1. Call to Order and Roll Call – Mr. Bredvick, President of the Board of Education, called the Regular Board Meeting to order at 6:31 PM. Members present: Dennis Berry, Tom Bredvick, Loretta Hauxwell, Mike Langan and Teresa Thomas, Absent Brad Hays. At the beginning of the meeting the chairperson announced and informed the public that a current copy of the Open Meetings Act was posted on the west wall of the meeting room.

4. Reports from Staff Members and Committees
Negotiation Committee

The first negotiations meeting with teacher representatives was on October 31.

Established next meeting date for Nov 19. Health insurance increased 6.71%. This will

affect total compensation for the negotiations process. The committee also discussed the array, which are similar schools, required by state to use for comparing benefits and salaries. State statute requires district's to be within 2% either side of the midpoint of the array. All public schools in the state are required to follow the same process.

Facilities Committee

The Facilities Committee met on November 5 with representatives from Trane, along with district maintenance staff. The group discussed upgrades to the lighting in the McCook Elem. Central Elem and the Junior High. They also discussed upgrades in the HVAC systems for the district. The process would use a low interest energy loan from the Nebraska Energy Office and work with a local bank. Trane was selected following a RFQ process to be the Energy Service Company (ESCO). More information will be gathered and made available to the board members. A meeting has been scheduled for November 25 at 1:00 to review and vote to approve the next steps.

The committee also reviewed and discussed: fundraising in the district, playground space and how those areas are used, and support from the community for the school district.

5. Board and Administrative Comments

Grant reminded the board of State Education Conference in Omaha next week. Each board member received a small packet of information. Mr. Norgaard also discussed the new score boards for the high school gym and the football field. The score board will be purchased from Daktronics and will be paid for by advertising dollars from local community businesses. The eight anchor sponsors have been acquired and the school is still looking for six additional founding sponsors. The district's hope is for an install of the new board in the gym around January 1, 2020. The football field will be installed later in the spring or summer and be ready for next football season.

Mr. Brazell informed the board of the move to a US Bank fleet card program. This provides the district with much more control over the district's credit cards.

Mr. Brazell reported on the audit conducted by KSO Auditors. The staff at McCook Public Schools do an outstanding job of properly managing district funds. All in all, the audit was very positive for the district. Two letters were provided by the Auditors. One outlined their scope of work and a second noted a deficiency over internal control. This deficiency is noted in most school districts across the state due to the number of staff in the business office. Items reviewed included: Financial highlights, and analysis of the district, debt administration, statements of receipts and disbursements, retirement plan, long term debt, TIF, fund balances, Federal single audit, and the schedule of findings.

6. New Business

Discussion over necessary energy upgrades and qualifying low interest Nebraska Energy Office Loan. This item was discussed during the facility committee report.

7. Positive Comments

TJ Renner – Highlighted the unified bowling team and the amount of support from the students toward this extracurricular activity.

John Brazell thanked the staff for assisting in all of the events held during the school year. It takes a lot of man power and support to successfully run the events. He also discussed a Military leave policy as a possibility for board approval at a later board meeting.

Loretta Hauxwell – Congratulated the choir and their fine performances. The students do a great job of representing the school and community.

Brad Hays – Absent

Mike Langan – Also mentioned the unified bowling team. His son was one of the participants and very much enjoyed the experiences. This a great program for students and staff.

Dennis Berry – Mentioned the Veterans Day program and offered his thanks to all Veterans.

Teresa Thomas – Discussed the Future Scientist of America Club being sponsored by Ms. Meyesenburg. Many students are getting involved and they have submitted bylaws and operating guidelines.

Grant Norgaard – Also recognized the Veterans, but payed special tribute to the students of MPS and their respect for the WWII veteran, Keith Arterburn, that presented at the program. He also mentioned the wellness committee and their walking challenge for November and December.

Tom Bredvick – Commented on the great support for our schools by the community. As evident in the support for the score board and their advertising campaign. Community members and businesses in the district, ask what can they do to support the school?

The next regular meeting of the MPS Board of Education will be on December 9, 2019 at 6:30 pm.

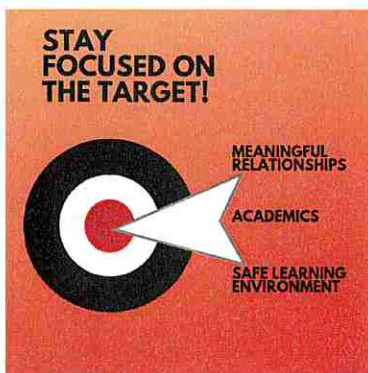

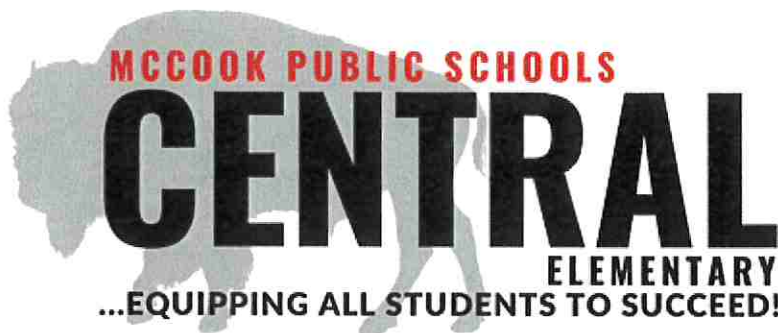
