SCHOOL BOARD MEETING

Wednesday, November 19, 2025

The School Board of the Sioux Falls School District 49-5 of Minnehaha County, South Dakota, was called into special session, pursuant to due notice, on Wednesday, November 19, 2025, at 5:30 p.m. in the Instructional Planning Center, 201 East 38th Street, Sioux Falls, South Dakota, with the following members present: Elizabeth Duffy, Dawn Marie Johnson, Gail Swenson, Vice President Marc Murren, and President Nan Kelly. Absent: none. Dr. James Nold, Superintendent of Schools, Todd Vik, Business Manager, and Daniel Conrad, Assistant Superintendent, were also present.

* * * * *

The purpose of this work session was to provide updates and have general discussion on the following topic:

Daniel Conrad, Assistant Superintendent, went over the **Renberg Elementary School Facilities Planning Process**. He proposed the following advantages to closing Renberg: reduced time on buses, larger specials (band and orchestra), blended classes, STEM room at Marcella LeBeau, budget savings (\$2.6M next year in capital outlay savings), and less travel for Specials Teachers. He discussed the disadvantages as: students who currently open enroll to Renberg, students who are adjacent to Renberg, and the small school setting. As of the 2025-2026 school year, 80 students who currently attend Renberg Elementary live closer to Marcella LeBeau or Laura B. Anderson Elementary schools.

Superintendent Nold addressed the questions and concerns raised during the prior two parent feedback sessions. Projected City growth and possible school boundary changes were also presented. In summary the administrative recommendation was to have the Board vote on the proposed closure of Renberg Elementary School in the first semester of the 2026-2027 school year for the 2027-2028 school year. (Prior to November 30, 2026)

Public Input on the Agenda Items: Tanwá Moit, Joshua Lamar, Lynda Nix, Jeffrey Trainer, and Matt Leiss. All were not in favor of closing Renberg.

RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION, DELIVERY AND PERFORMANCE OF (i) A SUPPLEMENT TO A CERTAIN SUBLEASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE SCHOOL DISTRICT, AS TENANT, AND THE SOUTH DAKOTA BOARD OF TECHNICAL EDUCATION, AS LESSOR, AND (ii) CERTAIN RELATED MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH

RECITALS

WHEREAS, SIOUX FALLS SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 49-5 (the “School District”) is authorized pursuant to law to operate Southeast Technical College, a post secondary vocational technical education college under the general supervision of the South Dakota Board of Technical Education (the “Board”); and

WHEREAS, the South Dakota Health and Educational Facilities Authority (the “Authority”) is authorized pursuant to Chapter 1-16A, South Dakota Codified Laws, to issue bonds to finance the acquisition, improvement, repairing and equipping of post-secondary vocational technical education facilities for lease to and purchase by the Board and/or for use by the School District and other school districts or LEAs authorized to operate post-secondary vocational technical education programs (all such School Districts and LEAs being referred to herein as “Qualified Participating Institutions”); and

WHEREAS, Title 13, SDCL, provides that to secure lease purchase rentals payable by participating institutions and the Board to the Authority, the Board may pledge certain amounts of tuition and other student fees required to be paid to the Escrow Holder for deposit into the Tuition Subaccount; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has established a program (the “Program”) whereby the Board may lease purchase post-secondary vocational technical education facilities from the Authority and sublease such facilities to the Participating Institutions; and

WHEREAS, the Authority and the statutory predecessor to the Board have heretofore entered into a Lease Purchase Agreement dated as of August 1, 1988 as supplemented by various Supplements to Lease Purchase Agreement through and including that certain a Twenty-Second Supplement to Lease Purchase Agreement dated as of May 1, 2022 (collectively, all of the foregoing are referred to as the “Lease”) pursuant to which the Board is leasing with an option to purchase certain facilities the acquisition of which was financed or refinanced with the proceeds derived from the issuance and sale by the Authority of its Vocational Education Program Revenue Bonds of various series (collectively, the “Bonds”) issued pursuant to an Indenture of Trust dated as of August 1, 1988 (the “Original Indenture”) between the Authority and The First National Bank in Sioux Falls, as Trustee (the “Original Trustee”) as most recently amended and supplemented by that certain Twentieth Supplemental Indenture of Trust dated as of May 1, 2022 (collectively, all of the foregoing are

referred to as the "Indenture") between the Authority and U.S. Bank Trust Company, National Association, as successor Trustee (the "Trustee"); and

WHEREAS, in order to provide a credit against Lease Rentals owed by the Board under the Lease, the Participating Institutions have heretofore entered into a certain Amended and Restated Facility Fee Tuition Collection and Deposit Agreement (the "Collection Agreement") with the Board, the South Dakota Treasurer (the "Treasurer") and The First National Bank in Sioux Falls, as Escrow Holder (the "Original Escrow Holder" and, together with the successor Escrow Holder, U.S. Bank Trust Company, National Association, the "Escrow Holder"), providing for the collection of Facility Fees on a current basis and the deposit of such Facility Fees to the Tuition Subaccount (an account of the Treasurer's maintained with the Escrow Holder); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to a Sublease dated as of August 1, 1988 between the Board and the School District (as heretofore supplemented and amended, the "Original Sublease"), the School District is currently leasing certain improvements described therein from the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Authority proposes to issue one or more new series of refunding bonds (the "Refunding Bonds") in a principal amount not to exceed \$34,000,000 to refund the outstanding principal amount of the following Bonds of the Authority: (a) the Vocational Education Program Refunding Bonds, Series 2015A (the "Series 2015A Bonds"), (b) the Vocational Education Program Bonds, Series 2015B (the "Series 2015B Bonds") and (c) the Vocational Education Program Revenue Bonds, Series 2015C (the "Series 2015C Bonds" and together with the Series 2015A Bonds and Series 2015B Bonds, the "Refunded Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the Series 2015C Bonds were issued in part to finance the costs of a Transportation Technology Center and other campus improvements for use by the School District (the "Refunded Project") pursuant to the Original Sublease; and

WHEREAS, the issuance of the Refunding Bonds will refinance such Refunded Project and have the result of shortening the term of the Sublease and reducing the aggregate Sublease rentals; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the School District to enter into a Supplement to the Original Sublease to adjust the rentals payable thereunder to reflect debt service on the Refunding Bonds ("Supplemental Sublease"); and

WHEREAS, the Refunding Bonds are to be issued pursuant to a new Supplemental Indenture of Trust between the Authority and the Trustee (the "Supplemental Indenture"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority, Board and various other parties will enter into (1) a new Supplemental Lease Purchase Agreement between the Authority and the Board (the "Lease Supplement"), (2) a Bond Purchase Agreement with Baird Securities (the "Original Purchaser") (the "Bond Purchase Agreement") and (3) a Continuing Disclosure Agreement (the "Continuing Disclosure Agreement") in forms substantially similar to those previously used in connection with the Program, as modified, revised or supplemented to incorporate the terms hereof or otherwise in the manner herein provided or contemplated; and

WHEREAS, the School District has determined it is in the best interest to enter into a supplement the Original Sublease by entering into the Supplemental Sublease (the Original Sublease as amended and supplemented by the Supplemental Sublease and hereafter further amended or supplemented being referred to herein as the "Sublease");

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the School Board of the School District as follows:

THE PROGRAM

1.1 This School District Board finds that it is desirable and expedient to authorize the amendment to the Original Sublease in order to permit the Authority and the Board to issue the Refunding Bonds pursuant to the Supplemental Indenture. By adoption of this Resolution and the execution of the Supplemental Sublease, this School District Board ratifies and confirms the authorization of the imposition, collection and allocation of the Facility Fees for the benefit of the Board, the Authority and the holders from time to time of all Outstanding Bonds as provided in the Amended and Restated Collection Agreement.

1.2 This School District Board hereby authorizes the execution and delivery of the Supplemental Sublease. In addition, this School District Board hereby authorizes, ratifies and confirms that fee title to the land and building in which the Refunded Project is located shall be in the name of the Authority, subject to the rights of parties to the Lease and the Sublease.

1.3 The execution and delivery by the President and the Business Manager, or in their absence any other officer of the School District (collectively, the "Authorized Officers"), of the Supplemental Sublease, any additional or supplemental documents required in connection with any Additional Bonds, the Continuing Disclosure Agreement (if required by the parties) and other instruments described herein (collectively, the "Program Documents"), shall be conclusive evidence of such authorization without any further requirement of approval or authorization from this School Board. The Supplemental Sublease and other Program Documents shall be executed in the name and on behalf of the School District by the Authorized Officers, in substantially the form of previous supplemental subleases for the Program, but with all such changes therein, not inconsistent with law, as may be approved by the officers executing the same, which approval shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution thereof.

1.4 The Authorized Officers, or any one of them, shall be hereby authorized and directed to prepare and furnish to the Trustee, certified copies of all proceedings and records of the School District relating to the power and authority of the School District to execute and deliver the Supplemental Sublease, and certificates as to matters within their knowledge or as shown by the books and records under their custody and control, including a general and non-litigation certificate, any tax certificate and agreement relating to the Refunding Bonds and matters governed by Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. Such certified copies and certificates shall be deemed representations, covenants and agreements of the School District as to the facts, covenants and agreements contained therein.

Action 39859

Kristin Grinager, High School Curriculum Coordinator, presented **Graduation Rates and Freshmen Transition to Tenth Grade report** as follows (MRF #19840):

The Sioux Falls School District (SFSD) continues to strengthen student outcomes, with on-time graduation rates rising from 84.8% in the 2019-20 school year to 88.7% in the 2024-25 school year, nearly three points above the state average. The District's "Completer Rate", which includes students who earn a diploma or complete their high school requirements within five years, remains strong at 90.4%, reflecting effective support systems that help students stay engaged and finish high school, even if additional time is needed.

Strong early high school supports play a major role in these results. The Summer Connections Program helps incoming ninth graders build relationships, understand expectations, and feel prepared before the year begins. During the school year, the Freshmen Academy provides a structured, team-based model that includes mentoring and coordinated interventions. This approach has proven highly effective, with more than 95% of students in the Freshmen Academy advancing to tenth grade each year. The program serves roughly 80% of ninth graders districtwide and continues to be a key driver of early high school success.

High schools reinforce this foundation with credit recovery options, academic counseling, advanced coursework, and regular progress monitoring. These combined efforts have increased the total number of on-time graduates while reducing the number of students pursuing GEDs.

Together, these multi-layered strategies reflect a districtwide commitment to preparing every student for graduation and success beyond high school.

A motion was made by Elizabeth Duffy and seconded by Marc Murren four (4) votes "yes" on roll call **acknowledging the Graduation Rates and Freshmen Transition to Tenth Grade report**.

Action 39860

Todd Vik, Business Manager, presented the **Budget Guidelines and Timeline report**, as follows (MRF#19841):

A committee of Sioux Falls School District administration, two school board members, and various staff have developed the proposed budget timeline and guidelines for the FY27 Budget of all funds of the District.

The timeline again contains two public information sessions to be held on March 25, 2026, and on April 1, 2026, to allow for additional community review of budget recommendations prior to the Board's tentative budget adoption at the first regular school board meeting on April 13, 2026.

The guidelines require most General and Special Education cost centers to include three levels of funding:

- Level Three: 100% of prior year program
- Level Two: 99% of prior year program
- Level One: 98% of prior year program (depending on whether cuts were made the prior year)

The guidelines also require Central Leadership and Budget Advisory teams to prepare significant reduction line items in the Committed Funds cost center. fifth-grade class was larger than the incoming kindergarten cohort. Middle school enrollment increased by 62 students, and high school enrollment declined by 93. Open enrollment grew slightly to 1,033 students.

The opening of Marcella LeBeau Elementary School with 281 students affected enrollment at nearby schools, including Hawthorne, Renberg, and Hayward. The Elementary Immersion Center closed, with students now attending other schools in the district.

Fall funding FTE is 24,136, which is 194 fewer than last year. Overall, enrollment reflects modest shifts across grade levels due to school openings and closures, while middle school and open enrollment continue to grow steadily.

The secretary may issue an educator certificate to an international applicant for reciprocity certificate, if the applicant:

- (1) Holds the U.S. equivalent of a bachelor's degree or higher, as shown by a course-by-course credential report of university-level credit completed by an agency approved by the Association of International Credential Evaluators or the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services that states the course title, grade, and number of semester credit hours earned for each course and the U.S. equivalency of the degree earned;
- (2) Provides documentation showing completion of a program equivalent to a department-approved educator preparation program; and
- (3) Submits:
 - a) Documentation showing that the applicant holds a foreign educator credential in a teaching field comparable to a field recognized in South Dakota; or
 - b) Documentation, completed by the superintendent, principal, agency director, or designated personnel officer of the foreign school where the applicant is currently or was previously employed, showing that the applicant has at least three years of experience in the applicant's certification area within the previous five calendar years.

Sioux Falls School District Class Size Report 2025-2026 School Year EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Purpose of Report: To provide information on the current Full Time Equivalent (FTE) allocations to schools and the resulting student-to-teacher ratios or class sizes.

The Sioux Falls School District (SFSD) continues to maintain class sizes that support effective teaching and learning. For the 2025-26 school year, teacher allocations were set using the Board-approved ratios of 24.3 students per teacher at the elementary level, 24.41 at middle school, and 25.12 at high school.

Current enrollment shows elementary class sizes remain below the budgeted ratio, with an average of 23.35 students per teacher across 465 classrooms. Most elementary classes, about 70%, serve 25 or fewer students, and only a small share (3%) reach 30 or more.

Two-Way Spanish Immersion programs at Hayward and Rosa Parks Elementary maintain an overall ratio of 24.1 students per teacher, supported by interns and education support professionals (ESP) staff in early grades. The RISE program continues to offer strong, individualized support with an average of 7.9 students per teacher, well below its allocated 10 to 1 ratio.

Elementary schools also benefit from a wide range of specialized teachers and support staff who strengthen instruction, student services, and enrichment opportunities. Similar staffing processes are used at the middle and high school levels.

Overall, the District's staffing approach reflects a clear commitment to maintaining class sizes that allow for strong instruction and positive learning environments across all schools.

Sioux Falls School District Class Size Report 2025-2026 School Year

Purpose of Report: To provide information on the Full Time Equivalent (FTE) allocations to schools and the resulting student-to-teacher ratios or class sizes for the 2025-2026 school year.

Priority Areas: Academic Success, Well-Being, Staff Excellence, Effective Use of Resources.

Explanation: The Sioux Falls School District School Board establishes the general budget each year that sets the allocations of teacher FTE to schools based on student enrollment projections and approved programming. The information contained in this report will utilize the current enrollment numbers to present the staffing ratios.

The Sioux Falls School District uses the following student-to-teacher ratios to determine the base teacher FTE allocation for schools at each level:

- High School 25.12 Student-to-Teacher Ratio
- Middle School 24.41 Student-to-Teacher Ratio
- Elementary School 24.30 Student-to-Teacher Ratio

The following class size ratios are based on student enrollment numbers for FY26 as of October 27, 2025.

Traditional Classrooms

For the 2025-26 school year there are 465 traditional elementary classroom teachers including classroom teachers at our specialized schools of Sonia Sotomayor, All City Elementary (ACE), and Eugene Field A+ Elementary. The average student-to-teacher ratio is 23.35 to 1 which is 18.25 FTE more than the budgeted ratio of 24.3 to 1. Eleven (11) of the additional 18.25 FTE are class size reduction teachers provided through federal title funds. The specific grade level student-to-teacher ratios are as follows:

- RISE teachers are allocated two Education Support Professionals for each classroom.



Community Learning Centers Programming Update Summer Programming Information Report EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Purpose of Report: To update the School Board on Sioux Falls Community Learning Centers (CLCs).

The Sioux Falls Community Learning Centers (CLCs) continue to expand their impact across the District, offering before- and after-school programs, summer enrichment, and expanding middle school services. Now in its third year, the elementary program has broadened before-school care from one to eight sites and added after-school programming at 23 schools.

Although enrollment fluctuated early in the 2025-26 school year, participation is stabilizing, and more students whose families qualify for financial assistance are accessing services. With federal funding remaining flat, the CLC is actively pursuing additional resources to meet the rising demand.

More than 70 community partners continue to provide students with enrichment in athletics, fine arts, life skills, and workforce readiness. Student engagement remains strong, with higher daily attendance and more hours of participation.

Middle school programming launched this fall at Whittier, Ben Reifel, and George McGovern and has grown quickly, increasing from 131 to 552 students in four months. Attendance continues to rise, and expanded programming is planned for all middle schools in fall 2026, funding permitting. The new Boys & Girls Club at George McGovern that opened this fall has already shown success. The program offers a high-tier model with extended hours, full-day summer options, and food support.

Family engagement continues to grow, with spring health and wellness fairs scheduled at JFK, Laura Wilder, and Whittier.

Overall, the CLCs are providing meaningful opportunities for students and families, strengthening partnerships, and laying the groundwork for continued growth and long-term sustainability.

Community Learning Centers Programming Update & Summer Programming Information Report

Purpose of Report: To update the School Board on Sioux Falls Community Learning Centers (CLCs).

Priority Areas: Academic Success, Community Engagement, Well-Being, and Effective Use of Resources

Explanation: The Sioux Falls Community Learning Centers initiative is a collaborative effort that helps students reach their full potential through extended academic learning, enrichment activities, life skills development, college- and career-readiness, and family engagement.

Elementary Program

The CLC Elementary Program has entered its third year of delivering before- and after-school care and summer enrichment for students across the Sioux Falls School District. As the program continues to grow, our primary focus for the 2025–2026 school year is to enhance program quality and further align our work with our mission: “To meet the needs of the whole child, strengthen families, and steward community resources through trusted partnerships”.

This year, the CLC expanded its reach by increasing after-school programming from 22 to 23 elementary schools and expanding before-school programming from one site to eight. While we have continued to refine programming in alignment with our mission, after-school enrollment experienced a slight decline at the start of the school year. However, participation is gradually returning to prior levels.

The before-school program began the year serving approximately 200 more students than in previous years. As the year has progressed, we have been navigating a month-over-month decline in before-school enrollment and continue to review data, staffing, and program structures to ensure we are effectively meeting student and family needs.

Over the past year, the CLC experienced a significant increase in the number of students served at or below 200% of the federal poverty level, with enrollment rising by roughly 200 students. We expect this demand to continue to grow. At the same time, federal support through the 21st Century Community Learning Centers grant has not expanded. To address this need, the CLC has proactively sought additional funding through the Access for All account with the Sioux Falls Area Community Foundation, which is accelerating the pace at

which overall resources are used. Developing a long-term sustainability plan will be essential in the coming years.

Our network of more than 70 community partners provides students with a wide range of opportunities in athletics, the arts, and the development of social, life, and workforce skills. Through the 21st Century Community Learning Centers program, targeted tutoring further extends learning beyond the regular school day. At the start of the school year, despite a modest decline in enrollment, higher student engagement has led to increased average daily attendance and greater total hours of service. Research indicates that this level of participation is linked to even stronger outcomes for students.

A program highlight from July 2025: Through a strong community partnership, the CLC transported 1,100 students to the Sanford Sports Complex for our Summer Olympics event. The day exemplified collaboration, demonstrating the impact of partnerships in action. Students enjoyed a wide range of athletic and recreational activities, and the event celebrated the incredible outcomes that are possible when a community comes together to support young people.

Middle School Program

The Community Learning Centers is pleased to announce the launch of programs at Whittier, Ben Reifel, and George McGovern Middle Schools for the 2025–2026 school year. In the first four months, enrollment has increased from 131 students to 552. Simultaneously, average daily attendance continues to climb.

The middle school CLC is actively developing new community-focused enhancements and CLC activities and homework help for middle school students beyond the school day. This rapid expansion has generated excitement, contributing to the notable increase in middle school enrollment.

The tiered middle school model is planned to expand next year to include all District middle schools. Funding permitting, the goal is to implement a Tier 3 model at the start of the 2026–2027 school year. Tier 3 will extend programming until 8 PM (instead of 6 PM), provide a connection coordinator at each middle school, and offer an evening meal. Funding support for expanded programming will come through donations, United Way contributions, grants, and parent tuition for families who do not qualify for free or reduced lunch.

The recent ribbon-cutting of the area's first Boys & Girls Club, attached to George McGovern Middle School, highlights both the vision for middle school programming and the community's commitment to investing in youth. The 16,000-square-foot facility, funded entirely through donations, will serve as the highest tier of programming. Its extended hours,

operating until 8:00 p.m. on school days and offering full-day programming during summer and no-school days, will provide expanded opportunities for students and families. Additionally, providing healthy snacks and evening meals will further enhance food security for participating students.

Family and Community Engagement

Since its inception, the CLC has found that health and wellness fairs are highly effective in bringing together families and the broader community. Building on this success, the CLC will host health and wellness fairs at John F. Kennedy Elementary on February 9, 2026; Laura Wilder Elementary on March 2, 2026; and Whittier Middle School on March 10, 2026. These events are designed to provide families with valuable resources, health screenings, interactive activities, and opportunities to connect with community partners. By aligning these fairs with other school events, the CLC anticipates even higher levels of participation, fostering stronger family engagement and community connections.

Connection Coordinators continue to play a pivotal role within the CLC. Based at each elementary and middle school, these staff members provide additional educational and behavioral support during the school day, extend services into after-school programs, and engage families through events such as family engagement nights. They are vital to fostering strong, lasting connections among the schools, CLC, and the community.

Summary: The Sioux Falls Community Learning Centers (CLCs) continue to grow, reaching an increasing number of students through before- and after-school programs, summer enrichment opportunities, and newly-developed middle school programming. Central to the success of the CLCs is the collaboration among schools, families, community partners, and staff, ensuring that programs are responsive to student needs and provide meaningful opportunities for learning, connection, and growth. Together, these efforts highlight the CLCs' positive impact while laying the foundation for continued growth and sustainability.

Costs: There are no direct district costs associated with this report. The Community Learning Centers continue to actively pursue funding to sustain and expand all aspects of the program.






After-School Enrollment




MIDDLE SCHOOL CLC PROGRAM




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Middle School Enrollment





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2026 School District Election

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY



Purpose:

To approve a resolution designating June, 2026, as Election Day.

As of January 1, 2026 South Dakota Codified Law §13-7-10 states “Unless otherwise exempted by law, each school district must hold an annual election on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in June or the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, between the hours of seven a.m. and seven p.m. The school board shall select the date of the election by resolution no later than the first regular meeting after January first of each year. Voter...”

The Sioux Falls School District School Board will have three vacancies next year when the terms of Marc Murren, Dawn Marie Johnson, and Gail Swenson expire in July. In accordance with the Board Resolution passed July 10, 2023, which establishes four-year terms for all Board Members by 2028, the transition plan states that all 2026 vacancies shall be four-year terms. To fill the vacancies, the District must hold an election.

The school district is negotiating with Minnehaha and Lincoln Counties to run the 2026 Sioux Falls School Board election.

Attached is a timeline for the election, with some deadlines for the election included.

3 **Safe and Secure Environment**

4
5
6 In promoting the well-being of all students and employees of the school system, it shall be Sioux
7 Falls School District policy to maintain a safe and secure environment in all District facilities and
8 on District grounds.

9
10 District buildings and property are weapon free zones. Law enforcement will be notified if any
11 person, other than a law enforcement officer, is in possession of: 1) a firearm, or air gun, whether
12 or not the firearm or air gun is designed, adapted, used, or intended primarily for imitative or
13 noisemaking purposes; or 2) any other object or material that is ordinarily considered a weapon,
14 look alike weapons, or any object that could place a person in reasonable fear of physical harm.
15 Students will receive a consequence in accordance with Policy JK/JK-R. Employees will be
16 disciplined in accordance with the applicable negotiated working agreement. Visitors may be
17 banned from future entrance onto District property.

18
19 The Sioux Falls School District adheres to the practices of the National Incident Management
20 System (NIMS) and corresponding Incident Command System (ICS) and conducts annual
21 training on its components.

22
23 A visitor management system is an essential element of the District's integrated safe and secure
24 network designed to provide a safe and secure environment and will be required to screen all
25 visitors when entering a District facility.

26
27 Practices and procedures to implement this policy include but are not limited to periodic
28 inspection of District facilities and grounds, regular and routine practice for evacuation or other
29 ways of dealing with emergency situations, a system for reporting and dealing with accidents,
30 plans of workers compensation insurance and student accident insurance, and inservice
31 education to promote safety and accident prevention.

5 **Incident Management System**

6 The National Incident Management System (NIMS) will be the standard incident management
7 system used by the Sioux Falls School District during times of emergency.

8
9 **Emergency Management Plan**

10 In the event of emergencies such as deaths, accidents or disasters, staff members are to utilize
11 guidelines outlined in the District's Emergency Management **Basic** Plan in dealing with the
12 situation.

13
14 The purpose of the Emergency Management **Basic** Plan is to maintain a unified and predictable
15 plan of action by District personnel in the event of an emergency.

16
17 The objectives of the Emergency Management **Basic** Plan policy include the following:

- 18
19 1. To assure safety and welfare of students, building staff, and visitors.
20 2. To communicate with staff, students, parents and community through the most effective
21 and practical manner.
22 3. To meet special needs of students and staff affected by an emergency.
23 4. To enable a building to return to established routines, instruction, rules and regulations
24 following an emergency incident.
25 5. To respond to emergencies and disasters in the most effective manner according to the
26 Incident Command System (ICS).
27 6. To ensure continuity and interoperability with first response agencies and community
28 partners during emergencies.

29
30 The Sioux Falls School District **Risk-ManagerSecurity Coordinator** will review annually the
31 Emergency Management **Basic** Plan reporting to the Superintendent the need for any revisions.
32 Guidelines for implementation will be prepared and revised as necessary by the Superintendent
33 or designee.

35 School Principals and Directors will review annually the Emergency Management **Basic** Plan and
36 facility-specific guidelines with staff.

3 **Safety Drills**

4 It is the responsibility of principals to conduct fire, tornado, and lockdown drills in their respective
5 buildings. There shall be at least two fire drills and one tornado drill per semester. In addition,
6 one lockdown drill must be conducted annually. Each principal shall maintain a record of
7 **evacuation-all** drill dates and times on the District's **Evacuation-Drill Report Formss electronic**
8 **form**. The evacuation drill record shall be available for inspection by a representative of the State
9 Fire Marshall upon request. All safety drills shall follow guidance provided in the Sioux Falls
10 School District Emergency Management Basic Plan.

11
12 **Tornado Drills**

13 Tornado drills will be carried out in the fall and spring with special emphasis on teachers and
14 students learning safe areas of the school building. Principals will designate interior areas on the
15 lowest floor away from doors, windows, and outside walls. Large rooms and auditoriums should
16 be avoided. Special protective body positions should be learned.

17
18 **Fire Drills**

19 Fire drill procedures shall be explained to students. All District employees shall be thoroughly
20 instructed with respect to their duties during these evacuation drills, including closing doors to
21 enhance fire control. In all cases teachers shall be responsible for accountability and guiding to
22 safety all students under their supervision.

23
24 There shall be at least two fire exit drills each semester of the school year in schools through
25 grade twelve. The first drill of the school year will be within the initial 10 days of student
26 attendance. During such drills all staff members and all students shall leave the building and
27 move a safe distance away. **Each principal shall maintain a record of dates and evacuation times**
28 **on the drills conducted on the District's form provided by the Department of Commerce and**
29 **Regulation.**

30
31 **Lockdown Drill**

32 All schools must hold at least one "lockdown drill" per school year to practice emergency
33 response procedures associated with hostage or shots fired situations. Administrators are
34 expected to work with school resource officers to plan and execute the drill.

1 **Data Breach of Personal or Protected Identifiable Information**

2
3 The goal of the Sioux Falls School District is to eliminate security incidents and avoid any breach
4 of District data. Thus, all District employees are required to immediately report to the Director of
5 Information and Technology Services when they know or suspect that a breach of system
6 security has occurred.

1 **Definitions**

2
3 *Data Breach, Breach of Security or Breach* – A security incident in which there was unauthorized
4 access to and unauthorized acquisition of personal information maintained in computerized
5 form that compromises the security, confidentiality or integrity of the information. A breach
6 includes, but is not limited to, incidents in which personal or protected information has
7 potentially been accessed without authorization or stolen; personal or protected information has
8 been compromised; or a network hack or intrusion has occurred. Good-faith acquisition of
9 personal information by a District employee or agent for a legitimate District purpose is not a
10 breach of security provided that the personal information is not used in violation of applicable
11 law or in a manner that harms or poses an actual threat to the security, confidentiality or integrity
12 of the personal information.

- 13
14 1. "Breach of system security," the unauthorized acquisition of unencrypted
15 computerized data or encrypted computerized data and the encryption key by any
16 person that materially compromises the security, confidentiality, or integrity of
17 personal or protected information maintained by the information holder. The term
18 does not include the good faith acquisition of personal or protected information by an
19 employee or agent of the information holder for the purposes of the information
20 holder if the personal or protected information is not used or subject to further
21 unauthorized disclosure;
22
23 2. "Encrypted," computerized data that is rendered unusable, unreadable, or
24 indecipherable without the use of a decryption process or key or in accordance with
25 the Federal Information Processing Standard 140-2 in effect on January 1, 2018;
26
27 3. "Information holder," any person or business that conducts business in this state, and
28 that owns or licenses computerized personal or protected information of residents of
29 this state;
30
31 4. "Personal information," a person's first name or first initial and last name, in
32 combination with any one or more of the following data elements:
33 (a) Social security number;
34 (b) Driver license number or other unique identification number created or
35 collected by a government body;
36 (c) Account, credit card, or debit card number, in combination with any required
37 SDCL chapter 22-40 security code, access code, password, routing number, PIN,
38 or any additional information that would permit access to a person's financial
39 account;
40 (d) Health information as defined in 45 CFR 160.103; or
41 (e) An identification number assigned to a person by the person's employer in
42 combination with any required security code, access code, password, or

1 biometric data generated from measurements or analysis of human body
2 characteristics for authentication purposes.

- 3
- 4 5. "Protected information," includes:
- 5 (a) A user name or email address, in combination with a password, security question
6 answer, or other information that permits access to an online account; and
7 (b) Account number or credit or debit card number, in combination with any required
8 security code, access code, or password that permits access to a person's
9 financial account;
- 10
- 11 6. "Unauthorized person," any person not authorized to acquire or disclose personal
12 information, or any person authorized by the information holder to access personal
13 information who has acquired or disclosed the personal information outside the
14 guidelines for access of disclosure established by the information holder.

15

16 **Incident Response**

17 Once notified of an event, the Director of Information and Technology Services will identify and
18 remedy the weakness that allowed the security incident to occur, to reasonably mitigate any
19 harmful effects resulting from any privacy or security incident involving any District Data,
20 minimize risk associated with the event, and determine who caused the incident. The
21 investigation shall also include a determination on whether the incident was intentional or
22 occurred because a user violated District policies, procedures or training, which may result in
23 disciplinary action.

24

25 **Data Breach**

26 The District's primary goal when a breach of system security occurs is to recover as much data as
27 possible, provide appropriate notifications of the breach of system security, and prevent further
28 disclosure and harm to District students, employees and business operations.

29 The Director of Information and Technology Services will lead an investigation into the incident
30 immediately to determine whether a breach occurred. If a breach occurred, the following steps
31 will be taken as quickly as possible:

- 32 1. The Superintendent and other appropriate administrative staff will be notified
33 immediately. The superintendent or designee will contact law enforcement when
34 appropriate.
- 35 2. The Director of Information and Technology Services will determine the status of the
36 breach and will take all appropriate measures to prevent additional loss of data and future
37 breaches.
- 38 3. If possible, the Director of Information and Technology Services will preserve any and all
39 evidence of the breach for future investigation, prosecution, insurance claims and other
40 legal action.

- 1 4. District officials will determine the scope of the breach and will work with law
2 enforcement (when appropriate) to determine whether District staff, impacted
3 parents/guardians and students, or the public need to be notified and whether additional
4 government agencies need to be involved.
- 5 5. Once the District's data has been secured, District officials will meet to evaluate the
6 incident, determine the probable causes of the incident and determine what action
7 should be taken to prevent future incidents.

8 **Security Breach Notification**

10 Breaches of confidential personal information are particularly problematic, and the District will
11 take additional steps to prevent theft or fraud. The Director of Information and Technology
12 Services will ensure that victims of security breaches are appropriately notified as required by law
13 (SDCL chapter 22-40).

14 If the Director of Information and Technology Services, after an appropriate investigation or
15 consultation with the relevant federal, state (notice to attorney general), or local agencies
16 responsible for law enforcement, determines that identity theft or other fraud is not reasonably
17 likely to occur as a result of the breach, such a determination shall be documented in writing and
18 will be maintained for three years. If it is determined that identity theft is reasonably likely, the
19 District will notify, without unreasonable delay, any person whose information may have been
20 accessed.

21 This notice may be delayed if a law enforcement agency informs District that notification may
22 impede a criminal investigation. Once the law enforcement agency communicates that notice
23 may be provided, the notice will be provided without unreasonable delay.

24 If the District must provide notice to more than 250 residents, the District will also notify the
25 Attorney General's Office. The District will report to these entities the timing, distribution, and
26 content of the notice sent to the persons whose information may have been compromised.

27 **Notice Content**

29 The notice provided to persons whose information was breached shall minimally include:

- 30 1. A written notice of the incident in general terms.
- 31 2. A description of the type of personal information that was obtained as a result of the
32 breach of security.
- 33 3. A telephone number that affected consumers may call for further information and
34 assistance, if one exists.
- 35 4. Contact information for consumer reporting agencies as defined by law.
- 36 5. Advice that directs affected consumers to remain vigilant by reviewing account
37 statements and monitoring credit reports.

6. Information about how to obtain a free credit report.

The notice may be made in writing or by e-mail if the person has agreed to receive communications from the District electronically in accordance with federal law. Telephone notice may be used if contact is made directly with the affected person.

Substitute notice may be used if the cost of providing notice would exceed \$100,000 or if the District needs to notify more than 10,000 individuals. The District may also use substitute notice for individuals the District is unable to identify or for whom the District does not have sufficient contact information, but the District will use the regular notice for all other affected individuals.

Substitute notice shall include:

1. E-mail notice when the District has an e-mail address.
2. Conspicuous posting of the notice or a link to the notice on the District's website.
3. Notification to major statewide media.

3 **Curriculum Development, Adoption, and Review**

4
5 The Sioux Falls School District instructional program is continuously evolving. As student and
6 societal needs change, the three cornerstones of instruction--curriculum, assessment, and staff
7 development--must adapt to accommodate the changes. None of the three cornerstones can
8 be discussed in isolation. All three are critical to an effective instructional program, grounded in
9 the belief that what is written, is taught, is tested.

10
11 **Curriculum**

12 The goal is to develop a well-coordinated instructional program based on professional, state and
13 district standards with clear learning objectives in all skill and content areas and at all grade levels.
14 District curriculum study committees, comprised of a K-12 Steering Committee and instructional
15 level subcommittees are an important part of the curriculum development process, focusing on
16 a curriculum designed to meet the needs of the learner in the 21st century.

17
18 The School Board directs the Superintendent to develop and implement an adoption process
19 that will result in the selection and adoption of high quality curriculum and instructional materials
20 that will be both challenging and engaging for students. The Board believes the selection of
21 instructional materials normally should be part of the regular curriculum review cycle.

22
23 **Assessment**

24 The goal is to provide a balanced assessment program for monitoring student learning in relation
25 to the written District curriculum. The data is collected from a variety of assessment tools for the
26 purpose of guiding classroom instruction and improving student achievement.

27
28 **Staff Development**

29 The goal is to provide professional growth opportunities that address both the science and the
30 art of effective teaching. The staff development program fosters the development of knowledge
31 and skills supported by research and designed to meet the needs of diverse groups of students.

32
33 **Curriculum Council**

34 The Curriculum Council reviews K-12 assessment data, recommends curriculum changes, and
35 oversees K-12 curriculum alignment. The Council evaluates all proposals for curriculum change
36 and makes recommendations to the Superintendent. The Council is comprised of community
37 members, parents/guardians, and various levels of school personnel.

19 arts, science, social studies, and math) ~~includes all of the~~ fully incorporates these state
20 standards.

5 Homework should be purposeful, aligned to grade-level standards, and reflect or reinforce
6 concepts already introduced in a class and should encourage application of those concepts.
7 Assignments should be meaningful, manageable, and considerate of students' overall well-being.
8 Homework should not be confused with makeup work given to compensate for students'
9 absences. Under no circumstances should homework be given as busy work or for disciplinary
10 purposes.

11
12 When assigning homework, teachers should:

- 13

- 15 • communicate their homework expectations to parents/guardians at the beginning of the year
16 and periodically throughout the year;
 - 17
18 • state a purpose that is understood by the student and parent/guardian, and invite students to
19 reflect on how the assignment connects to their learning;
 - 20
21 • consider the differentiation of assignments based on the student's age and capability;
 - 22
23 • plan to include a wide variety of activities; and
 - 24
25 • explain the evaluation and feedback process that will be used with the expectation that
26 feedback is timely, constructive, and primarily formative rather than high-stakes grading.

3 **Promotion, Retention and Acceleration of Students**

4

6 After initial placement, a student may be advanced or retained according to the student's
7 demonstrated performance and overall readiness. Decisions should prioritize the student's
8 academic progress, social-emotional development, and long-term success. The Sioux Falls
9 School District is dedicated to the best total and continuous development of each student
10 enrolled and the professional staff is expected to consider placing students at the grade level
11 best suited to them academically, socially, and emotionally.

12
13 Students will normally progress annually from grade to grade. Exceptions may be considered for
14 elementary and middle school grade retention or advancement (including acceleration) after
15 being reviewed by a committee that includes, at a minimum, the principal (chair), classroom
16 teacher (team leader at the middle school), a parent/guardian, and a counselor. If the student is
17 receiving special education services, the committee will include the student's special education
18 teacher.

19
20 Retention or advancement (including acceleration) should only be considered when supported
21 by strong evidence that it is in the best interest of the student.

4 **Student Surveys/Protection of Pupil Rights Act**

5
6 The Sioux Falls School District shall comply with the provisions of the Federal Protection of Pupil
7 Rights Act (PPRA) and its amendments and state law governing the following activities (“Activities”):
8 the administration of surveys, analyses or evaluations; collection of personal information from
9 students for marketing purposes; and certain non-emergency medical examinations required for
10 school attendance. Personal information includes a student’s or parent’s first and last name; a home
11 or other physical address; ~~and~~ a telephone number, or other personally identifiable information as
12 defined by federal or state law.

13
14 The District shall provide parents and eligible students notice of their rights under the PPRA annually.
15 Additionally, the District will directly notify parents of students who are scheduled to participate in
16 the above Activities and will provide parents the opportunity to consent, as required by the PPRA
17 and state law. The District will notify parents at the beginning of the year of any pre-scheduled
18 activities, and will provide reasonable notification for activities scheduled after the school year begins
19 using multiple communication methods to ensure accessibility.

20
21 Parental consent or student consent if the student is an adult or emancipated minor or will be
22 obtained prior to student participation in any survey that concerns one or more of the following
23 protected areas:

- 24 1. Political affiliations or beliefs of the student or the student’s parent;
- 25 2. Mental or psychological problems or aspects of the student or the student’s family;
- 26 3. Sex behavior or attitudes of the student or the student’s family;
- 27 4. Illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating, or demeaning behavior;
- 28 5. Critical appraisals of others with whom respondents have close family relationships;
- 29 6. Legally recognized privileged or analogous relationships, such as those of lawyers,
30 doctors, or ministers;
- 31 7. Religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or the student’s parent; or
- 32 8. Personal or family gun ownership; ~~or~~
- 33 9. Income (other than that required by law to determine eligibility for participation in a
34 program or for receiving financial assistance under such program).

35
36 Parents and eligible students have the right to inspect, upon request: any survey and/or
37 supplementary materials; instructional material used as part of the educational curriculum; and any
38 instrument used to collect personal information from students for marketing, sales, or distribution
39 purposes. Any request to ~~so~~ inspect must be presented in writing to the Building Principal/Program
40 Administrator within ten (10) days of receiving notice of the scheduled activity or survey.

41
42 This policy does not apply to the collection, disclosure, or use of personal information collection
43 from students for the exclusive purpose of developing, evaluationsevaluating, or providing

1 educational products or services for or to students or educational institutions. Nothing in this policy
2 limits the rights afforded under FERPA or other applicable federal or state student privacy laws.

3 **Communicable/Infectious Diseases**

4
5
6 The School Board recognizes the need and right of all children to receive free and appropriate
7 education. The Board further recognizes its responsibility to provide a healthy environment for
8 students and school employees. Determinations regarding communicability and attendance
9 may be made in consultation with city and state health officials, the Centers for Disease Control,
10 and other appropriate parties.

11
12 **School Attendance**

13 The determination of whether an infected or potentially infected student is excluded from the
14 classroom or school activities and how the student's needs will be met shall be made on a case
15 by case basis, under the direction of the building principal/building administrator or designee with
16 consultation from the assigned school nurse and Supervisor Coordinator of Health Services as
17 appropriate.

18
19 In situations that require additional knowledge or where the student may be out of school for five
20 (5) or more consecutive school days, the principal and school nurse will consult with the
21 Supervisor Coordinator of Health Services. Consideration regarding the need to exclude a
22 student from school shall include the characteristics of the contagious disease, the medical
23 condition of the student, and expected interaction with others in the school setting. If the
24 School District has reasonable cause to believe that a student is an infected individual, additional
25 medical information may be needed before the student may return to school.

26
27 **Confidentiality**

28 Appropriate information may be provided to school employees or the public if the potential for
29 communicability is a factor. School administrators may determine that it is necessary to disclose
30 personally identifiable information (PII) to appropriate parties (e.g. state health officials) in order
31 to address a health or safety emergency. PII of a student who may have a communicable disease
32 will not be disclosed to the public.

33
34 Classroom health checks and letters informing parents of communicable diseases may be done
35 in the case of an outbreak at the discretion of the school nurse in coordination with District
36 administrative staff or at the direction of state health officials.

37
38 **Infection Control**

39 Employees are required to follow infection control practices where all body fluids are treated as if
40 they are contaminated. Equipment and supplies needed to apply universal precautions will be
41 provided.

3 **Communicable/Infectious Diseases**

4
5 To provide a healthy environment for both students and employees, infection control practices
6 are to be used within the schools. The following information outlines practices to be observed:
7

- 8 1. **Hand Washing** - After exposure to contamination, use soap and warm water to cleanse
9 exposed surface of the body.
- 10 2. **Food Preparation and Personal Hygiene Care** - Sink and work areas for food preparation and
11 for personal hygiene care must be separate.
- 12 3. **Maintenance Cleaning** - Work areas for students and teachers, where potential for
13 contamination exists, must meet recommended procedures. Cleaning of student and
14 teacher work areas must be appropriate to the use and types of interaction taking place in the
15 area.
- 16 4. **Use of Personal Items** - Individuals should be discouraged from using each other's personal
17 items.
- 18 5. **Personal Hygiene Measures** - Individuals should be encouraged to develop and be provided
19 opportunities to practice commonly accepted personal hygiene habits.
- 20 6. **Routine Practices Relating to Body Fluids**
- 21 a. Individuals should wear approved disposable gloves when cleaning up bodily fluids.
- 22 b. When cleaning environmental surfaces, a freshly prepared solution of sodium
23 hydrochloride (household bleach one part to ten parts water) or other approved
24 disinfectant should be used.
- 25 c. When cleaning body fluids from an individual, soap and water should be used. In addition,
26 an appropriate disinfectant may be used.
- 27 d. Special injuries such as to the eye and mouth should be treated as recommended by the
28 Centers for Disease Control.
- 29 e. Cleaning of carpets should be referred to the custodial service for extraction cleaning.

3 **Instruction/Programs for Homeless Students**

4
5
6 The School Board shall make reasonable efforts to identify homeless children within the Sioux
7 Falls School District, encourage their enrollment, and eliminate barriers to their education which
8 may exist in District policies or practices, in compliance with all applicable federal and state laws.

9
10 Homeless students, as defined by federal and state statutes, residing within the District or
11 residing in temporary shelters in the District, are entitled to free school privileges. No child or
12 youth in the public schools shall be discriminated against or stigmatized because of
13 homelessness.

3 **Instruction/Programs for Homeless Students**

4
5
6 **School of Origin**

7 It is the School District's responsibility to provide continued education services for
8 homeless students. Such services for the child may be:

- 9
10
 - 11 • continuation in the school of origin that the student attended when permanently
12 housed or the school of last enrollment; or
 - 13 • provided in the school that is attended by other students living in the same
14 attendance area where the homeless child lives.

15 The District considers the best interest of the homeless student, with parental
16 involvement, in determining placement.

17
18 **Enrollment**

19 The school shall immediately enroll the homeless student even if he or she is unable to
20 produce records normally required for enrollment, including academic records,
21 immunization records, proof of residency or other documentation. The District shall
22 make a reasonable effort to locate immunization records from information available. The
23 District shall arrange for students to receive immunizations through health agencies and
24 at District expense if no other recourse is available. Immunizations may, however, be
25 waived for homeless youth only in accordance with provision of the School Board's
26 policy on immunizations. The District may require a parent or guardian of a homeless
27 student to submit contact information.

28
29 **Transportation**

30 Transportation services will be comparable to those provided other students in the
31 selected schools. Transportation shall be provided to the student's school of origin in
32 compliance with federal and state regulations.

33
34 **Elimination of Segregated Services**

35 Homeless students shall be provided services comparable to services offered to other
36 students in the District including, but not limited to, transportation services; educational
37 services for which the student meets the eligibility criteria, such as education programs
38 for disadvantaged students, students with disabilities and gifted students; vocational
39 programs and technical education; school nutrition programs; preschool programs;
40 before and after school care programs; and programs for students with limited English
41 proficiency. Homeless students will not be segregated in a separate school or in a
42 separate program within a school based on the students' status as homeless.

43
44 **Elimination of Identified Barriers**

45 The District administration shall attempt to remove existing barriers to school
46 attendance. Enrollment requirements or fees and charges that may constitute a barrier

1 to the enrollment or education of a homeless child or youth may be waived at the
2 discretion of the Superintendent. In the event a fee or charge are a barrier,
3 parents/guardians of homeless children should contact the Student Support Services
4 Department to report the barrier. The Student Support Services Department will
5 communicate with the Superintendent for removal of the fee or charge.

7 **Resolution of Disputes Regarding Homeless Education**

8 Disputes regarding enrollment of, or services for, homeless students shall be referred in
9 writing to the ~~Assistant Superintendent of Administrative Services~~ District Homeless
10 Liaison. –Parents/guardians or other adult or an unaccompanied youth can provide
11 written or oral documentation to support their position. Students shall be provided with
12 all services for which they are eligible while disputes are being resolved. –The ~~Assistant~~
13 ~~Superintendent~~District Homeless Liaison will provide a written statement of his/her
14 decision within 10 student days of receiving the written dispute and any accompanying
15 ~~written or oral~~ documentation.

16
17 If a dispute is not resolved at the ~~Assistant Superintendent~~–District Homeless Liaison
18 level, the individual may file a written appeal with the Superintendent ~~in accordance with~~
19 ~~Policy KE~~ within 10 student days of receipt of the written decision of the ~~Assistant~~
20 ~~Superintendent~~–District Homeless Liaison. If a dispute is not resolved at the District
21 level, it may be forwarded by the individual to the South Dakota Department of
22 Education for review.

23
24 ~~At any time this dispute process requires a written appeal, the parents/guardians, other~~
25 ~~adult, or unaccompanied youth may make this formal request orally to an Administrator~~
26 ~~or the homeless liaison; that person will transcribe the oral report into writing.~~

27
28 When inter-district disputes arise, the individual, all involved districts and the South
29 Dakota Department of Education shall be present to resolve the dispute.
30

DISPUTE OF ELIGIBILITY, SCHOOL SELECTION, OR ENROLLMENT UNDER THE MCKINNEY-VENTO HOMELESS ASSISTANCE ACT

Note: This form may be used at the district level (as allowed) and the state level. You have the right to retain an advocate or attorney at your own expense. If English is not your native language, or if you need additional supports because of disability, translators, interpreters or other support services, the services will be made available to you without charge in the appropriate language.

This form is for use to initiate the dispute resolution process required by the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act when the parent, guardian, or unaccompanied youth disagrees with the District's eligibility, school selection, or enrollment decision.

If a dispute arises over school selection or enrollment in a school, the child shall be immediately admitted to the school in which enrollment is sought, pending resolution of the dispute. The student will remain attending the school where enrollment is sought during the entire dispute resolution process.

3 Public Concerns/Complaints about Policies

4
5 The School Board recognizes that, from time to time, concerns regarding the development and
6 implementation of School District policies and regulations will arise. The Board further believes
7 that constructive criticism can assist in improving the quality of the program, and in meeting
8 individual student needs more effectively. The Board also places trust in its employees, and
9 desires to support their actions in a manner that frees them from unnecessary or unwarranted
10 criticism and complaints. The following procedures for dealing with complaints about the
11 content or implementation of District policies/regulations shall apply:
12

- 13 • Public concerns/comments about a policy or regulation that is before the Board for review,
14 revision, deletion, or adoption may be expressed orally in accordance with policy BEDH. Written
15 comments from District residents or parents/guardians of enrolled students should be addressed
16 to the Superintendent for submission to the Board. In order to be considered by the Board,
17 written comments must contain the name and address of the person or persons submitting
18 them. All comments, either oral or written, will be confined to the contents of the policy or
19 regulation.
20
- 21 • Public concerns about a policy or regulation that is not before the Board, or ideas for a new
22 policy/regulation shall be submitted in writing to the Superintendent for submission to the Policy
23 Review Committee in accordance with Policy BG. Within 45 calendar days of the original
24 submission, the Superintendent shall provide the individual(s) submitting the concern/idea with
25 the administrative decision. This decision may or may not result in either creation of a new policy
26 or change to the existing policy/regulation. Any proposed change must be submitted to the Board
27 in accordance with Policy BG.
28
- 29 • Concerns about the implementation of a policy or regulation should be dealt with by first
30 discussing the concern with the staff person involved – such as, the classroom teacher. If, for
31 some reason, the concerned individual is not satisfied, [he/shethy](#) should [next](#) discuss the matter
32 with [the following persons in the following order](#): the principal of the building or supervisor, [and](#)
33 then the Superintendent’s designee. If necessary, any appeal to the Superintendent shall be
34 made in accordance with policy KE.

3 **Equal Opportunity/Nondiscrimination**

4

5 The Sioux Falls School District believes that a valuable element of education is the development
6 of respect for all individuals and seeks to provide equal access/equal opportunity for students,
7 employees and the public to District programs and activities.

8

9 In an effort to provide a safe, respectful educational environment, the District prohibits
10 discrimination in its policies, employment practices, programs and activities on the basis of race,
11 color, creed, religion, age, gender (including pregnancy), sexual orientation, disability, national
12 origin or ancestry, military/veteran status, genetic information or any other category protected
13 by law. The District prohibits acts of discrimination toward any individual(s) while on District
14 property or at District sponsored activities. Additionally, the District provides equal access to the

17 The District prohibits discrimination against students on the basis of parental status, marital

21 Prohibited acts of discrimination include racial, sexual (including sexual violence), ethnic or other
22 types of slurs, insults, intimidation, harassment and other such conduct directed toward another

25 The District will make reasonable modifications to its programs, facilities, employment practices,
26 and activities to accommodate otherwise qualified individuals with a disability, unless such
27 modifications would impose an undue burden on the operation of the particular program, or
28 would alter the fundamental nature or purpose of the program or position, or cause an undue
29 hardship on the District.

30

31 The District is committed to ensuring the accessibility of its web content, and other
32 communications, to people with disabilities. The District's website will include information on
33 how to report a website accessibility issue.

34

35 Violations of this policy may result in discipline up to and including expulsion for students, up to
36 and including termination for employees and suspension from attending school activities for
37 citizens.

38

39 The District prohibits retaliation against any individual who reports a claim under this policy or
40 participates in an investigation of any such claim.

3 **Equal Opportunity/Nondiscrimination**

4
5 **Resolution of Discrimination Complaints**

6 A complaint may be filed by a student, parent/guardian, employee or other citizen when it is felt
7 that a violation of Policy AC Equal Opportunity/ Nondiscrimination has occurred. Confidentiality,
8 to the extent possible, will be maintained at each level of the complaint procedure.

9
10 The complainant is encouraged to attempt to resolve the issue informally by working with the
11 administrator most directly involved in the situation before filing a formal complaint. However, it
12 is understood that for some issues this may not be appropriate.

13
14 **A. Reporting Incidents of Discrimination – Grievance Procedures**

15
16 Any person who believes he or she has been the victim of discrimination by a student or an
17 employee of the District will report the alleged acts immediately to the building principal, the
18 department director, or the Civil Rights Officer/Title IX Coordinator on the Complaint
19 Investigation form available from the building principal or from Human Resources.

20
21 1. **Designated Personnel.** The building principal is the person designated by the District for
22 receiving written reports of discrimination at each school building. All other written
23 reports shall be directed to the applicable department director. Upon receipt of a report,
24 the principal or director shall immediately notify the Civil Rights Officer/Title IX
25 Coordinator and forward the written report form to the Civil Rights Officer/Title IX
26 Coordinator. Failure to forward any discrimination report or complaint as provided herein
27 will result in disciplinary action. If the complaint involves the building principal or
28 department director, the complaint shall be filed directly with the Civil Rights Officer/Title
29 IX Coordinator.

30
31 2. **Districtwide.** The School Board hereby designates the In-House Counsel as the District's
32 Civil Rights Officer/Title IX Coordinator to receive reports or complaints of discrimination
33 from any individual, employee or victim of discrimination and also from the building
34 principal or department director as outlined above. If the complaint involves the Civil
35 Rights Officer/Title IX Coordinator, the complaint shall be filed directly with the
36 Superintendent. The District shall post on employee bulletin boards and on the website
37 the mailing address and telephone number of the Civil Rights Officer/Title IX Coordinator.

- 1 3. **Submission of a complaint or report of discrimination.** Submission of a complaint or
2 report of discrimination will not affect the individual's employment or work assignments.
3
- 4 4. **Confidentiality.** The District will make attempts to respect the confidentiality of the
5 complainant and the individual(s) against whom the complaint is filed as much as
6 possible consistent with the District's legal obligations and the necessity to investigate
7 allegations of discrimination and take disciplinary action when the conduct has occurred.
8
- 9 5. **Procedure.** The complainant will be asked to put the facts surrounding the conduct in
10 writing on the Complaint Investigation form provided by the District that includes the
11 following: Complainant's name and address; date of the incident; type of discrimination;
12 description of the incident; name of any witnesses; what action, if any, has been taken;
13 and signature of the complainant.
14
- 15 6. **Required Reporting.** If the accusations include possible criminal activity such as
16 molestation, sexual battery, or similar contact, the Civil Rights Officer/Title IX Coordinator
17 shall comply with all mandatory state reporting requirements including, but not limited
18 to, contact with the State Department of Social Services.
19

20 Nothing in this grievance procedure forecloses individuals from seeking redress for their
21 concerns through other legal avenues, such as law enforcement, the Office of Civil Rights, the
22 Equal Employment Opportunity Commission or the South Dakota Division of Human Rights.
23

24 B. Investigation

25
26 Upon receipt of a written report alleging discrimination, the Civil Rights Officer/Title IX
27 Coordinator shall immediately authorize an investigation. This investigation may be
28 conducted by District officials or by a third party designated by the District. The investigating
29 party shall provide a written report of the status of the investigation within ten (10) working
30 days to the Superintendent and the Civil Rights Officer/Title IX Coordinator.
31

32 In determining whether alleged conduct constitutes discrimination, the District should
33 consider the surrounding circumstances, the nature of the advances, if any, relationships
34 between the parties involved, and the context in which the alleged incidents occurred.
35

36 The investigation may consist of personal interviews with the complainant, the individual(s)
37 against whom the complaint is filed, and others who may have knowledge of the alleged
38 incident(s) or circumstances giving rise to the complaint. The investigation may also consist
39 of any other methods and documents deemed pertinent by the investigating party.
40

41 In addition, the District may take immediate steps at its discretion to protect the
42 complainant, students, and employees pending completion of an investigation of alleged
43 discrimination.
44

45 During the investigation all parties directly involved in the complaint may have legal or other
46 representation. If any party elects to be represented at any step of the complaint procedure,
47 the name of the representative must be declared in writing to the Civil Rights Officer/Title IX

1 Coordinator within two (2) days of the filing of the complaint, notification of any
2 investigation, or the filing of any appeal.
3

4 **C. School District Action**
5

- 6 1. Upon receipt of a recommendation that the allegations of a complaint constitute a
7 violation of District policy, the District will take such action as appropriate based upon the
8 results of the investigation.
9
- 10 2. The results of the investigation of each complaint will be reported in writing and kept on
11 file in the Human Resources Department. The report shall include findings of fact and
12 will document the disciplinary action taken, if any, as a result of the complaint. A finding
13 will be determined on the basis of whether it is more likely than not that the conduct as
14 alleged occurred.
15
- 16 3. The complainant will be advised of the District decision in writing on a form supplied by
17 the District within ten (10) working days from the conclusion of the investigation.
18
- 19 4. If either party is not satisfied with the written decision rendered by the District, he or she
20 may appeal the decision in writing to the Superintendent within ten (10) working days
21 following receipt of the decision. The appeal must include the original Complaint
22 Investigation form, a copy of the written decision, and a written statement as to the
23 reason for appeal.
24
- 25 5. The Superintendent will review the material submitted, investigate the circumstances,
26 and respond in writing within fourteen (14) working days of the appeal with a
27 determination to uphold, modify, or reverse the District decision. At the
28 Superintendent's discretion, an additional investigation may be conducted, including
29 interviews with the complainant, the individual(s) against whom the complaint is filed,
30 and others who may have knowledge of the alleged incident(s) or circumstances giving
31 rise to the complaint. The appeal may include any other methods or documents deemed
32 pertinent by the Superintendent.
33
- 34 6. If either party is not satisfied with the decision rendered by the Superintendent, he or she
35 may request a hearing in executive session with the School Board. The request for
36 hearing must be submitted in writing through the Superintendent's Office within ten (10)
37 working days following receipt of the Superintendent's response. The appeal must
38 include the original Complaint Investigation form, a copy of the written decision from the
39 Superintendent, and a written statement as to the reasons for appeal. The hearing will be
40 scheduled within thirty (30) working days of the request for hearing. The parties involved
41 will be notified in writing of the time and date of the scheduled hearing.
42
- 43 7. The School Board will render a decision in writing within ten (10) working days following
44 the hearing.
45

46 **D. Prohibition against Retaliation**
47

1 The District will discipline any individual who retaliates against any person who reports
2 alleged discrimination or who retaliates against any person who testifies, assists, or
3 participates in any investigation, proceeding, or hearing related to a discrimination complaint.
4

5 Retaliation includes, but is not limited to, any form of intimidation, reprisal, or discrimination.
6 Retaliation is itself a violation of federal and state laws prohibiting discrimination and may
7 lead to separate disciplinary action against an individual.
8

9 If any school personnel or student who has filed a complaint or has testified, assisted, or
10 participated in the investigation of discrimination believes that he or she has been retaliated
11 against because of his or her participation, he or she should follow the procedures set forth
12 above.
13

14 **E. False Charges**

15
16 Charges found to have been intentionally dishonest or made maliciously without regard for
17 truth may subject complainants and those conspiring with complainants to disciplinary
18 action.
19

20 **F. Uncomfortable Situations**

21
22 The District recognizes that not every uncomfortable situation constitutes discrimination.
23 Whether a particular action or incident is a personal, social relationship without a
24 discriminatory employment effect requires a determination based on all the facts and
25 surrounding circumstances. False accusations can have a serious detrimental effect on
26 innocent parties.
27

28 **G. Discipline**

29
30 Any action taken by the District pursuant to this policy will be consistent with requirements
31 of applicable collective bargaining agreements and District policies. The District will take
32 such disciplinary action it deems necessary and appropriate, including but not limited to,
33 warning, suspension, or immediate discharge to end discrimination and prevent its
34 recurrence.
35

6 compatible with the goals of the School District.

Budget Planning

The annual budget shall be based upon the prioritized needs of the School District and the reasonable needs of the community in relation to the financial ability of the District to support its schools.

In formulation of the budget, all expenditure items shall be considered in their relationship to the total school program.

Requests for major building improvements/repairs, as well as major changes in educational programs, shall be submitted in connection with the annual budget requests. If an emergency arises, requests, along with budget impacts caused by the emergency, shall be placed before the School Board for decision at that time.

The Superintendent, in conjunction with the Business Manager and the Assistant Superintendents, shall prepare and submit to the Board the proposed allotments of personnel as part of the District budget process prior to the adoption of the tentative budget.

3 **Funds from Federal Tax Sources**

4
5 Funds for educational purposes made available by the federal government will be accepted
6 by the Sioux Falls School District providing the conditions of their availability are in harmony
7 with the purposes and policies of the District and of state statutes.
8

9 No person in the United States shall, on the basis of race, color, creed, religion, gender,
10 sexual orientation, disability, national origin or ancestry, age, military/veteran status, genetic
11 information or any other basis protected by law, be excluded from participation in, be denied
12 the benefits of or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving
13 federal financial assistance.
14

15 It is the policy of the District that no federal funds received by a contract, grant, loan or
16 cooperative agreement may be expended to pay any person for influencing or attempting to
17 influence an office or employee of any agency, a member of Congress, an officer or
18 employee of Congress or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with any of
19 the following covered federal actions: the awarding of any federal contract, the making of any
20 federal grant, the making of any federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement
21 and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment or modification of any federal contract,
22 grant, loan or cooperative agreement.
23

24 Further, if funds from another source have been paid or will be paid to any person for
25 influencing or attempting to influence in connection with a federal contract, grant, loan or
26 cooperative agreement, the Superintendent shall complete and submit a Disclosure Form to
27 Report Lobbying.
28

29 In addition, the District will comply with the provisions of the Hatch Act which limit the political
30 activities of employees whose principal employment activities are funded in whole or in part
31 with federal funds.

3 **General Education Homebound Services**

4
5 General Education Homebound Services may be provided to any enrolled students who are
6 capable of benefiting from academic instruction but due to a temporary medical condition
7 (unrelated to any disability or substantially limiting health condition), whether chronic or acute,
8 are confined to their home and/or a hospital for 20 consecutive school days, or an intermittent
9 pattern of absences over a period of time totaling 20 school days in a school year for the same
10 health condition.

11
12 **Procedure**

13 A parent/guardian must complete an application for General Education Homebound Education
14 Services which requires information and a certification from a medical provider. The Application
15 must be submitted to the building principal/supervisor. The building principal/supervisor will
16 submit the application to the ~~health services supervisor~~ Coordinator of Health Services.

17
18 In person services will not be provided in cases where the condition of the student might
19 endanger the health or safety of teaching staff.

20
21 **Services/Instruction**

22 Services are provided in an effort to minimize the impact of a student's absences due to a
23 verified medical condition and ~~is~~ are not meant to replace the instruction a student receives in the
24 regular school setting.

25
26 Services may be provided in person or virtual. Services/instruction will be provided on days of
27 student attendance in accordance with the school calendar. Services/instruction will be provided
28 in the home, ~~or~~ hospital, or another location if deemed appropriate by the District. An adult in
29 addition to the District instructor must be present during instruction.

30
31 Instruction will be provided in core courses provided in the regular school session. Materials used
32 will be consistent with those provided in the student's home attendance center. Elementary
33 students will receive two (2) hours of instruction per week and secondary students will receive
34 four (4) hours of instruction per week. No more than one (1) hour of instruction should be given
35 per day.

36
37 A record of instruction, signed by the adult present during the instruction, shall be kept by the
38 teaching staff and reports provided to building principal/supervisor on a monthly basis and at the
39 conclusion of services. The building principal/supervisor will submit the reports to the ~~health~~
40 services supervisor Coordinator of Health Services.

41
42 **Absences and Attendance**

43 Students will be retained on the attendance register of the school in which they were enrolled at
44 the time homebound education services begin and will be recorded as Homebound Instruction
45 (HBD). After three cancellations or no shows, or if a parent/guardian or student fails to comply

1 with the homebound education services, all further absences will be considered unexcused and
2 the right to further homebound education services may be forfeited.

5 **Textbook Arrangements for Nonpublic School Students**

6
7 It shall be the policy of the School Board to loan textbooks upon written request by a student
8 or the student's parent or guardian without charge to all persons in the Sioux Falls School
9 District aged five through nineteen who are not enrolled in the Sioux Falls public schools.

10
11 Such textbooks shall be non-sectarian and designed for student use. The administration
12 shall determine that textbooks to be loaned are non-sectarian in nature. South Dakota law
13 precludes buying religious textbooks for loan to students. Consumable textbooks for
14 kindergarten through second grade may be loaned under this policy.

15
16 The amount of money expended per student in one budget year for purchasing textbooks for
17 loan shall not exceed the annual per student cost for textbooks purchased for students
18 enrolled in public schools. Annual private school allocations will be adjusted by the per
19 student increase in the general state aid formula.

Parents/guardians of homeschool students must complete a textbook loan contract and submit it to the principal of the public school the student would normally attend. Textbook loan contracts are available from the Assistant Superintendent of Administrative Services. All borrowed textbooks are to be returned to the public school at the end of the school year or immediately prior to moving out of the District boundaries, whichever comes first.
