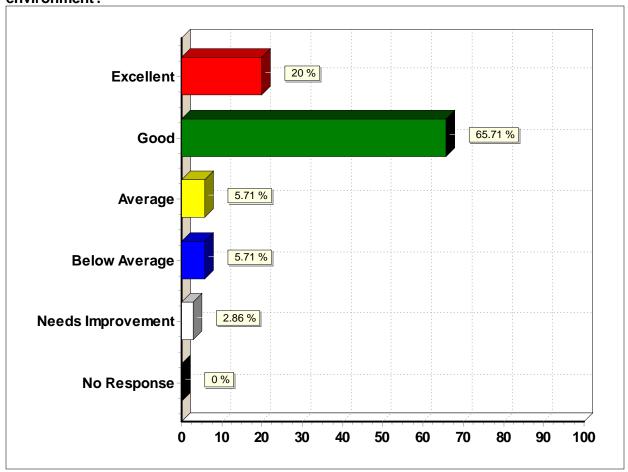

#### Superintendent's Report

#### June 12, 2018

- **1. Goal #1:** Wakefield Community School will provide students an education that develops relationships utilizing a relevant curriculum that infuses technology providing 21<sup>st</sup> Century learning for all students. (Curriculum, Americanism & Technology)
  - a. The administrators are developing our summer retreat to discuss our instructional model and school culture. This summer meeting will replace our data retreat. Our team agrees that both schools are doing a good job on data analysis. This topics fit into our AdvancED goals and following our summer leadership training with Dr. Phil Warrick that we need to focus our attention on these topics. We are inviting the teachers to a day long retreat, either in July or early August to work on these important building and district aspects.
- **2. Goal #2:** Wakefield Community School will make an efficient use of all resources. (Business & Finance)
  - a. The budget for June reflects that the district is 10.22% under budget for the year. Local General Fund tax receipts in May was \$1,487,397 and expenditures of \$596,397. This month the budget reflects 33.80% is unencumbered compared to 30.41% unencumbered the previous year. Fund balances as of June 1, 2018 are: General Fund \$1,712,271; Lunch Fund \$155,402; Bond Fund \$38,709; Depreciation Fund \$627,823; Employee Benefit Fund \$25,667; Special Building Fund \$649,554; Qualified Capital Purchase Undertaking Fund (QCPUF) \$135,532 and Interim Fund is \$4,628. Total unencumbered funds all funds is \$3,353,657.
  - b. Environmental Energy Consultants performed our three year asbestos re-inspection. Mr. Gary Collins performed the inspection and found that no changes had occurred since the prior inspection. Asbestos tiles in classrooms were found to be in good condition. The energy conservation project resulted in changes to pipe joint materials in the boiler room. The inspection revealed no exposed joint asbestos found in the boiler room. He noted that no additional asbestos abatement had occurred during the last three years. The report stated our facilities were in good condition and no asbestos exposure was evident.

- **3. Goal #3:** Wakefield Community School will facilitate communication with staff, parents, patrons, and students (Public and Personnel Relations)
  - **a.** We are preparing two classrooms for Humpty Dumpty Daycare to use this summer. Visiting with Zack Dolen, DHHS must come and inspect the classroom prior to the students using the classrooms this summer. We are both waiting on an inspection date from DHHS.

#### 4. Miscellaneous

- a. Summer maintenance repairs continue at both the elementary and high school level. Rex has completed all the ceiling tile replacements. Kristi completed the painting of the business classroom and school psychologist office. She is currently working in the library repainting the west wall. Classroom cleaning continues in both buildings with carpet cleaning in the high school classrooms are finished. The custodial crew is working on more elementary classrooms (Haisch). Rooms being used for migrant summer school will be cleaned once summer school is concluded at the end of June. Rex has replaced the lighting in Mrs. Vander Weil with long lasting LED bulbs.
- **b.** A week ago, I sent letters out to the three county attorneys regarding disciplinary policy. Deputy Co. Attorney Erick Knutson responded back with a line item addition to our student handbook stating that "in addition to school consequences, law enforcement will be contacted if a student commits a crime." I have not heard from the Dixon County Attorney or Thurston County Attorney.

The board special committees met on March 15, 2018 to discuss a possible cooperative athletic agreement for the upcoming school year. Allen Consolidated Schools recognizes that the benefits of an athletic agreement is not as significant to Wakefield as it is to Allen. Simply stated the census of Allen students is declining and will continue to decline. Although Allen could continue to support girls teams another year, they desire to be proactive and not wait to the last moment to cooperate with Wakefield. Allen Consolidated Schools desires to commit to a longer term relationship with Wakefield. The Allen committee stated that their positive relationship with Wakefield is a major consideration for cooperating with Wakefield. The longer term relationship represents real opportunities for cooperating in academic, extra-curricular activities and student social skills development.

Major Topic Standards are being integrated into each grade level. The standards have greater inquiry and hands-on activities reflecting increased rigor by grade level. Grades 7 - 8 standards reflect an integration of life science, earth science, physical science and earth & space science. Currently these topics are taught by grade level in grades 6 - 8. Constructing, evaluating and analyzing data and information is emphasized in the new state standards, resulting in significant increases in rigor of student learning expectations. High school curriculum standards are course specific. The current materials still address the newly revised standards. The high school revised standards are based on course topics such as Physical Science, Life Sciences Earth and Space Sciences. These standards reflect increased investigations, gathering of data, analyzing science truths and communicating constructs that others can understand. These higher order thinking and exploratory science activities reflect increased rigor.

## **English Learner Program Review 2018**

The Wakefield EL team met on May 15, 2018 for a program review of EL services. The team discussed the identification process of EL students. The team recommended a change of one sentence on the Language Survey form to come into compliance with state/national guidelines. The elementary is obtaining parent permission to conduct testing from parents/guardians. Mr. Roberts and Mr. Heitz reported that secondary newcomers did not received initial tested due to the lack of English language skills. The secondary team agreed to begin testing all newcomer students using the district's Woodcock Munoz and all students going forward will receive initial testing with parent/guardian permission. Mr. Roberts will be responsible for conducting the Woodcock-Munoz for all students entering the program.

The Language Instruction Education Programs (LIEP) as a program review is new. Our program is an English Language immersion program designed around a "push-in, pull-out" model. EL instruction is occurring as an inclusion classroom component served by EL instructors. Limited pull out is used for additional instruction needed by students beginning to learn English requiring addition services.

Staffing needs were discussed by the team and certainly additional time for EL services delivery to students at the elementary level would be ideal. The general consensus is that current staffing is meeting most of the needs at the elementary level. The largest EL service deficit is grades four through 6<sup>th</sup> grade at the elementary level. Staff would like to see a increasing our second EL instructor to full time status, however they recognize that budgetary constraints are a limiting factor. Upper elementary is currently limited in EL services where two newcomer students have entered. A suggestion to add additional para-education support during 7<sup>th</sup> period would be helpful at the high school.

Examining standards the team is utilizing increased reading time to help master English as well as stay engaged in standards mastery. The team was very pleased with the having secondary students newcomers serve as teacher aides in the lower elementary. The team discovered this intervention helped the newcomers master reading and speaking English as well as help the primary students develop listening skills and reading skills. These student spend time reading books to students, asking questions resulting in both EL's learning English together.

The elementary team helping EL's by increasing the use of scripted Reading Mastery materials. The elementary staff is adding "Reading Mastery" in grades K – 5 for students needing additional language assistance. The secondary team is looking at using LLI with newcomer students helping English comprehension and reading fluency. General consensus is to find supplementary materials that will close language gaps at a quicker pace at the secondary level to ensure greater mastery of core content. We discussed looking at ELLOQUENCE as a possible supplementary package at the high school level. Rosetta Stone utilization for newcomers was ineffective and will be removed next year. Increased vocabulary in science was mentioned as another growth area.

Examining the utilization of assessments, the team is pleased with the purchase of two new Woodcock-Munoz testing kits. The newer materials are more relevant and a better assessment of each student's initial English skills. The team expressed concern with new testing requirements for EL's on NSCAS assessments. Requiring EL's to take the exams regardless of English skills is an extremely stressful experience for students especially newcomers and left students with feelings of failure. The team realizes the goal is to establish a baseline for measuring improvement however; we question the value

of the anxiety generating experience by students, some who have not learned the alphabet at the time of testing. Teaching staff expressed concern.

Examining ELPA21 assessment for 2016-17 and 2017-18 reflect positive improvement in student acquisition of English language skills. Sixteen elementary students moved to the "Proficient" category in the elementary and four students moved to "Proficient" at the high school level. Students scoring in the "Proficient" level are moved out of the EL program and are on monitoring status. District wide 29.3% of students received EL services in grades K – 12. Only three students in the elementary exams scored as "Emerging," while 68 students are "Progressing" in their language acquisition. Moving to proficient at the high school level appears to be more challenging at upper grade levels. Many of the students in grades 7-12 are students in their early years of EL services. Some students are also receive special education services. NSCAS data is not available at this time for review.

Examining the class of 2018 all seven students graduated from high school. Three of these students maintained an 87 – 93 percent GPA for eight semesters. Although the seniors remained in the EL program eligible, their ability to be fully mainstreamed in the general education curricula is reflective of their academic success. Only one EL student dropped out of high school this past year and entered the work force.

Monitoring students exiting English Language services occurs at parent-teachers conferences. The team stated the need to improve student progress monitoring during the year through more systematic evaluation. Students on "monitoring status" currently are reviewed each semester and will be on a expanded on a quarterly basis.

Examining modifications, the EL team is electing to bring LLI reading interventions in the upper grades. The committee also recommends expanded meeting times with EL staff to coordinate increased communications between team members. We continue to be challenged by high school age students with limited formal education. Greater emphasis in vocational skills possibly including school-to-work opportunities would be beneficial. Improving life skills training for older students with major deficient in formal education would be beneficial academically while they are learning English. Staff members desire greater clarification on whether EL student courses can be label as "EL" courses on their transcript. The team suggested the use of "Pass / Fail" grades with life skills course work.

### **Wellness Committee 2018 Annual Report**

The Wakefield Community School Wellness Committee met on May 14, 2018 to conduct a review of the 2017-18 Wellness Activities. The Wellness Committee consists of Mark Bejot, Arianne Conley, Jolene Klein, Jaime Manz, Joe Wendte, Kristi Foote, Angie Borg, Jamie Dolph & Michele Galles. The committee met three times during the year.

Student Council taste testing survey is a highlight for both elementary and high school students. The food survey indicated that students dislike goulash hands down and ask the main dish is removed from the menu. Students like the new smart snack juices, strawberry scones, while tornados were rated as "okay" but very spicy. Students and staff were very positive regarding the changes to the salad bar and encouraged more variety in offerings. Salad bar offerings are available to all students in grades 4 -12. Primary students are offered select salad items generally served by student assistants. We discussed having all the meat and salad making items on the snack bar. One concern was students receiving the required protein levels for a billable meal, which will be looked into. Another suggestion was to insert beets into the salad bar. Everyone was appreciative of the changes in the salad bar offerings and thanked the nutrition staff for their efforts. Krisiti reported that student consumption of fruits and vegetables has increased largely because of greater offerings on the salad bar.

The team discussed ways to improve serving times and increase lunchtime. Everyone recognized that the elementary and high school schedules create constraints on meal time scheduling. Mr. Wulf is adding more recess time to increase student activity. The high school vending machines contains products that meet the healthy snacks requirements. The utilization of water bottles throughout the day continues in the elementary and high school. Water bottle filling stations in both building and in the lunchroom are credited for increased water consumption while students are at school. A recommendation for more positive nutrition posters being placed in the lunchroom to advertise healthy eating styles.

Mr. Wendte reported that the morning fun run continues daily with approximately 150+ students participating daily. He states that some students fail to make the fun run due to eating breakfast, which maybe we could look at next year. Mr. Wendte asked for additional adult participation and supervision during the fun run would help the process. He was very pleased with "Pacer Test" results reflecting student improvement and overall good results. Recess participation has increased this past year due to increased participation at the upper elementary level. Mr. Wendte's six fitness clubs are showing increased student participation in the elementary. The Jump Rope for Heart event was a success generating over \$600 for the American Heart Association.

Mrs. Manz reports that the lunch walk was successful with almost all K-12 students participating. She credited the staff for helping make this event a district wide success. The fall "Bike & Walk to School" reflected large student participation at the elementary. The elementary "Track & Field Day," continues to be a highlight for elementary student participants as well as the high school helping Mr. Hassler organize and run the various events. All elementary students participated in at least three activities during the field day. Parents and patrons show up to support students in the event.

Activity breaks were another wellness goal. Committee members report that students were being more activity breaks within the classroom. This may be an area of increased emphasis next year at both the elementary and high school level. The introduction of multiple seating options in classrooms is another activity designed to address student activity while participating In various classroom learning activities.

Mrs. Manz reports that staff wellness promotion activities continue to be challenging for our staff. Eight staff completed the wellness survey out of 70 staff. She was surprised at how few staff members completed the free health screenings through EHA, which if they submitted their results to EHA, a fifty dollar reward was given. A number of staff utilize the activities center after school. A number of staff also participate in distance running activities. The committee desires to explore ways to increase staff wellness activities. Many of the staff utilize water bottles and actively promote water consumption throughout the school day. The team discussed the importance of staff involvement in healthy activities has been a key to student wellness activities.

The team will meet in the fall to begin school wellness planning for the upcoming 2018-19 school year.

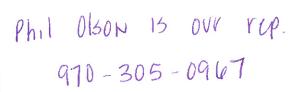
