Tom Bredvick, President, called the regular board meeting of McCook Public Schools to order at 6:30 p.m. Members answering present to roll call given by Loretta Hauxwell, Board Secretary, were Dennis Berry, Tom Bredvick, Brad Hays, Mike Langan, Teresa Thomas, Loretta Hauxwell, and student member, TJ Renner. The public was informed of the Open Meeting Law posted by the door by Mr. Bredvick. MHS Student, Baylor Winters, led those in attendance in the reciting of the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mrs. Davidson introduced a few of the MHS One Act team members and gave a brief overview of their performance of "Blue Stockings". Katrine Bogardus, Erica Hoyt, Sean Griffin, Chasity Santiago, Owen Smith, and Baylor Winters representing the cast of "Blue Stockings" shared their talent with the Board by presenting a couple short scenes.

Mr. Norgaard welcomed members of the McCook Community Foundation to the Board Meeting. Rhonda Graff presented Tom Bredvick, Board President, with a check to contribute to the Bison Days projects. Cindy Huff, President of the McCook Community Foundation, shared with the Board and the Administrative Team present their desire to continue to financially support unique programs that promote student learning outside of the regular needs of the classroom. Pam Wolford, representative from the Bison Days Committee, shared additional information on the plans for the 2020 Bison Days to be held on February 17th and 18th.

Teresa Thomas let the Board know that further negotiations discussions would be happening during Closed Session.

Tom Bredvick shared the basics of the Programs Committee Meeting held on Monday, December 9th at 7:00 a.m. Tom gave a basic update on the AQUEST work, high school scheduling, JH electives, and creative planning within curriculum. Mr. Berry added his insight into the AQUEST process. Loretta Hauxwell shared a bit on the committee's discussion in "creating student experiences" in career exploration throughout their time at MPS. The Programs Committee is very aware of the budgetary restraints that MPS faces in providing the teaching support needed for unique programs for student learning.

Mr. Norgaard reported that MHS received the bump from GOOD to GREAT through the AQUEST process. He shared some of the growth that took place from going through the process and some of the challenges that are found in meeting the guidelines of the tenants and subtenants that are outlined through AQUEST. Mr. Gross added that the process was intense; but a learning experience. He also stated his appreciation for raters' comments on their feedback forms. Mr. Norgaard shared some of the learning that he also garnered from being a rater for this Nebraska assessment process.

Mr. Norgaard thanked the MPS board members who were able to attend the NASB conference in Omaha last month. He shared some of his learning from the conference.

Loretta Hauxwell shared with the Board her research regarding the organization of MPS Policies for public access. She recommended the use of already existing systems and MPS staff as the economical option for this process and is hoping to meet with the Policy Committee in January to get this process rolling.

TJ Renner presented the Student Council Report. Their major projects this month included setting up and creating gingerbread houses with the Kindergarten students and their families. He shared the positive experiences of high school students serving as models for the younger ones. He reminded the Board of the gifts to Veterans organized by Student Council and shared a bit about the planning stages of Color Day next month.

Tom Bredvick tabled the motion regarding the Executive Session requested for the Superintendent's Evaluation to the January Board Meeting.

Positive Comments were opened with TJ Renner sharing his excitement of the beginning of the Winter Sports Season and students supporting one another in their events. Brad Hays thanked the Student Council for their work with the Kindergarteners making Gingerbread Houses. Dennis Berry recognized the 35 MHS student-athletes that were selected as part of the GNAC All Academic Team. Teresa Thomas highlighted the FFA program selling their produce to local restaurants in our community. Tom Bredvick highlighted the career development opportunities for students involved with the BisonTV, especially highlighting their work during the Bison basketball games and for an MNB Promotion. Mike Langan thanked and celebrated the MHS One Act Team. Loretta Hauxwell recognized the work that YCR members have done in partnership with the McCook Community Foundation and thanked Shelly Sehnert for her leadership as the MPS representative. Mr. Gross shared his experiences of walking down the halls at MPS and seeing students engaged and learning. He recognized the teachers for their hard work. Mr. Bednar also celebrated the teachers' work, especially their commitment and expertise in the vertical alignment process that has taken place recently. Mr. Norgaard noted the FFA Auction and thanked the community for supporting this program and its students by bidding.

Discussion continued on the selection of the local financial institution. President Tom Bredvick asked Tim Weibe from MNB Bank who was in attendance to detail the process for the loan. Tim stated that the Nebraska Energy Office (NEO) provides the forms and that all financial institutions would use the same forms to request the low interest loan. The rates for the low interest loan are the same for the school no matter which financial institution is selected. The NEO buys down the loan to make it palatable for the financial institution. The school will only pay the 1% interest on the energy loan.

Motion by Tom Bredvick to approve the District entering into an Energy Savings Contract (ESCO) with Trane, as may be presented and modified through negotiations between Trane and the Superintendent and Business Manager of Schools; and, further hereby approve the execution of such contract by the Superintendent on behalf of the School District. The ESCO contract with Trane and their sub-contracting partners shall not exceed the lessor of (\$500,000, or the amount of the Energy Loan), for Energy Savings projects in all buildings at McCook Public Schools. These projects include but are not limited to Lighting Retrofits, Recommissioning, Building Automations System, and HVAC Retrofits. The approval of this contract is contingent upon McCook Public Schools acceptance for a low interest energy loan from the Nebraska Department of Environment and Energy and all other legal requirements being met. 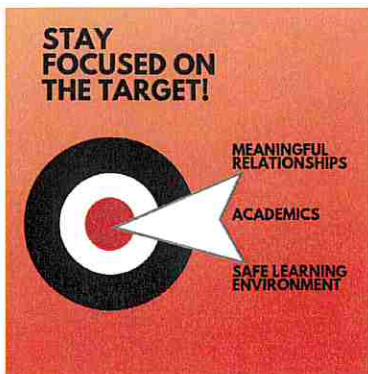

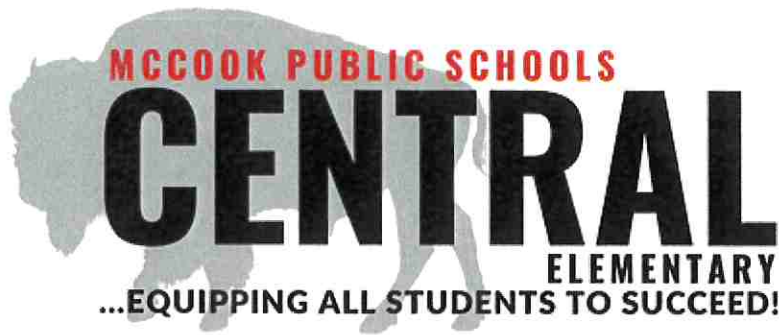

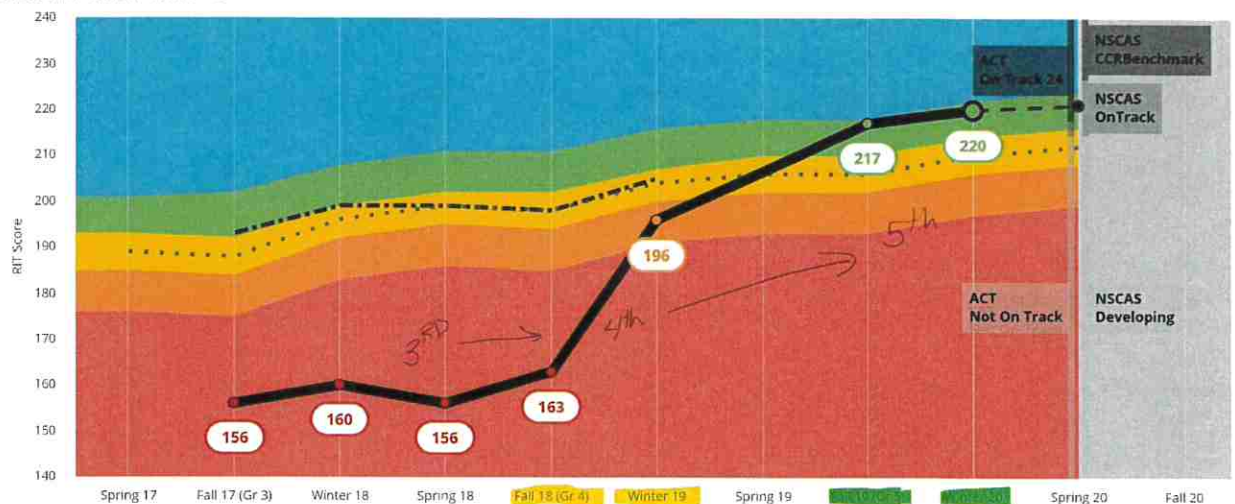
