PreK-6 Principal's Report

Fourth grade has joined ICU. The ICU schedule will accommodate elementary classroom schedule. NSCAS testing for 6th grade Math is scheduled for Tuesday, January 18 and 3rd grade Reading will take test on Thursday, January 20. MAPS testing, K-6th grade-January 11-January 14. Acaidence Testing- 82% of all elementary students made a benchmark; the goal is 90%

7th-12th grade Principal's Report

Testing-NWEA-MAPS took place this past week. NSCAS Winter Pilot (6th Math/3rd Reading). Planning for 2022-23- Working on classroom projections and staffing. Discussions and decisions for administration. The ICU System and staff members working in the ICU department at Twin River are making a positive difference! Data shows the positive results: Last

year first semester (2020-2021) students had 78 failed courses in grades 7-12. This year first semester (2021-2022) students had 0 failed courses in grades 7-12. Mr. Heier said great job to the students and staff and keep it going second semester.

12.3. Activities Report

Wrestling is continuing a strong season. Girls Wrestlers continue to have a successful season. Boys Basketball is 0-14, but seeing improvement. Girls Basketball- 4-10 wins against Madison, Schuyler, and Central City. Speech hosted their first Twin River Speech Invite and it was a successful day. Speech placed first at Wisner-Pilger invite on Saturday 1/15. JH Boys Basketball season started with 8 boys on the team. The new Head Baseball Coach is Aaron Rinkol. They haven't hired any assistant baseball coaches yet.

12.4. Superintendent Report

The Legislative Session started on January 5th. This is a 60 day session. Dr. Weidner discussed legislative bills and spoke about the Academic Transparency Act. This bill would require everything being taught to be put online so the materials can be reviewed by the parents. In 2016, the federal government passed additional required training for people who want to be bus drivers. It was supposed to go into effect in 2018, but for some reason it was pushed back to 2022. This new requirement will go into effect February 7. If you hold a CDL before February 7, you will not be required to have the extra 90 hours of training. Dr. Weidner is not aware of any licensed provider in this state to help people get this training. That will probably change over time. The extra 90 hours of training, which does include behind the wheel time, is on top of the Level I training the State of Nebraska requires. Over the past couple of months, Dr. Weidner has discussed the need to bolster their technology-related security practices. He is working with ESU 7, they are close to being compliant with ALICAP's requirements for insurance protection should they happen to get hacked. As part of the requirements for the ALICAP coverage, they are planning to show the staff how to secure their Google accounts with the 2-factor login process. All adults will have to use this type of login. They can run a report that shows who is not using the 2-factor login. This will be the same report ALICAP would request if the district had to make a claim about a cyber-attack. If one person is not using it, the district runs the risk of not getting coverage.

Supt. Report – February 2022

1. Legislative – A number of the bills limiting a district’s ability to finance its operations have been skuttled. The Columbus Plan, LB 890, has come out of the Education Committee. This bill would give the Twin River District \$800,000 in state aid. Based on current valuation, that would lower the levy by \$0.08.

However, there are a number of amendments to this bill already, most of which improve this bill. Senator Briese, who was very upset that his bill, LB 986, got tied up in a filibuster has filed an amendment to filibuster this bill.

Also, this bill needs a companion bill, LB 891, to fund it. It has yet to come out of the Revenue Committee. Senator Linehan chairs that committee.

Although Linehan’s Voucher bill was defeated earlier this session, a very similar bill, LB 1237, was introduced as the vehicle to provide vouchers. As of this writing, it is still being held in the Revenue Committee. Do not be surprised if there is an action to pull LB1237 from the committee without the Revenue Committee acting on it. This has been happening a lot in recent years.

2. I have contacted various music departments at colleges and universities in our state. I did receive a couple of names, but only one has applied so far.
3. Mr. Heier and I will be attending a Career Fair at Missouri Western State University in St. Joseph on February 25th. I am afraid this will be the norm in the future. As big schools are attending these types of events, smaller schools had better make their presence known to future teachers otherwise we will be left holding the bag.

Mrs. Buhl and I attended the Teacher Career Fair at UNK. Although we did visit with a few upcoming graduates, I have not received any applications. It is to note, when we visited with music majors, we were informed the entire class but one already had jobs for next year.

4. The 2-step verification process is coming along. Most of the staff have enabled it. Again, this is one of the requirements from ALICAP so they can consider giving us coverage in the event of a cyber or ransomware attack.
