Brian Templeton of Upland Design Group provided an update on Candy's Creek Cherokee Elementary School construction:

Contractor continues to make steady progress.

Duct work and piping above ceilings are moving along.

Gym and multipurpose are complete except finishes. They are storing flooring materials in the gym.

Exterior sidewalks are taking good shape and should be complete soon.

Sowing and seeding outside is taking shape.

Kitchen flooring will be installed before the end of the month. Equipment should be there at the end of the month.

Contractor is on schedule, and everything is looking good.

Everything is under roof now so weather delays should be minimal.

3.G. Elementary School Zone Committee Update

Dr. Dyer stated that administrators and Board members spent three hours during the Board Retreat talking about the zoning process. The first Community Meeting is Thursday, 6:00 pm at Mayfield. It will be broadcast on CHSLive and archived on their Facebook page for future viewing. We are taking questions in advance online. There will be presentations and a Q&A panel. The Guide K12 traning was last week; committees will work this program. Special Called meeting on school zones was changed to Monday, December 17, 3:00 pm. Dr. Dyer stated that zone options will be discussed at this meeting.

3.H. Energy Program Update

Paul Ramsey, Energy Management Specialist, provided an update on the Energy Program:

In the past nine years, we've had \$5,639,506 or 33% savings.

We are using 3.2 million kwh less energy at CHS even though we have added a new arena, culinary program, science wing, and computers since 2009.

ESG program is finishing up in the schools. We received an ESG grant of \$50,000 for lighting projects.

Through the efforts of CCS and Brian Templeton's team, we were awarded a \$130,000 TVA grant for going all electric and geothermal at Candy's Creek Cherokee Elementary School.

3.I. TLN Report

Carolyn Ingram provided an update:

Memphis and Nashville rejected four Charter Schools in their area.

CTE programs are growing across the state.

Board members discussed dates for legislators lunch again this year; group will email and find a date.
