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McCook School Board Report
March 11, 2019
Special Education Dept., John Hanson, Director

- 1) Doing a lot of teacher evaluations this time of year...not anticipating any SPED teachers leaving or retiring this year.
- 2) Went to Fort Hays State Univ. Speech/Language Pathologist Career Fair on Friday, March 8th for the ESU and also to put McCook's name out there...SLPs are very hard to find.
- 3) Going to UNK and UNL this Monday and Tuesday even though we're not looking for any sped staff at this particular time...it's good to keep McCook's name out there for prospective employees.
- 4) Building to building sped transition meetings start at the end of the month...this is where the two staffs get together and discuss our neediest students strengths, areas of concern and constructive advice on how to help them have as smooth a transition as possible.
- 5) We had another student with autism move into the district from Virginia this week. He will be served in our Developmental Learning Center most of the day with some access to specials (art, music, PE) and lunch/recess with his non-disabled peers.
- 6) School staff are occasionally being subpoenaed to testify in court regarding needy students...just seeking input because there are many issues in the homes...school staff is grateful for the opportunity to provide appropriate input.
- 7) I am providing Crisis Prevention Intervention (CPI) training in Trenton on Thursday, March 21st. This is a behavior de-escalation training that helps staff know how to react in certain difficult situations. We only restrain or seclude students that are a threat to themselves or others. Our staff does a great job with this, and our first priority is student and staff safety.
- 8) Megan Giorgione, Freshmen Class Para and I took 13 McCook High School students to ESU 15 in Trenton last week to attend the "Transition to Work" event where they learned what it takes to get a good job/career. The students represented themselves and McCook High School very well, and they learned some good tips that many of them said they will use in the future.

- e. All grades have completed their TDA writing assessment.

- b. Field Trips are being prepared and planned for a number of our grades.
- c. We have received information regarding the Reading Improvement Act and are working very hard to put into place our plan on how to address the requirement.


