§6-102.01 ANIMAL CONTROL AUTHORITY; RESPONSIBILITIES. The Animal Control Authority shall be responsible for (1) enforcing the animal control laws and regulations of the Municipality and the state within the corporate City Limits; (2) issuing tickets for violations of animal control laws and regulations of the Municipality and collecting fines established by the Municipality for such violations; (3) processing applications as described in this Article; (4) issuing licenses for domestic dogs, domestic cats, dangerous dogs; (5) issuing certificates for special animals; (6) collecting taxes established by the Municipality for such licenses and applications; (7) impounding animals as described within this Article (8) collecting fees and fines established by the Municipality; (9) coordinating the with local veterinarian(s) for the confinement, care, release or the expeditious and humane disposal of impounded animals; and (10) the maintenance of related records.

§6-102.05 ANIMAL CONTROL AUTHORITY; FEES, COSTS, AND EXPENSES; RESPONSIBILITY; PAYMENT PRIOR TO RELEASE. (1) The City Council approves and establishes the following fees: (a) Impound: (i) domestic dog, domestic cat, or domestic animal: Twenty dollars (\$20.00) or forty dollars (\$40.00) for any subsequent impound, (ii) livestock or special animal: Seventy five dollars (\$75.00) or one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) for any subsequent impound, (iii) dangerous dog or prohibited animal: Two hundred dollars (\$200.00) or three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for any subsequent impound; (b) Care: As billed by the Municipal Animal Pound; (c) Boarding: As billed by the Municipal Animal Pound; and (d) Euthanasia: As billed by the Municipal Animal Pound. (2) Owners are responsible for all fees, costs, and expenses associated with the impounding, care, keeping, and euthanasia of any animal impounded by any animal control officer regardless of the disposition of the animal. (3) Owners shall pay such fees, costs, and expenses prior to the release of such animal.

§6-102.06 ANIMAL CONTROL AUTHORITY; FINES. (1) The City Council approves and establishes the following fines for violations of this Article to be payable at City Hall: (a) Possession of a prohibited animal (§6-104): Four hundred dollars (\$400.00); (b) Possession of a livestock animal (§6-105): One hundred dollars (\$100.00); CHAPTER 6 POLICE REGULATIONS Article 1. Dogs and Cats 6-1-3 (c) Possession of an exotic animal (§6-106): One hundred dollars (\$100.00); (d) Special animal running at large (§6-107.07): Fifty dollars (\$50.00); (e) Possession of a dangerous dog in violation of any provision of this Article (§6-108) other than those listed within this Section: Three hundred dollars (\$300.00); (f) Dangerous dog running-at-large (§6-108.09): Three hundred dollars (\$300.00); (g) No collar on dangerous dog (§6-108.10): Twenty five dollars (\$25.00). (h) No metallic plate (e.g. rabies vaccination or dangerous dog license or name of owner) on collar of dangerous dog (§6-108.10): Twenty five dollars (\$25.00) each. (i) Failure to secure and maintain liability insurance for dangerous dog (§6-108.12): Two hundred dollars (\$200.00); (j) Dangerous dog bite or attack (§6-108.13): Four hundred dollars (\$400.00); (k) Failure to license domestic dog or cat (§6-109): Fifty dollars (\$50.00); (l) No collar on domestic dog or cat (§6-109.04): Ten dollars (\$10.00). (m) No metallic plate (e.g. rabies vaccination or domestic dog or cat license or name of owner) on collar of domestic dog or cat (§6-109.04): Ten dollars (\$10.00) each. (n) Domestic dog or cat running-at-large (§6-110): Twenty five (\$25.00); (o) Interference with service or police animal (§6-111.02): Four hundred dollars (\$400.00); (p) No rabies vaccination (§6-112.02): One hundred dollars (\$100.00); (q) Torture, poison, slaughter, or injure of any animal (§6-115): Five hundred dollars (\$500.00); (r) Animal cruelty (§6-116): Three hundred dollars (\$300.00); (s) Offensive noise (§6-117): Fifty dollars (\$50.00); (t) Animal fighting (§6-118): Five hundred dollars (\$500.00); (u) Public nuisance animal enclosure (§6-119): Fifty dollars (\$50.00); (v) Destruction of ticket (§6-120): Fifty dollars (\$50.00); and (w) Interference with officer, trap, or vehicle (§6-121): Four hundred dollars (\$400.00).

CHAPTER 6 POLICE REGULATIONS Article 1. Dogs and Cats 6-1-4 (2) All money collected by the Municipal Police under this section shall be transferred to the Municipal Treasurer. (3) Should any fine not be paid within ten (10) days from the date of offense or issuance of citation or if no fine is identified for a particular offense, the Municipal Police shall forward all necessary information to the Municipal Attorney. The Municipal Attorney may file a complaint in the appropriate Court. (4) Payment of any fine is an admission of guilt for said offense; (5) This fine schedule notwithstanding, the Court may assess and impose a fine up to and including five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for any violation identified within this Article. (Ref. 16-235 and 16-246 RS Neb.) (Amended by Ord. 1938, 08/04/15)

§6-103 ANIMAL REGULATIONS; TERMS; DEFINED. For the purposes of this Article, the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings respectively ascribed to them unless the context otherwise requires:

(1) Abandon: To leave any animal or livestock in one's care, whether as owner or custodian, for any length of time without making effective provision for its food, water, or other care as is reasonably necessary for the animal's health. (Ref. 28-1008[1], 54-902[1] RS Neb.)

(2) Alpaca: Any domesticated species of South American camel.

(3) Animal: All vertebrate members of the animal kingdom except humans or wild animals at large (Ref. 54-701.03[2] RS Neb.)

(4) Animal Control Authority: The Crete Police Department. (Ref. 54-617[1] RS Neb.) CHAPTER 6 POLICE REGULATIONS Article 1. Dogs and Cats 6-1-5

(5) Animal Control Officer: Any police officer, reserve police officer or community service officer employed by the City and assigned to the Animal Control Authority with the authority to enforce this Article or any other ordinance relating to the licensure, control, seizure and/or impoundment of animals and also any law enforcement officer or other employee whose duties in whole or in part include assignments that involve the enforcement of any provisions within this Article including, but not limited to, the seizure and impoundment of any animal within the Municipality. (Ref. 54-617[2] RS Neb.)

(6) Birds of Prey: Any buzzard, caracaras, eagle, falcon, harrier, kite, osprey, owl, secretary bird, or vulture.

(7) Bovine: Any cow, ox, or bison. (Ref. 54-902[3] RS Neb.)

(8) Care: The act of providing medical examination and/or treatment of any impounded animal by any veterinarian.

(9) Cervine: Any elk, deer, moose, caribou, or other member of the Family Cervidae.

(10) Cruelly Mistreat: To knowingly and intentionally kill, maim, disfigure, torture, beat, mutilate, burn, scald, or otherwise inflict harm upon any animal. (Ref. 28- 1008 [3] RS Neb.)

(11) Cruelly Neglect: To fail to provide any animal in one's care, whether as owner or custodian, with food, water, shelter or other care as is reasonably necessary for the animal's health. (Ref. 28-1008[4] RS Neb.)

(12) Dangerous Dog: (a) Dangerous dog shall mean any dog that: (i) has killed a human being; (ii) has inflicted injury on a human being that required medical treatment; (iii) has killed a domestic animal without provocation; or (iv) has been previously determined to be a potentially dangerous dog by the Chief Animal Control Officer or by another animal control authority, and the dog inflicts an injury on a human being that does not require medical treatment, injures a domestic animal, or threatens the safety of a human being or domestic animal. CHAPTER 6 POLICE REGULATIONS Article 1. Dogs and Cats 6-1-6 (b) Exceptions: (i) If the dog was not running at large, a dog shall not be defined as a dangerous dog under subsection (a)(ii) of this section if the human being was tormenting, abusing, or assaulting the dog at the time of the injury or has, in the past, been observed or reported to have tormented, abused, or assaulted the dog. (ii) If the dog was not running at large, a dog shall not be defined as a dangerous dog under subsection (a)(iv) of this section if the injury, damage, or threat was sustained by a human being who, at the time, was committing a willful trespass as defined in Neb. Rev. Stat. §20-203, 28-520, or 28-521; was committing any other tort upon the property of the owner of the dog; was tormenting, abusing, or assaulting the dog; or has, in the past, been observed or reported to have tormented, abused, or assaulted the dog, or was committing or attempting to commit a crime. (iii) A dog shall not be defined as a dangerous dog under subsection (a) of this section if the dog is a police animal as defined in Neb. Rev. Stat. §28-1008. (Ref. 54-617, 54-624 RS Neb.)

(13) Destroy/Destruction: The humane killing of an animal.

(14) Domestic Animal: Any animal, other than domestic dogs or cats, not defined as a dangerous dog, or prohibited or livestock animal within this section, which is kept as a household pet for the purpose of companionship. Domestic animals include: (a) Aquarium Fish: Any nonlethal fish maintained in an indoor aquarium; (b) Domestic Amphibians: Any animal of the Lissamphibia subclass such as a: frog, toad, salamander or newt; (c) Domestic Bird: Any parrot, cockatoo, parakeet, canary, mynah, or lovebird; (d) Domestic Rabbit: Any rabbit or bunny from the family Leporidae living indoors or in an enclosed outside hutch; (e) Domestic Reptile: Any non-poisonous lizard or turtle, or any or non-constricting or non-poisonous snake less than 4 feet; CHAPTER 6 POLICE REGULATIONS Article 1. Dogs and Cats 6-1-7 (f) Domestic Rodent: Any animal belonging to the Rodentia Order such as a gerbil, guinea pig, hamster, mouse, or rat living indoors. (g) Domestic ferret. (Ref. 29-818, 54-626[15] RS Neb.)

(15) Domestic Cat (Cat): Any animal which is wholly or in part of the Felis domesticus species which is harbored as a household pet for the purpose of companionship. This definition does not include feral cats or prohibited animals as defined within this section. (Ref. 54- 626[5],[15] and 71-4401[1] RS Neb.)

(16) Domestic Dog (Dog): Any animal which is wholly or in part of the Canis familiaris sub-species which is harbored as a household pet for the purpose of companionship. This definition does not include dangerous dogs or prohibited animals as defined within this section. (Ref 54-624, 54- 626[10],[15] RS Neb.)

(17) Equine: Any horse, pony, donkey, mule, hinny, or llama. (Ref. 54-902[6] RS Neb.)

(18) Euthanasia: The destruction of any animal by commonly accepted veterinary practices. (Ref. 54-902[7] RS Neb.)

(19) Exotic Animal: Any animal which is not commonly sold through licensed livestock auction markets. Such animals shall include, but not be limited to, miniature cattle, miniature horses, miniature donkeys,

Barbary sheep, Dall's sheep, alpacas, llamas, pot-bellied pigs, and small mammals not including domestic dogs or cats. The term also includes birds and poultry. The term does not include beef and dairy cattle, calves, swine, bison, sheep sold for wool or food, goats sold for dairy, food, or fiber, and domesticated cervine animals. (Ref. 54-701.03[8] RS Neb.)

(20) Feral Animal: Any dog or cat found at large within the Municipality without a collar, license tag, or identification tag.

(21) Hybrid Animal: Any animal that is the product of the breeding of a domestic dog with a nondomestic canine species. (Ref. 54-624, 71-4401[5] RS Neb.) CHAPTER 6 POLICE REGULATIONS Article 1. Dogs and Cats 6-1-8

(22) Humane killing: The destruction of an animal by a method which causes the animal a minimum of pain and suffering. (Ref. 28-1008[5] RS Neb.)

(23) Impound: The act of capturing and arranging the temporary confinement of any animal by any animal control officer.

(24) Keep: The act of providing confinement and/or shelter and/or supplying water and/or nourishment to any animal.

(25) Law Enforcement Officer: Any police officers employed by the Municipality and all deputy sheriffs, marshals, police officers, state highway patrol officers, members of the National Guard on active service by direction of the Governor during periods of emergency, and all other persons with similar authority to make arrests. (Ref. 49-801[15] RS Neb.)

(26) Livestock Animal: Any bovine, equine, porcine, sheep, goat, cervine, ratite bird, or poultry. (Ref 54-701.03[13], 54-902[9] RS Neb.)

(27) Medical Treatment: Treatment administered by a physician or other licensed health care professional resulting in the use of sutures or surgery or treatment for one or more broken bones. (Ref 54-617[5] RS Neb.)

(28) Municipal Animal Pound: The licensed veterinarian and/or veterinary clinic which, through cooperative agreement with the City, provides proper care, treatment, and confinement of impounded animals. (Ref. 71-4408 RS Neb.)

(29) Own: To possess, keep; harbor; or have control of, charge of, custody of any dangerous dog; or domestic or livestock animal. This term does not apply to domestic dogs or cats temporarily maintained on the premises of a veterinarian or kennel operator for a period of not more than thirty (30) days. (Ref. 71-4401[6] RS Neb.)(Amended Ord. 1915, 9/16/14) CHAPTER 6 POLICE REGULATIONS Article 1. Dogs and Cats 6-1-9

(30) Owner: Any person, firm, corporation, organization, political subdivision possessing, harboring, keeping, or having control or custody of any domestic dog, domestic cat, dangerous dog, domestic animal, exotic animal, or livestock animal or permitting any domestic dog, domestic cat, dangerous dog, domestic animal, exotic animal, or livestock animal to habitually be or remain on or be lodged or fed within any structure, grounds, or premises of such person, firm, corporation, organization, or political subdivision. This term does not apply to veterinarians, kennel operators, or livestock market

representatives temporarily maintaining on their premises animals owned by other persons. (Ref. 71-4401[7] RS Neb.)

(31) Police Animal: Any horse or dog owned or controlled by the Municipality, Saline County, State of Nebraska, or agency of the federal government especially trained for the purpose of assisting a law enforcement officer in the performance of his or her official enforcement duties. (Ref. 28-1008[8] RS Neb.)

(32) Porcine: Any pig, swine, or hog.

(33) Potentially Dangerous Dog: (1) Any dog that when unprovoked (a) inflicts an injury on a human being that does not require medical treatment, (b) injures a domestic animal, or (c) chases or approaches a person upon streets, sidewalks, or any public grounds in a menacing fashion or apparent attitude of attack or (2) any specific dog with a known propensity, tendency, or disposition to attack when unprovoked, to cause injury, or to threaten the safety of humans or domestic animals. (Ref. 54-617[7] RS Neb.)

(34) Prohibited animal: Any species or mix of any species prohibited by the State of Nebraska by statute or by the Municipality by ordinance to include but not limited to any: (a) Non-domesticated wild animal; (b) Coyote, wolf, or hybrid animal; (c) Venomous or constricting snake, alligator, crocodile, Gila monster, or Komodo dragon; (d) Nonvenomous snake that will grow to more than eight (8) feet (2.44 meters) in length at maturity; CHAPTER 6 POLICE REGULATIONS Article 1. Dogs and Cats 6-1-10 (e) Wild bird or bird of prey such as condors, falcons, hawks, eagles, and vultures; (f) Skunk; (g) Animal of the family Felidae other than a domestic cat such as tigers, lions, leopards, mountain lions, pumas, lynx, cheetahs, jaguars and ocelots; (h) Animal of the family Ursidae including American black bears, brown bears, panda bears and polar bears; (i) Marsupial such as kangaroos, koalas, and possums; (j) Primate such as baboons, lemurs, chimpanzees, monkeys, orangutans, and gorillas; (k) Lethal or invasive fish such as snakehead or piranha; (l) Bees; (m) Livestock animal, ~~with the exception of a livestock animal permitted by the Mayor as defined and prescribed within the Article as a special animal;~~ (n) Exotic animal, ~~with the exception of an exotic animal permitted by the Mayor as defined and prescribed within the Article as a special animal;~~ or (o) Animal which reasonably poses or may pose a threat to the life or health of any human. Prohibited animals do not include any domestic dog, domestic cat, domestic animal or dangerous dog. (Ref. 37-477 RS Neb.) (Amended Ord. 1915, 9/16/14)

(35) Poultry: Any domesticated bird that serve as a source of eggs or meat and includes, but is not limited to, chickens, turkeys, ducks, and geese. (Ref. 54-701.03[14] RS Neb.)

(36) Rabies Control Authority: The Crete Police Department. (Ref. 71-4401[8] RS Neb.)

(37) Ratite Bird: Any ostrich, emu, cassowary, rhea, or kiwi.

(38) Service Animal: Dogs that are individually trained to do work or perform tasks for people with disabilities.

(39) Slaughter: The purposeful killing of any animal in preparation for consumption and/or as part of a ceremonial ritual. CHAPTER 6 POLICE REGULATIONS Article 1. Dogs and Cats 6-1-11

~~(40) Special Animal: Any exotic or livestock animal permitted within the Municipality by authorities granted to the Mayor as prescribed within this Article.~~

(41) Torture: Intentionally subjecting an animal to extreme pain, suffering, or agony. Torture does not include conduct performed by a veterinarian licensed to practice veterinary medicine and surgery in this state or conduct that conforms to accepted veterinary practices. (Ref. 28- 1008 [11] RS Neb.)

(42) Transfer: The lawful disposition of any animal to a licensed humane society or individual from the Animal Control Authority.

(43) Veterinarian: Any accredited veterinarian approved by the deputy administrator of the United States Department of Agriculture in accordance with 9 C.F.R. part 161, as such regulation existed on January 1, 2006.

(44) Wild Animal: Any species of mammals native to, migrating to or through, or having established free-ranging populations in the State of Nebraska except the fallow deer, the house mouse, the Norway rat, the black rat, the feral domestic dog, and the feral domestic cat. (Ref. 37- 246 RS Neb.) (Amended Ord. 1827, 6/19/12) §6-104 PROHIBITED ANIMAL; UNLAWFUL; SEIZURE; DISPOSITION. (1) It shall be unlawful for any owner to possess, harbor, keep, or maintain control or custody of any prohibited animal within in the Municipality. (2) The Animal Control Authority may seize and impound any prohibited animal found in the Municipality. If such seizure or impound is deemed unsafe, an animal control officer may kill such animal. No action shall be maintained against any animal control officer for killing a prohibited animal. (3) At the direction of the Chief of Police, the Animal Control Authority may sell or transfer an impounded prohibited animal to competent authority or order the euthanasia of such animal. (Ref. 16-235, 37-477 RS Neb.) (Amended Ord. 1827, 6/19/12)

§6-105 LIVESTOCK; PROHIBITED; EXCEPTION. It shall be unlawful for any owner to possess, harbor, keep, or CHAPTER 6 POLICE REGULATIONS Article 1. Dogs and Cats 6-1-12 maintain control or custody of livestock in the Municipality. Exceptions include: (1) The expedient transportation of such animals through the City or to destinations described within this section; (2) Livestock animals temporarily held for sale upon commercially zoned lots with State license to sell such livestock; (3) Livestock animals temporarily held within the confines of Tuxedo Park associated with events approved by the City Council to include, but not limited to, the Saline County Fair, rodeos, circuses, demonstrations, and shows; (4) Horses participating in parades approved by the City Council; (5) Birds of the family Anatidae owned by and harbored upon properties owned by Doane College; and ~~(6) Livestock animals permitted by the Mayor as special animals, as prescribed within this Article.~~ (Amended Ord. 1827, 6/19/12)

§6-106 EXOTIC ANIMAL; PROHIBITED; EXCEPTION. It shall be unlawful for any owner to possess, harbor, keep, or maintain control or custody of any exotic animal in the Municipality. Exceptions include: (1) The expedient transportation of such animals through the City; and ~~(2) Exotic animals permitted by the Mayor as special animals, as prescribed within this Article.~~ (Amended Ord. 1827, 6/19/12)

~~§6-107 SPECIAL ANIMAL; PERMIT; RESTRICTIONS. Upon receipt and approval of proper application, the Mayor may designate any livestock or exotic animal to be a special animal. No more than one (1) special animal may be: (a) owned by a single owner or (b) harbored upon a single lot within the Municipality. The Mayor may not designate any domestic dog, domestic cat, domestic animal, dangerous dog or any other animal defined as a prohibited animal to be a special animal.~~ (Amended Ord. 1827, 6/19/12)

~~§6-107.01 SPECIAL ANIMAL; PERMIT; APPLICATION INFORMATION. The owner of any livestock or exotic animal may make application at City Hall and, if approved, renew such permit annually for the life of the~~

special animal. At the time of application, the owner shall provide the following: (1) (a) His or her name, (b) address, (c) telephone number; (2) (a) the name (if any) of the animal, (b) species, (c) description, (d) estimated weight, (e) a photograph of the animal (no smaller than 5"x7"), (f) and the City lot upon CHAPTER 6 POLICE REGULATIONS Article 1. Dogs and Cats 6-1-13 which the special animal shall be harbored; and (3) verifiable written certification from an insurance carrier, licensed within the State, of liability insurance coverage, including the City of Crete as a co-insured, of no less than \$100,000. (Amended by Ord. 1938, 08/04/15)

§6-107.02 SPECIAL ANIMAL; PERMIT; APPLICATION; TAX. The Municipal tax for each special animal permit application shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00) per year for each special animal. The Animal Control Authority shall not accept or process the special animal permit application until such payment is received. This application tax is nonrefundable. §6-107.03 SPECIAL ANIMAL; PERMIT; APPLICATION PROCESS. Upon proper application for a special animal by the owner, the Animal Control Authority shall forward such application through the Chief of Police to the Mayor for approval or denial. Upon receipt, the Mayor shall confer with the Chief of Police and consider the recommendation of the Animal Control Authority. The Mayor shall render a decision to the Chief of Police who will notify the owner of such decision.

§6-107.04 SPECIAL ANIMAL; PERMIT; CERTIFICATE. Upon receipt of the Mayor's approved permit of a special animal, the Animal Control Authority shall make record of the permit and issue the owner a certificate bearing the municipal special animal permit identification number, "CRETE, NEBRASKA SPECIAL ANIMAL PERMIT", and date of expiration not to exceed one year from the date of approval.

§6-107.05 SPECIAL ANIMAL; PERMIT; TRANSFER; REFUND PROHIBITED. The transfer of a special animal permit from one animal to another or from one owner to another is prohibited. No refund shall be made in case of death, sale, or other disposition of the permitted animal or if the permit application is denied.

§6-107.06 SPECIAL ANIMAL; RUNNING AT LARGE; UNLAWFUL. It shall be unlawful for any owner to permit a special animal, livestock animal, or exotic animal to run at large. The Animal Control Authority may impound any such animal. If CHAPTER 6 POLICE REGULATIONS Article 1. Dogs and Cats 6-1-14 unclaimed within five (5) days, the Animal Control Authority may arrange the sale of such animal to discharge the fees, costs, and expenses of impounding and keeping the same, and of such sale. (Ref. 16-235 RS Neb.) §6-107.07 SPECIAL ANIMAL; PERMIT; REVOCATION. The Mayor may, at any time, revoke any special animal permit or decline to permit any animal as a special animal.
