation and quarantine for both students and staff members.
6. Diagnostic and screening testing.
  - A. HPS will continue to ask parents to screen students at home prior to bringing them to school.
  - B. HPS will continue to ask staff members to self-screen before reporting for duty.

7. Efforts to Provide Vaccinations to school community  
HPS already has and will continue to offer our facilities to be used as vaccination sites for students with parental consent as well as for staff members.
8. Appropriate accommodations for children with disabilities with respect to health/safety policies  
Each student with a disability will have accommodations to meet their health and safety needs.
9. Coordination with State and local health officials.  
HPS will continue to meet with and coordinate with State and local health officials and will be prepared to change operating procedures should the need arise. We will also continue to monitor the guidance given by the CDC.

#### “Ensuring Continuity of Services”

Hastings Public Schools will continue to ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address students’ academic needs and students’ and staff’s social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services.

#### “Public Comment Requirements”
