A meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of Bellevue was called to order by Mayor Rusty Hike at the Bellevue City Hall on the 2nd day of July, 2019, at 6:00 p.m. Present were Council Members Bob Stinson, Paul Cook, Pat Shannon, Don Preister, Thomas Burns, and Kathy Welch.

Notice of this meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Bellevue Leader and posting in two public places, the designated method for giving notice and was also given to the Mayor and all members of the City Council. A copy of the affidavit of publication, the certificate of posting, and the council's acknowledgment of receipt of notice are hereby attached to these minutes. All proceedings shown hereafter were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public.

Pledge of Allegiance and Invocation

Mayor Hike led in the Pledge of Allegiance. Pastor Joseph Gastineau, Revival Tabernacle Church, 2226 Jefferson Street gave the invocation.

Statistics were provided by Mr. Rhone regarding the number of owners of alarm systems and payment policies. Mr. Rhone paid the required registration fee of \$25.00 to Mr. Jim Ristow, City Administrator.

Mayor Hike thanked Mr. Rhone for his concerns. He advised him the issue is being addressed.

Mr. Ristow explained ProPhoenix will be available on line which will localize the majority of the billing. Chief Mark Elbert advised he is hoping the program will be available in a year.

Mrs. Abby Highland, CDBG Program Administrator, advised this item refers to the five-year consolidated plan, which includes the one-year action plan. The five-year plan outlines the goals and priorities which will be achieved with CDBG money over the next five years. The one-year action plan outlines the proposed funding recommendation for the entitlement money for 2019/2020. Fund are allocated through an application process. The CDBG committee reviews the applications and conducts interviews before the funding recommendation is prepared.



E. REQUESTED ACTION:

Rezone Lot 1, Wood Replat, from RS-72 to RD-60.

F. EXISTING ZONING AND LAND USE:

RS-72, Vacant

G. PURPOSE OF REQUEST:

The purpose of this request is to obtain approval of a rezoning to allow for the construction of a duplex.

H. SIZE OF SITE:

The site is approximately .29 acres.

II. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

A. EXISTING CONDITION OF SITE:

The site is presently vacant. Previously, there was a single family residence on the property. This residence was torn down by the city after being destroyed by fire.

B. GENERAL NEIGHBORHOOD/AREA LAND USES AND ZONING:

1. North: Single Family Residential, RS-72

2. East: Single Family Residential, RS-72

3. South: Single Family Residential, RS-72

4. West: Single Family Residential, RS-72

C. REVELANT CASE HISTORY:

On June 20, 2019, the Planning Commission recommended denial of a request to rezone Lot 1, Wood Replat, from RS-72 to RD-60 for the purpose of duplex residential development.

D. APPLICABLE REGULATIONS:

Section 5.11, Zoning Ordinance, regarding RD-60 uses and requirements.

III. ANALYSIS

A. COMPREHENSIVE PLAN:

The Future Land Use Map of the Comprehensive Plan designates this property as single family residential.

B. OTHER PLANS:

This property is large enough to be replatted into two lots if rezoned to the RD-60 zoning district.

C. TRAFFIC AND ACCESS:

- 1. There is no traffic data available for this area.
- 2. The property could have access from either South 30th Street or McCorkindale Avenue.

D. UTILITES:

All utilities are available to this property.

E. ANALYSIS:

- 1. Paul Pignotti has submitted a request to rezone Lot 1, Wood Replat, for the purpose of allowing a duplex.
- 2. This property is presently zoned RS-72. The intent of the RS-72 zoning district is to permit single family residential developments on medium sized lots, while the intent of the RD-60 zoning district is to permit single family and two family residential developments on smaller sized lots.
- 3. The applicant desires to sell the property to a buyer who wants to construct a duplex.
- 4. This application was sent out for review by the following departments and individuals: Public Works, Permits and Inspections, Chief of Police, Offutt Air Force Base, Fire Inspector, and the Omaha Public School District. The cover letter indicated a deadline to send comments back to the Planning Department, and also stated if the requested department did not have comments pertaining to the application, no response was needed.

No comments were received on this case.

- 5. The Future Land Use Map of the Comprehensive Plan designates this area as single family residential.
- 6. The applicant has provided several addresses of existing duplexes nearby. They are as follows:
 - 2803-2807 Irene Street
 - 2717 Irene Street
 - 2802-2804 Sandra Street
 - 2713 Bonnie Street
 - 8004 Sarpy Avenue

The addresses on Irene Street and Sandra Street are part of an RG-50 zoning district, where duplexes are a permitted use. Please refer to the attached zoning map to view these duplexes in relation to the applicant's property.

The duplexes located at 2713 Bonnie Street and 8004 Sarpy Avenue are considered legal non-conforming. They are both zoned RS-72, and were constructed in 1969. These duplexes were likely constructed while this area was under Sarpy County's jurisdiction.

7. Staff does not believe the requested RD-60 zoning is compatible with the immediate neighborhood. This property is presently surrounded by RS-72 zoning and single family residences. Rezoning this particular lot would be considered spot zoning, which is not desirable planning practice.







My wife and I are residents of 2916 Betty Street, the lot adjacent to 7801 South 30th Street. It has come to our attention that you wish to rezone this area from a single family Residential lot to a Duplex Lot. We vehemently oppose such action.

We were not given fair notice of the lot rezoning. We discovered through one of our neighbors that one person was gathering signatures on the morning of Saturday, June 15th. We were not home and did not receive any supplemental information regarding the potential zone change, nor of the petition. If there is any entry under our address, disregard it and consider it fraudulent. Further, we do not know what the person gathering signatures said or did in their pitch to gain signatures. Please take this into account when you evaluate the legitimately of this petition.

We have not been told what the plans are for such a building. Any driveways on the corner of McCorkindale and 30th St present a safety concern. The area sits on the crest of a hill, and is a significant blind spot in an area that often hosts many kids playing on the sidewalks and sometimes riding bikes in the streets. Mr. Wilsey had also worked for the city of Bellevue for over 25 years and has extensive knowledge of the area not only as a resident but as someone who has worked on every street in the city.





Section 5.20 of the BN (Neighborhood Business) zoning district allows for medical clinics limited to two practitioners in any one building. This regulation was discussed at the May 23, 2019 Planning Commission meeting as part of a rezoning request for Remedy Health. During that discussion, there was an overall consensus the language should be amended to allow for four medical practitioners in any one clinic. This was largely due to the fact dental clinics are allowed in the BN zoning district with an unlimited amount of practitioners.

As a result of that conversation, staff is recommending the following amendment to Section 5.20:

EE. Medical clinics established to provide service to the inhabitants of the local neighborhood and limited to two four full-time practitioners in any one building.

This amendment would not regulate part-time practitioners; focusing only on full-time practitioners.

ORDINANCE NO. 3952

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 5.20, ORDINANCE NO. 3619, BELLEVUE ZONING ORDINANCE, RELATING TO PERMITTED USES IN THE BN NEIGHBORHOOD BUSINESS DISTRICT; TO REPEAL SUCH SECTIONS AS HERETOFORE EXISTING; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE ORDINANCE; AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE PUBLICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE IN PAMPHLET FORM.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That Section 5.20 of Ordinance No. 3619 hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 5.20 BN Neighborhood Business District

5.20.01 Intent. This zone is designed to provide for limited commercial uses serving the common and frequent needs of residents of the immediate vicinity.

5.20.02 Permitted Uses:

- 1. Retail and service stores and offices of the following small store types (not to exceed 7,500 sq. ft. floor area), provided all activities and display goods are carried on within an enclosed building except that green plants and shrubs may be displayed in the open and further provided that all waste material be kept within a sight obscuring enclosure:
 - A. Accounting, billing and tax preparations services.
 - B. Animal hospital
 - C. Apparel store, tailor shops, dressmaker.
 - D. Art gallery.
 - E. Bakery, custom, selling all production at retail on the premises or as retail custom orders for delivery.
 - F. Bank, Savings and Loan Association.
 - G. Barber, beauty shops.
 - H. Book store.
 - I. Candy, ice cream store including manufacture, if all production is sold at retail on the premises or as retail custom orders for delivery.
 - J. Child Care Center.
 - K. Convenient Store without fuel sales.
 - L. Dancing studios and schools including group instruction, not including those classified under sexually oriented business.
 - M. Dental Clinics
 - N. Drug or drug-variety store.
 - O. Dry cleaning (self-service automatic) establishments of not more than 10 cleaning units.
 - P. Dry cleaning pick-up station with custom pressing and repair, but not including cleaning and laundering on the premises, unless self-service laundry or dry cleaning as permitted herein.
 - Q. Dry good store.
 - R. Florist shop
 - S. Frame shop.
 - T. Furniture (specialty) shops.
 - U. Garden supply, commercial greenhouses, nursery stock sales yards.
 - V. General office uses.
 - W. Gift and card shop.
 - X. Grocery, supermarket.
 - Y. Hardware and appliance store and small tool rental when incidental to a hardware or other business.
 - Z. Hobby and craft store.
 - AA. Interior design firms.
 - BB. Jewelry store.
 - CC. Laundry (self-service automatic) of not more than 30 washing units.
 - DD. Meat market, retail, but no killing, eviscerating, skinning, plucking or smoking of food products on the premises.
 - EE. Medical Clinics established to provide service to the inhabitants of the local neighborhood and limited to four full-time practitioners in any one building.
 - FF. Music store, music studio.
 - GG. News and tobacco store.
 - HH. Paint, wallpaper, drapery and floor covering store.
 - II. Photographer, artist, photo finishing, and camera store.
 - Real estate sales office.
 - KK. Restaurant (Limited).
 - LL. Shoe repair shop.

MM. Shoe store.

NN. Television, radio and small appliance repair.

OO. Toy and sporting goods store.

PP. Variety store.

- 2. Public utility main transmission lines including substations, distribution centers, regulator stations, pumping stations, treatment facilities, storage, equipment buildings, garages, towers, or similar public service uses.
- Railroad through and spur tracks, but no sidings or other terminal type facilities and no service, repair
 or administrative facilities.

5.20.03 Conditional Uses:

- Churches, synagogues, chapels, and similar places of religious worship and instruction when located in a business building or on the same lot as a business building.
- 2. Communication Towers meeting the requirements as set forth in Section 8.05.
- 3. Governmental services Administrative Facilities.

5.20.04 Permitted Accessory Uses:

- Accessory uses for commercial development shall include those normally appurtenant to such development, except as further specified herein.
- 2. Residential and small wind energy systems, subject to Section 8.09.

5.20.05 Space Limits:

- 1. Minimum lot area: 7,500 square feet.
- 2. Minimum width of lot: 50 feet.
- 3. Maximum height of building: 25 feet.
- 4. Minimum front yard: 25 feet.
- 5. Minimum rear yard: 20 feet.
- 6. Minimum side yard: 10 feet, when abutting a lot in use as a residence. None, when abutting business districts.
- 7. Minimum side yard on street side of corner: 25 feet. The 20 feet of a required corner side yard adjacent to the building may be used for the parking of automobiles.
- 8. Maximum gross floor area ratio: 0.7.
- Maximum ground coverage: 70 percent.

5.20.06 Miscellaneous Provisions:

- 1. Off-street parking and loading shall be provided for all uses established in this zone.
- All parking and storage of vehicles, boats, campers and trailers shall be in conformance with Sections 8.01-8.03.
- 3. All signage shall be in conformance with Article 7.
- 4. All buildings shall conform to building design regulations in Section 8.11.
- 5. All landscaping shall conform with Article 9.

Section 2. That Sections 5.20 and 5.21 of Ordinance No. 3619, Bellevue Zoning Ordinance, as heretofore existing are hereby repealed:

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as required by law.

I am requesting the City Council suspend the rules requiring three separate readings on Ordinance No. 3950 (Agenda item 12b) and take a vote on this item at the conclusion of the public hearing.

At its May meeting, the Planning Commission heard a request for a change of zone from BN to BG on property located at 1315-1321 Galvin Road South. The purpose of the request was to allow the applicant to operate a medical clinic with more than two practitioners (the limit in the BN zoning district). While the Commission was supportive of the applicant, it had various concerns about changing the zoning classification on this property. In order to support the applicant, the Commission recommended that the Planning Department bring forward a text amendment to allow more than two medical practitioners in the BN district; they felt this was appropriate as there is no limit on the number of dentists in the BN district. The text amendment to increase the limit to four full-time practitioners is the subject of Ordinance No. 3950.

I am making the request to waive the third reading because the applicant was delayed while the text amendment was prepared and presented to the Planning Commission for its recommendation. Neither the change of zone request nor the text amendment received any opposition at the Planning Commission public hearings.

Sec. 19-70. - Prohibited generally; declaration of nuisance.

Not withstanding sections 19-2 and 19-3, it shall be unlawful and a public nuisance for any person to make, continue or cause to be made or continued within the city's zoning jurisdiction, any loud, unnecessary or unusual noise, or any noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of others within the limits of the city's zoning jurisdiction.

(Ord. No. 3193, § 1, 2-25-2002; Ord. No. 3387, § 1(19-70), 10-24-2005)

Sec. 19-71. - Enumeration

The acts described in this article, among others, are declared to be loud, disturbing and unnecessary noises in violation of this Code, but such enumeration shall not be deemed to be exclusive.

(Ord. No. 3193, § 1, 2-25-2002; Ord. No. 3387, § 1(19-71), 10-24-2005)

Sec. 19-72. - Horns, signaling devices.

The following shall be deemed a violation of the provisions of this article:

- (1) The sounding of any horn or signaling device on any automobile, motorcycle, street car or other vehicle on any street or public place, except as a danger warning.
- (2) The creation by means of any such signaling device of any unreasonably loud or harsh sound and the sounding of any such device for any unnecessary and unreasonable period of time.
- (3) The use of any signaling device except one operated by hand or electricity.
- (4) The use of any horn, whistle or other device operated by engine exhaust.
- (5) The use of any such signaling device when traffic is for any reason held up.

(Ord. No. 3387, § 1(19-72), 10-24-2005)

Sec. 19-73. - Radios, phonographs, etc.

- (a) Prohibitions. The following shall be deemed a violation of the provisions of this article:
 - (1) The using, operating or permitting to be played, used or operated any radio receiving set, musical instrument, phonograph or other machine or device for the producing of sound in such manner as to disturb the peace, quiet and comfort of the neighboring inhabitants or at any time with louder volume than is necessary for convenient hearing for the person or persons who are in the room, vehicle or chamber in which such machine or device is operated and who are voluntarily listeners thereto.
 - (2) The operation of any such radio, musical instrument, phonograph, or other machine or

device between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. in such a manner as to be plainly audible at a distance of 50 feet from the building, structure or vehicle in which it is located shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of this article.

(b) Waiver.

- (1) Provided, however, that the city council hereby finds and declares that it is in the best interests of the general public and welfare that subsection (a) be waived from time to time upon proper consideration of the facts and circumstances surrounding certain events to be held at public-use facilities.
- (2) The city council may waive the above provisions so as to permit the use, operation, or playing of any such radio receiving set, musical instrument, phonograph, or other machine or device for the production of sound at any fully enclosed, public-use facility during the hour from 11:00 p.m. to 12:00 a.m. (midnight); upon the application of any eligible organization or individual.
- (3) At such time as any individual or organization makes application for the use of a city-owned facility, the application shall specify whether such waiver is requested. As to any other public use facility, the application for a waiver may be made to the city clerk. At the next occurring regularly scheduled city council meeting, the city council shall consider the application and the relevant surrounding facts and circumstances and shall determine whether or not it is in the general public interest to grant the said one-hour waiver.
- (4) The relevant surrounding facts and circumstances upon which such determination shall be based shall include (but not be limited to) the following items:
 - a. If an organization, the nature and purpose of the organization;
 - b. The purpose of the function for which the waiver is requested; and
 - c. The prior experience of the city in its contacts and dealings with the requesting individual or organization.

28-1322. Disturbing the peace; penalty.

- (1) Any person who shall intentionally disturb the peace and quiet of any person, family, or neighborhood commits the offense of disturbing the peace.
 - (2) Disturbing the peace is a Class III misdemeanor.

Annotations

The State cannot constitutionally criminalize speech under this section solely because it inflicts emotional injury, annoys, offends, or angers another person. But speech can be criminalized under this section if it tends to or is likely to provoke violent reaction. State v. Drahota, 280 Neb. 627, 788 N.W.2d 796 (2010).

Under subsection (1) of this section, the definition of breach of the peace is broad enough to include the offense of disturbing the peace; it signifies the offense of disturbing the public peace or tranquility enjoyed by citizens of a community. The term "breach of the peace" is generic and includes all violations of public peace, order, or decorum, or acts tending to the disturbance thereof. Provocative language consisting of profane, indecent, or abusive remarks directed to the person of the hearer may amount to a breach of the peace, and such language constitutes "fighting" words, which are not constitutionally protected forms of speech. State v. Broadstone, 233 Neb. 595, 447 N.W.2d 30 (1989).





Dear public works,

On August 14th 2018, my father died and as such I began to make arrangements to accommodate my mother.

We came to the conclusion based on our budget, that our best option was to build an addition.

I am requesting that the side walk clause for new construction for new construction be waived. For the following reasons:

- 1) Sidewalk would not tie into neighbor's sidewalk as neighbor's sidewalks do not exist.
- 2) Existing mature walnut and pear trees would have to be removed since the construction of the sidewalk would cut into and remove half of the root system and cause structural instability to the trees. If not removed the trees would inevitably fall into the house to the east.
- 3) A 43-foot-long retaining wall would have to be built to support the natural slope of the terrain.
- 4) Water main and gas main run underneath where the proposed sidewalk is to be installed.
- **5)** There is limited travel by walkers on this street.
- **6)** The walker would have to walk from the street, to the sidewalk and back to the street if the sidewalk were to be used.
- 7) The look of the home would be substantially changed and would not be appealing. In addition, it would be the only house in the neighborhood to have a sidewalk.



- 8) The cost of tree removal, dirt work and retaining wall would be \$12,000.00 plus;
- •Walnut tree removal \$3,300.00
- •Pear tree removal \$1,500.00
- •Sidewalk \$5,200.00
- •Retaining wall \$2,100.00

9) The property would not be physically improved.

The home is on a corner lot and the proposed sidewalk would wrap around the entire west and south sides of the house.

I appreciate your consideration of waiving the sidewalk clause.

Sidewalk Waiver Policy

When a Temporary Waiver of Sidewalk Construction is requested, the Public Works Director or his/her designee will make the determination and have this determination consistent with the following parameters:

- If the sidewalk in question is on an unimproved road or a rural section that does not have curb and gutter or storm sewer and has a drainage ditch a waiver is granted.
- If the sidewalk in question is on an urban street the waiver is denied regardless of the lack of adjacent sidewalks and if the terrain is such that no additional appurtenances are needed such as structural retaining walls or the relocation of utilities, etc.
- If the sidewalk in question is on an urban street the waiver can only be granted if the cost for prep work for the sidewalk far exceeds the value of the actual sidewalk construction.
- Depending on the amount of build-out a sidewalk district is created and, as its stated in
 the waiver, all in the district will be required to construct a walk even on a rural section
 which will then be improved with curb and gutter and storm sewer and will be assessed to
 the property owners based on property footage. These districts can only be approved by
 Council through an ordinance.

RESOLUTION NO. 2019 -21

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, NEBRASKA APPROVING AN AMENDMENT ADDING THE CITY OF BELLEVUE TO THE INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF LA VISTA, THE CITY OF PAPILLION, AND SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA, FOR PARTICIPATION ON THE SARPY COUNTY SPECIAL WEAPONS AND TACTICS TEAM AND CRISIS NEGOTIATION UNIT.

WHEREAS, it has long been recognized that mutual aid between law enforcement agencies sharing similar demands is highly desirable; and

WHEREAS, the responses to critical incidents require the specialized attention of a team trained to be effective in highly volatile situations; and

WHEREAS, the police departments also recognize that delivery of these services can be done most cost-effectively and with enhanced flexibility when forces are combined and said agreement is in the best interest of the citizens of Bellevue;

WHEREAS, Sarpy County and the cities of Papillion and La Vista ("Current Participants") entered an Interlocal Agreement for participation on the Sarpy County Special Weapons and Tactics Team and Crisis Negotiation Unit dated on or about April 2, 2019, attached hereto as Exhibit "A" ("Interlocal Cooperation Agreement");

WHEREAS, the City of Bellevue ("Bellevue") and Current Participants desire to execute a First Amendment to Interlocal Agreement, attached as Exhibit B, for Bellevue to become a party to the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement effective August 1, 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Bellevue, Nebraska, hereby authorize the Mayor to execute the First Amendment to Interlocal Agreement presented with this resolution to amend and add Bellevue as a party to the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the City of Papillion, the City of La Vista and Sarpy County, Nebraska, for participation on the Sarpy County Special Weapons and Tactics Team and Crisis Negotiation Unit and allow for any non-substantive changes to Exhibit "A" as deemed necessary by the City Administrator.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

This First Amendment is made and entered into by and between Sarpy County, Nebraska (hereinafter "County"), the City of Bellevue, located in Sarpy County, Nebraska (hereinafter "Bellevue"), the City of Papillion, located in Sarpy County, Nebraska (hereinafter "Papillion"), and the City of La Vista, located in Sarpy County, Nebraska (hereinafter "La Vista") and referred to collectively as the Parties, pursuant to the authority granted to the parties under Nebraska Revised Statute 13-801, *et seq*.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Nebraska Revised Statute 13-801 *et seq*, the County, La Vista, and Papillion entered into an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for Sarpy County Special Weapons and Tactics Team and Crisis Negotiation Unit (hereinafter "April 2, 2019 Interlocal Agreement") on or about April 2, 2019.

WHEREAS, the County, La Vista, and Papillion desire to amend the April 2, 2019 Interlocal Agreement by this First Amendment to add Bellevue as a party to the April 2, 2019 Interlocal Agreement, and by executing this First Amendment, Bellevue desires to become a party to the April 2, 2019 Interlocal Agreement.

It is mutually agreed between the parties that the following terms and conditions of the April 2, 2019 Interlocal Agreement are hereby amended to read as follows:

IV. Executive Board.

- A. The Executive Board ("Board") consists of the Sarpy County Sheriff, La Vista Chief of Police, Papillion Chief of Police, and **Bellevue Chief of Police**, (or their designees).
- **IX.** Terms of Agreement. This Agreement shall be effective for an initial term of three years beginning on April 1, 2019, and ending March 31, 2022; provided, however, Bellevue's participation in the Agreement shall commence beginning August 1, 2019. At the end of the initial term, this Agreement shall automatically renew for additional two-year terms ("Renewal Term"), unless otherwise terminated at any time by mutual written agreement of all the Parties.
- **XXIV.** Notice and Authorized Representatives. Notice, required under this Agreement, shall be delivered in writing and shall be effective upon receipt by the authorized representative. Delivery shall be made by certified mail, return receipt requested. For purposes of Notice, following individuals are the authorized representatives of the Parties:

Bellevue, by executing this First Amendment, shall become a party to, participate in, and be bound by, the April 2, 2019 Interlocal Agreement, as amended by this First Amendment.

Except as modified by this First Amendment, all other terms and conditions of the April 2, 2019 Interlocal Agreement shall remain in full force and effect and be binding on all Parties.

INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT FOR SARPY COUNTY SPECIAL WEAPONS AND TACTICS TEAM AND CRISIS NEGOTIATION UNIT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into as of this 2nd day of April , 2019, by and between the undersigned parties (hereafter individually "Party" and collectively "Parties").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Parties and their representative law enforcement agencies:

- 1. Wish to provide for law enforcement personnel backup and other such assistance as any of the parties may require in time of emergency or other time of need;
- 2. Have not only common goals, staffing needs, training needs and other needs in common in the area of law enforcement, but also overlapping demands for law enforcement responses, often to high-risk/critical incidents which require the specialized attention of a team trained specifically to be effective in highly volatile situations;
- 3. Expressed a desire to respond more swiftly to critical law enforcement incidents, with enhanced local control and a more consistent response, and with a combined larger group of officers than any one of the agencies could provide alone;
- 4. Recognize that law enforcement incidents of a serious criminal nature require the need for a specially trained and equipped team and that responses to these incidents are better served and more economical when the resources are combined to form a multi-jurisdictional special weapons and tactics/crisis negotiation team; and
- 5. Desire to form the Sarpy County Special Weapons and Tactics ("SWAT") Team and Crisis Negotiation Unit ("CNU") (collectively, the "SWAT and CNU Team" or "Team"), which Team shall work in conjunction with and provide support to the Sarpy County Tactical Medic (STACMED) TEAM ("STACMED Team").

WHEREAS, by separate Resolution, the Parties have created the Sarpy County STACMED Team pursuant to an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement, and the Parties desire that hereinafter the Sarpy County STACMED Team and the SWAT and CNU Team shall work together in providing law enforcement and tactical emergency medical services to the Agencies, as set forth in this Agreement and the Sarpy County STACMED Interlocal Cooperation Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- I. <u>Purpose.</u> The Parties shall hereby form the Sarpy County SWAT Team and CNU (collectively "Team"). The purpose of this Agreement is to define the roles and responsibilities of the Parties when providing mutual aid and assistance through the activation of the Team in responding to critical law enforcement incidents.
- II. <u>Definitions</u>: As used herein the following terms shall have the following meanings:

- A. "Agency(ies)" or "Cooperating Agency(ies)" shall mean the police/sheriff department(s) of the Parties which are signatories hereto.
- B. "Executive Board ("Board")" shall mean the board comprised of the Agency heads or their designated representatives, who shall be responsible for administering this cooperative undertaking as provided in Paragraph IV.
- C. "Team" shall mean all duly sworn paid law enforcement officers in the employment of any Agency that have been assigned by their employing Agency head to participate in the SWAT and/or CNU in accordance with the policies and procedures as adopted by the Board and Agencies.

III. Authority:

- A. The authority for this Agreement is that authority granted by law, including without limitation the general powers of each Party and Agency, as well as Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 13-801 to 13-827 (the "Nebraska Interlocal Cooperation Act"), Neb. Rev. Stat. § 29-215, and Neb. Rev. Stat. § 81-1401 et seq.
- B. This Agreement is not intended nor shall it be construed to in any way limit the power and authority granted by Neb. Rev. Stat. § 29-215. To that end, each Agency may individually impose on its own officers such conditions or limitations regarding their exercise of statutory law enforcement powers as such Agency may choose and so long as not inconsistent with the terms hereof.

IV. Executive Board.

- A. The Executive Board ("Board") consists of the Sarpy County Sheriff, La Vista Chief of Police, and Papillion Chief of Police, (or their designees).
- B. The Board is responsible for:
 - 1. Meeting at least twice per year;
 - 2. Assigning leadership positions to Team members;
 - 3. Approving expenditures from the Team budget;
 - 4. Selecting Team members and any leadership positions for the Team;
 - 5. Establishing policies and procedures for the operation of the Board, which shall include, but are not limited to:
 - a. Chain of command and control over critical incident responses;
 - b. Process for activation of the Team in response to critical incidents;
 - c. Process for search warrants and investigations;
 - d. Expectations for a Team member's conduct in the operation of law enforcement vehicles, use of lethal force, and use of deadly force;
 - e. Qualifications for Team members, including but not limited to, physical agility and tactical firearms qualifications; and
 - f. Any other topics deemed appropriate by the Board.
 - 6. Performing any other functions necessary for the executive oversight, administration, and supervision of the Team.
- C. Each member of the Board has an equal vote in all decisions of the Board.
- D. Unless otherwise specified herein, decisions of the Board shall be made by majority vote.

V. Cost Sharing/Budget and Finance:

- A. Sarpy County shall be responsible for general financial administration of the Team, and thus will coordinate budgetary expenditure matters with all Agencies.
- B. Sarpy County will provide each Agency with a semiannual report on all receipts and disbursements.
- C. All costs associated with the initial purchase, repair, or replacement of a Team member's equipment and clothing shall be the responsibility of the Team member's Agency. This equipment and clothing shall remain the property of the Team member's Agency.
- D. Cost of training for individual Team members will be the responsibility of the Team member's Agency.
- E. Team members are considered employed by his or her own Agency and shall be considered and held as serving in the regular line-of-duty of the Agency that employs the Team member. Thus, personnel costs and related benefits including health insurance, retirement, etc., shall be the responsibility of the employing Agency.
- F. Each Agency shall contribute funding for making combined purchases necessary for operations of the Team. The amount of annual funding to be contributed by each Agency shall be determined by the unanimous vote of the Board as part of the budget process as outlined in the policies and procedures adopted by the Board and Agencies.
- G. Any remaining funds in the Team budget at the end of the fiscal year will be held in the account for future purchases.
- H. By March 1 of each year, the Team Commander will submit a proposed budget request to the Board. Said requests shall itemize requested purchases for the following budget cycle. The process for approval or denial of the request shall be identified in the policies and procedures adopted by the Board and Agencies.
- I. If an emergency expense arises outside of the customary budgetary process, the Board may approve said expense.

VI. SWAT and CNU Team Operations:

- A. Requests for Activation. Requests for activation of the SWAT and/or CNU Team may be made by the Police Chief, Sheriff, or designated representative thereof of the Agency requesting assistance. In situations posing an immediate threat to the life and safety of an officer or other individual, any officer may make the request.
- B. <u>Authority to Arrest and Detain</u>: Subject to the limitations herein, a Team member responding to an incident outside of his or her Agency's jurisdiction shall have full law enforcement authority, including the authority to arrest and detain, in the following circumstances:
 - 1. The commission of a felony witnessed by the Team member; or
 - 2. The Team member is a witness to a criminal act or threatened criminal act, or a traffic infraction, whether or not constituting felonious conduct, where nonarrest poses immediate danger or threat to life or safety to the Team member or any other person or persons:
 - a. While engaged in or providing services under this Agreement.
 - b. While cooperating in investigative activity or other cooperative law enforcement activity authorized by this Agreement.
- C. <u>Internal Affairs Investigations/Disciplinary Actions</u>. Internal Affairs Investigations and disciplinary action arising out of a Team member's conduct, omissions, actions,

- etc. while serving on the Team shall be handled by Team member's Agency. Notification or initiation of an investigation will follow the employing Agency's policies.
- D. <u>Declining/Delaying/Terminating Response</u>. The Agencies acknowledge that the purpose of this Agreement is to provide mutual aid and assistance in response to critical law enforcement incidents. However, a Police Chief, Sheriff, or designated representative thereof, may decline to respond, may be delayed in responding, or may terminate its response, to an Agency's request for mutual aid and assistance. Notification of said declination, delay, or termination must be made pursuant to the policies and procedures adopted by the Board and Agencies.
- VII. <u>Policies and Procedures.</u> The Board is responsible for establishing policies and procedures for the operation of the Team (see Section IV(B)(5)). These policies and procedures may be amended from time to time by approval of the Board. Each Agency shall adopt identical policies and procedures for its Team members.
- VIII. <u>Dispute Resolution Process.</u> In the event of a dispute arising under this Agreement, the matter shall be referred to the Board for resolution. Written notice of the dispute shall be provided to each Board member. The Agencies must meet and attempt to resolve the dispute in a satisfactory manner. This meeting must take place within ten (10) business days after all Board members have been served notice of the dispute. The Board shall issue a written decision within thirty (30) days after the meeting. The content of the written decision shall approved by a majority of the Board. During the pendency of this process, the Parties and Agencies shall act in good faith to perform their respective duties described herein. No Party or Agency shall institute a formal legal proceeding, file a claim, provide notice of withdraw, etc., until after the Board has issued a written decision.
 - IX. <u>Terms of Agreement</u>. This Agreement shall be effective for a term of three years beginning on April 1, 2019, and ending March 31, 2022. At the end of the initial three-year term, this Agreement shall automatically renew for additional two-year terms ("Renewal Term"), unless otherwise terminated at any time by mutual written agreement of all of the Parties.

X. Withdrawal:

A. Process.

- 1. During the initial three-year term, a Party may withdraw from the Agreement if the withdrawal and timeline for said withdrawal is agreed to in writing by a majority of the Parties. If written consent is not provided by a majority of the Parties, the withdrawing Party must refer the matter of withdrawal to the Board pursuant to the Dispute Resolution Process described in Section VIII. In the event that the matter is not resolved pursuant to Section VIII, the withdrawing Party shall issue a written "Notice of Withdrawal" to the non-withdrawing Parties no later than ten (10) days after the written decision of the Board. The Notice must be served in writing to each Board Member before pursuing legal remedies available to each Party.
- 2. By March 1st of a Renewal Term, a Party may withdraw from the Agreement by providing written notice of its intent to withdraw to the other Parties. The Notice

- must include the effective date of termination, which shall be no later than March 31st of the Renewal Term.
- B. <u>Property</u>. If a Party withdraws from this Agreement, the Party shall retain title to all property, resources, and equipment it had prior to, or obtained while, a Party to this Agreement. Within thirty (30) days after withdrawal, the withdrawing Party shall remove and retake possession of such property. Any property, resources, or equipment purchased or donated on behalf of the Team shall be disposed of upon withdrawal in accordance with the policies and procedures adopted by the agencies.
- C. <u>Liability</u>. If a Party withdraws from this Agreement, it shall not be relieved of liability incurred by the Board prior to such withdrawal, including, but not limited to, such Party's responsibilities for funding the then current annual Team budget. In addition, in the event that the withdrawing Party has made a financial commitment to fund any specific future expense(s) of the Board which would impact future Team budgets as a result of such withdrawal, the withdrawing Party may remain financially responsible for its committed share of such specific future expense(s), as determined by the Board.
- XI. <u>Liability Insurance</u>: The Parties agree to be self-insured or to carry liability insurance written on an "occurrence" basis (as distinguished from "claims made" basis) covering all law enforcement personnel assigned by each Party and insuring against liability for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage, in an amount not less than the maximum liability of such Party under applicable law. No Party represents in any way that the insurance specified herein, whether in scope of coverage or limits, is adequate or sufficient to protect any other Party or its interests. Each Party is solely responsible to determine its need for and to procure additional coverage which may be needed in connection with this Agreement. The procuring of insurance as required by this Agreement shall not be construed to limit any Party's liability hereunder or to fulfill the indemnification provisions of this Agreement.
- XII. Mutual Non-Discrimination Clause. In accordance with Neb. Rev. Stat. § 48-1122, each Party agrees that neither it nor any of its subcontractors or agents shall discriminate against any employee, or applicant for employment to be employed in the performance of this Agreement, with respect to hire, tenure, terms, conditions, or privileges of employment, because of age, color, disability, genetic information, marital status, military status, national origin, pregnancy, race religion, sex, or any other prohibited basis of discrimination.
- XIII. <u>Incorporation of Recitals</u>. The recitals set forth above are, by this reference, hereby incorporated into and deemed part of this Agreement.
- XIV. <u>Entire Agreement.</u> This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the Parties. No representations were made or relied upon by any Party other than those that are expressly set forth herein. The provisions of this Agreement may not be explained, supplemented, or qualified through evidence of trade usage or prior course of dealings. No agent, employee or other representative of any Party is empowered to alter any of the terms hereof except as provided herein.
- XV. <u>Amendments/Modification</u>. This Agreement may be modified for any reason, including but not limited to adding another Party. Said modification shall be made by written amendment,

approved and executed by the governing bodies of each Party. No alteration or variation of the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be valid unless made pursuant to an amendment. Every amendment shall specify the date on which its provisions shall be effective.

- XVI. Assignment. None of the Parties may assign its rights under this Agreement.
- XVII. <u>Successors and Assigns Bound by Covenants.</u> All covenants, stipulations, and agreements herein shall inure to the benefit of the Parties and extend to and bind the legal representatives, successors, and assigns of the Parties.
- XVIII. Waiver. The failure of a Party to insist on strict performance of any covenants or conditions, or to exercise any option herein conferred on any one or more instances, shall not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment of any such covenant, condition, right, or option, but the same shall remain in full force and effect. For a waiver of a right or power to be effective, it must be in writing signed by the waiving Party. An effective waiver of a right or power shall not be construed as either a future or continuing waiver of that same right or power, or the waiver of any other right or power. In addition, any act by a Party which it is not obligated to do hereunder shall not be deemed to impose any obligation upon that Party to do any similar act in the future or in any way change or alter any of the provisions of this Agreement.
 - XIX. <u>Severability.</u> If any provision of this Agreement is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or otherwise unenforceable, that provision will be severed and the remainder of this Agreement will remain in full force and effect.
 - XX. <u>Indemnification/Liability.</u> To the extent permitted by law, each Party (as "indemnitor") agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless each of the other Parties (as "indemnitee(s)") from and against any and all claims, losses, liability, costs, or expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees (hereinafter collectively referred to as "claims") arising out of bodily injury, including death, or property damage, but only to the extent that such claims which result in vicarious/derivative liability to the indemnitee(s), are caused by the act, omission, negligence, misconduct, or other fault of the indemnitor, its officers, officials, agents, employees, or volunteers; provided, however, that a Party shall have no liability whatsoever for declining to respond, delaying to respond, or terminating its response to another Party's request for mutual aid and assistance. These indemnification provisions are not intended to waive a Party's sovereign immunity. A Party's liability is governed by and limited to the extent provided by the Nebraska Political Subdivisions Tort Claims Act or other applicable provisions of law.
 - XXI. <u>Notification of Claims and Lawsuits</u>. In the event that a claim or lawsuit is brought against a Party for any matters related to this Agreement, it shall be the duty of that Party to notify the other Parties of said claim or lawsuit.
- XXII. <u>Sovereign Immunity</u>. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as an express or implied wavier of the sovereign immunity of any Party in any forum or jurisdiction.

- XXIII. No Third Party Rights. This Agreement is not intended to, nor shall it provide third parties, excluding any assignment as provided herein, with any remedy, claim, liability, reimbursement, cause of action or other right or privilege; except that this Agreement's indemnification provision shall also inure to the benefit of a Party's employees, officers, agents and servants.
- XXIV. <u>Notice and Authorized Representatives.</u> Notice, required under this Agreement, shall be delivered in writing and shall be effective upon receipt by the authorized representative. Delivery shall be made by certified mail, return receipt requested. For purposes of Notice, following individuals are the authorized representatives of the Parties:

- XXV. <u>Drug Free Policy.</u> Parties assure each other that each has established and maintains a drug free workplace policy.
- XXVI. New Employee Work Eligibility Status (Neb. Rev. Stat. § 4-114). Each Party is required and hereby agrees to use a federal immigration verification system to determine the work eligibility status of new employees physically performing services within Nebraska. - XXVII. <u>Public Benefits.</u> With regard to Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 4-108 to 4-113, no Party is an individual or sole proprietorship. Therefore, no Party is subject to the public benefits attestation and related requirements of Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 4-108 to 4-113.

- XXVIII. <u>Joint Work Product.</u> This Agreement is the joint work product of the Parties; accordingly, in the event of any ambiguity, no presumption shall be imposed against or in favor of any Party by reason of document preparation.
 - XXIX. <u>Authority.</u> Each of the persons signing below warrant and represent that they have the authority to enter into this Agreement and to bind the Parties hereto.
 - XXX. No Separate Legal Entity. This Agreement does not create a separate legal entity under the Interlocal Cooperation Act. For purposes of that Act, this Agreement shall be administered jointly by the Parties. In the event of a conflict, the majority decision of the Cooperating Agencies shall govern. This Agreement does not contemplate acquiring, holding or disposing of joint property nor does it contemplate the levying or collecting of any tax.
 - XXXI. <u>Multiple Counterparts:</u> This Agreement, involving numerous parties, may be executed in multiple counterparts each of which may bear the signatures of less than all of the parties hereto, and it shall be in full force and effect even if so executed.
- XXXII. <u>Headings.</u> The section headings appearing in this Agreement are inserted only as a matter of convenience, and in no way define or limit the scope of any section.

It has long been recognized that mutual aid between law enforcement agencies sharing similar demands is highly desirable. The law enforcement agencies of Sarpy County possess a number of collaborations that creates mutually beneficial advantages, such as county wide radio system, Law Records Management Systems, a single jail facility, DUI Task Force, Crash Team, Sarpy Douglas Law Enforcement Agency, etc.

The response to critical incidents require the specialized attention of a team trained to be effective in highly volatile situations. La Vista has been a partner with Bellevue and Papillion on such a specialized team since 1994. In the early 2000's, Ralston and Plattsmouth, located in different counties than Bellevue, La Vista and Papillion, were added to the team. For the past 12 years under the terms of an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement, we've operated a five city team. During that time, the Sarpy County Sheriff operated a separate team, serving the areas outside Bellevue, La Vista and Papillion.

There was never any specific cooperative SWAT efforts between the South Metro and Sarpy teams. I think much of the distance was created by personalities within each agency that went back years. In recent years, however, the names have changed as well as the need for more cooperative efforts (as described above). I believe the timing is right for what we have proposed with a Sarpy County tactical team. Instead of "Why would you merge with the Sheriff", the question citizens should have is "Why haven't you combined teams?" With all the other successful collaborations mentioned above, it only makes sense to consider a merger of tactical teams.

We recognize that delivery of these services can be done most cost-effectively and with enhanced flexibility when forces are combined. A unified SWAT element in Sarpy County makes complete sense and will provide greater overall efficiency of fiscal resources, operational resources, equipment and personnel. It would not only increase our ability to protect life, preserve peace, but also would increase our response and delivery of service to our citizens. Our police officers and deputy sheriffs have great relationships on the street, and provide mutual aid every day. Our intent is to bring the police resources in Sarpy County together and create the best trained and effective tactical team in the area. Personalities can make or break teams, and public safety in Sarpy County is bigger and more important than individuals.

Dear Chief Elbert,

In 1994, the Bellevue Police Department, LaVista Police Department and Papillion Police Department collaborated to form the South Metro Special Weapons and Tactics Team (SWAT) Team. This collaboration expanded in the early 2000s to include the Plattsmouth Police Department (Cass County) and Ralston Police Department (Douglas County). To date, the Bellevue Police Department provided the majority of the leadership, personnel and other resources towards the operation of the South Metro SWAT Team. As a result, the Papillion Police Department is grateful and indebted to the Bellevue Police Department.

According to the National Tactical Officers Association (NTOA), there are essentially two levels of SWAT teams: Tier 1 and Tier 2. A Tier 1 SWAT team consists of 26 members composed of a team commander, 3 team leaders, 4 snipers and 18 operators. A Tier 1 SWAT team is capable of handling Hostage Rescue Operations, Barricaded Subject Operations, Sniper Operations, High Risk Warrant Service, High Risk Apprehensions, High Risk Security Operations, Terrorism Response Operations, Tactical Operations with SWAT and Bomb Squad. There are additional requirements for monthly training and equipment lists for general/specialized skills, such as explosive breaching. A Tier 2 SWAT team consists of 19 members composed of a team commander, 2 team leaders, 4 snipers and 12 operators. A Tier 2 tactical team can handle all of the above except planned deliberate hostage rescues. The NTOA does recognize two lesser teams, a Tactical Response Team and Perimeter Control/Containment Team. These lower grade teams are very limited in their number of personnel and mission capabilities. SWAT Teams operating above and outside these standards are at an increased risk of catastrophic events and/or civil liability.

During the last three years, we have discussed some areas where the South Metro SWAT Team could be more effective in achieving its mission. The South Metro SWAT Team is a Tier 2 tactical team under the current NTOA standards. However, there are a number of things

threatening to diminish its mission capabilities and prevent its success, such as the current vacancies, anticipated future vacancies, succession planning, monthly/annual/specialized training, technology and equipment.

Nevertheless, there has been a great deal of ongoing discussion about overcoming our struggles, in hopes of building a tier 1 tactical team in the future. As a result, the law enforcement agencies of Sarpy County must collaborate, in order to meet this shared goal for our communities. As a member of the Patrol and Tactical Operations Committee for the International Association of Chiefs of Police since 2010, I interact on a regular basis with law enforcement agencies across the country and the NTOA. A number of law enforcement agencies have turned to participate in larger multijurisdictional SWAT teams for many of the same reasons that we face today. Thus, we can draw upon the best models of merging SWAT teams and pooling our resources, such as the Pima Regional SWAT Team in Pima County (Tucson), Arizona.

For these reasons, Sheriff Jeff Davis, Chief Deputy Greg London, Chief Bob Lausten, you and I met on several occasions to discuss a possible merger of our SWAT Teams. We believe merging the South Metro SWAT Team and Crisis Negotiations Unit (CNU) with the Sarpy County Sheriffs' Office (SCSO) SWAT Team is the next step in providing greater overall efficiency of fiscal resources, operational resources, equipment, technology and personnel. This improved advisory board will oversee a new SWAT team which would consist of 39 total personnel from the Bellevue Police Department, LaVista Police Department, Sarpy County Sheriffs' Office and Papillion Police Department. The new team will be composed of a team commander, 5 team leaders, 28 operators, 1 sniper team leader and 5 snipers. The new Crisis Negotiations Team is composed of a team commander, 2 team leaders, and 16 negotiators. Our hope is to blend the more skilled and experienced officers with those with lesser experience. This new team will be better suited to support its specialized skill sets and endure operations longer in duration. Moreover, the new team will be better poised to acquire the training, equipment and other resources necessary to increase its mission capabilities to become a Tier 1 tactical team in the future.

This new SWAT will also possess a tactical medic element of specially trained officers deployed on SWAT operations for emergency casualty care on-scene within the Hot Zone. The Sarpy Tactical Medic (StacMed) Program is composed of officers and paramedics specially trained in emergency casualty care from Papillion Fire Department, Sarpy County Sheriffs' Office, LaVista Police Department and Papillion Police Department. This addresses a long time need and reduces the costs of committing on-duty ambulance to standby status during SWAT operations.

As you know, the law enforcement agencies of Sarpy County already possess a number of collaborations that creates mutually beneficial advantages, such as county wide radio system, LRMS, single jail facility, DWI Task Force, Crash Team, Sarpy Douglas Law Enforcement Academy, etc. Finally, the creation of a single multijurisdictional SWAT Team fulfills our greatest commitment to providing excellence in our law enforcement services towards

protecting life, preserving peace, reducing crime and enhancing the quality of life for the citizens of Sarpy County. Our law enforcement agencies are stronger together!

I greatly appreciate your patience and support in this matter.

Section 28-27, Bellevue City Code, requires property owners to maintain, in good and proper repair, the sidewalks abutting or adjacent to their property. The sidewalk abutting 13204 South 35th Street, Bellevue, Nebraska has been inspected and found to be unsafe for pedestrian travel. This letter is your official notice, as owner of record, to replace the broken, defective, or missing sidewalk returning it to a condition for safe travel for pedestrians.

If after thirty days from receipt of this notice the repair work has not been initiated or completed, the work may be completed by the city of Bellevue and the expense levied as a special assessment or lien against your property.

Should the repair work abut a street corner, the city of Bellevue Street Department will grind and remove the curb at no expense to the property owner. Their phone number is (402) 293-3126. You will need to call the Street Department at least 48 hours prior to needing the curb ground. On all new and replacement sidewalks that abut a curb, this grinding is a requirement of the American With Disabilities Act.

- Twenty-two youths participated in the American Red Cross Babysitting Certification Course held Saturday, June 29, as part of the Young Adult 2019 Summer Library Program (SLP). This was the first of two sessions with the second scheduled for July 20. The American Red Cross gives the library a discounted rate for the courses (\$76.50 versus the usual \$89), which is then made available to those participating in the library-sponsored course. The workshops are open to youths 11-18.
- The maker program to create Galaxy Tees/Bags on Thursday, June 27, drew 28 participants in this 2019 Young Adult SLP event. Participants had a chance to make either unique shirts or bags, creating a layered galaxy from paint, sponge brushes and more. Those taking part were asked to bring their own black or dark blue cotton short or a cotton/canvas tote bag. Paint and other supplies were provided.
- City Administrator Jim Ristow and Library Director Julie Dinville met with representatives of the Leo A. Daly architectural firm to talk about possible plans to explore a renovation/addition project to the current site of the library. The Leo A. Daly representatives indicated that they would be able to provide conceptual drawings in this fiscal year. They reviewed current space allocations at the library and talked about some priorities if a project were to go forward.

- Children participating in the 2019 SLP had three opportunities for maker activities during the week, starting with making "Alien Eggs Slime" on June 26. Then on Thursday, June 27, they created solar system mobiles, and on Friday, June 28, they made constellation jars that could be lit up to show the night sky.

- The Bellevue Public Library will be hosting Omaha musician Joey Gulizia in a free concert on Tuesday, July 16, starting at 6:30 p.m. The concert is sponsored by the Nebraska Arts Council and the Nebraska Library Commission in support of communities which have been impacted by flooding this year.
- In late July and in early August, the library will be hosting a series of financial literacy workshops put together by Sequent. The seminars include "Medicare 101" on July 25; "Social Security Strategies" on July 30; "Estate Planning" on Aug. 1; and "Tax-Efficient Retirement" on Aug. 6. All of the sessions are free to the public.
- The summer Food Drive for the Bellevue Food Pantry continues through July 21 as part of the Young Adult 2019 SLP. Last week volunteers from the Food Pantry picked up 17 boxes of nonperishable food items and hygiene products donated by the community and library staff.
